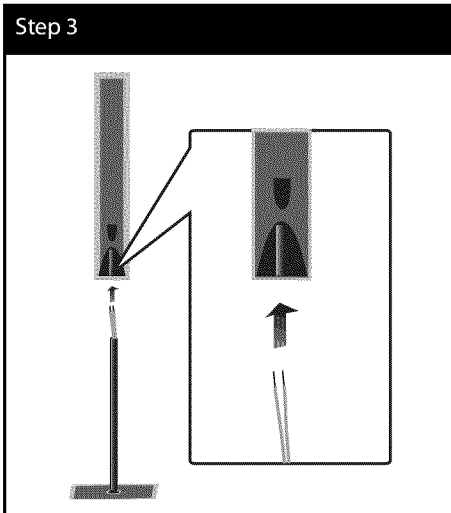
1. Attach the pole to the base, then secure the connection with a supplied screw.



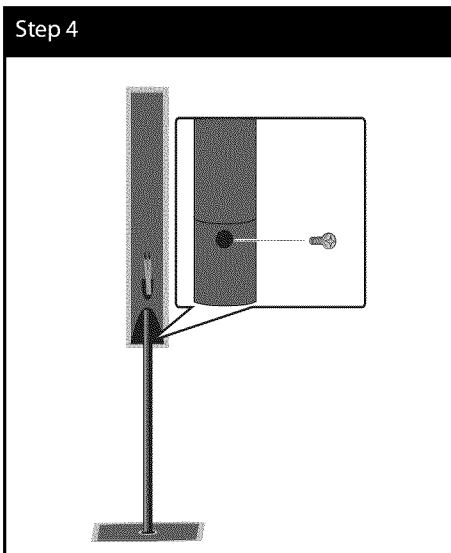
2. Insert a speaker wire from the bottom of the base.



3. Draw the speaker wire through the inside of the pole and also through the hole on the bottom of the speaker.

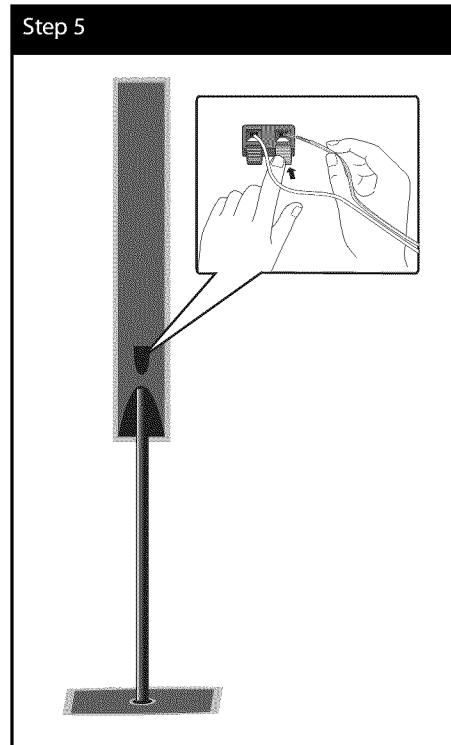


4. Attach the speaker to the pole, then secure the connection with a supplied screw.



5. Connect the speaker wire to the terminal on the speaker.

Make sure the wire marked black goes in to the terminal marked “-” (minus) and the other wire goes in to the terminal marked “+” (plus).

Be careful that the speaker should not fall down. Otherwise it may result in the speaker malfunctioning and causing personal injury and/or property damage.



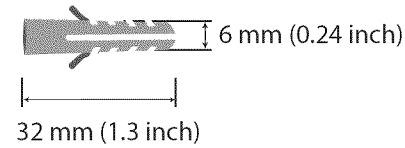
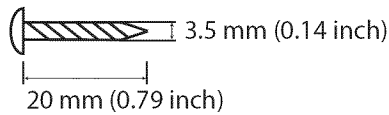
Mounting the speakers to a wall

You can mount the speakers to a wall. Prepare screws and brackets supplied.

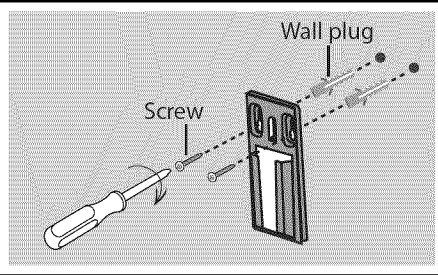
1. Attach the wall bracket to the wall with screws as shown in the illustration below.

When you mount to a wall (concrete), use the wall plugs. You should drill some holes (Diameter: 6 mm, Depth: more than 32 mm) for the mounting.

Speaker Connection

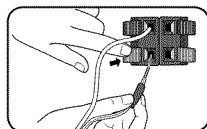
Attaching the speakers to the player

1. Connect speaker wires to the main unit. Each speaker wire is color-coded. Use matching color wires for corresponding speakers.



Color	Speaker	Position
Green	Center	Center
Red	Front	Front right
White	Front	Front left

2. Connect speaker wires to the wireless receiver. Use the same method for connecting rear speakers to the wireless receiver unit.



CAUTION


- Be careful to make sure children not to put their hands or any objects into the *speaker duct. *Speaker duct: A hole for plentiful bass sound on speaker cabinet (enclosure).
- Place the center speaker at a safe distance from the child's reach. Otherwise it may result in the speaker falling down and causing personal injury and/or property damage.


Wireless speakers connection

Subwoofer connection

The wireless subwoofer makes setup simple, too there are no cables to connect. When you turn on the unit and subwoofer the connection will be completed automatically.

You can set up wireless connection manually, when your connection is not completed.

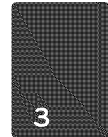
Case 1 : If the wireless connection indicator will blink, press and hold  (STOP) on the front panel and then MUTE button on the remote control. "REMATE" will be displayed.

Case 2 : If the wireless connection indicator will red, press and hold  (STOP) on the front panel and then MUTE button on the remote control. "REMATE" will be displayed.

Disconnect and connect the power cord of the subwoofer to the wall outlet. If the indicator on subwoofer is blue, the connection is completed

NOTE

- If the wireless connection fails again, check whether there is any conflict or strong interference (for example, interference from other electronic devices) around your location. After removal of the conflict or strong interference, repeat the above procedures.
- The available length is 10 m (33 ft.) for wireless connection on open place.

LED indicator of wireless receiver

LED Color	Operation
Blue	The wireless receiver is receiving the signal of the wireless transmitter.
Red	The Wireless Receiver is in standby mode.
Off (No display)	The Wireless Receiver is turned off.

Initial setting an ID of wireless receiver

1. Connect the Wireless Receiver and the rear speaker (right, left) with the speaker cables.
2. Connect the power cord of the Wireless Receiver to the outlet.
3. Turn on the main unit and Wireless Receiver: The main unit and wireless receiver will be automatically connected. "●" appears in display window.

Setting an ID of wireless receiver

When the unit is manufactured, the ID is already set. If an interference occurs or you use a new wireless receiver, an ID should be set again.

1. Turn on the main unit and turn off the wireless receiver.
2. Press and hold ■ (STOP) on the front of unit and MUTE on the remote control. "REMATE" appears in display window.
3. Turn on the Wireless Receiver. A new ID is set.

! NOTE

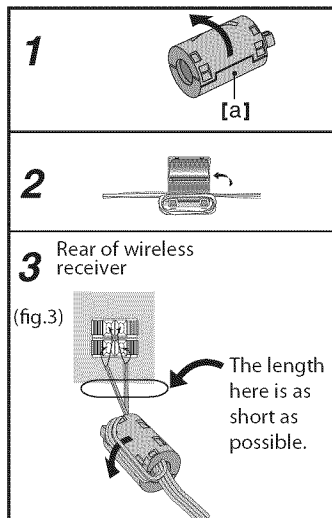
- If there is a strong electromagnetic wave product nearby, interference may occur. Put the unit (Wireless Receiver and main unit) away from there.
- If there is no audio signal for longer than 10 minutes, the Wireless Receiver will automatically switch to standby mode. In power saving mode, both LEDs will turn red. LEDs will turn blue when there is any audio signal back.
- If you operate main unit then wireless speakers (rear speakers) sound within a few seconds in standby mode.
- Set the distance between this unit and Wireless Receiver within 10 m (32 ft).
- Optimum performance can be implemented only when the Wireless Transmitter and the Wireless Receiver within distance of 2 m (6 ft.) to 10 m (32 ft.) is used since communication failure may occur if longer distance is used.
- Be sure to match the speaker cable to the appropriate terminal on the components: + to + and - to -. If the cables are reversed, the sound will be distorted and will lack bass.
- It takes a few seconds (and may take longer) for the Wireless Transmitter and Wireless Receiver to communicate with each other.
- Use the rear speaker at least 30 cm (11 inch) away from either TV screen or PC monitor.

About Ferrite Core (for EMI only)

Be sure to attach the ferrite core to the speaker cable (for connecting to this unit and wireless receiver). This ferrite core can reduce noises.

How to attach the ferrite core

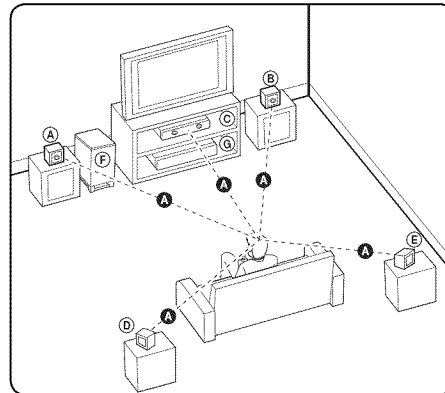
1. Press the stopper [a] of the ferrite core to open.
2. Wind the speaker cables once on the ferrite core.
3. Close the ferrite core until it clicks. Refer to the fig.3 and comment.



Positioning the system

The following illustration shows an example of positioning the system. Note that the illustrations in these instructions differ from the actual unit for explanation purposes.

For the best possible surround sound, all the speakers other than the subwoofer should be placed at the same distance from the listening position (A).



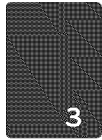
- (A) Front left speaker (L)/**
- (B) Front right speaker (R):**
Place the front speakers to the sides of the monitor or screen and as flush with the screen surface as possible.
- (C) Center speaker:**
Place the center speaker above or below the monitor or screen.
- (D) Surround left speaker (L)/**
- (E) Surround right speaker (R):**
Place these speakers behind your listening position, facing slightly inwards.
- (F) Subwoofer:**
The position of the subwoofer is not so critical, because low bass sounds are not highly directional. But it is better to place the subwoofer near the front speakers. Turn it slightly toward the center of the room to reduce the wall reflections.

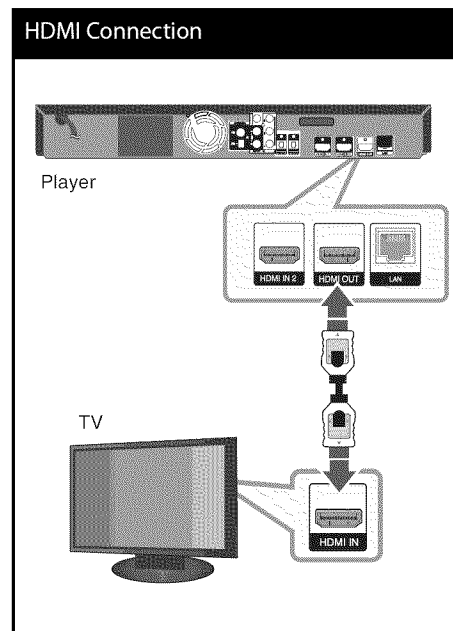

NOTE

- Depending on your TV and other equipment you wish to connect, there are various ways you could connect the player. Use only one of the connections described in this manual.
- Please refer to the manuals of your TV, stereo system or other devices as necessary to make the best connections.
- Make sure the player is connected directly to the TV. Tune the TV to the correct video input channel.
- Do not connect your player via your VCR. The image could be distorted by the copy protection system.

HDMI Connection

If you have a HDMI TV or monitor, you can connect it to this player using a HDMI cable (Type A, Version 1.3). Connect the HDMI OUT jack on the player to the HDMI IN jack on a HDMI compatible TV or monitor.



Set the TV's source to HDMI (refer to TV's Owner's manual).


NOTE

- Changing the resolution when the connection has already been established may result in malfunctions. To solve the problem, turn off the player and then turn it on again.
- When the HDMI connection with HDCP is not verified, TV screen is changed to black screen. In this case, check the HDMI connection, or disconnect the HDMI cable.
- If there is noise or lines on the screen, please check the HDMI cable (length is generally limited to 4.5 m (15 ft.) and use a high speed HDMI cable (version 1.3).
- If a connected HDMI device does not accept the audio output of the player, the HDMI device's audio sound may be distorted or may not output.
- When you use HDMI connection, you can change the resolution for the HDMI output. (Refer to 'Resolution Setting' on page 25.)
- Select the type of video output from the HDMI OUT jack using [HDMI Color Setting] option on the [Setup] menu (see page 37).
- When you connect a HDMI or DVI compatible device make sure of the following:
 - Try switching off the HDMI/DVI device and this player. Next, switch on the HDMI/DVI device and leave it for around 30 seconds, then switch on this player.
 - The connected device's video input is set correctly for this unit.
 - The connected device is compatible with 720x480p, 1280x720p, 1920x1080i or 1920x1080p video input.
- Not all HDCP-compatible HDMI or DVI devices will work with this player.
 - The picture will not be displayed properly with non-HDCP device.
 - This player does not playback and TV screen is changed to black screen.

What is SIMPLINK?



Some functions of this unit are controlled by the TV's remote control when this unit and LG TV's with SIMPLINK are connected through HDMI connection.

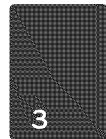

- If you want to access content from PCs or DLNA servers, this player must be connected to the same local area network with them via a router.

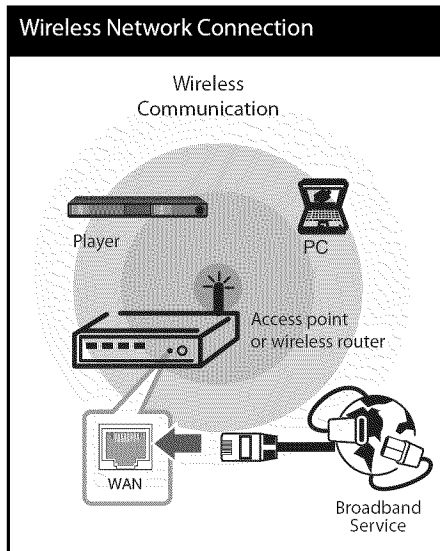
Another connection option is to use an Access Point or a wireless router. In the example configuration for wireless connection below, this player would be able to access content from either of the PCs.

The network configuration and connection method may vary depending on the equipment in use and the network environment.

This player is equipped with an IEEE 802.11n (2.4 GHz band only) wireless module, which also supports the 802.11b/g standards. For the best wireless performance, we recommend using a IEEE 802.11n certified Wi-Fi network (access point or wireless router).

Refer to the setup instructions supplied with your access point or wireless router for detailed connection steps and network settings.



NOTE

- For best performance, a direct wired connection from your Home theater to your home network's router or cable/DSL modem is always the best option. If your Home theater is far away from your router or cable/DSL modem, Ethernet or LAN cables are available at many stores in lengths of 15 m (50 ft.) and longer. If you do chose to use the wireless option, note that performance can sometimes be affected by other electronic devices in the home.
- An Access Point is a device that allows you to connect to your home network wirelessly.

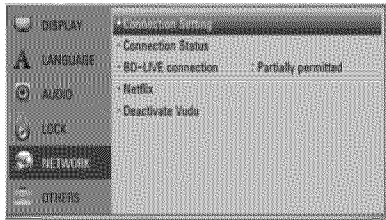

- Select [OK] and press ENTER to apply network settings.
- The player will ask you to test the network connection. Select [OK] and press ENTER to complete the network connection.
- If you select [Test] at step 7 above, the network connection status is displayed on the screen. You can also test it on the [Connection Status] in the [Setup] menu.

Outputs 1080 lines of interlaced video.

[720p]

Outputs 720 lines of progressive video.

1080p Display Mode

When the resolution is set to 1080p, select [24 Hz] for smooth presentation of film material (1080p/ 24 Hz) with a HDMI-equipped display compatible with 1080p/ 24 Hz input.

HD AV Sync

Sometimes Digital TV encounters a delay between picture and sound. If this happens you can compensate by setting a delay on the sound so that it effectively 'waits' for the picture to arrive: this is called HD AV Sync. Use **▲ ▼** to scroll up and down through the delay amount, which you can set at anything between 0 and 300m sec.



The delay will vary depending on which digital TV channel you are on. If you change channel you may need to readjust the HD AV Sync.

DRC (Dynamic Range Control)

When a content encoded in Dolby Digital or Dolby Digital Plus is playing back, you may wish to compress the dynamic range of the audio output (the difference between the loudest sounds and the quietest ones). This allows you to listen to a movie at a lower volume without losing clarity of sound. Set [DRC] to [On] for this effect.

! NOTE

The DRC setting can be changed only when a disc is not inserted or the unit is in complete stop mode.



[LOCK] Menu

To access the any features in [LOCK] settings, you must enter the 4-digit security code you have created.

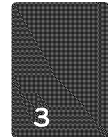

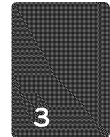

Press ENTER to view the notice of Network Service Disclaimer on page 103.

**NOTE**

If you reset the player to its original factory settings using [Factory Set] option, you have to set all the activation for the on-line services and network settings again.

Sound Effect

You can select a suitable sound mode. Press SOUND EFFECT repeatedly until the desired mode appears on the front panel display or the TV screen. The displayed items for the equalizer maybe different depending on sound sources and effects.

[PL II Music]: Performs Pro Logic II music mode decoding to the input signal and produces five full-bandwidth output channels from 2 channel sources. This setting is ideal for normal stereo sources such as CD. This mode is available only to 2 channel sources.

[Clear Voice]: This mode makes voice sound clear, improving the quality of voice sound.

[Virtual]: You can enjoy more dynamic sound with improved center channel.

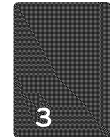

Handling Discs

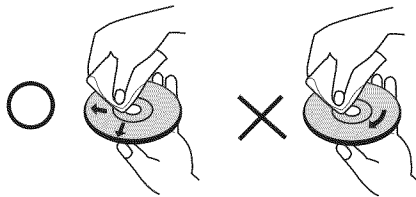


Never stick paper or tape on the disc.

After playing, store the disc in its case. Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight or sources of heat and never leave it in a parked car exposed to direct sunlight.

Cleaning Discs



Do not use strong solvents such as alcohol, benzine, thinner, commercially available cleaners, or anti-static spray intended for older vinyl records.

Handling the Unit

When shipping the unit

Please save the original shipping carton and packing materials. If you need to ship the unit, for maximum protection, re-pack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.

Keeping the exterior surfaces clean

- Do not use volatile liquids such as insecticide spray near the unit.
- Wiping with strong pressure may damage the surface.
- Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the unit for a long period of time.

Cleaning the unit

To clean the player, use a soft, dry cloth. If the surfaces are extremely dirty, use a soft cloth lightly moistened with a mild detergent solution. Do not use strong solvents such as alcohol, benzine, or thinner, as these might damage the surface of the unit.

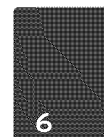

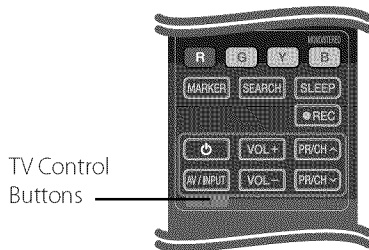

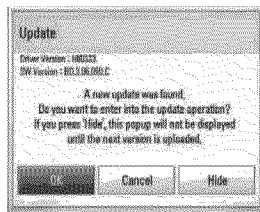
Network Software Update

Network update notification

From time to time, performance improvements and/or additional features or services may be made available to units that are connected to a broadband home network. If there is new software available and the unit is connected to a broadband home network, the player will inform you about the update as follows.

Option 1:

1. The update menu will appear on the screen when you turn on the player.
2. Use </> to select a desired option and then press ENTER (⊙).

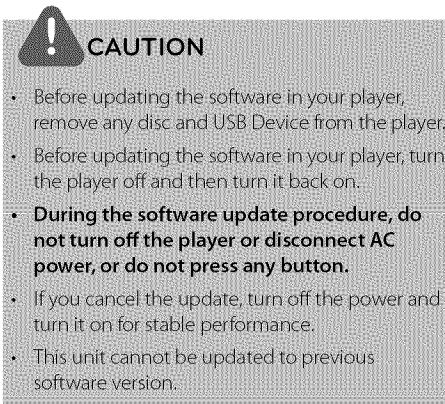

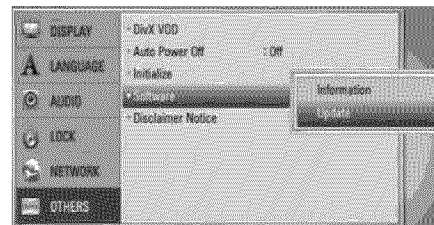
If the software update is available from the update server, the "Update" icon appears at the bottom of the Home menu. Press blue (B) colored button to start the update procedure.

Software Update

You can update the player using the latest software to enhance the products operation and/or add new features. You can update the software by connecting the unit directly to the software update server.



1. Check the network connection and settings (page 28-33).
2. Select [Software] option in the [Setup] menu then press ENTER (⊙).
3. Select [Update] option, and press ENTER (⊙).

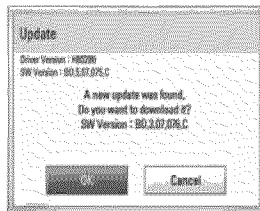


The player will check for the newest update.

NOTE

- Pressing ENTER (Ⓢ) while checking for the update will end the process.
- If there is no update available, the Message, "No update is found" appears. Press ENTER (Ⓢ) to return to the [Home Menu].

4. If newer version exists, the message "A new update was found. Do you want to download it?" appears.



5. Select [OK] to download the update. (Selecting [Cancel] will end the update.)
6. The player starts downloading the newest update from the server. (Downloading will take several minutes depending on your home network condition)
7. When downloading is completed, the message, "Download is complete. Do you want to update?" appears.
8. Select [OK] to start updating. (Selecting [Cancel] will end the update and downloaded file will not be re-usable. To update software the next time, the software update procedure has to be started from the beginning again.)

CAUTION

Do not turn off the power during the software update.

NOTE

If the software includes the driver update, disc tray may open during the process.

9. When update is completed, the message, "Update is complete." will appear, and then power will turn off automatically after 5 seconds.
10. Turn the power back on. The system now operates with the new version.

The Software Update function may not work properly depending on your internet environment. In this case, you can obtain the latest software from the authorized LG Electronics Service Center then update your player. Refer to "Customer Support" on page 92.
