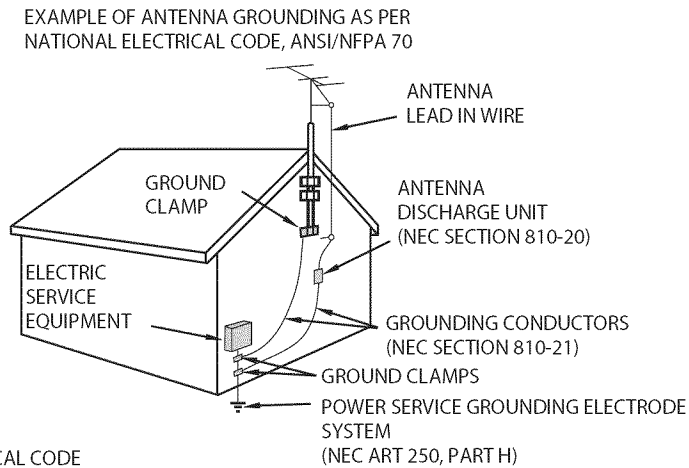

- **Lightning** — For added protection for this television equipment during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna. This will prevent damage to the equipment due to lightning and power-line surges.
- **Power Lines** — An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. 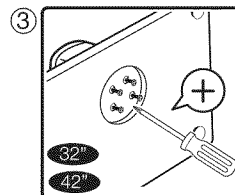
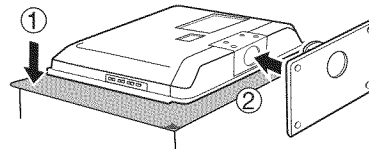
Attaching/Detaching the Stand

- Before attaching (or detaching) the stand, unplug the AC cord from the AC INPUT terminal.
- Before performing work spread cushioning over the base area to lay the TV on. This will prevent it from being damaged.

CAUTION

- Attach the stand in the correct direction.
- Be sure to follow the instructions. Incorrect installation of the stand may result in the TV falling over.

- Put the TV face down on a safe surface that is covered by a soft and smooth cloth.
- Adjust the TV stand to the bottom of the TV.
- Fasten the screws by using a cross-head screwdriver (Not supplied).



CAUTION

- Do not push too hard or put excessive pressure to the stand neck to avoid damages when you turn the TV for the most comfortable viewing angle.

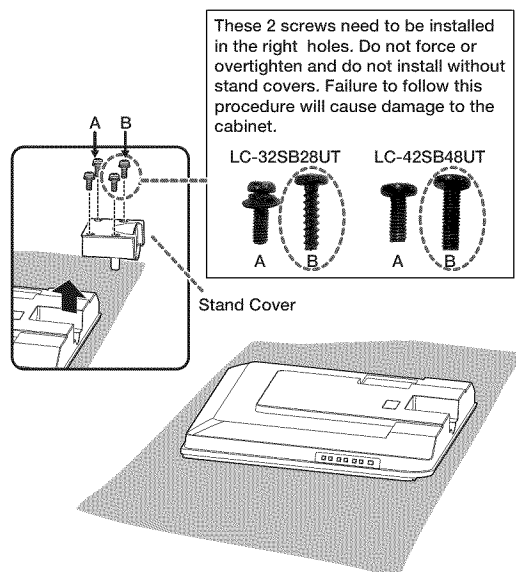
- To detach the stand, perform the steps in reverse order.

Detaching the stand neck for wall mounting

CAUTION

- Please use care when disassembling cabinet, stand, and pillar for wall mounting.
- Detach the stand neck in the correct direction.
- Do not remove the stand neck from the TV unless using an optional wall mount bracket to mount it.

- Loosen the 4 screws that secure the stand neck by using a cross-head screwdriver. Remove stand cover from the TV set.



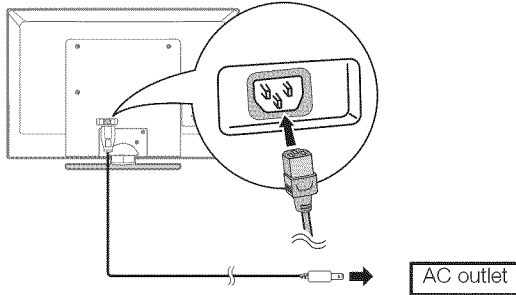

- To attach the stand neck, perform the steps in reverse order.
- There are 2 types of screws for the stand cover (Machine screws on top and self-tapping screws at the bottom).

Quick Installation Tips

- 1 Attach your antenna to the back of the television. (See page 8.)
- 2 Connect the AC plug for the television into the AC outlet.

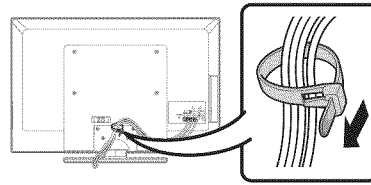


- Place the TV close to the AC outlet, and keep the power plug within reach.
- This product must only be connected to a 120V, 60Hz, grounded (3-prong) outlet. Connecting it to any other kind of outlet will damage the product and invalidate the warranty.

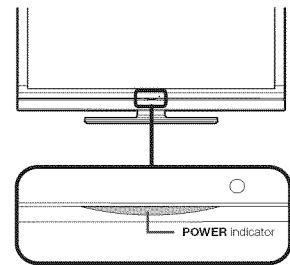
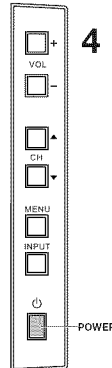

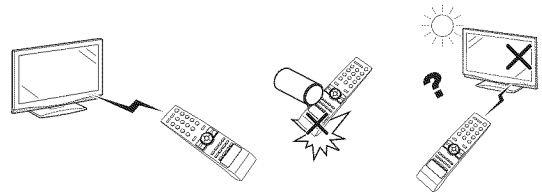
Using the Remote Control Unit

Use the remote control unit by pointing it towards the remote control sensor on the TV. Objects between the remote control unit and the remote control sensor may prevent proper operation.



■ Cautions regarding the remote control unit

- Do not expose the remote control unit to shock. In addition, do not expose the remote control unit to liquids, and do not place in an area with high humidity.
- Do not install or place the remote control unit under direct sunlight. The heat may cause deformation of the remote control unit.
- The remote control unit may not work properly if the remote control sensor on the TV is under direct sunlight or strong lighting. In such cases, change the angle of the lighting or the TV, or operate the remote control unit closer to the remote control sensor.



IMPORTANT:

The POWER indicator on the television should light BLUE indicating you have power to the television.

If the POWER indicator on the television still does not light up, press **POWER** on the remote control to turn the power on.

IMPORTANT:

IF THE UNIT DOES NOT POWER ON - UNPLUG THE TELEVISION FROM THE OUTLET AND REPEAT THE INSTALLATION STEPS.

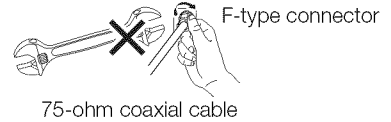
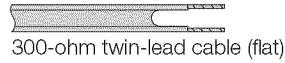
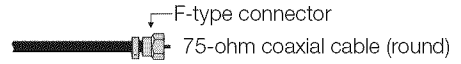
Antennas

To enjoy a clearer picture, use an outdoor antenna. The following is a brief explanation of the types of connections that are used for a coaxial cable. If your outdoor antenna uses a 75-ohm coaxial cable with an F-type connector, plug it into the antenna terminal at the rear of the TV set.

1. A 75-ohm system is generally a round cable with F-type connector that can easily be attached to a terminal without tools (Commercially available).
2. A 300-ohm system is a flat "twin-lead" cable that can be attached to a 75-ohm terminal through a 300/75-ohm adapter (Commercially available).

NOTE

When connecting the RF cable to the TV set, do not tighten F-type connector with tools. If tools are used, it may cause damage to your TV set. (The breaking of internal circuit, etc.)



Connecting Antenna

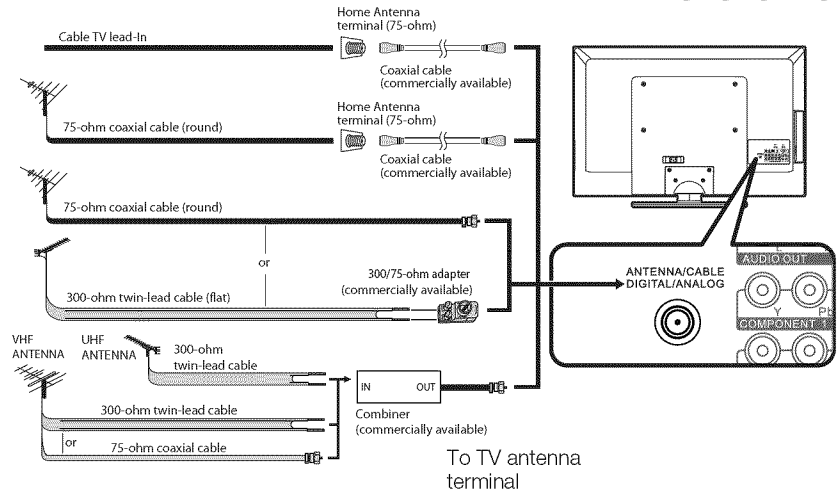
- Connect the antenna cable to the TV using one of the methods in the illustration as shown (①, ②, ③ or ④).

④ Separate VHF/UHF antenna



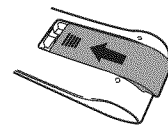
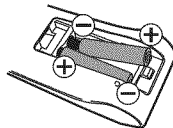
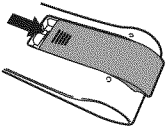
Installing Batteries in the Remote Control Unit

If the remote control fails to operate TV functions, replace the batteries in the remote control unit.

1 Open the battery cover.

2 Insert two "AAA" size batteries (supplied with the product).

3 Close the battery cover.



- Place the batteries with their terminals corresponding to the (+) and (-) indications in the battery compartment.

CAUTION

Improper use of batteries can result in chemical leakage or explosion. Be sure to follow the instructions below.

- Do not mix batteries of different types. Different types of batteries have different characteristics.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Mixing old and new batteries can shorten the life of new batteries or cause chemical leakage in old batteries.
- Remove batteries as soon as they are worn out. Chemicals that leak from batteries come in contact with skin can cause a rash. If you find any chemical leakage, wipe thoroughly with a cloth.
- The batteries supplied with this product may have a shorter life expectancy due to storage conditions.
- If you will not be using the remote control unit for an extended period of time, remove batteries from it.

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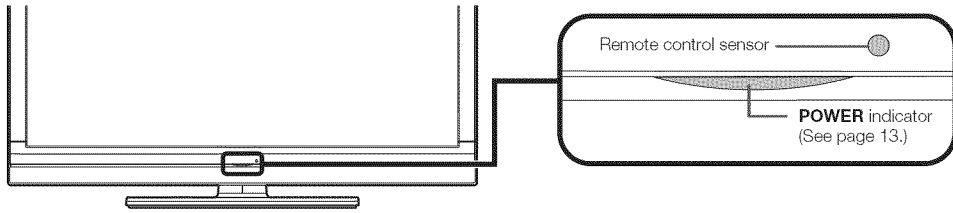

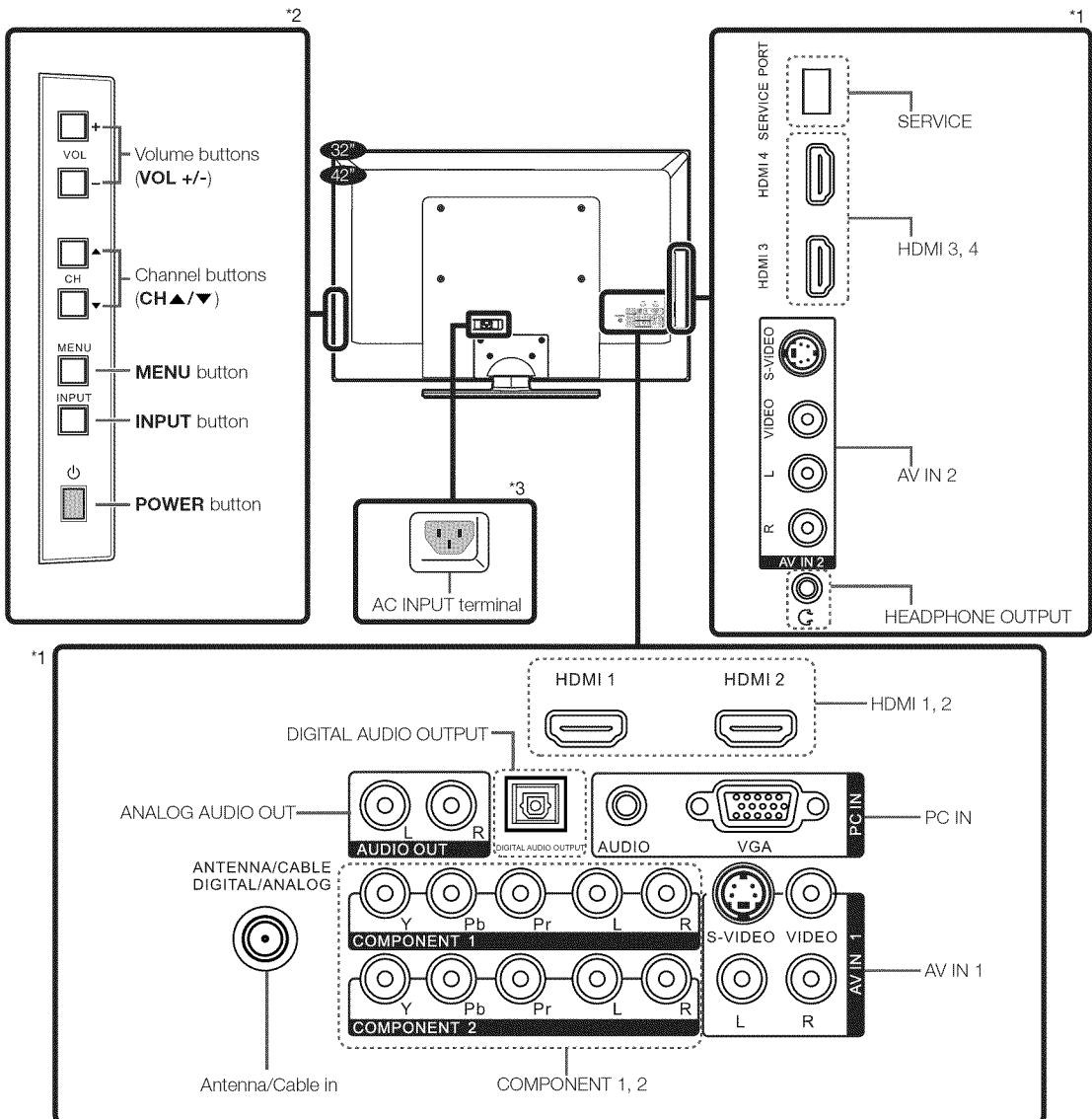

TV (Side/Rear)

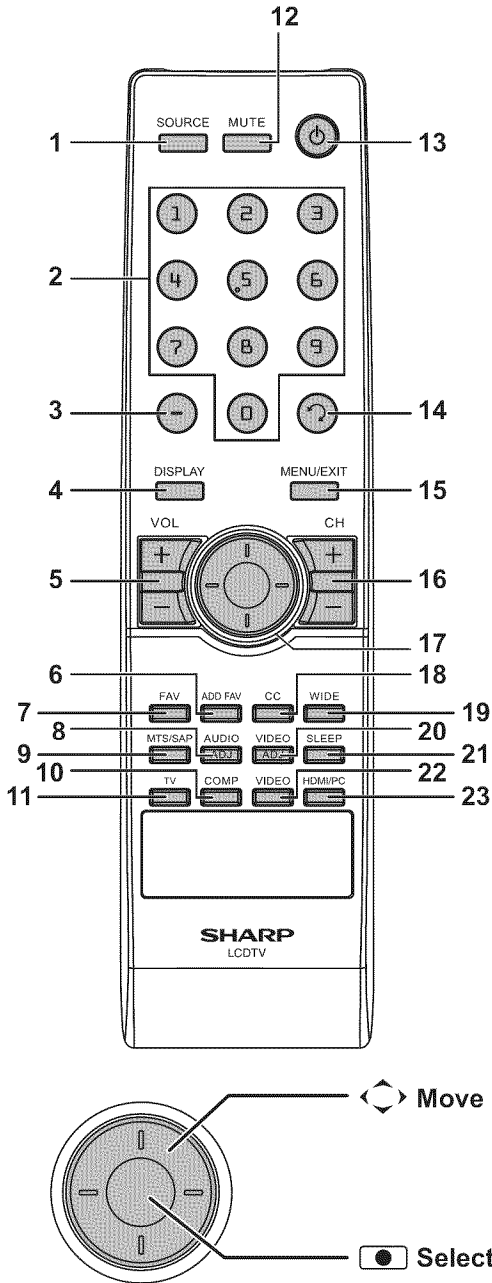

Remote Control Unit



- 1 **SOURCE:** Select a TV input source. (See page 15.)
- 2 **0-9:** Set the channel.
- 3 **- (DASH):** (See page 15.)
- 4 **DISPLAY:** Display the current channel (or input source) information on the screen.
- 5 **VOL +/- :** Set the volume. (See page 15.)
- 6 **ADD FAV:** Press to add channel to Favorite List.
- 7 **FAV:** Press to display the Favorite Channel List.
- 8 **AUDIO ADJ:** Press to choose preset audio mode from Standard, Movies, News, or Custom. (See page 15.)
- 9 **MTS/SAP:** Display the MTS/SAP setting menu. (See page 16.)
- 10 **COMP:** Press to choose Component 1 or Component 2 source mode.
- 11 **TV:** Press to choose TV source mode.

- 15 **MENU/EXIT:** Display or close the menu screen.

- 17 **Navigation Ring:** Select a desired item on the screen.
- 18 **CC:** Display captions during closed-caption source. (See page 16.)
- 19 **WIDE:** Select the screen size. (See page 17-18.)
- 20 **VIDEO ADJ:** Press to choose the Picture Mode from Vivid, Standard, PWR, Theater, Sport, or Custom. (See page 15.)
- 21 **SLEEP:** Allows you to set a time when the TV automatically switches to standby. This display will disappear after a few seconds, and the sleep timer automatically starts counting down. (See page 15.)
 - If you want to adjust the sleep timer again, you can press this button repeatedly then change the time setting.
 - The TV will enter the standby mode when the remaining time reaches zero.
- 22 **VIDEO:** Press to choose AV1 or AV2 source mode.
- 23 **HDMI/PC:** Press repeatedly to choose VGA, HDMI 1, HDMI 2, HDMI 3, or HDMI 4 source mode.

NOTE

- When using the remote control unit, point it at the TV.

Connecting to External Equipment

You can connect many types of external equipment to your TV like a Blu-ray disc player, HD-DVD player, DVD player, VCR, Digital TV tuner, HDMI equipment, game console or camcorder. To view external source images, select the input source from **SOURCE** on the remote control unit or **INPUT** on the TV. (See page 15.)

CAUTION

- To protect equipment, always turn off the TV before connecting any external equipment.
- Please read the relevant operation manual (Blu-ray disc player, etc.) carefully before making connections.

DISPLAY

VIDEO ADJ gives you viewing options to choose from to best match the surrounding environment of the TV, which can vary due to factors like room brightness, type of program watched or the type of image input from external equipment.

AUDIO ADJ

AUDIO ADJ gives preset audio options to choose from to best match the program content.

MTS/SAP

■ MTS/SAP stereo mode

The TV has a feature that allows reception of sound other than the main audio for the program. This feature is called Multi-channel Television Sound (MTS). The TV with MTS can receive mono sound, stereo sound and Secondary Audio Programs (SAP). The SAP feature allows a TV station to broadcast other information, which could be audio in another language or something completely different like weather information.

You can enjoy Hi-Fi stereo sound or SAP broadcasts when available.

- **Stereo broadcasts:** View programs like live sporting events, shows and concerts in dynamic stereo sound.
- **SAP broadcasts:** Receive TV broadcasts in either MAIN or SAP sound.
MAIN sound: The normal program soundtrack (either in mono or stereo).
SAP sound: Listen to a second language, supplementary commentary or other information. (SAP is mono sound.)

If stereo sound is difficult to hear.

- Obtain a clearer sound by manually switching to fixed mono-sound mode.

You can change MTS as shown below to match the television broadcast signal.

Press **MTS/SAP** to toggle between audio modes.

Examples: when receiving MTS and SAP

MAIN + SAP mode: MAIN ↔ SAP

MONO mode: MONO

■ Digital broadcasting audio mode

The types of audio transmitted in a digital broadcast include SURROUND as well as MONO and STEREO. In addition, it is possible for multiple audio tracks to accompany a single video track.

Press **MTS/SAP** to toggle between audio modes.

Example: when receiving Digital broadcasting

STEREO (Audio1) → STEREO (Audio2)

MTS only operates while in TV mode.

Closed Captions and Digital Closed Captions

Your TV is equipped with an internal Closed Caption decoder. It allows you to view conversations, narration and sound effects as subtitles on your TV. Closed Captions are available on some TV programs and on some VHS home video tapes at the discretion of the program provider.

Digital Closed Caption service is a new caption service available only on digital TV programs (also at the discretion of the service provider). It is a more flexible system than the original Closed Caption system, because it allows for a variety of caption sizes and font styles. When the Digital Closed Caption service is in use, it will be indicated by the appearance of a 3-letter abbreviation that also indicates the language of the Digital Closed Captions: ENG (English), SPA (Spanish), FRA (French) or other language codes.

Not all programs and VHS videotapes offer closed captions. Please press **DISPLAY** and look for CC presence information.

In the Closed Caption system, there can be more than one caption service provided. Each is identified by its own number. The "CC1" and "CC2" services display subtitles of TV programs superimposed over the program's picture.

In the Closed Caption system, the "Text1" or "Text2" services display text that is unrelated to the program being viewed (e.g., weather or news). These services are also superimposed over the program currently being viewed.

1. Press **DISPLAY**.
This will present the Closed Caption information display.
2. Press **CC**.
This will display the current Closed Caption information. Press **CC** repeatedly to choose the mode.

CC Off → CC On → CC On With Mute

- The Digital Closed Captions feature only works when using the "TV" input of this television.

Canadian Rating Systems (Canadian English ratings and Canadian French ratings).

- The TV rating systems in Canada are based on the Canadian Radio-Television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) policy on violence in television programming.
- While violence is the most important content element to be rated, the structure developed takes into consideration other program content like language, nudity, sexuality and mature themes.
- When setting the V-CHIP on the Canadian system you can choose either the Canadian English ratings or the Canadian French ratings.

Canadian English Ratings

E	Exempt: Includes news, sports, documentaries and other information programming; talk shows, music videos, and variety programming.
C	Children: Intended for younger children under the age of 8 years. Pays careful attention to themes that could threaten their sense of security and well-being.
C8+	Children over 8 years old: Contains no portrayal of violence as the preferred, acceptable, or only way to resolve conflict; nor encourage children to imitate dangerous acts which they may see on the screen.
G	General: Considered acceptable for all age groups. Appropriate viewing for the entire family, contains very little violence, physical, verbal or emotional.
PG	Parental Guidance: Intended for a general audience, but may not be suitable for younger children (under the age of 8) because it could contain controversial themes or issues.
14+	Over 14 years: Could contain themes where violence is one of the dominant elements of the storyline, but it must be integral to the development of plot or character. Language usage could be profane and nudity present within the context of the theme.
18+	Adults: Intended for viewers 18 years and older and might contain depictions of violence, which while related to the development of plot, character or themes, are intended for adult viewing. Could contain graphic language and portrayals of sex and nudity.

The inhibitive channels or source signals can be unlock.

Closed Captions

This displays the transmitted CC- or CS-text on the screen according to your chosen CC or CS service. This text can either be permanently displayed (assuming that the service is available in the broadcast) or only when mute is active.

Use ► to toggle between “Off”, “On”, and “With Mute”. (See page 16.)

Analog Captions

This allows you to select the Closed captions service levels of analog broadcasting to be displayed. Closed captioning allows you to read the voice content of television programs on the TV screen. Designed to help the hearing impaired, this feature uses on-screen “text boxes” to show dialogue and conversations while the TV program is in progress. Captions will appear on the screen during captioned broadcasts.

- CC1,2,3 or 4
Dialogue (and descriptions) for the action on the captioned TV program shows on screen. Usually CC1 is the most used. CC2 can be used for alternate languages if they are being transmitted.
- TEXT1,2,3 or 4
Often used for channel guide, schedules, bulletin board information for Closed captions programs, news, weather informations or stock market reports. Not all Caption services are necessarily being used by a TV channel during the transmission of a Closed caption program.

On-Screen Display Menu

Digital Captions

This allows you to configure the way you choose to view digital captioning. Select one of the digital service channels made available by the caption provider. There are six standard services. Size: Selects this option to choose a caption display size according to your own preference. Select "Automatic", "Small", "Normal", or "Large".

Font: Select digital closed caption font style.

Background Color: Choose caption display character background color.

Background Opacity: Choose one of the background opacity options.

Edge Effect: Choose one of the edge effect options.

Edge Color: Select one of the caption display edge colors.

Input Labels

User can edit the input labels.

Component Setting

This option only shows and is available in component mode, which provides fine tuning component display.

Phase: Adjust picture phase to reduce horizontal-line noise. The tuning range is from 0 to 100.

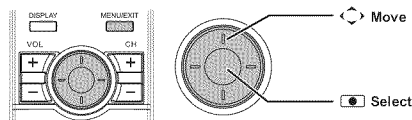
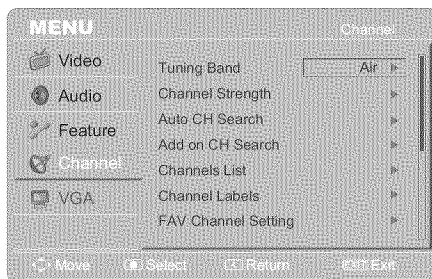
