

Installation Considerations

Before you install your VCR...



Ventilation — Proper ventilation keeps your VCR running cool. Air circulates through perforations in the back and bottom of the cabinet. Do not block these vents or you will shorten the life of your VCR.



Power Source — Your VCR is designed to operate on normal household current, 120 volt 60 Hertz AC. Do not attempt to operate it on DC current.



Power Cord — Your VCR power cord has a polarized plug as required by Underwriters' Laboratories. It has one regular blade and one wide blade and fits only one way into a standard electrical outlet. If the blades will not enter either way,

your outlet is very old and non-standard. A new outlet should be installed by a qualified electrician.



Safe Operation — Your VCR is manufactured and tested with your safety in mind. However, unusual stress caused by dropping or mishandling, exposure to flood, fire, rain or moisture, or accidental spilling of liquids into the VCR, can result in

potential electrical shock or fire hazards. If this happens, have your VCR checked by a service technician before using it again.

Please read and observe each safety point in the "Safety Tips" section of this operating guide when installing and using your VCR.

- Plugging in Your VCR Be sure to plug your VCR into an 'unswitched' AC power source. The "switched" AC outlets found on some video equipment will not continue supplying power to the VCR once the equipment is turned off. If the power to the VCR is interrupted for an extended time, you will have to reset the clock in the VCR.
- Keep the video recorder and video cassette away from strong magnetic fields.
- Use only Zenith approved and recommended accessory units with your Zenith video recorder to avoid potential hazards.
- Save the shipping carton and packing material. They will
 come in handy if you ever have to ship your video recorder. For maximum protection, re-pack the video
 recorder as it was originally shipped from the factory.

Moisture condensation is apt to occur under the following conditions:

- When the video recorder is moved from a cold place to a warm place.
- Under extremely humid conditions.

In locations where moisture condensation may occur:

- Keep the power cord plugged into an AC outlet and the POWER switch set to ON. This will help prevent condensation from occurring.
- When condensation has occurred, it will not evaporate quickly once the power is switched on. Wait a few hours for the video recorder to become dry before using the video recorder.



BEFORE YOU OPERATE YOUR VCR

This VCR is "menu" operated. In other words, features and characteristics of the VCR are adjusted by selecting options on "menus" that appear on the TV screen. Therefore, you should carefully review the menus in this operating guide. In particular, see the "VCR Menu Operations" section for information on how to access the menus and select an item on the menu.

1. Make Equipment Connections

(**Required**) Typical connections for your VCR are provided in the "Connections for Your VCR" section of this operating guide. Determine your video system needs, then make the connections shown on the applicable diagrams.




2. Connect the Power

(**Required**) Plug your VCR into an unswitched 120 Vac, 60 Hz household power outlet. Turn on the VCR by pressing the POWER switch on the remote control or on the front panel of the VCR.




Do not plug the VCR into a switched power outlet. Otherwise, when the power is switched off, the VCR turns off. You may then have to reset the time and date, and reprogram operational features.



3. Set Position of the CH3/CH4 Switch


(Required) The CH3/CH4 switch on the back panel of the VCR determines which channel is used by the VCR to send video signals to your TV. The TV must be tuned to the same channel you set with the CH3/CH4 switch to see tape playback and status displays from the VCR. To determine which video channel provides the best picture for your system, try the switch in CH3 position and tune your TV to CH3; then try the switch in CH4 position and turn your TV to CH4.

You may use the VCR menus for a test display. Press TV/VCR on remote repeatedly until VCR symbol appears in the front panel display of the VCR. Press MENU on the remote to see the main menu.



4. Select Language for VCR Menus/Displays

(Optional) Select the language (English, Spanish or French) you want for VCR menus and status displays. See LAN-GUAGE SELECT option on the SETUP menu for details.




5. Set Date and Time for Clock

(Required) Set the clock in the VCR to the current date and time. See CLOCK Menu for details.






6. Select Tuning Band for VCR

Choose CATV if you have a cable system (with or without a cable box) connected to the VCR. See TUNING BAND option on SETUP menu for details.




7. Use Auto Channel to Find Channels.




9. Select Other Menu Options


 Your VCR adjusts the clock automatically to the current time. As an alternative to Auto Clock Set, you can select ON for the Auto Daylight Savings option on the Special Menu. The clock will be adjusted automatically for Auto Daylight Savings time changes. Refer to the Special Menu for details.



 You may select the audio format (STEREO, MONO or 2ND AUDIO) to be used when you record programs, if you have a stereo VCR. We recommend you set this option to STEREO for recording most programs. Refer to the RECORD MODE option on the AUDIO menu for details.

Information appears in the Front Panel Display depending on the VCR function being used. For example, when you press SP/EP, the message SP or EP appears in the display to indicate the current tape speed. As you change channels, the channel numbers are shown. The current time is shown, even while the VCR is turned off. Messages shown include the following:

AU — Auxiliary A/V input channel is selected for viewing equipment connected to Audio/Video jacks on front or rear of the VCR.

EP — Extended Play speed is selected.

ERR — Error: Take VCR to an authorized repair center.


LP —Long Play speed is being used.

SP — Standard Play speed is selected.

VCR Status Displays



VCR Status Display Operation

The VCR Status Display appears on the TV when a VCR function starts, like changing a channel or selecting a different VCR mode. For example, pressing STOP while the VCR is in PLAY mode shows STOP in the display. You can press ENTER on the remote control any time to see the Status Display.

NOTE: If the VCR Status Display does not appear on the TV screen, check the status of the ON-SCREEN DISPLAY option on the SETUP menu. Select ON Status to see the display. Refer to the "VCR Menu Operations" section for details.


VCR Status Display Options

When the Status Display is shown, you can press ENTER repeatedly to see abbreviated displays, as follows:


- 1. Press ENTER to see Status Display.
- 2. Press ENTER a second time to show only the tape counter position.
- **3.** Press ENTER a third time to show only the tape time remaining.
- **4.** Press ENTER repeatedly until all displays are removed.

Remote Control Operation








Selecting Mode of Operation

- 1. Slide VCR/CBL/TV selector to desired position for VCR, cable box or TV operation.
- 2. Press POWER to turn selected equipment On/Off.
- **3.** Refer to instructions with TV and or cable box for operation.

Installing Batteries



Batteries are provided with this remote, but they must be installed. Match positive (+) and negative (-) battery ends with markings shown in battery compartment.

After installing batteries, the remote control resets to the following Zenith brand codes:

TV = 100, CABLE = 300

NOTE: All VCR operations and menu options can be accessed by using the remote control.

Remote Control Key

ADJ (ADJUST Left/Right) — Use to change status of menu options. Adjusts tape playback tracking while in VCR mode.

CH MAP — Use to begin VCR Plus+® setup.

ENTER — Use for programming menu options and to see VCR status display.

F FWD (Fast Forward) — Use to advance tape rapidly.

JOG SH (Shuttle) — Use to enable jog shuttle operation for special video effects during playback.

MEMORY — Use to zero Real-Time tape counter or return tape to M 0:00:00 position.

MENU — Press to see menus and available items. Accesses Zenith TV menus while in the TV mode.

MODE — Use to select operational mode of remote.

MUTE — Press to turn off TV sound. Press again to restore TV sound.

Numbered keys - Use to choose channels and enter programming information.

PAUSE — Use to pause tape temporarily during playback or record.

PLAY — Use to begin tape playback.

POWER — Turns VCR On and Off. Concurrently turns VCR Timer Off and On, if programmed.

PRG (**Program**) — Use to program remote with brand codes for your brand of TV and/or cable box.

OUIT/CC — Use to exit menu system. Selects closed caption for some TVs while in TV mode.

RECORD — Use to access record feature.

REV II FWD (Reverse/Still/Forward) - Rotate Shuttle Ring for variable-speed playback. Move Jog Wheel for frameby-frame playback.

REW (**Rewind**) — Use to rewind tape.

SEARCH — Use to access recording start locations.

SELECT (Up/Down)— Use to choose on-screen menu options.

STOP— Use to cancel playback or record modes.

TV/VCR SOURCE — Use to switch source of TV picture between TV channel and VCR channel selection. VCR functions are available for use in VCR mode.



Programming Your Remote



VCR/CBL/TV Mode Selector

PRG (Program) Selector This multi-brand remote control operates the common features of most, but not all, models and brands of IR (infrared) controlled TVs and cable converters. Some functions of your particular equipment may not be controlled by this remote. In such cases, use the original remote control for your equipment.

If you are using Zenith products, the remote is programmed for the most commonly used codes. For other brands — or if your remote fails to control your Zenith product — you will have to program the remote.

Follow these steps for each product:

- 1. Locate the three-digit code for your brand and type of equipment in the code tables provided.
- **2.** Slide VCR/CBL/TV to select desired TV or cable box mode of operation.
- **3.** Press and hold PRG while inputting the brand code for your equipment.
- **4.** Key in the three-digit brand code and then release PRG. If your equipment does not work, repeat steps 3 and 4, or try a different brand code.






Shuttle Ring Operation


- **1.** Press PAUSE for playback STILL mode.
- **2.** Press and hold JOG SH. for special video effects.
- **3.** Rotate shuttle ring toward FWD to advance the tape, or toward REV to reverse the tape. How far you rotate and hold the shuttle ring determines the speed at which the tape moves.
- **4.** Release the shuttle ring to return to STILL mode.
- **5.** Release JOG SH. to exit special video effects.
- **6.** Press PLAY to return to normal playback speed.

NOTES:

- Shuttle ring may also be operated while in PLAY mode instead of in STILL mode. In that case, you will return to PLAY mode at normal playback speed when the Shuttle Ring is released.
- 2. Some of the speeds given in the pictorial above are not indicated in the VCR Status Display shown on the TV.
- Some video "noise" may be present in REV (Reverse) mode.
- 4. Tapes recorded at SP (Standard Play) speed have better quality special effects than tapes recorded at EP (Extended Play) speed.
- You can push the JOG SH. momentarily to get a few seconds of operation with special video effects, if continuous operation is not needed.

Jog Wheel Operation


- 1. Press PAUSE for playback STILL mode.
- 2. Press and hold JOG SH. for special video effects.
- 3. Move jog wheel with finger toward FWD to advance tape frame-by-frame, or toward REV to reverse tape frame-by-frame. Movement of the jog wheel one "click" moves the tape by one frame. How "fast" you move the jog wheel determines how fast the frame-by-frame movement occurs.
- 4. Release JOG SH. to exit special video effects.
- 5. Press PLAY to return to normal playback speed.


- 1. Jog wheel cannot be used for special video effects while the VCR is in play mode.
- 2. Tapes recorded at SP (Standard Play) speed have better quality special effects than tapes recorded at EP (Extended Play) speed.
- 3. You can push the JOG SH. momentarily to get a few seconds of operation with special video effects, if continuous operation is not needed.

Basic Menu Operation



NOTE: Menu operations are done with the VCR and TV turned on, and the TV tuned to the VCR video output channel (3 or 4). Also, the VCR must be in the VCR tuner mode of operation. Press TV/VCR repeatedly until VCR symbol appears in the VCR front panel.

How to Access Menus

- 1. Press MENU to see main menu.
- 2. Press ADJ Left/Right repeatedly to select desired sub menu to be used.
- **3.** Press MENU to see options on selected sub menu.
- **4.** Press SELECT Up/Down to choose desired option to be changed.
- **5.** Press ADJ Left/Right repeatedly to change status of option to desired value.
- **6.** Press CC/QUIT to exit menu, or wait a few minutes and the VCR returns to normal operation.

How to Access Special Menu

- 1. Press MENU to see main menu.

- **3.** Press SELECT Up/Down to choose desired option. Only one of these two options can be set to ON status at the same time (mutually exclusive). Press ADJ Left/Right to choose ON/OFF.

Clock Menu

The Clock Menu is used to set the clock in the VCR to the current date and time.



TYPICAL CLOCK MENU WITH DATE AND TIME SETTINGS



The clock must be set before you can record by using the TIMER menu.



You may have to reset the CLOCK if a power outage lasts for more than 15 minutes.

How to Set Clock

- 1. Choose the CLOCK menu as described in "How to Access Menus."
- 2. Press SELECT Up/Down arrows and ADJ Left/Right arrows to choose and specify current month, day, and year.

For example: use SELECT Up/Down arrows to choose MONTH position, and use ADJ Left/Right arrows to choose current month, (JANUARY, FEBRUARY, MARCH etc.)

- **3.** Press SELECT Up/Down arrows to choose TIME position. Use numbered keys or press ADJ Left/Right to set current time and AM or PM as appropriate.
- 4. Press CC/QUIT to exit the menu system.


NOTE: This VCR can adjust the clock automatically for the current time, or for Daylight Savings Time. See "Special Menu" for details.

Timer Menu

The timer menu is used to tell the VCR when to record a program automatically on the day and at the time you specify.

You can specify eight different events to be recorded in a one-year period.





How to Use Timer

- Choose TIMER menu as described in "How to Access Menus."
- 2. Press SELECT Up/Down and ADJ Left/Right to program the timer.
- 3. Press CC/QUIT to exit menu system.

NOTE: TMP appears in front panel when the VCR is placed in the TIMER mode by pressing POWER to turn the VCR off.



While VCR is operating in TMR (timer) mode, it cannot be operated manually. If needed, press POWER to release VCR from Timer mode.

The Setup Menu is used to customize the operation of the VCR for your particular system and needs. Choose SETUP Menu as described in "How to Access Menus."

AUTO CHANNEL	Finds all active channels and stores them in the memory of the VCR for access by Channel Up/Down. Press ADJ Left/Right to begin search.	
TUNING BAND	Designates the type of equipment (TV or CATV) that is connected to the ANT IN jack on the VCR. Choose TV if you have an antenna connected to the VCR. Choose CATV if you have a cable system (with or without a cable box) connected directly to the VCR.	
CH. ADD/DEL	Edits the channels found previously when using AUTO CHANNEL. Use numbered buttons followed by the ENTER key to select the channel to be edited (e.g., to ADD channel 3, press 3 then the ENTER key). Press ADJ Left/Right to ADD or DEL (Delete) channels to create your own list of favorite channels.	
SOURCE SELECT	Selects the equipment (TUNER or AUX) that is to be used as the source of the program to be watched or recorded. 

The Audio Menu is provided only with stereo VCRs. It is used to specify the type of sound format to be used when recording or playing a tape. Choose AUDIO Menu as described in "How to Access Menus."

RECORD MODE	Selects the audio format (STEREO, MONO or 2ND AUDIO) to be used when recording a program. STEREO records sound from the left and right audio channels/tracks in stereophonic format. MONO (Monaural) records sound in monaural format even if the program is in stereo. 2ND AUDIO records the Second Audio Program (SAP) channel/track, if present, in addition to the stereo audio channels/tracks. SAP usually contains audio in another language.
PLAYBACK MODE	Selects the audio format (HI-FI or NORMAL) to be used during tape playback. HI-FI (High Fidelity) provides stereo sound, if present on the tape, to the Left and Right AUDIO output jacks on the back of the VCR. NORMAL provides monaural sound regardless of the audio format present on the tape.





- 3. Select the VCR output channel (3 or 4) at the TV. If you have connected your VCR to the A/V input jacks on the TV, you should select the A/V source at the TV for improved picture performance.
- **4.** Select AUX channel at VCR by using Channel Up/Down to select the next channel after the highest or lowest channel programmed in the VCR.

NOTE: Equipment connected to the front Audio/Video (A/V) jacks on the VCR has operational priority over equipment connected to the rear A/V jacks.





Automatic Playback (No Safety Tab)

- 1. Tape playback begins automatically, if the safety tab is removed from the cassette case. Simply insert the prerecorded VHS cassette into the VCR. Power turns on and playback begins automatically.
- 2. Select the VCR output channel (CH3/CH4) at the TV. Or, select the AUX (Auxiliary) source at TV to see picture if you are using the A/V jacks.

NOTE: Your VCR sets the playback speed automatically to the speed used to record the tape. This VCR records only in SP and EP speeds.

Manual Playback (Has Safety Tab)

- 1. Press POWER to turn VCR on.
- **2.** Insert a prerecorded VHS cassette into the VCR.
- **3.** Press PLAY to begin playback.
- **4.** Select the VCR output channel (CH3/CH4) at the TV. Or select AUX (auxiliary) source at TV to see picture if you are using the A/V jacks.

Unloading the Cassette from the VCR

- **1.** Press STOP if the tape is playing.
- **2.** Press and hold STOP/EJECT at the VCR until the cassette is ejected from the VCR.

Auto/Manual Tracking Adjustment

Your VCR adjusts tracking automatically when you play a tape. If the tape was recorded on a different VCR, streaks (video noise) may appear. While the tape is playing, press ADJ (Left/Right) to adjust the tracking manually.

Real-Time Tape Counter

Press ENTER two times to keep the real-time tape counter display on the TV screen. Press ENTER repeatedly to remove all displays. The counter resets to 0:00:00 when you insert a cassette or when a tape is rewound to its beginning.

Pause/Forward/Reverse Slow-Motion Video

(While in Play mode) Press PAUSE, for still video. Press PAUSE again, and follow on-screen instructions for Forward or Reverse slow motion. Selected direction is used until you press PLAY to resume normal tape playing.

Tape Rewind and Fast Forward

(While in Stop mode) Press and release REWIND or F FWD, as desired. Press STOP when tape reaches desired location.


Reverse/Forward Search and Jet Search

(While in Play mode) Press and release REWIND or F FWD, as desired. Press and hold REWIND or F FWD for Jet Search. Press PLAY to resume normal tape playing.


Index Search

An index code is inserted on the tape at the start of each recording. You can use the index codes to search and rapidly locate the segment of the tape you want to see. Index search can only be used on tapes recorded on this VCR.

Rewind the tape to the beginning and press SEARCH. Input the number of index codes from the beginning of the tape that will get you to your playback start location, and then press F FWD. The VCR advances the tape to that location and begins playback. Or, during playback, press STOP and then press SEARCH. Input the number of index codes that need to be passed to reach your desired playback start location, and press F FWD or REWIND, as appropriate.

Controls on Remote Control

Recording What You Are Watching On TV

Instant Recording is a method of attended recording where you record until the end-of-tape is reached or you press STOP to stop recording.

- 1. Turn TV and VCR on.
- **2.** Place VCR in VCR mode by pressing TV/VCR on remote control repeatedly until the VCR symbol appears in the VCR front panel.
- **3.** Select the VCR output channel (3 or 4) at the TV. If you have connected your VCR to the A/V input jacks on the TV, you should select the A/V source at the TV for improved picture performance.
- 4. Select the channel to be watched and recorded at the VCR. If you have a cable box, select the cable box output channel (usually 3 or 4) at the VCR. Cable box channels are selected at the cable box.
- **5.** Insert a VHS cassette tape into the VCR.
- **6.** Press SP/EP to select recording speed, if desired. Recording speed is always SP, unless EP is selected.
- 7. Press and hold RECORD or REC/ITR until recording begins. REC appears in the VCR front panel. Recording continues until the end-of-tape is reached, or until you press STOP to stop recording.

Recording By Using Preset Time Periods

Instant Timer Recording (ITR) is a method of attended recording where you record for a specific preset time period, instead of recording until the end-of-tape is reached. For example, you may want to record a program for only 30 minutes because that is when the program ends.

- 1. Perform steps 1 through 7 above for Instant Recording.
- **2.** Press RECORD or REC/ITR repeatedly to select a preset recording time period. Each subsequent press of RECORD or REC/ITR increases the recording time by 30 minutes until a maximum of 4 hours is reached.


Recording One Program While Watching Another Program

The program you record is selected using the channel selector in the VCR and the program you watch is selected using the channel selector in the TV. If you have a cable box connected to your VCR, you cannot record one program and watch another program.


- 1. Perform steps 1 through 7 above for Instant Recording.
- **2.** Place VCR in TV mode by pressing TV/VCR on remote to turn off VCR symbol in the VCR front panel.
- 3. Select program to be watched using the channel selector in the TV.

NOTE: To return to the program you are recording, select the VCR video channel (3 or 4) at the TV and place the VCR in the VCR mode by pressing TV/VCR on remote to show VCR symbol in VCR front panel.

Recording While You Are Away

Timer-controlled recording is a method of unattended recording available for you to use. It allows you to record a program on the day and at the time you specify. The program may be recorded only once, or it can be recorded on a daily or weekly basis. Eight different events can be programmed into the TIMER for recording, as long as no event overlaps other events in the same time period.

- 1. Turn TV and VCR on.
- 2. Place VCR in VCR mode by pressing TV/VCR switch on remote control repeatedly until the VCR symbol appears in the VCR front panel.
- **3.** Select the VCR output channel (3 or 4) at the TV.
- **4.** Insert a VHS cassette tape into the VCR.
- 5. Program events to be recorded in the TIMER by following the procedure given in the TIMER MENU section of this operating guide. If you have a cable box, select the cable box output channel (usually 3 or 4) as the channel to be recorded. Keep your cable box turned on when using the TIMER to record programs.

6. Enable the TIMER by pressing the POWER switch to turn off the VCR. TMR appears in the VCR front panel to indicate the VCR is in the TIMER mode of recording.



Recording With PlusCodeTM Program Numbers

VCR Plus+® is a method of recording that does the taping for you automatically. Simply enter the PlusCodeTM program number for your favorite program from the TV listing, and your VCR does the rest. It turns on automatically at the proper time, selects the channel to be recorded, and starts recording. You can have the program recorded only once, or it can be recorded on a daily or weekly basis. Eight different programs can be entered in the VCR Plus+® recording system, as long as no program overlaps other programs in the same time period.

- 1. Turn TV and VCR on.

Automatic Video Head Cleaning

The VCR automatically cleans the heads as it is used. However, after long periods of use, the video heads may become clogged with accumulated dirt, causing distortion. When this occurs, use a do-it-yourself wet-head cleaning cassette available from your Zenith dealer.

Caution: Do not use a dry-head cleaning system. It may seriously damage the VCR and cassettes used in the VCR. Visual signs such as snow, streaking in picture, and horizontal pulling of picture indicate the need for professional video head cleaning. See your Zenith approved service center for cleaning.

Cabinet Cleaning

The outside surfaces of the VCR may be cleaned with a soft lint-free cloth as required. Use care not to scratch the VCR during cleaning.


