



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This VCR will operate with any cassette that has the VHS mark. For best results, we recommend the use of high-quality tapes. Do not use poor quality or damaged tapes.

PRECAUTIONS

- Avoid moisture. Moisture condensation may occur on the tape if it is moved from a cold place to a warm place. Before using a tape with these conditions, to avoid a damage of the tape and your VCR, wait until the tape has warmed to room temperature and the moisture has evaporated.



INSERTING A CASSETTE


Insert the cassette in the direction as shown. Push in gently, but continuously, on the center-back of the cassette until it is drawn into the VCR.

The VCR will automatically turn on.




REMOVING A CASSETTE

- 1) In the Stop mode, press STOP/EJECT button on the VCR. The cassette will be ejected.
- 2) Pull the cassette out of the cassette compartment.
- 3) Store the cassette in its case as shown.




You can prevent accidental erasing of recording by breaking off the tab on the back edge of the cassette.




If you decide to record on the tape again, cover the hole with a plastic tape.



OPERATING CONTROLS AND FUNCTIONS



-REMOTE CONTROL VIEW-



1. Cassette Compartment

- 2. REW button-Press to rewind the tape, or to view the picture rapidly in reverse during the playback mode. (Rewind Search)
- 3. PLAY button-Press to begin playback.
- **4. F.FWD button**-Press to rapidly advance the tape, or view the picture rapidly in forward during playback. (Forward Search)
- 5. PAUSE button-Press to temporarily stop the tape during recording or to view a still picture during playback.
 Frame Advance Function-Press to advance the picture by one frame during the still mode.
- 6. STOP button-Press to stop the tape motion.
 EJECT button-Press to remove a tape from the VCR. (only on the VCR)
- 7. **REC button(s)**-Press to begin manual recording. When you operate by remote control, press both 2 buttons (1 is a safety button) together.

IRT button–Press to activate Instant Recording Timer. (only on the VCR)


8. CHANNEL buttons-Press to select desired channels for viewing or recording.

SET function–Press to enter digits when setting program (for example: setting clock or timer program). Press to select setting modes from on screen menu.

Tracking function–Press to minimize video 'noise' (lines or dots on screen) during playback (only the VCR) or slow mode.

Press to stabilize the picture in the Still mode when the picture begins to vibrate vertically.

- **9. Digital display-**Displays the clock, timer recording, counter and channel etc.
- **10. Remote sensor window-**Receives the infrared signals from the remote control.
- **11. POWER button**–Press to turn VCR on and off. Press to activate a timer recording.



12. Search buttons

- BLANK SEARCH button-Press to use Blank Search mode.
- TIME SEARCH button–Press to use Time Search mode.
- INDEX SEARCH-Press to use Index Search mode.
- NUMBER buttons-Press to select desired channels for viewing or recording. To select channels from 1 to 9, first press "0" button then 1 to 9.

100/ENT button-When selecting cable channels which are more than 100, press this button first, then press the last two digits. (To select channel 125, first press "100/ENT" button then press "2" and "5").

- 14. MENU button-Press to display the main menu on the TV screen.
- **15. SELECT button-**When setting program (for example: setting clock or timer program), press to determine your selection and proceed to a next step you want to input. Press to determine setting modes from on screen menu.

Status function-Press to display the remain, counter, or the current channel number and current time on the TV screen.

- **16. SLOW button-**Press to reduce the playback speed. Slow speed can be controlled by pressing F.FWD button (faster) or REW button (slower).
- **17. JOG/SHUTTLE button**-Press to use the Jog Dial or the Shuttle Ring. (See page 21.)
- **18. Jog/Shuttle indicator**–Lights on when JOG/SHUTTLE button is pressed. (See page 21.)
- **19. Jog Dial**-Turn to advance one frame in the forward or backward direction at the speed with which the dial is turned. (See page 21.)
- 20. Shuttle Ring-Turn to make rewind or fast forward speed faster in the forward or backward direction in the Play mode or Still mode. The further the Shuttle Ring is rotated, the faster the playback speed. (See page 21.)





SETTING A VIDEO CHANNEL

If your TV does not have A/V terminals;


When the VCR is in the Playback mode or when the VCR is in the VCR position, your TV will receive the signals from the VCR on either channel 3 or 4.

To use the VCR with your TV, set the selector switch to CH3 or CH4, whichever is not used or least used for normal broadcasts in your area. Then set your TV to that same channel.



CONNECTING TO INPUT JACKS

When you copy a video tape, or watch a program recorded on an another source, use audio/video input jacks.



To an video output jack

• When you connect the monaural VCR etc to this VCR, connect the Audio output jack of the monaural VCR etc to the AUDIO IN L jack of this VCR. The audio signal will be recorded in both L and R channel equally.

INPUT SELECT


To use the external input jacks, select the AUX position. Press the CHANNEL \blacktriangle or \checkmark button or enter "00" with number button on the remote control so that "AUX" appears on the screen.

Note: "AUX" is found before the lowest memorized channel. (Example: CH2)

A/V TERMINALS

If your TV has A/V input jacks, you may connect your VCR's AUDIO/VIDEO OUTPUT jacks to the audio/video input jacks on back of your TV.

Direct audio/video connections usually result in a better picture and sound quality for tape playback. Please see your TV's owner's manual for A/V input connections.




This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

MTS (Multi-Channel Television Sound) SYSTEM


You can record or listen to a program in MTS broadcast, by using a stereo amplifier and speakers.

Connect your VCR to your stereo source using the following diagram.



CHECKING THE SELECTED MTS MODE

When you receive a signal from a tape or VCR tuner channel you are watching, the status shown below will appear when you press the SELECT button on the remote control.



	A Second Audio Program which means your program is received in a second language.		
1	High Fidelity which produces a clear sound from two sources.		

- 1] When a program broadcast in stereo can be received, STEREO appears on the TV screen.
- 2] When a program broadcast in second audio can be received, SAP appears on the TV screen.
- 3] When a program broadcast both in stereo and second audio can be received, STEREO and SAP appear on the TV screen.

NOTE: Although a program may be broadcast in both stereo and second audio, you cannot record in both stereo and second audio at the same time.

4] While VCR is set in HIFI stereo mode, HIFI appears on the TV screen. While VCR is set in monaural(MONO) mode, HIFI disappears from the TV screen.

NOTE: If you play non-HIFI tapes while the VCR is set in HIFI, HIFI will disappear from the TV screen and the VCR will play automatically in monaural.



AUTOMATIC CHANNEL PRESET (Without a Cable Box)

NOTES:

- Follow the steps below once. Repeat it only if there is a power failure or the VCR is unplugged for more than 30 seconds. (In these cases, the programmed channels are erased.)
- You must follow the steps below before attempting to play or record a video tape. If you want to play or record a video tape <u>BEFORE</u> programming the tuner, you must first press the POWER button to turn off the VCR. Then, press the POWER button again to turn it back on. To program the tuner again, see "CHANNEL PRESET AGAIN".

1 Plug in the VCR power cord

Plug the VCR power cord into a standard AC outlet. "--:--" appears on the display.

• Whenever the AC plug is connected, the VCR search the local PBS station for auto clock setting. If the VCR find the local PBS station, current time appears on the display.

2 Select channel 3 or 4 on the TV



TO RECALL A DESIRED CHANNEL

Note for using number buttons:

- When selecting cable channels which are higher than 100, press 100/ENT button first, then press the last two digits. (To select channel 125, first press "100/ENT" button then press "2" and "5").


You can have the VCR set the clock automatically by using the Public Broadcasting Station (PBS) channel in your area. Once you have set the clock by using the following procedure, the VCR will automatically monitor the correct time and date being broadcast by the PBS station in your area, using a new service called Extended Data Service (EDS) whenever turning the VCR off, at 12:00AM and 12:00PM.

Make sure ...

- Confirm that the antenna connections are correct.
- The cable converter box must be turned on if your VCR is connected directly to it. (See NOTES)
- You must use the remote control for the following procedure.
- VCR power must be turned on.
- Turn on the TV and set the TV channel to the same video output channel as located on the back of the VCR. (CH 3 or 4)
- Press VCR/TV button on the remote control so that "VCR" appears on the display.

NOTES:

- Auto clock setting only needs to be set once, but can be done again if the clock's time has become incorrect for some reason.
- If you will set Daylight-Saving Time Selection to ON or OFF, the time will be changed to corresponding with Daylight-Saving Time Selection when the VCR load the EDS signal. The VCR will load the EDS signal whenever turning the VCR off, at 12:00AM and 12:00PM.
- If the VCR is connected directly to a cable converter box, the local PBS station must be selected on the cable box itself, and the VCR must be set to the output channel of the cable converter box (usually channel 3 or 4), to be able to set up and automatically correct the clock. 

- If the time that is automatically set by this selected PBS station is incorrect, it may not be your local PBS station, but one from a different time zone. Or there is a possibility that no channel is broadcasting the EDS signal in your area, as shown by no time being set even after an overnight search. In these cases, you must manually enter the correct local PBS station, or set the clock manually, turning off the Auto Clock Setting feature.





11 Start the clock



PICTURE SEARCH

NOTE:If it is left in the Still mode for more than five minutes, the VCR will automatically switch to the Stop mode.

VERTICAL HOLD CONTROL

When the picture begins to vibrate vertically, stabilize the picture by pressing CHANNEL (or CH/SET) \triangle or ∇ button in the Still mode.

NOTES:

- When the picture is distorted or rolling vertically, adjust vertical hold control on your TV.
- Some latest TV's do not have a user adjustable vertical hold control.

TRACKING ADJUSTMENT

- Tracking adjustment will be set automatically (Digital TRacking function) when you start playback. "DTR" appears on the display.
- When playing pre-recorded tapes or tapes recorded on units other than your own, noise lines (black and white streaks) may appear on the playback picture. If this occurs, you can adjust the tracking control manually by pressing CHANNEL ▲ or ▼ button on the VCR until the streaks disappear. To return to the DTR function, stop the tape once and start playback again.
- You can reduce the noise lines by pressing CHANNEL ▲ or ▼ button in slow mode, too. Slow tracking adjustment will not be set automatically.

Note: In Still mode, press SLOW button on the remote control and press CHANNEL \blacktriangle or \checkmark button until the streaks disappear. To return to Still mode, press PAUSE button again.

SLOW MOTION

Press SLOW button on the remote control to reduce the playback speed. The VCR mutes the sound during slow motion. You can control the speed by pressing F.FWD button (faster) or REW button (slower).

Each additional push will increase the recording time by 30 minutes. It is set up to 8 hours.

- If the tape runs out before the end time, the VCR will switch to the Stop mode immediately, eject the tape and the VCR power will be turned off.

You may set the VCR to start and end a recording while you are away. You can set seven programs to record on specific days, daily or weekly within a 1 year period.



- Clock must be set to the correct time and date before setting the timer.


Avoid overlap of programs ...

There is a case that a program will not be performed. When programs overlap:

- The program that the start time is set earliest has priority.
- When the earliest program has finished and the programs which should start still overlap, the recording will start in order of the program number.

To set another program, repeat steps [1] to [10].

TO CORRECT AN AUTOMATIC TIMER PROGRAM

If you want to correct an automatic timer after you finished setting program,

- 1) Repeat steps [1] to [3] on previous page.
- 2) Select a digit you want to change using SELECT button or ADD/DELETE button.
- 3) Enter correct numbers using CH/SET \blacktriangle or \triangledown button.
- 4) Press MENU button to return to original mode.

TO STOP AN AUTOMATIC TIMER PRO-**GRAM WHICH HAS ALREADY STARTED**

Press STOP/EJECT button on the VCR.

NOTE: STOP button on the remote control will not function in the Automatic Timer Recording mode.

TO CANCEL OR CHECK THE START/END TIME

- 1) Repeat steps [1] and [2] on previous page.
- 2) Select a program number you want to check using CH/SET ▲ or ♥ button. The details of selected program appears on the TV screen.

You may cancel the entire program by pressing ADD/DELETE button.

HINTS FOR TIMER RECORDING

- If there is a power failure or the VCR is unplugged for more than 30 seconds, all timer settings are lost. When you set the clock manually, the clock setting may be lost.
- If the tape runs out before the end time, the VCR will switch to the Stop mode immediately, eject the tape and the VCR power will be turned off. The "I indicator will flash.
- If a tape is not inserted or the erase-protection tab is removed, the " \square " indicator flashes and automatic timer recording cannot occur. Insert a tape that allows recording.
- The TV that is connected to your VCR may be turned ON or OFF when the VCR is in the timer-record mode.
- When you record a cable channel program with cable converter box, first set the VCR's channel to 3 or 4 whichever is the output channel of your cable converter box. Then set your cable converter box to the channel you want to record and leave on while you are recording with power on.

AUTO RETURN

If you select auto return to [AUTO] from the menu, when all the timer recordings are completed, the VCR will rewind to the beginning of the recorded program(s).

NOTE: If there are any remaining programs including Daily & Weekly, this function does not be done.

1 Select the main menu

Press MENU button.

2 Select "VCR SET UP"

Press CH/SET \blacktriangle or \triangledown button repeatedly to point to "VCR SET UP".

JUST-IN TIME RECORDING

This function allows you to fully utilize the available tape length for timer recording. The VCR calculates the remaining tape amount and then adjusts the tape speed from SP to SLP as needed.

If it is suspected that the end of the tape will be reached before the reserved program ends (as long as SP mode is kept all the way), set recording mode to AUTO. This function is available only with Program No. 1 (Timer Recording).

The auto mode starts recording in SP mode. The internal circuit compares the rest of the program against the available tape length. If the internal circuit determines that the available tape is not long enough to record the program in the SP mode, the Recording mode is automatically changed to SLP mode. This will assure coverage of the desired timer program before the end of the tape is reached.

Notes:

- Set the tape remainder switch ("~T60", "~T130" or "T140~") to the tape loaded. See "Setting the Remaining Time" on next page.
- Even if SLP mode is selected, just-in time recording cannot compensate for a tape length which may be too short.
- A momentary picture break up will occur at the point on the tape when the recording speed changes from SP to SLP.
- The displayed remaining tape running time may not always match the actual remaining time on the tape (usually longer than the actual time). It is recommended to set the end of the reserved recording time several minutes after the end of the TV program.

SETTING THE REMAINING TIME

You can set the remaining tape running time of your tape. Follow the steps below to correct the tape remaining indication.

Make sure ...

- VCR power must be turned on.
- Turn on the TV and set the TV channel to the same video output channel as located on the back of the VCR. (CH 3 or 4)
- Press VCR/TV button on the remote control so that "VCR" appears on the display.
- You must use the remote control for the following procedure.
- A video cassette must be inserted in the VCR for this function to work.

1 Select the main menu

Press MENU button.

2 Select "VCR SET UP"

Press CH/SET \blacktriangle or \triangledown button repeatedly to point to "VCR SET UP".

Then, press SELECT button.

3 Select "~T60", "~T130" or "T140~"

• In the Remain Time Mode calculating will start when the cassette tape is inserted and PLAY button is pressed.

While calculating, the TV screen shows as illustrated.

REMAINING TAPE RUNNING TIME DISPLAY

- Since the reel diameter and tape thickness are not common to all cassettes, the time count differs from cassette to cassette. Use the time display as an informative number only.
- During recording, the remaining tape running time is estimated based on the current recording mode (SP, LP, SLP).
- During playback the remaining tape running time is calculated based on the current playback mode.
- Remain time will not appear on TV screen while in the Fast forward or Rewind Mode.
- There will be a delay of up to 1 minute before the remain time appears on the TV display.


Note:

The use of the following tapes will result in difference between the displayed remaining time and actual time to the end of the tape:

- Tape housed in a VHS-C cassette adapter.
- Shorter tape length such as a 10-minute cassette
- T-180 cassette. In this case the display may read 2 Hours, 40 Minutes at the start point of the tape in SP mode.

COPYING A VIDEO TAPE

Connect the editing (recording) VCR, source (playing) VCR and your TV using the following diagram. EXAMPLE : The editing (recording) VCR is this unit. The source (playing) VCR is another VCR. NOTE: When you connect the monaural VCR to this VCR, connect the Audio output jack of the monaural VCR to the AUDIO IN L jack of this VCR. The audio signal will be recorded in both L and R channel equally.



CONTROLLING YOUR TV WITH THE VCR'S REMOTE

This Hitachi remote control can be used with your TV as well as the VCR, as long as your TV comes with a remote control. This feature comes in handy--you don't have to juggle two remotes.

The remote control is compatible with the fifteen makers of TVs listed below--but don't be alarmed if yours is not on our list. You may still be able to program the remote for your TV.

Every TV that comes with a remote control is set up to detect certain infrared signals. You need to program the VCR's remote control to send signals that your TV will recognize and respond to. Here's what to do:

- The remote control is designed to be operated with many televisions and cable converters, but will not work with every one made. If your TV or cable box does not respond the way it should when you program if as explained follows, this remote may be incapable of operating it.
- Once you have programmed the remote, you won't have to do it again until you change the batteries.

CONTROLLING THE TV

Once programmed, the VCR's remote control is ready to control the TV.

NOTE: Be aware that not all of your TV's functions may work even though the remote control is correctly programmed.

1 Select the TV function mode

First press TV button to change to the TV function mode, then press the button of the TV function that you want.

For example;

Press TV button and the CH/SET (\blacktriangle), and the TV station will change to the next higher station.

2 Return to the VCR function mode

Press VCR button to operate your VCR with the remote again.

REMOTE CONTROL OF THE CABLE CONVERTER

If you have a cable converter, you will probably want to program your VCR's remote control so you can easily change channels. The process is the same as for programming the remote to operate your TV. For additional details, see the previous page.

PROGRAMMING THE REMOTE CON-TROL OF THE CABLE CONVERTER

MAINTENANCE

SERVICING

Should your VCR become inoperative, do not try to correct the problem by yourself. There are no user-serviceable parts inside. Turn off, unplug the power cord, and take the unit to Authorized Service Center for servicing.

CABINET CLEANING

- Wipe the front panel and other exterior surfaces of the VCR with a soft cloth immersed in lukewarm water and wrung dry.
- Never use a solvent or alcohol. Do not spray insecticide liquid near the VCR. Such chemicals may cause damage and discoloration to the exposed surfaces.

HEAD CLEANING

Playback picture may become blurred or interrupted while the TV program reception is clear. Dirt accumulated on the video heads after long periods of use, or the usage of rental or worn tapes can cause this problem. If a streaky or snowy picture appears during playback, the heads of your VCR may need to be cleaned.

- 1. Please visit your local Audio/Video store and purchase a good quality VHS Video Head Cleaner.
- 2. If a Video Head Cleaner does not solve the problem, consult the nearest Authorized Service Center. Professional video head cleaning requires highly technical attention.

NOTES:

- Remember to read the instructions included with the head cleaner before use.
- Clean heads only when problems occur.


