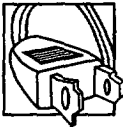

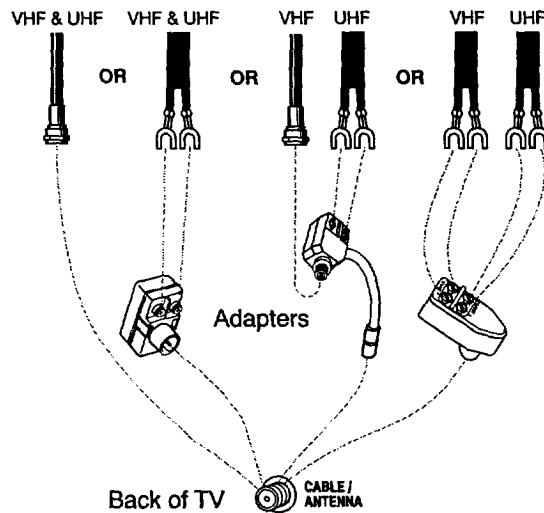

1. Hook up your TV

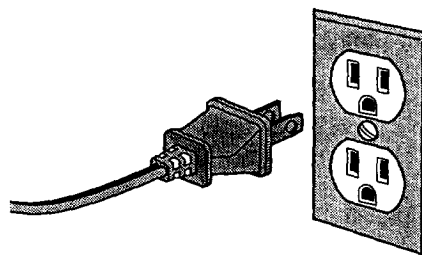

Match Your Type of Antenna or Cable



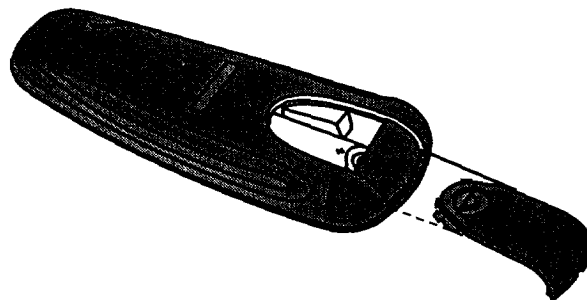
Hook up your antenna or cable to the TV before you follow the steps below.

2. Plug in the TV



Plug the cord into the outlet, matching the wide and the small end of the plug with the outlet.

3. Put Batteries in the Remote



- Pull off the cover of the battery compartment.
- Place the two AAA batteries as shown, matching the + and - end of each battery in the compartment.
- Replace the cover.

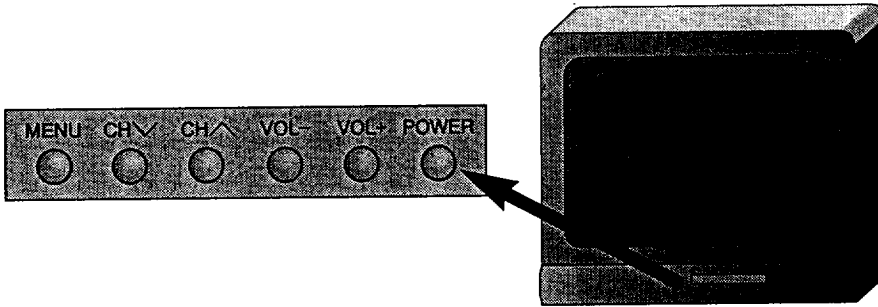

Press POWER on the remote.

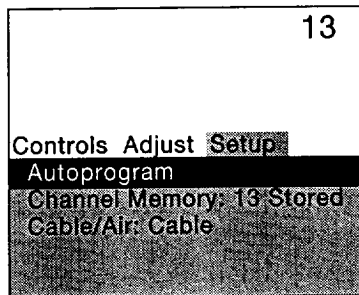

- A. Press MENU on the TV front panel until the Setup menu is selected. This menu is white.
- B. Press + to place channels in the TV's memory (Autoprogram).
- C. Wait until TV has cycled through all the channels and returns to the original channel.
- D. Press DISPLAY to remove the menu from the screen when you are finished.

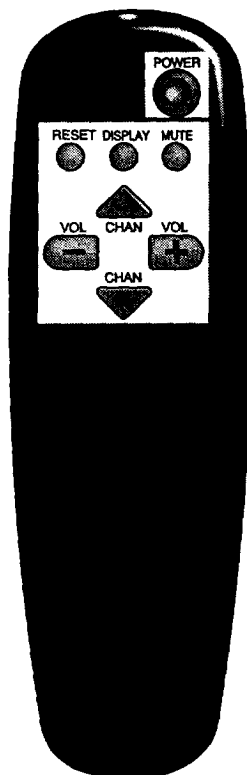

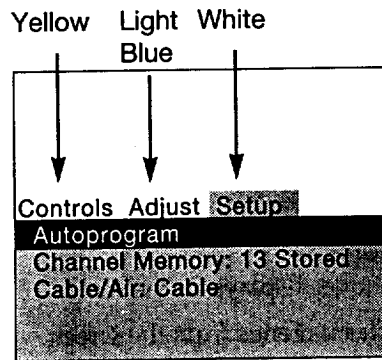

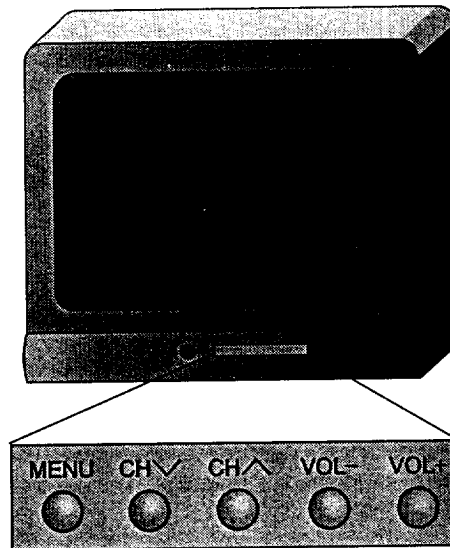


Press MENU on the TV front panel repeatedly to see each of the three menu colors.

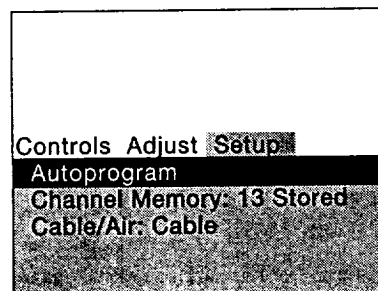
Each menu has a different color background as shown at the left.

These buttons are used with the TV's menus to adjust the features.



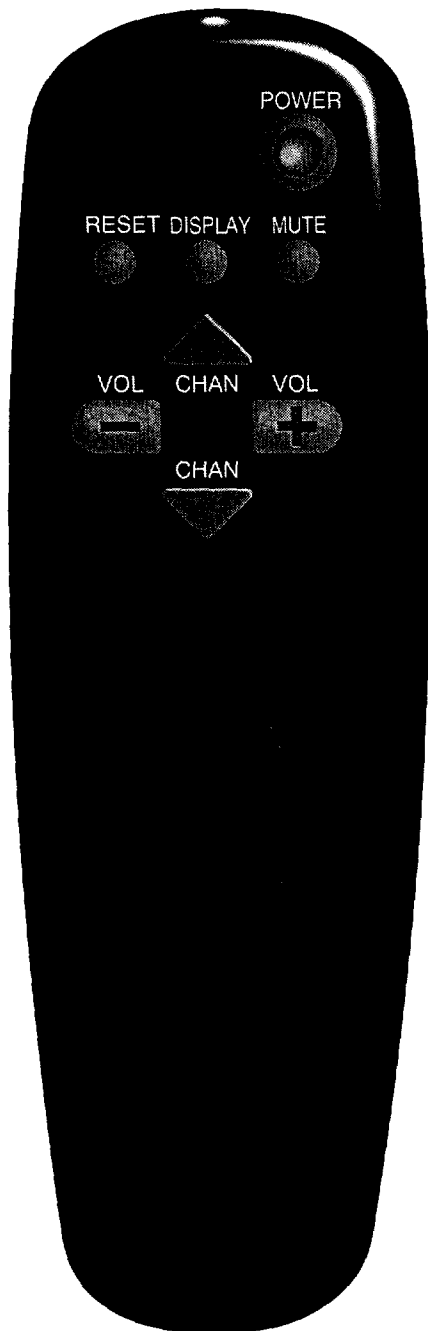
Moving through the Menus



1. Press MENU to move from menu to menu.
2. Press CHANNEL up and down to move up and down through the features in the menu.
3. Press VOLUME + and - to move left and right on the menu lines.

Remote Buttons



POWER
Turns the TV on and off.

RESET
Returns the picture adjustments to the original factory settings.

DISPLAY
Shows displays on the screen.
Clears menus from the screen.

MUTE
Switches the TV sound on or off.

CHAN Δ and ∇
(Channel up and down)
Scans up and down through channels in the TV's memory.

Moves up and down menus. *See Menu Basics on page 5.*

VOL + and -
(Volume up and down)
Raises and lowers sound.

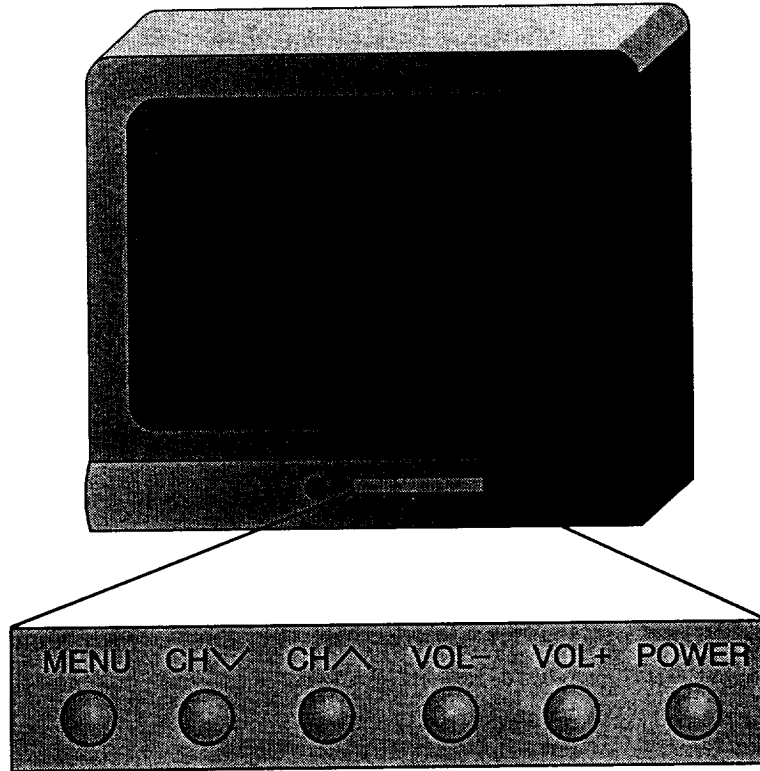

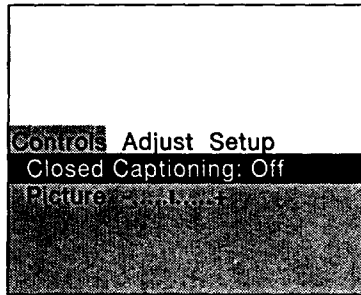

Overall Picture

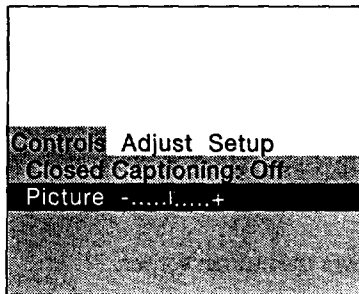
Follow the steps below to lighten or darken the overall picture without changing the color levels.

1. Select the Controls Menu



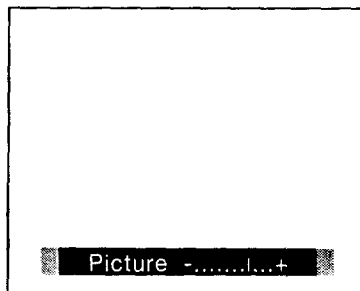
Press **MENU** on the TV front panel to select the Controls menu. This menu is yellow.

2. Highlight Picture



Press **CHANNEL** down to highlight **Picture**.

3. Use **VOLUME +** and **-** to adjust the Picture



Press **+** to lighten the picture.

OR

Press **-** to darken the picture.

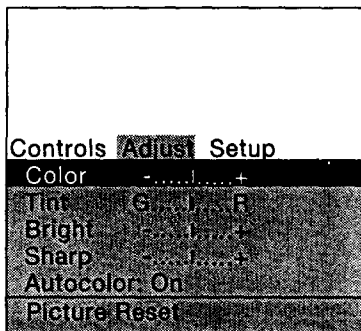
Press **DISPLAY** to remove the menu from the screen when you are finished.

Adjusting Your TV

Picture Settings

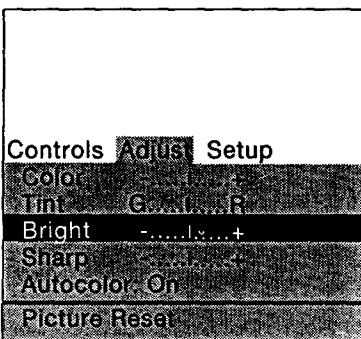
Follow the steps below to change the picture on the screen to your personal setting. The chart below explains your options.

1. Select the Adjust Menu



Press MENU on the TV front panel repeatedly to select the Adjust menu. This menu is light blue.

2. Highlight item to change



Press CHANNEL down to highlight the picture item you want to adjust.

3. Use VOLUME + or – to adjust each item

Press + or – to adjust each item.

Press DISPLAY to remove the menu from the screen when you are finished.

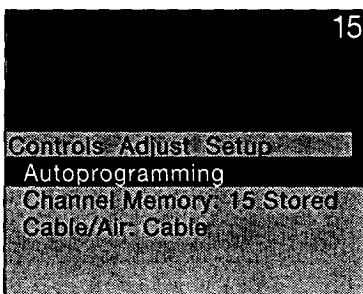
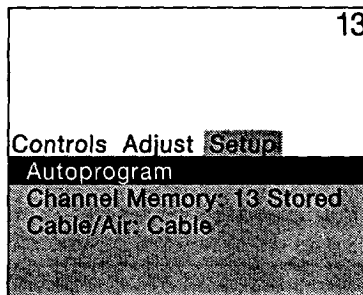
Using Advanced Features

Placing Channels in Memory (Autoprogramming)

Only channels 2–13 appear in the TV's memory when you first turn it on. The channels available in your area must be programmed into the TV's memory when you hook up your TV. Using CHANNEL up or down allows you to scan through these channels.

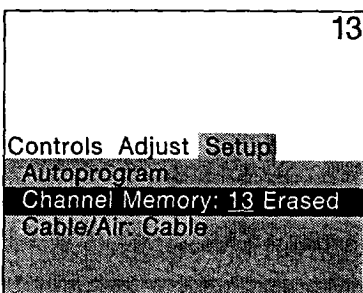
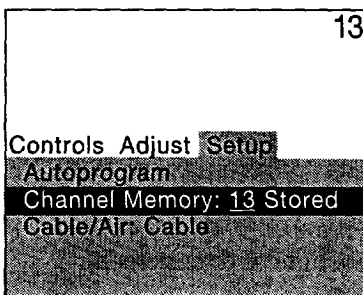
You may want to add or delete a few channels if some stations have weak signals or were off the air when the TV was programmed. Refer to the *Add or Delete Channels* section below.

1. Place channels in memory (AutoProgram)



- Hook up an antenna, cable or components before you begin these steps or you will not be able to add channels into memory.
- Press MENU on the TV front panel repeatedly to select the Setup Menu and highlight Autoprogram. This menu is white.
- Press + to start the TV adding all active channels into memory.
- Wait until the TV has cycled through all the channels and returns to the original channel.
- Press DISPLAY to remove the menu from the screen when you are finished.

2. Add or delete channels



- Press MENU repeatedly to select the Setup menu. This menu is white.
- Press CHANNEL down to highlight Channel Memory.
- Press + to highlight the channel number.
- Select the channel number you want to add or delete with the CHANNEL buttons.
- Press + to add or delete a channel (you will see Stored on the screen when added and Erased when deleted).
- Repeat D and E for more channels.
- Press DISPLAY to remove the menu from the screen when you are finished.

Using Advanced Features

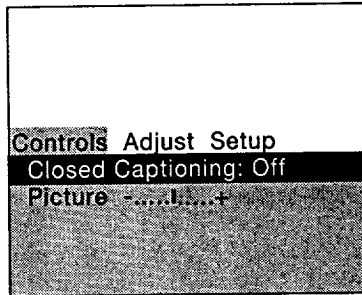
Watching Closed Captioning

Closed captioning displays the audio portion of a program as words on the TV screen. It is useful for the deaf, hearing impaired, or anyone who wants to watch a program without sound.

If you have turned Closed Captioning on and it does not appear on the screen, it is not available on the channel you are watching. Closed captioning is not available on all programs or at all times.

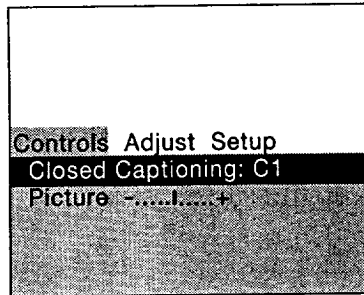
This TV does not support the text mode. Text information typically consists of program information, weather bulletins, local activities, etc.

1. Select the Controls Menu



Press MENU on the TV front panel to select the Controls menu and highlight Closed Captioning. This menu is yellow.

2. Select Setting



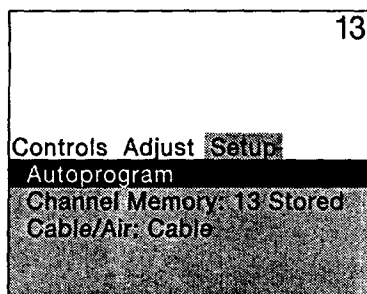
- A. Press + or - to select Off, C1, or C2. Select C1 for the display of the primary language in your area. Select C2 for an alternate service, such as secondary language translation or simplified English.
- B. Press DISPLAY to remove the menu from the screen when you are finished.

Using Advanced Features

Setting Your TV for Antenna or Cable

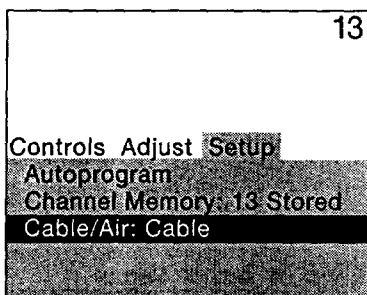
Your TV automatically adjusts this feature when the TV places channels in memory (autoprogram). Follow the steps below to change the setting as needed.

1. Select the Setup menu



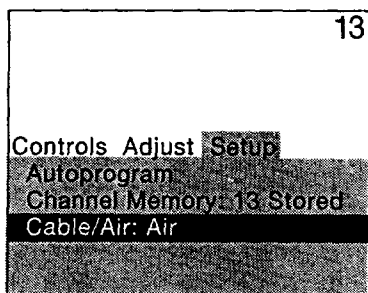
Press MENU on the TV front panel repeatedly to select the Setup menu. This menu is white.

2. Highlight Cable/Air



Press CHANNEL down to highlight Cable/Air.

3. Select Cable or Air



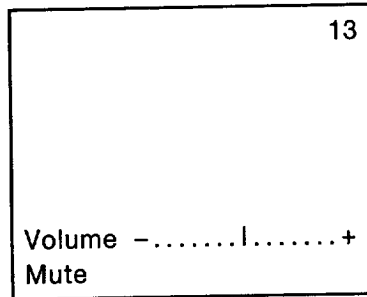
A. Press + or - to select Cable or Air. Select Cable if you have cable. Select Air if you have a home antenna connected to your TV.

B. Press DISPLAY to remove the menu from the screen when you are finished.

Trouble Checks

You may have problems that can be fixed with a few minor adjustments. Look for the type of problem you are having below and then try the suggestions to get your TV going again. *For warranty information see page 17.*

Trouble	Checks and Adjustments
<u>Power</u>	
TV will not turn on	Plug TV in. Plug something else into the outlet to make sure it is working. Make sure batteries in the remote are not dead. Aim the remote at the TV and press POWER. Make sure batteries are placed in the remote the right way. <i>See batteries on page 2.</i> Unplug TV for a few minutes and then turn it on again.
No picture, no sound but TV has power	Check antenna connections. Check position of Cable/ Air feature. <i>See page 12.</i> Try another channel. Inactive channel may be tuned.
<u>Picture</u>	
Blank screen	Try another channel. Inactive channel may be tuned. Make sure cable or an antenna is connected to the TV correctly.
Picture poor, sound okay	Check antenna connections. Adjust TV picture. <i>See pages 8-9.</i>
<u>Remote</u>	
Works part or none of the time	Clear the path between the remote and TV of any objects. Make sure batteries in the remote are not dead. See if batteries are placed in remote correctly. <i>See batteries, page 2.</i>
Can't select certain channel	Channel may not be in memory. <i>See autoprogram on page 10.</i> Set Cable/ Air feature to Cable for channels higher than 69. <i>See page 12.</i>
<u>Sound</u>	
Picture okay, no sound	Press VOLUME + or MUTE to restore sound.
Picture okay, sound poor	Try another channel.
<u>Closed Captioning</u>	
No closed captioning	Turn on closed captioning. <i>See page 11.</i> Make sure program is being broadcast with closed captioning (CC).

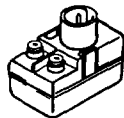

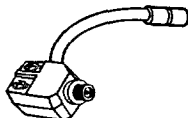

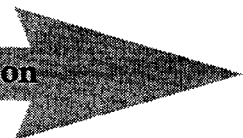

What your warranty covers:	Any defect in material or workmanship.
How long after your purchase:	90 days for labor charges. One year for parts. Two years for picture tube. The warranty period for rental units begins with the first rental.
What we will do:	Pay any Authorized RCA Television Servicenter the labor charges to repair your television. Pay any Authorized RCA Television Servicenter for the new or, at our option, rebuilt replacement parts and picture tube required to repair your television.
How you get service:	For screen sizes of 20" and smaller: Take your RCA television to any Authorized RCA Television Servicenter. For screen sizes larger than 20": Request in-home service from any Authorized RCA Television Servicenter.
