One Time Set Ups

Before you begin, make sure...

- your Antenna or Cable system is connected to the VCR. (See separate Connection Guide.)
- you familiarize yourself with the easy operation of the Select/Set Wheel before turning on the VCR.



When the VCR is first turned on, the language select and channel auto set screens appear automatically followed by a prompter to set the clock.

- This VCR will accurately maintain its calendar up to Dec. 31, 2012, 11:59PM.
- Make entries within 5 minutes, or the VCR exits the Set Clock screen.
- Normal TV or Cable channels are automatically selected and placed in memory depending on how your VCR is hooked up.
- By pressing the Wheel or CLEAR button repeatedly, you can skip forward or backward over correct entries and go directly to a specific item.

to select a program for viewing. The VCR will continue to record your program while you watch any channel you choose.

• You can switch back and forth between the channel being recorded and the channel you are viewing by using the VCR/TV button.

Select Channels at the VCR for Recording or Viewing Turn TV on. VCR Select VCR Channel. This indicator lights in the Multi Channel 3 or 4. Function Display. If not, press the VCR/TV button to turn it on. Then, press (17 (or C) to select channels. Helpful Notes

• If you are recording channels from a cable box, the cable box must be left on for timer recording. Also, if the cable box cannot be controlled with the VCR (see page 15), you must manually select the channel to be recorded at the cable box.

- Another way to review program contents is to first, place the VCR in VCR mode. Then, press the PROGRAM button while a Timer Recording is in progress.
- · Check your times carefully to avoid overlapping.
- If the record tab is missing when the power is turned off, the tape ejects and the Timer indicator
- If there is a power interruption of more than about one minute, the Recording cannot be performed or continue.
- If "PROGRAM IS INCOMPLETE" appears, check all entries carefully and make any corrections. Then, continue with step 3.
- When recording from an external source, rotate the Wheel until "L1 (Rear connection)" or "L2 (Front connection)" appears instead of the Channel.

With the proper audio mode setting, your VCR can:

- 1) record and playback an MTS stereo broadcast (main language) in stereo Hi-Fi.
- record and playback a monaural broadcast (main language) or a Second Audio Program (second language) on the Hi-Fi tracks for better quality monaural sound.
- 3) playback non-Hi-Fi tapes in monaural.





- When purchasing or renting prerecorded tapes, remember that only those recorded in Hi-Fi stereo will play back with true stereo sound. Standard stereo tapes will play back with monaural sound.
- If "STEREO" is selected in the SET AUDIO MODE screen, the MONO indicator will not appear on-screen regardless if a mono broadcast is being received.
- If the Stereo broadcast has a weak signal, you may get better results if the STEREO/ MONO portion of the SET AUDIO MODE screen is set to MONO for recording. Also, set to MONO if STEREO display flickers.
- In order to listen to Hi-Fi stereo playback, the VCR AUDIO (L/R) jacks must be connected to a stereo TV or stereo amp and speakers. (See page 12.)
- When adjusting the tracking during playback, the Hi-Fi audio sound may revert to normal audio sound. This is normal.
- There may be a difference in audio level between Hi-Fi and normal audio playback.
- Rec Level Meter will show the audio level during recording or playback.

This setup is for VCR Plus+ and timer programming only. For TV/Cable Box Universal Remote Control operation, please see page 20.

In order for your VCR to do a VCR Plus+ recording (see top of page 16 for explanation of VCR Plus+), or a timer recording of cable stations, some setup is required. At first, find the antenna or cable connection that matches yours. Then, follow the accompanying instructions.

If you receive channels through a cable box, it is necessary to establish a link with the VCR. This is done by entering the cable box output channel (the channel that you tune your TV to in order to watch cable stations) into the VCR's memory. If your cable box is remote controllable, it may be possible for the VCR to automatically change cable box channels for VCR Plus+ and Timer recordings.



For connection "A" on page 14, or connection "B" if cable box is remote controllable.

VCR Plus+ programming allows you to set most items of a timer recording by simply entering a special code found in *TV GUIDE* magazine as well as the TV listings in selected newspapers. In order for the VCR to read this special code, some set up is required. A Guide (VCR Plus+) channel number is assigned to each local broadcast and cable station. Because this number sometimes differs from the channel your TV receives the station on, it is necessary to program the VCR with local channel information.

Before you begin, make sure ...

• the clock is set. • VCR Plus+ Channel Set Up is complete (if applicable). • each entry is made within 60 seconds or VCR leaves this mode.

- the PlusCode for a program is not listed.
- you anticipate the program, such as a sporting event, to run over the scheduled stop time.

One Minute Skip

With this feature, you can skip over commercials recorded on a tape.

Press IMN SKIP **30** in Play mode. The VCR will go into FF search mode and skip over 60 seconds of recorded time. Then, normal playback will resume.

Auto Operation Functions

Auto Playback

When a tape is inserted, the power comes on (Auto). If the record tab* is removed, playback begins (Auto).

Auto Rewind

After a tape reaches its end during playback, fast forward or manual record, the VCR will rewind it and go into Stop mode.

Playback Auto Eject

After a tape without a record tab* is played to its end, the VCR will rewind and then eject the tape.

Memory Rewind Off

When the POWER button is pressed during rewind, the VCR will turn off after rewind is complete.

Eject Cassette

A cassette may be ejected with power on or off.

VHS Index Search System

Each time you start a recording, an invisible index mark is automatically placed on the tape. You can then use these index points to locate a particular recording in one of the two ways described below.

- Make entries within 10 seconds, or the Index Search mode will be canceled.
- Index marks will be placed for Timer recording as well.
- If the Direct Access index search is initiated extremely close to an index mark, there is a possibility that the index mark will not be counted in the search.



A timer recording can be set up using the buttons on the VCR. If necessary, the clock can also be set.



Helpful Notes

- It is not possible to clear a timer program using the VCR buttons. Please use the Remote Control.
- Press SET (FF) repeatedly to move to a particular item for setting or correction.
- Once the VCR is in the Program mode, the PLAY, REC, FF, and REW buttons on the VCR are nonfunctional.

Helpful Notes on Operations

Special Playback Features

- During search playback, horizontal noise bars will appear on the TV screen.
- After the VCR is in the Still or Slow mode for 3 minutes it will go into the Stop mode automatically to protect the tape and video head.
- The special effects playback feature is intended for tapes recorded in SP or SLP speed. Tapes recorded in LP mode can also be viewed in special effects playback, but the picture may be completely snowy.

Basic Recording

- While it is possible to change the tape speed when you are recording, there will be some distortion on the tape where the change occurred.
- After the VCR has been in Pause mode for 5 minutes, it will stop automatically to protect the tape and video head.

Timer Recording

- Timer recording may not be performed or continue if a power interruption of more than about 4 hours occurs before or during timer recording, even if power resumes thereafter.
- If the start times of 2 preset programs overlap, the preset time of the lower numbered program will have priority.
- If the preset time for a timer recording comes up during a normal recording or One Touch Recording, the timer recording will not be performed.

D.S.T (Daylight Saving Time)

Spring

First Sunday in April (minus 1 hour)

Because the clock automatically changes from 2AM to 3AM, keep in mind that any part of a scheduled timer recording which falls between these two times will not be performed.

Examples:

A recording set to begin at 1:30AM and end at 2:30 will actually record for 30 minutes.

A recording set to begin at 1:30AM and end at 3:30 will actually record for 1 hour, and so on.



Autumn

Last Sunday in October (plus 1 hour)

The clock automatically changes from 2:00AM back to 1:00AM and therefore affects your recording length.

Examples:

A recording set from 12:50AM to 2:30, will actually record for 2 hours and 40 minutes.

A recording set from 1:00AM to 1:30, will actually record for 30 minutes. (Not affected.)

A recording set from 1:30AM to 2:30, will actually record from 1:30 to 2:00 and then go into the Stop mode until it becomes 1:30 again. The recording will then continue until 2:30 for a total recording time of 1 hour and 30 minutes.



• Even if a recording of a daily or weekly series is affected, other recordings of the series will be performed as programmed.

Before Requesting Service

Check the following points once again if you are having some trouble with your VCR.

Power	Correction
No power	 Check that the Power Plug is completely connected to an AC outlet. Check that the POWER button is set to on.
Recording & Playback	Correction
TV program can't be recorded	 Check the connections between the VCR, the external antenna, and your TV. Check that the band selected matches your antenna or cable TV system. (P.5) Make sure that the record tab on the back of the cassette is still intact. (P.21)
Timer recording can't be performed	 Set the recording start/stop times correctly. (P.10) Make sure that the POWER button is set to off. (P.10) Timer recording may not be performed or continued if a power interruption of more than 4 hours occurs before or during Timer Recording, even if power resumes thereafter.
There is no playback picture, or the playback picture is noisy or contains streaks	 Select the same channel on your TV as that of the Channel 3/4 switch located on the rear panel of the VCR. (Separate Connection Guide) Set the VCR/TV selector to "VCR". (P.7) Check that channel 3 or 4 of the TV is properly adjusted. Adjust the TRACKING control slowly in either direction. (P.7)
During special effects playback, the picture may contain some vertical jitter when using a TV which has an Automatic Vertical Hold Control	 Set the TV's Vertical Hold Control to "MANUAL" and then adjust it.
If the top of your playback picture waves back and forth excessively	• Because the VCR playback signal is not as stable as an off-the-air TV signal, the top of your TV screen may be bent or unstable during playback. To solve this problem, slowly turn the horizontal hold control on your TV to correct the wavy picture. If your TV does not have a horizontal hold control or adjusting the control does not help, please contact your local TV service center.
Remote Control	Correction
VCR can't be remote controlled	 Aim the Remote Control directly at the remote sensor on the VCR. (Refer to Control Reference Guide.) Avoid all obstacles which may interfere with the signal path. Inspect or replace the batteries (P.2).
Miscellaneous	Correction
You can't view programs normally on TV	 Set the VCR/TV selector to "TV". (P.8)
Video cassette can't be inserted	 Insert the cassette with the window side up and the record tab facing you.
Video cassette can't be removed	 Check that the power plug is completely connected to an AC outlet.
Video cassette ejects when the REC and PLAY buttons are pressed or when the POWER button is pressed off to set the Timer	 Make sure the record tab on the back of the cassette is still intact. (P.21)
In the stop mode, the motor (CYLINDER) continues to rotate	 To enable the quick play mechanism, the cylinder will rotate for about 10 minutes. The quick play mechanism reduces response time from stop to PLAY mode from PLAY to REWIND search mode.
