Clogged Video Heads

While your VCR will not normally require head cleaning, however the heads may become clogged when playing an old or damaged tape. If the image on your screen resembles the illustration on the left or the screen becomes solid blue when playing back a pre-recorded signal on the tape, the heads probably require cleaning.

Cleaning the Heads


It is recommended that head cleaning be performed by a qualified service technician. Please contact your nearest Panasonic Service Center. An alternate solution is to obtain a head cleaning cassette. Be sure to follow the cleaning instructions carefully. Excessive use of a cleaning cassette could shorten head life. Use this cassette only when symptoms occur.






Case 1: Twin Lead Cable Only



Case 2: Twin Lead & Coaxial Cables








Case 1: Screw & Plug Type Terminal



RF Coaxial Cable




Case 3: Double Screw Type Terminal

Note to CATV system installer:

This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC in USA (and to the Canadian Electrical code in Canada) that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

The setup on pages 12 through 14 is vital for proper VCR operation. Please read the instructions carefully and in the order presented.


Setup Overview

You will be performing the following tasks:

- Setting the language you want on-screen displays to appear in (English, Spanish, French).
- Telling the VCR what kind of equipment you are using to receive channels and how it is connected.
- Entering pertinent cable box or DSS receiver information if used.
- Entering a local PBS channel so that the VCR can receive auto clock set data. (Not available in all areas.)
- Placing channels in memory and setting the clock.

Make sure all equipment is hooked up as described on pages 6~9. The diagrams below illustrate some of the basic connection types. Confirm which method you used for later reference.

ONE TIME SETUP IMPORTANT NOTES:

- For detailed DSS receiver connection instruction, please see your DSS operating manual.
- The DSS receiver must be turned off to view programs from the cable box or antenna.
- If you use a DSS receiver, it must be turned off for auto clock set.
- If your cable box is not remote controllable, it must be tuned to your PBS channel.
- If you use Audio/Video Jack connection between the VCR and cable box or DSS receiver, you must also connect the RF coaxial cable in order to use the auto clock set and channel auto set features.



Positioning Your Cable Box or DSS Receiver

If your cable box or DSS receiver is remote controllable, place it on or near the VCR as shown in the example below. The VCR transmits an infrared signal from two locations. Be sure not to cover the transmitter windows.


Before Requesting Service

Check the following points once again if you are having some trouble with your VCR.



Power	Correction
No power	 Check that the Power Plug is completely inserted to an AC outlet. Check that the POWER button is set to on.
Recording & Playback	Correction
TV program can't be recorded	 Check the connections between the VCR, the external antenna, and your TV. Check that the band selected matches your antenna or cable TV system. (P.15) Make sure that the record tab on the back of the cassette is still intact. (P.5)
Timer recording can't be performed	 Set the recording start/stop times correctly. (P.22) Make sure that the POWER button is set to off. (P.22) Timer recording may not be performed or continued if a power interruption of more than 1 minute occurs before, or during, Timer Recording, even if power resumes thereafter.
There is no playback picture, or the playback picture is noisy or contains streaks	 Select the same channel on your TV as that of the Channel 3/4 switch located on the rear panel of the VCR. (P.6) Set the VCR/TV selector to "VCR". (P.17) Check that channel 3 or 4 of the TV is properly adjusted. Adjust the TRACKING control slowly in either direction. (P.17)
During special effects playback, the picture may contain some vertical jitter when using a TV which has an Automatic Vertical Hold Control	 Set the TV's Vertical Hold Control to "MANUAL" and then adjust it.
If the top of your playback picture waves back and forth excessively	 Because the VCR playback signal is not as stable as an off-the-air TV signal, the top of your TV screen may be bent or unstable during playback. To solve this problem, slowly turn the horizontal hold control on your TV to correct the wavy picture.
