

14. Outdoor Antenna Grounding

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the product, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Article 810 of the National Electrical Code (U.S.A.), ANSI/ NFPA 70 provides information with regard to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

15. Lightning

For added protection for this product (receiver) during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the product due to lightning and power-line surges.

16. Power Lines

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

17. Overloading

Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.

INSTALLATION CONSIDERATIONS

Before you install your TV...



Ventilation — Proper ventilation keeps your TV running cool. Air circulates through perforations in the back and bottom of the cabinet. Do not block these vents or you will shorten the life of your TV.



Power Source — Your TV is designed to operate on normal household current, 120 volt 60 Hertz AC. Do not attempt to operate it on DC current.



Power Cord — Your power cord has a polarized plug as required by Underwriters' Laboratories. It has one regular blade and one wide blade and fits only one way into a standard electrical outlet. If the blades will not enter either way, your outlet is very old and non-standard. A new outlet should be installed by a qualified electrician.



Safe Operation — Your TV is manufactured and tested with your safety in mind. However, unusual stress caused by dropping or mishandling, exposure to flood, fire, rain or moisture, or accidental spilling of liquids into the TV, can result in potential electrical shock or fire hazards. If this happens, have your TV checked by a service technician before using it again.

Please read and observe each safety point in the "Safety Tips" section when installing and using your TV.

VIDEO GAMES AND OTHER FIXED

PATTERN DISPLAY CAUTION — If you use your TV for video games or other fixed displays, avoid setting the BRIGHTNESS control for an excessively bright picture. A fixed display is any image which does not change frequently, such as a channel/network identification or other symbol that remains in the same location for long periods of time. A bright, fixed pattern, if left on for long periods of time, can result in a permanent imprint on the TV picture tube. You can reduce this possibility by alternating the use of the fixed pattern display with normal TV picture viewing, by turning down the CONTRAST control for sustaired fixed pattern use, and by turning off the fixed pattern display when not in use.

PLUGGING IN YOUR TV — Be sure to plug your TV into an "unswitched" AC power source. The "switched" AC outlets found on some video equipment will not continue supplying power to the TV once the equipment is turned off. If the power to the TV is interrupted, you will have to reset the clock in the TV to the current time.

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INTRODUCTION

METHODS OF TV AND ACCESSORY EQUIPMENT OPERATION

Your new Zenith TV is a very sophisticated, High-Tech electronic appliance. TV operation, video picture adjustments and audio sound adjustments are performed through on-screen menus and displays. Self-explanatory menu icons are used throughout. Most features can be selected and adjusted from the comfort of your favorite chair by using either of the infrared remote controls, the Universal (7 Mode) remote or the Z-Trak trackball (TV/VCR) remote. Either of the two remote controls can be used to operate the TV.

Use the multi-brand (7 Mode) programmable remote if you have different brands and types of equipment in your video system which you need to control remotely. Use the Z-Trak (TV/VCR) programmable remote if you feel comfortable using trackball access similar to that provided by the familiar computer mouse device. Also, many features can be selected and adjusted by using the control panel on the TV, except for StarSight.

StarSight provides an electronic programming guide which is updated with new scheduling information automatically while the TV is Off. StarSight allows you to rapidly scan through the channel programming guide to find a program for viewing or recording. Programs can be searched and selected by category, theme, subject, etc. if desired.

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How to use this operating guide

Standard TV installation and operation is given in this portion of the operating guide. Follow the procedures given if you will not be using StarSight®. Two remote controls are provided, each with its own set of on-screen menus. Refer to the appropriate sections of this guide when using the different remote controls.



Refer to the StarSight® portion of this operating guide for StarSight® activation and operation.

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SETUP CHECKLIST



Note: Turn off the power on all system components before making connections. Do not disconnect your cable box power cord, it may interfere with your cable service.

L	Connect All Source Equipment to TV Connect your Antenna or Cable service line as well as any accessory equipment such as a VCR. Do not connect this TV or other system component equipment to an electrical outlet that is controlled by a wall switch.
	Install Batteries in the Remote Controls Batteries are provided but must be installed in both the universal and trackball remote controls.
	Turn on All Source System Components The TV and other Source equipment you connected to the TV/Source Connection Panel or, if available, the TV Front Panel.
	Select Main Picture Source and PIP Inset Picture Source The Main Picture Source and the PIP Inset Window Picture Source can be any source listed and available in the Source Menu
	Subscribe to StarSight Service (Optional) You do not have to subscribe to StarSight to operate this TV. Refer to the StarSight portion of the operating guide for StarSight subscription information.
	Perform Projection TV Setup (Projection TV Models Color Convergence) This procedure should be performed when the TV is first installed and if it is moved later to a different location.
	Perform Auto Program Procedure (Not required with StarSight Service) This procedure finds and stores the available channels from your local broadcast area in the TV's memory.
	Options You may consider using the following options: Surf Channel Scan, Channel Labels, Channel Add/Delete/Surf, Source ID, and make changes to the Audio and Video settings to your personal preference.

Two Tuner Capability

Using either Ant/Cable 1 or 2 sources gives you two-tuner capability; one Tuner for the Main Picture, and a second Tuner for the PIP Inset Picture. (Use the TV to tune 2 live TV channels, depending on hookup.)

Options Quick Overview

Surf Channel Scan — Create a list of only the channels you view frequently for access by Chan Up/Down.

Channel Labels — Include a channel or network name such as HBO, Max etc., for the channels you receive or give a channel a custom name of your own.

Channel Add/Delete/Surf — Allows to you include or omit any available channel from the channel scan accessed by Chan Up/Down.

1-Minute Commercial Surf-to-PIP — Allows you to transfer temporarily your surf channels to the Main screen picture for viewing while a commercial is being broadcast.

Source ID — Allows you to label and identify your system component by type of equipment such as VCR, Photo CD, etc.,

Audio/Video Adjustments — You can set the video and audio adjustments to your personal preferences.


Color Convergence — Projection TVs only. Aligning Red and Blue colors over Yellow yields the ultimate in picture appearance. There are some TV models that have built-in and optional screen protectors, be sure to follow instructions when cleaning them becomes necessary.

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INTRODUCTION TV/SOURCE CONNECTION PANEL

Shown below are examples of the type of "Source" equipment you can connect to your TV. Your antenna or cable service line should be connected to Antenna/Cable 1. If you have a Cable Box, connect it to Antenna/Cable 2. Use the Audio/Video connections for accessory equipment like a VCR. To hear stereo audio from your stereo VCR during tape playback, you must use the Audio/Video connections. Note: Additional Audio/Video Input jacks are provided (on some TVs) on the front of the TV for your convenience.

Locate the TV/Source Connection Panel on the back of the TV.



75-ohm antenna or cable-TV connection to your TV. Attach your antenna, cable-TV line or VCR to this jack.

LOOP OUT TO DECODER ANTENNA/CABLE 2

Routes the cable-TV input to Antenna/Cable 2 back to the cable box supplied by the cable service.


SPEAKER EXT/INT

Select EXT (external) to remove sound from the TV's speakers.

Select INT (internal) to hear sound from the TV's speakers.

SURROUND SPEAKER TERMINALS

Connections for output to optional surround sound speakers.



VIDEO 1 or 2 IN

Jacks for audio and video input from a stereo VCR or other A/V component. (You must connect to these jacks in order to hear stereo sound when playing a stereo tape.)

S-VIDEO IN

Jacks for audio and video input from a Super-VHS component.

MONITOR OUT

Standard audio/video jacks for output to an audio/video monitor.

VARIABLE AUDIO OUTPUT

Standard phono jack connectors for output to an optional stereo amplifier or to external speakers.

Jack for connection of StarSight Remote Emitter cable.


FRONT CHASSIS TV/SOURCE CONNECTIONS PANEL (Available on Some Models)

If your TV model is equipped with front TV/Source A/V input jacks, they are located behind a small door on the control panel on the front of the TV. Although two types of panels are used on the front of the TV (as shown below), in the on-screen menus, both Type 1 and Type 2 are referred to as "Front Video" and "Front S-Video."

Note: Use the Right and Left Audio jacks with either Video or S-Video jacks.

Jacks for audio and video input from a Super-VHS VCR.




Type I, VIDEO (In)

Jacks for audio and video input from a stereo VCR or other A/V component.










USING PARENTAL CONTROL (PC)

Parental Control allows you to be selective about viewing, on your particular TV, the programming which is being televised in your local broadcast area. If there are undesirable programs or channels you wish to block, you can use Parental Control; block out particular channels or the entire video image. You can also specify the hours Parental Control will be active. To access the Parental Control Menu from the Special Features Menu, press Up/Down arrow key to highlight Parental Control.

Use Up/Down/Left/Right arrow keys to specify your Parental Control preferences.

Block Ch. (Channel)

Use to block an individual channel's video and audio. A padlock symbol will appear next to the channel numbers that are blocked, as shown in the example at the right. Block Video

Set Password

Use to set your Parental Control Password.

Note: Remember your Password or you will have to wait until the specified time has elapsed before you can operate the TV.

Lock On/Off

Use to turn the Parental Control feature On and Off. The parental control settings will remain but can be activated, (On) or deactivated (Off).


AUTO DEMO

When active sets in motion a series of on-screen demonstrations of the features that are available on this TV. Shows examples of the trackball remote control menus and the different features available with the trackball, and with the universal rernote. Once selected, Auto Demo will begin after a short delay. Options are: On or Off.

Notes:

To turn Auto Demo Off, you must choose the Off option from the Special Features menu as shown at the right.

If you press any key during Auto Demo operation it will disappear from the TV screen, and then begin again after about 20 seconds.



The Zenith Trackball remote is already programmed to work with most Zenith VCRs. If your VCR is not a Zenith, or if your Zenith VCR does not respond to the trackball remote, you will need to program your remote as follows:

- 1. Refer to the VCR Codes by Brand Name Listing table on the next page. Locate the 3-digit number which corresponds to your brand of VCR.
- 2. Make sure the TV is On.
- 3. While pointing the Zenith Z-Trak remote towards your TV, simultaneously hold the MUTE and ENTER keys until the TV displays a "VCR Setup" menu screen (takes about 3 seconds). The VCR key will light upon entering the Programming Mode.
- 4. Notice that the current VCR brand code (initially 201) is displayed on the screen. Roll the trackball up or down (or use Chan Up/Down) to choose the 3-digit number of your VCR.
- 5. When the correct 3-digit number is displayed on the TV screen, press the POWER key to see if your VCR turns On and Off properly. If the VCR does not respond, refer to the VCR Code Brand Listing table to select a different 3-digit number.

- 6. If your VCR turns On and Off successfully, press the trackball (or ENTER) to save the current VCR brand code. The VCR Setup screen will disappear from the TV. Also the VCR key will blink 3 times upon exiting the Programming Mode. The remote will be in the VCR mode.
- 7. Now try other controls on your VCR, such as PLAY, REWIND, etc., to make sure that the correct VCR brand code number was selected. (If not, repeat steps 1 to 7.)
- **8.** The MUTE key can be pressed at any time to cancel programming mode.
- Note: Only the VCR Mode can be programmed.
 Pressing the VCR or TV mode key will have no effect in the Programming Mode. Similarly VOL Up/Down RECRD, and FLSHBK will have no function in the Programming Mode.
- The remote will exit Programming Mode automatically after 60 seconds if no key or trackball movement is detected.

AUTO FIND: PROGRAMMING YOUR Z-TRAK REMOTE TO CONTROL VCR

If you have tried all 3-digit codes listed for your VCR manufacturer, and none of them operate your VCR, you will need to try "AutoFind" to see if a different code will operate your VCR. Proceed as follows:

- 1. Make sure your VCR and TV are turned on.
- 2. Simultaneously hold the MUTE and ENTER keys until the VCR key lights up (about three seconds).
- 3. Point the Z-Trak trackball remote towards your VCR. Press CHAN (Up) followed by POWER. If your VCR did not turn off, keep repeatedly pressing CHAN (Up) followed by POWER until the VCR responds.
- 4. If your VCR turned off, press ENTER to save the code. (Write it down for future reference.) The VCR key will flash three times after ENTER is pressed.
- 5. Now try other controls on your VCR, such as Play, Rewind, etc., to make sure that the correct VCR brand code number was selected. (If not, repeat steps 2 to 4.)
- 6. The MUTE key can be pressed at any time to cancel AutoFind mode. The original VCR brand code will remain unchanged.
- 7. The remote will exit AutoFind mode automatically after 60 seconds, if no key press or trackball movement is detected.

CLEANING THE TRACKBALL

To keep the Z-Trak remote functioning properly, it is necessary to occasionally clean the TRACKBALL device. To do this:

- 1. Use a solution of mild dish washing detergent and water.
- 2. Moisten a clean soft cloth with the solution and lay the cloth flat on a table.
- 3. Turn the Z-Trak remote upside down and gently roll the TRACKBALL on the cloth.
- 4. Allow the remote to air-dry before using it again.
- CAUTION:
- DO NOT USE ALCOHOL OR OTHER CLEANING FLUIDS TO CLEAN THE TRACKBALL AS THESE MAY DAMAGE THE REMOTE.




AUTO PROGRAM

Auto Program finds all available channels on the currently selected source and stores them in the memory of the TV. To start the Auto Program procedure from the Setup Menu, point and press to highlight Auto Program. 
Note: If StarSight* Mode is active, clock is set automatically. You can specify a Time Zone and Daylight Savings time even if clock is in Auto mode.

- From the Setup menu, point and press to highlight Clock Set.
- Point and press on Left/Right arrow to access Clock Menu. Clock Mode = Use to choose clock operating mode, Auto or manual. Auto, the clock time is set

automatically while TV is Off. Manual, the current time and related information

must be keyed-in by the user.

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TIMER SETUP: Sleep Timer

The Sleep Timer programs the TV to automatically turn itself off after a period from 15 minutes up to 4 hours.

- 1. From the Special Features menu, point and press to highlight **Timer Setup**.
- Point and press on Left/Right arrow to access Timer Menu.
- Point and press on Sleep Timer to access Sleep Timer option.
 Press trackball repeatedly to choose time the TV

will turn off. Options are: Off, 0:15, 0:30, 1:00, 1:30, 2:00. 2:30, 3:00, 3:30 or 4:00.

4. Move pointer off menu and press trackball to remove menu from screen.

One minute before the TV turns off, the GOOD NIGHT display appears on the screen. At this time you have a choice of the following two actions:

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USING PARENTAL CONTROL (PC)

Parental Control allows you to be selective about viewing, on your particular TV, the programming which is being televised in your local broadcast area. If there are undesirable programs or channels you wish to block, you can use Parental Control; block out particular channels or the entire video image. You can also specify the hours Parental Control will be active. To access the Parental Control Menu, use the "Point and Press" method of menu access described on the previous pages.



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MAINTENANCE AND TROUBLESHOOTING

CARING FOR YOUR PROJECTION TV

Your projection TV will look better, have a longer life and perform better if you care for it properly.



First check to see that the TV is off. For added safety, disconnect AC power to your TV.

NOTE: If you unplug your TV, you will have to reset the clock to the current time.

CABINET CARE

Non-Wood Cabinet or Cabinet Components Moisten a soft cloth with a mild soap solution or Ivory dishwashing detergent. Wipe the surface with a damp cloth. Then rinse the cloth in clean water and wipe the surface again. Allow the TV to airdry before turning it on.

Wood Cabinets or Cabinet Components Use any good furniture cleaner and polish. Regular care will help preserve the firish.



PICTURE SCREEN CLEANING

Use a soft cloth moistened with warm water and rub lightly in the soiled areas of the screen. DO NOT USE A TISSUE OR PAPER TOWEL, AS THESE MAY DAMAGE SURFACE. Wipe only in the vertical (up/down) direction (along the grooves). If there is a dirt buildup, a mild solution of warm water and Ivory dishwashing detergent may be used. Use dry soft cloth to dry the screen. Care should be taken to avoid scratches or damage to the screen surface.

NOTE: THE TV SCREEN IS EASILY DAMAGED. AVOID ACCIDENTAL CONTACT WITH THE SCREEN.

EXTENDED ABSENCE

Before an extended absence (such as a vacation) you may want to disconnect AC power to your TV. This will protect the projection TV from possible damage from lightning or power line surges. If you have an outdoor antenna, you may also want to disconnect the antenna from the wall plate connection center

NOTE: If you unplug your TV, you will have to reset the clock to the current time.

PICTURE INTERFERENCE

Your picture may be affected by interference caused by one or a number of factors. These include:

Speckled or Streaked Picture Can be caused by nearby automobile ignition, electrical appliances, etc. This is most noticeable in weak signal areas.

Snow in Picture Caused by insufficient signal. Usually caused by the TV being located too far from the TV station or by an improper antenna installation.

Ghosts or Reflections Caused by signals being reflected from surrounding buildings, water tanks, or other high structures.

Radio Signal Police, amateur or CB radio transmitters may cause interference.

These interference problems can often be corrected through the use of a better antenna, signal amplifiers, or various filter devices. See your TV dealer for additional information, and accessories available for your projection TV.

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MAINTENANCE AND TROUBLESHOOTING

BEFORE CALLING FOR SERVICE

Check these items and see if you can correct the trouble by changing the adjustment of a control or a menu setting. By making these simple checks before calling for service, you may save time and money.

Problem	Try This		
Picture OK. Poor sound.	Re-orient antenna. Try another channel — possible station trouble. Adjust AUDIO MENU options. Check Mute feature? Check for local interference. Is antenna/cable connection loose?

Picture blurred or distorted. Ghost in picture.	Check antenna or cable hook up for broken wires. Try another channel — possible station trouble. Check for local interference.		
No color, or poor color.	Is it a color program? Check antenna or cable hook up for broken wires. Adjust VIDEO MENU options.		
No sound or sound is low.	VOLUME (VOL) setting may be too low. Check MUTE key operation on remote control. Is Speaker EXT/INT switch set to EXT?		
Cannot select certain channels or other channels.	Channels may be skipped in CH. ADD/DEL/SURF option of SETUP MENU. Use AUTO PROGRAM a second time. Is TV in Surf Channel Scan mode with only one channel specified as a Surf channel?		
No closed captions	Are captions available? Is CAPTION 1, CAPTION 2, CAPTION 3 or CAPTION 4 selected using the CAPTIONS option on the SETUP MENU?		
Black or blue box covers half of screen.	Is text information available? Is TEXT 1, TEXT 2, TEXT 3 or TEXT 4 selected in the CAPTIONS option of the SETUP MENU.		
No picture or sound when VIDEO 1 or VIDEO 2 source is selected.	Is audio/video source hooked up properly? Are all wires connected to VIDEO 1 IN or VIDEO 2 IN jacks on connection center?		
No stereo sound or weak stereo sound when using a stereo VCR.	Check AUDIO mode. Was stereo sound present before selecting VIDEO 1 or VIDEO 2 source?		
Cannot select desired PIP source.	If Ant/Cable 1 or 2 is Main Source, TV makes it PIP source also.		
PIP inset frame is black or lacks contrast when selecting VIDEO 1 for PIP inset.	Adjust PIP COLOR AND CONTRAST settings in PIP MENU. Are all wires connected to VIDEO 1 IN jacks on connection center?

Notes:

If your TV fails to respond to the VIDEO PRESET selection, or to any other menu selection, you must reset the TV. Simply disconnect the AC power cord from the power outlet. Wait a few minutes, then plug the TV back into the power outlet. You may have to reset the clock to the current time.




