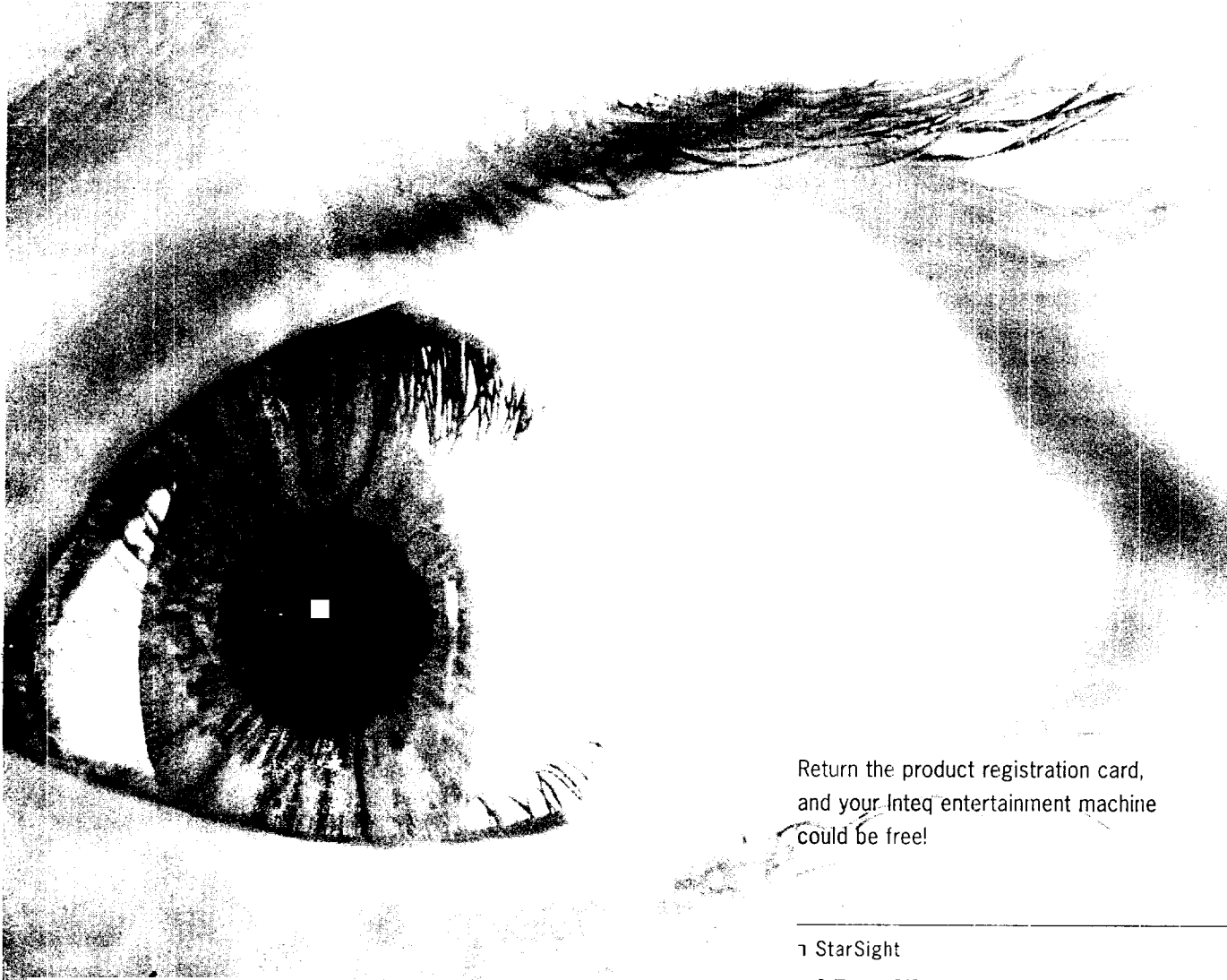
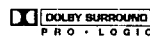

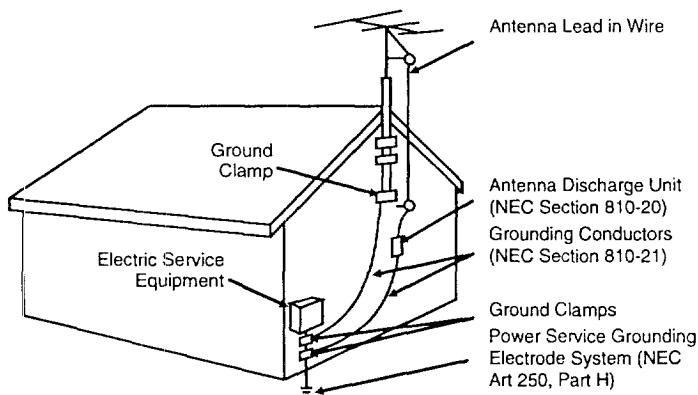

## 14. Outdoor Antenna Grounding

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the product, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Article 810 of the National Electrical Code (U.S.A.), ANSI/ NFPA 70 provides information with regard to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

## 15. Lightning

For added protection for this product (receiver) during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the product due to lightning and power-line surges.

## 16. Power Lines

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

## 17. Overloading

Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.

## 18. Object and Liquid Entry

Never push objects of any kind into this product through openings as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short-out parts that could result in a fire or electric shock. Never spill liquid of any kind on the product.

## INSTALLATION CONSIDERATIONS

### Before you install your TV...



**Ventilation** — Proper ventilation keeps your TV running cool. Air circulates through perforations in the back and bottom of the cabinet. Do not block these vents or you will shorten the life of your TV.



**Power Source** — Your TV is designed to operate on normal household current, 120 volt 60 Hertz AC. Do not attempt to operate it on DC current.



**Power Cord** — Your power cord has a polarized plug as required by Underwriters' Laboratories. It has one regular blade and one wide blade and fits only one way into a standard electrical outlet. If the blades will not enter either way, your outlet is very old and non-standard. A new outlet should be installed by a qualified electrician.



**Safe Operation** — Your TV is manufactured and tested with your safety in mind. However, unusual stress caused by dropping or mishandling, exposure to flood, fire, rain or moisture, or accidental spilling of liquids into the TV, can result in potential electrical shock or fire hazards. If this happens, have your TV checked by a service technician before using it again.

**PLEASE READ AND OBSERVE EACH SAFETY POINT IN THE "SAFETY TIPS" FOLDER WHEN INSTALLING AND USING YOUR TV.**

### VIDEO GAMES AND OTHER FIXED

**PATTERN DISPLAY CAUTION** — If you use your TV for video games or other fixed displays, avoid setting the BRIGHTNESS control for an excessively bright picture. A fixed display is any image which does not change frequently, such as a channel/network identification or other symbol that remains in the same location for long periods of time. A bright, fixed pattern, if left on for long periods of time, can result in a permanent imprint on the TV picture tube. You can reduce this possibility by alternating the use of the fixed pattern display with normal TV picture viewing, by turning down the CONTRAST control for sustained fixed pattern use, and by turning off the fixed pattern display when not in use.

**PLUGGING IN YOUR TV** — Be sure to plug your TV into an "unswitched" AC power source. The "switched" AC outlets found on some video equipment will not continue supplying power to the TV once the equipment is turned off. If the power to the TV is interrupted, you will have to reset the clock in the TV to the current time.

**PICTURE SCREEN CLEANING** — Use a soft cloth moistened with warm water and rub lightly in the soiled areas of the screen. DO NOT USE A TISSUE OR PAPER TOWEL, AS THESE MAY DAMAGE SURFACE. Wipe only in the vertical (up/down) direction (along the grooves). If there is a dirt buildup, a mild solution of warm water and Ivory dishwashing detergent may be used. Use dry soft cloth to dry the screen. Care should be taken to avoid scratches or damage to the screen surface.

**NOTE** — The TV screen is easily damaged. Avoid accidental contact with the screen.

Also, the short focal optical path gives the system its slim profile so it takes up less floor space without sacrificing performance. And, the screen's Frennel lens provides uniform light distribution – without "hot spots" – for a more realistic picture with a whopping 160° wide viewing angle. (That means you don't have to sit directly in front of the projection TV to see a quality picture.)

With optional speakers hooked up, the separate center channel keeps dialogue and other central sounds close to the screen while other sounds (like background noise) come from the back, in a "surrounding" effect. You might actually think you're in a theater.

Dolby 3™: A perceptual digital audio coding technique of phenomenal efficiency, quality and versatility. Now, true stereo sound effects can be achieved for expanded depth, localization, and realism — even without surround sound speakers.

BBE Sonic Maximizer™: Nothing can compare to being at a live performance .... until now! When sound is recorded, transmitted, and wrung through miles of wires and countless audio circuits, it's obvious that some of the live performance experience will be lost. That's where the BBE Sonic Maximizer comes to the rescue: BBE technology compensates for phase and amplitude distortions to return sound to a near live-performance state. The result is crystal-clear highs and earth-shattering lows.

Dolby Phantom Pro-Logic™: This phantom takes nothing away. Instead, it actually creates the illusion of a "true" center channel and uses the same logic steering Dolby is famous for in systems without a surround sound speaker system.

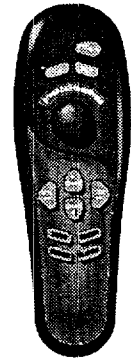
All TV operations, video picture adjustments, and audio sound adjustments are performed through the use of on-screen menus and displays. And, most of the TV's features can be selected and adjusted from the comfort of your favorite chair by using either of the two infrared remote controls: The Multi-brand (7 function) remote or the Intraq trakball (TV/VCR) remote.

The multi-brand programmable remote can operate up to seven different pieces of audio/video equipment. Talk about convenience: Your VCR, Video Disk Player, TV, Audio Amplifier, and others can all be operated by this one remote. About the only thing it doesn't do is change its own battery – that's up to you.

# INTRODUCTION

If you really like modern toys, you'll want to operate your Inteq machine with the Intraq™ programmable trakball remote. "Point-and-press" — such as the pointer on a computer screen — is the effortless way to unleash this machine's capabilities. 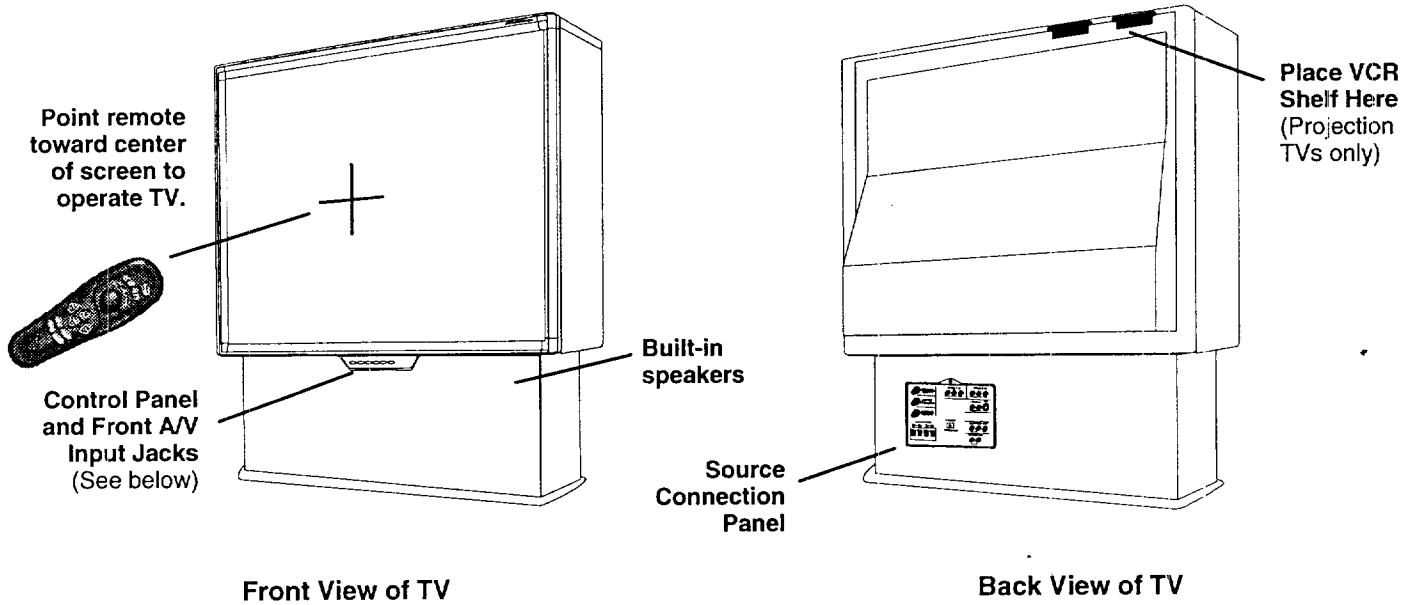

# GET TO KNOW YOUR ENTERTAINMENT MACHINE

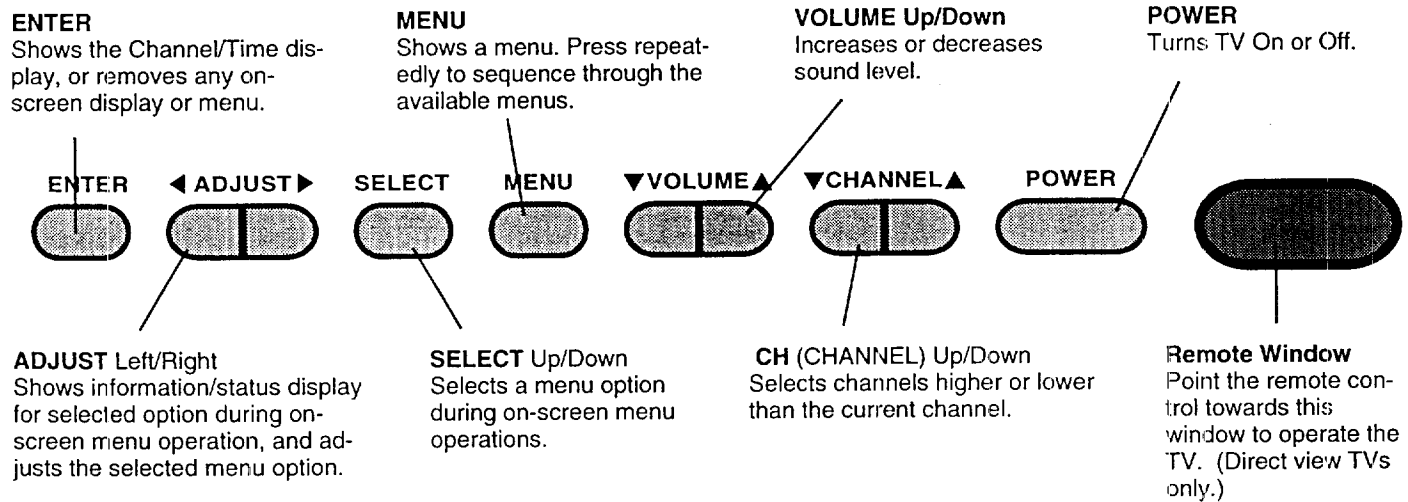
## TYPICAL LOCATION OF USER ITEMS

The control panel on your TV may differ slightly from the one shown but its operation is the same.

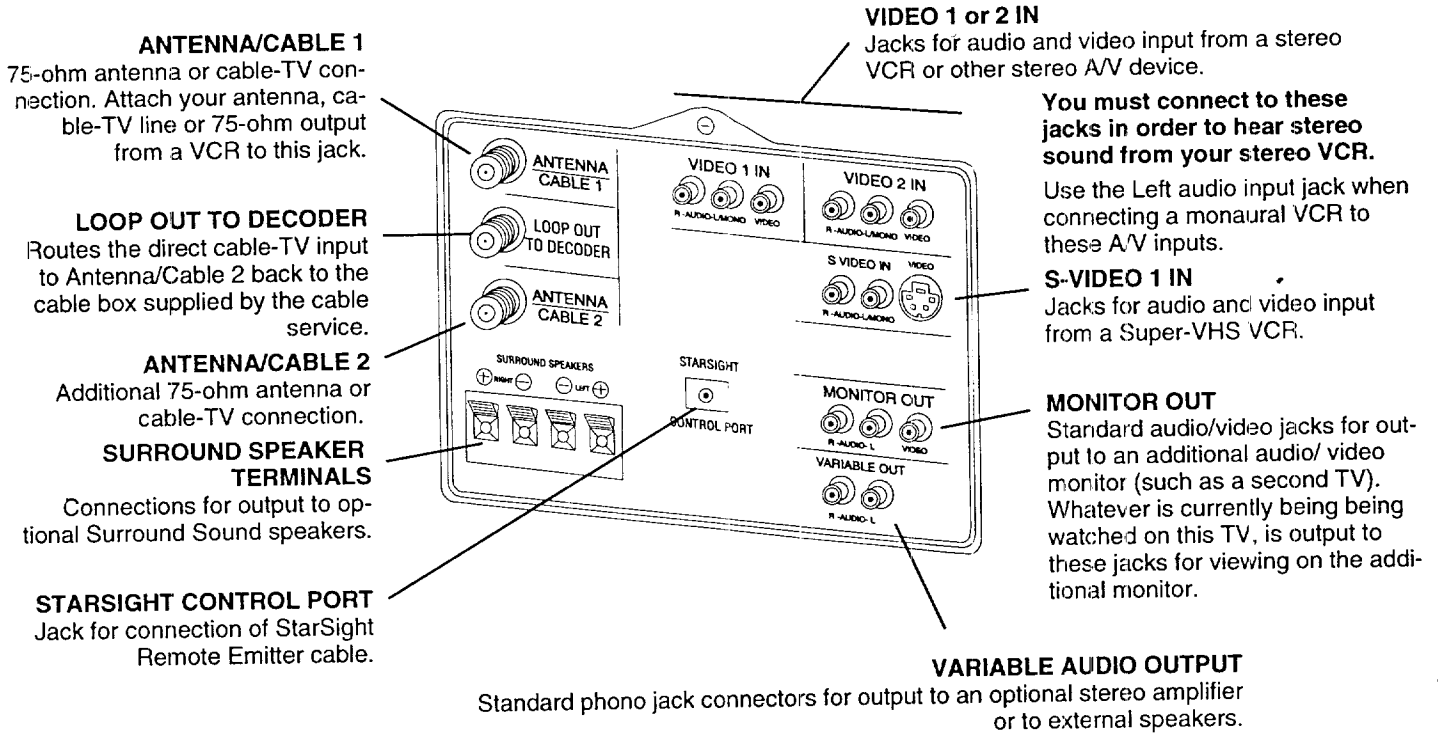


# GET TO KNOW YOUR ENTERTAINMENT MACHINE

## TV SOURCE CONNECTION PANEL

Before you can use it, you have to connect it! And with the help of the easy-to-follow diagrams on the following pages, setting up your entertainment machine is a snap.

The jacks shown here on the **Source Connection Panel** provide three basic functions: 1. Input connection from an antenna or cable system; 2. Input connection from a VCR or other A/V device; 3. Output connection to an optional monitor, amplifier or speakers. Refer to the following descriptions.

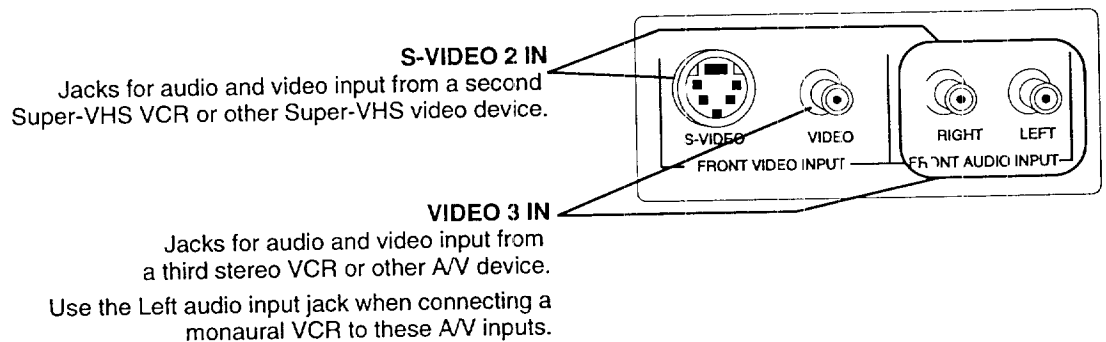

## FRONT A/V INPUT JACKS

If your TV model is equipped with front A/V input jacks, they'll be on the control panel on the front of the TV behind a small door.

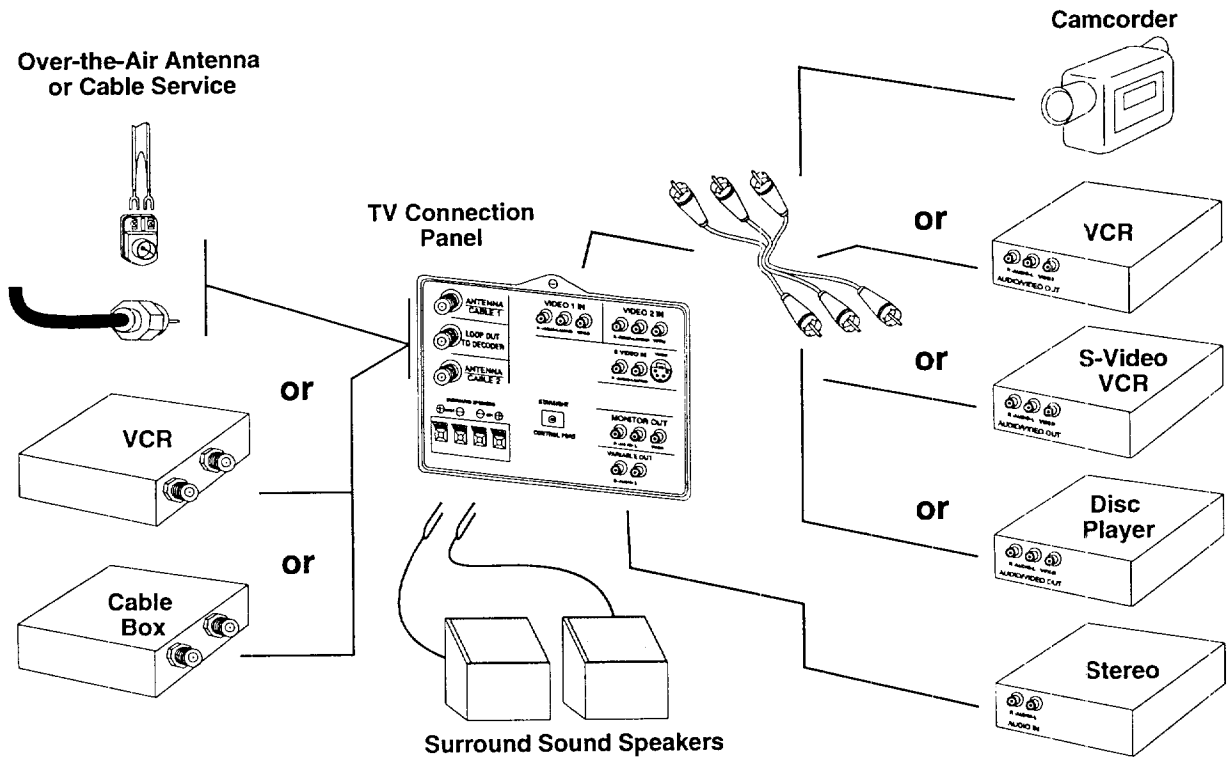


# CONNECTING YOUR TV

## OVERVIEW: SOURCE EQUIPMENT CONNECTION OPTIONS

A "source" refers to the equipment that supplies the picture and sound to your TV. Several types of "source" equipment are shown below: Antennas, cable boxes and VCRs. And, your television has many input jacks to allow the connection of several different input sources all at the same time.

The following pages show several alternatives for connecting sources and other equipment to your TV. These recommended connections will provide you with the greatest possible versatility when using the TV. Once all connections are done, proceed to "The First Time You Operate Your TV" section to get your entertainment machine up and running.

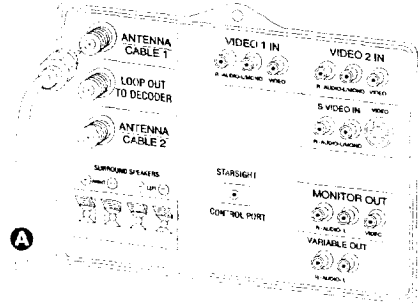

- View a channel selected by the TV as the main TV picture and simultaneously view a different channel selected by the VCR, or a video tape in the PIP window. (Main Source is Ant/Cable 1; PIP Source is Video 1 In; TV/VCR switch on VCR set to TV.)
- View a channel selected by the VCR or a video tape as the main picture of the TV and simultaneously view the same channel or video tape in the PIP window. (Main Source and PIP Source are Video 1.)
- Swap the PIP picture and main picture.

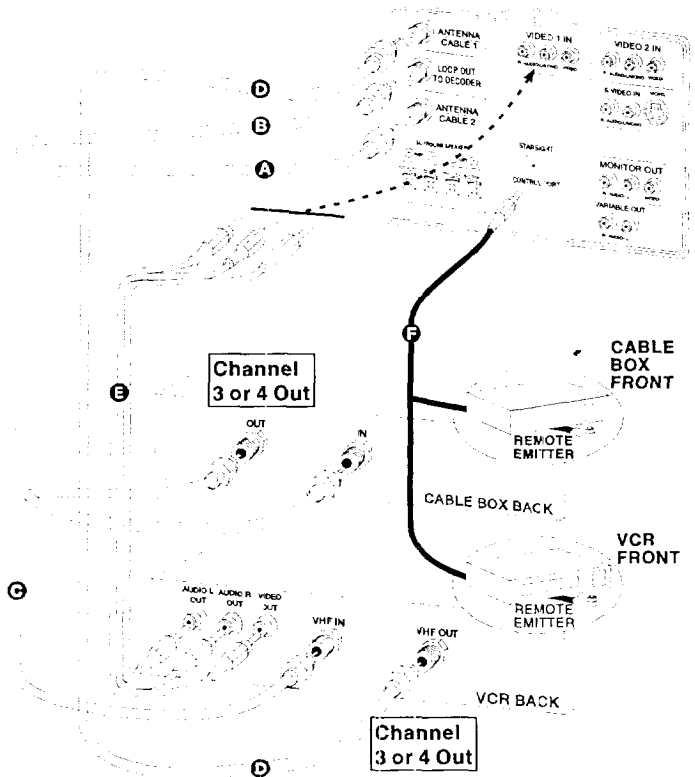

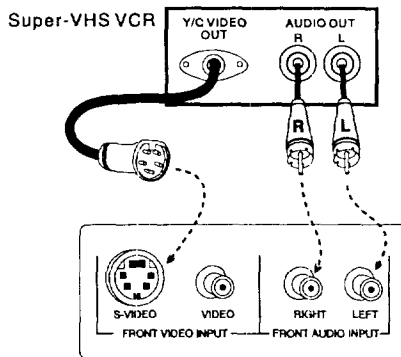
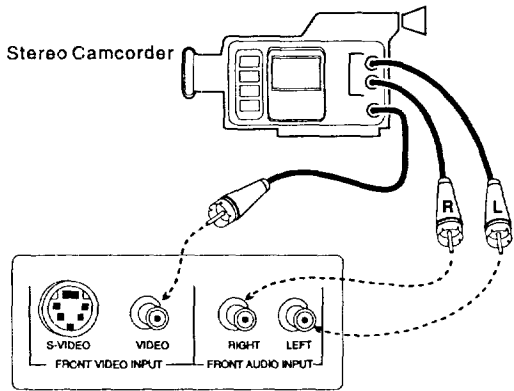

### Starsight Notes:

- The Remote Emitter is only necessary if you are planning to activate StarSight.
- Do not adhere the Remote Emitter until after you have completed activating StarSight and you have confirmed the correct codes that operate your VCR and Cable Box.** Once the code is confirmed, peel off the backing of the sticker on the Remote Emitter and adhere it in place.

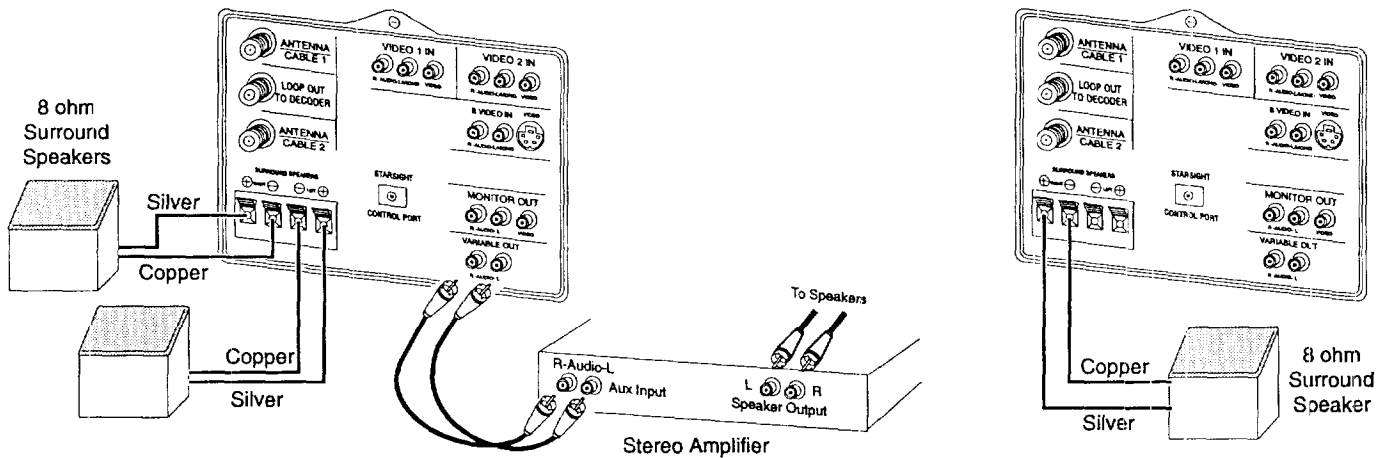

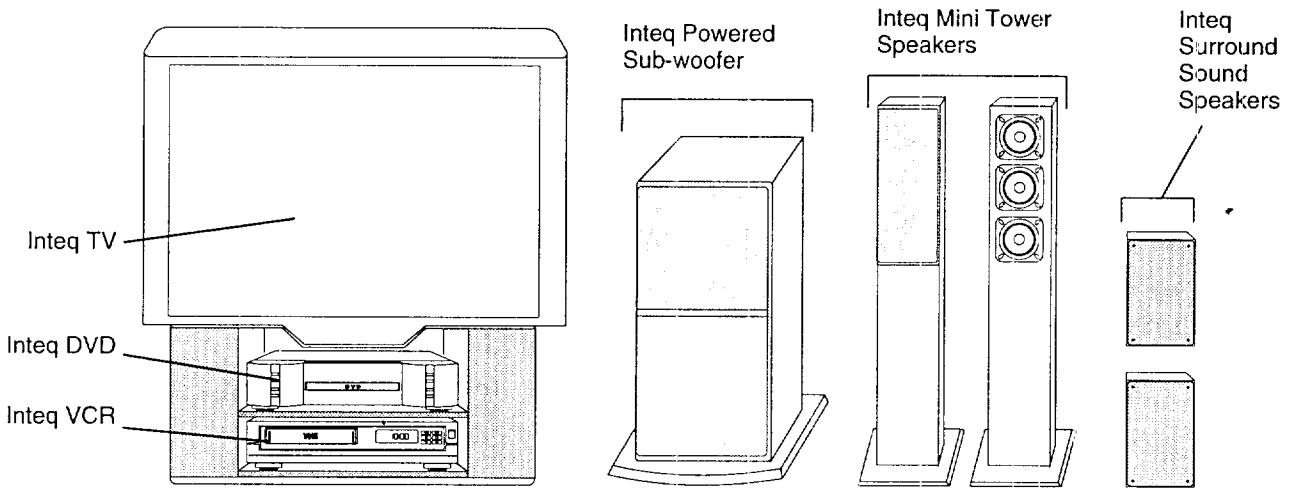

# CONNECTING YOUR TV

## TYPICAL HOME THEATER SETUP

What is "home theater?" In simple terms, it is providing a movie theater-like experience in the privacy of your own home. Your Inteq entertainment machine has been designed with home theater in mind and delivers outstanding video and audio performance. By adding a few optional accessories as shown below, you could have the entertainment system that is the envy of everyone on your block.

A typical home theater system can contain the following optional equipment: Inteq television, Inteq Digital Video Disc (DVD) player, Inteq VCR, Inteq Powered Sub-woofer, Inteq Mini Tower Speakers, and Surround Sound speakers. You'll want to connect these items as described below.

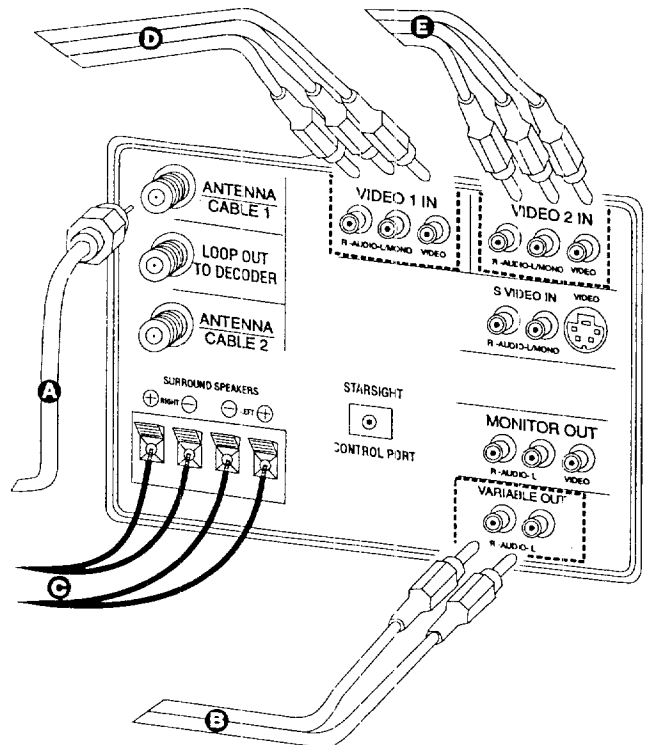

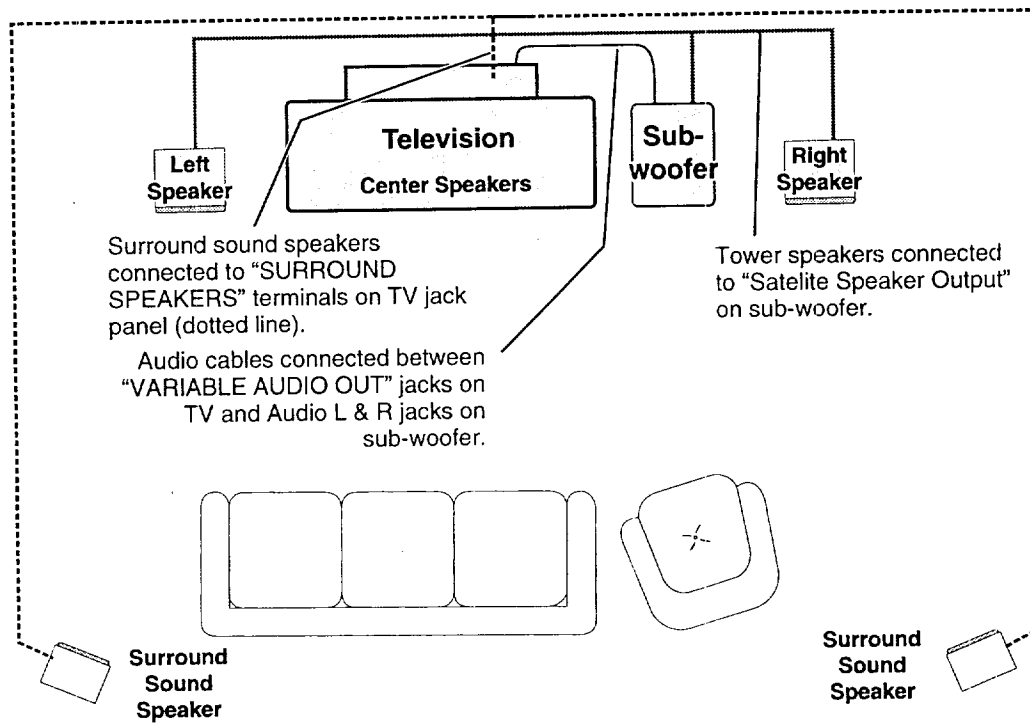

# CONNECTING YOUR TV

## Placement of System Equipment

Typically, you'll want to place your home theater equipment as shown in the illustration: Left, Center, and Right channel speakers are set in front of you, creating what is referred to as a "front sound stage" to provide dialog and stereo sound. The Surround Sound speakers (rear-channel sound) are set behind you and to the side. There are many ways a home theater system can be arranged. The example shown here is just one possible setup.

## While Operating The Home Theater System

While you're experiencing your new home theater, you'll want to keep the following in mind:

- Your entertainment machine is shipped from the factory with the picture and sound adjustments preset. To change these settings, select the Video or Audio menu and adjust the options to your own personal preference.
- To hear the correct level of sound from your speakers, perform the speaker balancing procedure described in the Inteq Audio Menu section of the operating guide.
- If you are not hearing any audio from the surround speakers, the program may not have Surround Sound. Not all programs or movies contain Surround Sound.

# WHAT YOU SHOULD DO FIRST

## STEP 1: INSTALL THE BATTERIES INTO THE REMOTE CONTROLS

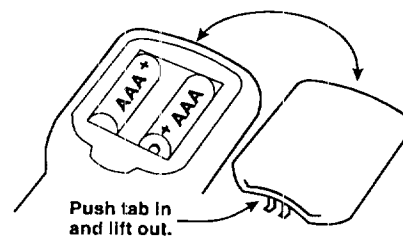
Batteries are provided with your remotes but they must be installed before you use the remotes. When a remote no longer functions normally, or when it loses memory, replace the batteries with high-quality, alkaline batteries. Match plus with plus (+ with +) and minus with minus (- with -), as shown in the battery compartment.

Unless your equipment responds to the factory preset codes, you will need to reprogram the remotes with the codes of your particular equipment each time you replace batteries.

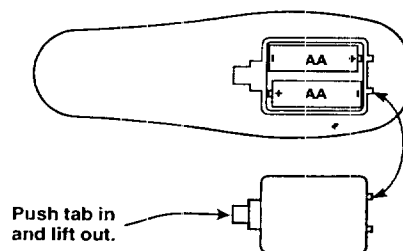
### Notes:

- ❑ Do not place heavy objects on top of the remote control keys. Prolonged unintentional operation of the remote shortens battery life.
- ❑ Remove the batteries if the remote control will not be used for a month or more.

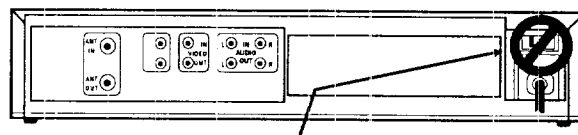


## STEP 2: CONNECT THE POWER

After you have made the necessary connections to your entertainment machine, plug the power cord into an AC power outlet.

### To connect power to your TV:

1. Plug your TV into an unswitched AC power source. (Normal household current outlet that does not turn On and Off with a switch.)
2. Turn the TV on by pressing **POWER**.

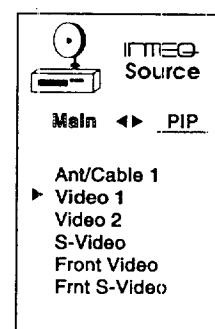
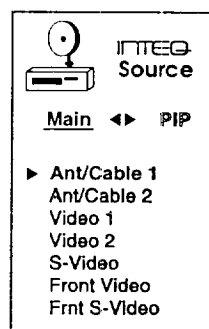

## STEP 3: SELECT YOUR MAIN SOURCE & PIP (Picture-in-Picture) SOURCE

A TV "source" refers to the equipment connected to the TV Source Connections Panel that supplies the picture and sound to your TV. You select the viewing source by using the **Inteq Source** menu.

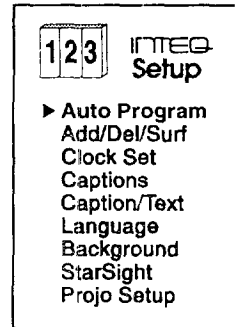
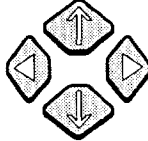

## STEP 4: USE AUTO PROGRAM

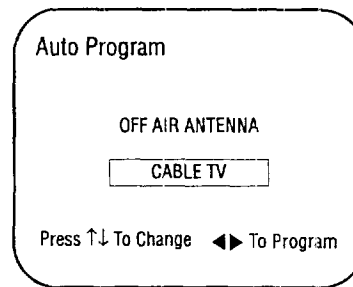
Auto Program finds all available channels on the selected antenna or direct cable-TV source and stores them in the memory of the TV.

### To Start the Auto Program Procedure:

1. Either Ant/Cable 1 or 2 must be selected as the **Main** picture source. The selected source must be an antenna or direct cable-TV line.
2. Press **MENU** on your multi-brand remote until the **Inteq Setup** menu appears.
3. Press an Up or Down arrow until **Auto Program** is highlighted then press a Left or Right arrow to view the next screen.
4. **What kind of TV signal is coming in to your TV? Did you connect a cable-TV line or an antenna to the jack on the back of the TV?**  
Press an Up or Down arrow to select either OFF AIR ANTENNA or CABLE TV.
5. Press a Left or Right arrow to begin the search for all available channels.
6. After the search is completed, wait a few seconds for the TV screen to clear.

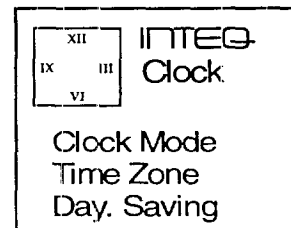
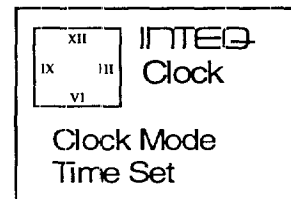

## STEP 5: SET THE CLOCK

Don't forget to set the clock: If you're going to use features like the On/Off Timer, this is important.

1. Press **MENU** repeatedly on your multi-brand remote until the **INTEQ Setup** menu is displayed, then press the Up or Down arrows to select Clock Set.
2. Select Clock Mode, and press the Left or Right arrows.
3. Press the Up or Down arrow to select Auto or Manual, then press **MENU** to return to the previous menu:  
AUTO: TV sets the time automatically (while the TV is turned OFF).  
MANUAL: Use the universal remote to set the time.

4. Use Up/Down arrows to select Time Zone, then press a Left/Right arrow.		4. Use Up/Down arrows to select Time Set and use the number keys to set the time.

### StarSight Clock Set Note:

After StarSight is authorized for your TV, it can take up to 48 hours for StarSight information to be provided to the TV. This may result in the Clock's time being set incorrectly. Simply activate the Clock Menu and set the correct time.

### Auto/StarSight:

If StarSight is authorized for your TV, "StarSight Mode" appears in the display instead of Manual or Auto.

# WHAT YOU SHOULD DO FIRST

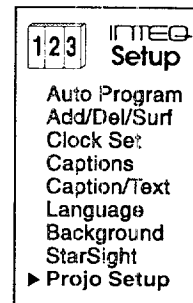
## STEP 6: VERIFY COLOR CONVERGENCE (Projection TVs Only)

From the factory, your projection TV should perform as you expect it to: Crystal clear, teeth-rattling sound with brilliant, razor-sharp video images. However, because your TV "projects" three different images, each in a different color, and overlaps them on the TV screen, gravitational forces and strong magnetic fields can affect whether or not the images precisely overlap. If they do not, you will notice images on your TV with blue, red or green "fringes" around them.

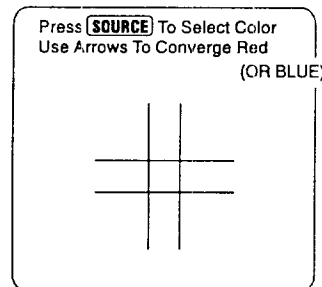
### To "converge" the Color(s) Back Into Alignment:

1. Press **MENU** on your multi-brand remote repeatedly until the **Inteq Setup** menu appears.
  2. Press the Up/Down arrow keys to select **Projo Setup** then press the Left/Right arrow keys to view the "Converge" lines.
- If you see four intersecting white lines, the colors are converged correctly. Press **QUIT** on your remote to exit the procedure.
- If you see red or blue lines offset from the reference lines, the convergence procedure is necessary.
3. Press **SOURCE** to select either red or blue lines to converge.
  4. Press the Up/Down and Left/Right arrow keys to move the red (or blue) lines directly on top of the reference lines. (Do this for both colors if necessary.)
  5. Once the four lines are white, the colors are converged correctly. Press **QUIT** on your remote to exit the procedure.

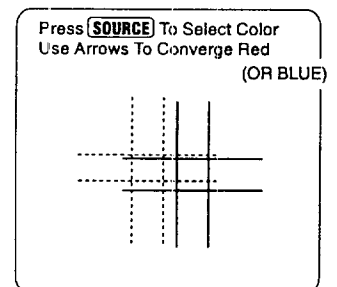
**Note:** Each time the TV is moved to a different location, check the convergence.

## STEP 7: AUTO DEMO

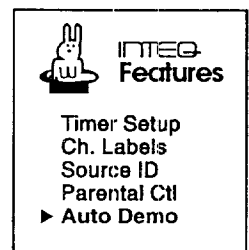
To gain a basic understanding of the special features and many other features built into your new entertainment machine, you may wish to activate the Auto Demo. The TV will give you a quick "tour" of its abilities.

### To begin the Auto Demonstration:

1. Use an Up or Down arrow to highlight Auto Demo.
2. Press a Left or Right arrow to activate the demonstration. (It will begin after a few seconds.)

#### Notes:

- To stop the demonstration, you must select Auto Demo in the menu and set it to Off. Auto Demo will continue until it is set to Off.
- If you press any key during Auto Demo, it will disappear from the TV screen and begin again after about 20 seconds.

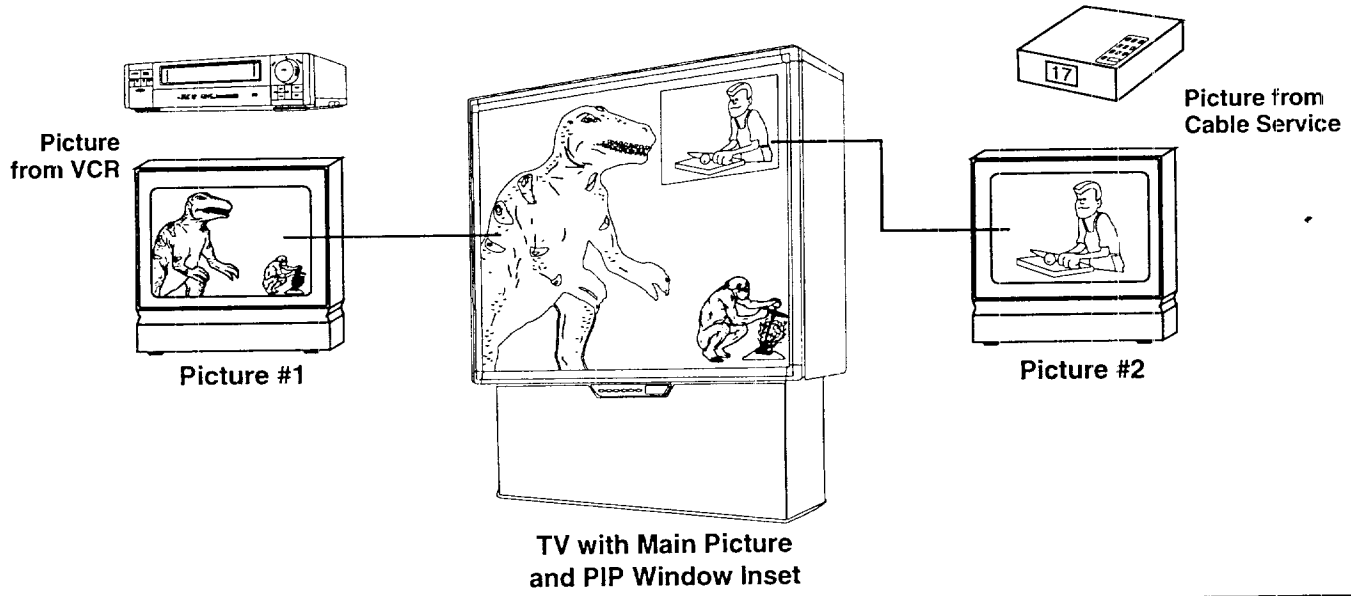
## STEP 8: USE OTHER OPTIONS

You may want to consider using the **Add/Del/Surf** option to delete undesirable channels or add additional channels, apply "labels" to your available channels using the **Ch. (Channel) Labels** option, label the input sources with descriptive names such as "VCR," or adjust the options in the **Audio** and **Video Menus**.

# PICTURE-IN-PICTURE (PIP) OPERATION

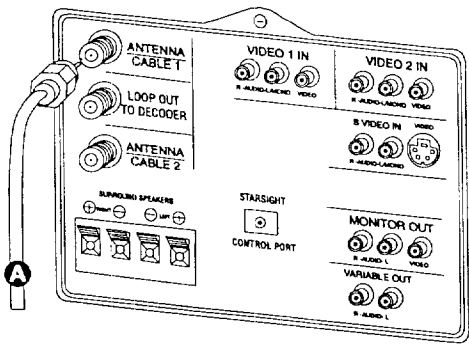
## OVERVIEW

Picture-in-Picture (PIP) allows your single TV to perform like two TVs. As illustrated below, two different pictures can be watched at the same time – on one TV screen – using the PIP feature. With this kind of convenience, you'll no longer need to place two TVs side-by-side to keep track of two important football games being played at the same time. The pictures on the TV screen are provided by the equipment, or "sources," connected to the Connection Panel on the back of the TV. Of the many input jacks available on this connection panel, you can specify one input viewing source for the TV's main picture and a separate input viewing source for the PIP image.



## TWO TUNER PIP

Your TV is designed with two tuners. That means that there are two internal devices that can select the channels. This also means that the operation of PIP is easier than ever: With a single antenna or direct cable-TV connection to the Ant/Cable 1 or Ant/Cable 2 jack on the back of the TV, as shown below, you can watch one channel as the Main Picture of the TV while a completely different channel is showing in the PIP window. The instructions for using the two-tuner PIP capabilities are different, depending on the remote control being used. Refer to the "PIP Features/Controls" sections on the following pages for specific operating instructions.

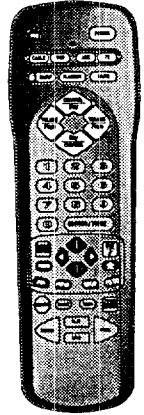


Example of antenna or direct cable-TV connection. (Antenna/Cable 2 can also be used.)

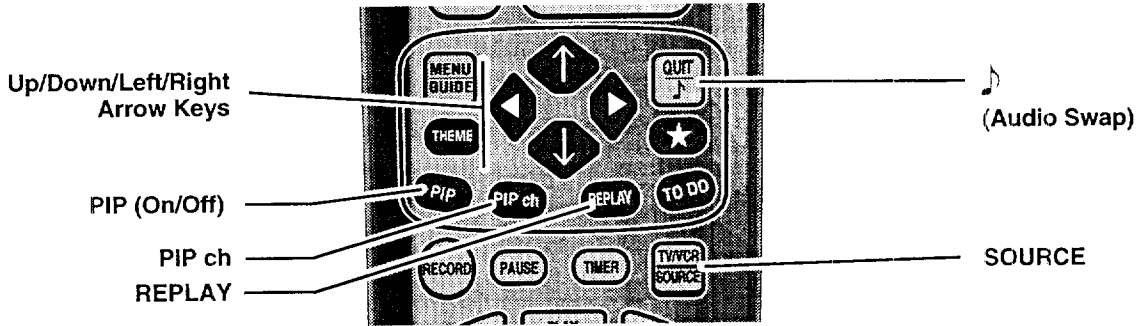
### Notes:

- You can choose any source listed for the Main picture and the PIP picture, as long as you have equipment connected to the corresponding jacks on the TV's connection panel.
- Initially, the Main and PIP picture sources are the same if the Main Picture is either Antenna/Cable 1 or 2. However, once you actually change the PIP source, the selected source is "remembered" and retained until it is changed again.

## PIP FEATURES/CONTROLS OPTIONS WITH UNIVERSAL REMOTE



### PIP Active Remote Control Functions


The "highlighted" text of the Channel/Time display shows which window – Main or PIP – is "active." The active mode (in this case PIP) is the window that the remote will operate.

When PIP is first turned On, the remote is immediately ready to operate in the PIP mode. The functions such as Channel Up/Down, Channel Flashback and the number keys for direct channel entry will be functioning and operate on the PIP window picture.

#### To change the active window:

Press **PIP ch** to switch the remote functions to the Main Picture source. Press again to return to PIP window operations.

#### To change source of Audio (Audio Swap):

To switch Audio sound from the Main Picture source to the sound from the PIP inset picture source, (without any other menus on-screen) repeatedly press the musical note (  ) key.

#### PIP (On/Off)

Press **PIP** to turn the PIP feature On and Off.

#### PIP ch

Press to switch the channel selection from the PIP window to the Main picture.

#### PIP Replay

While a PIP window is on: Use to stop-action (freeze) the motion of the image in the PIP window. Press again to return to live action.

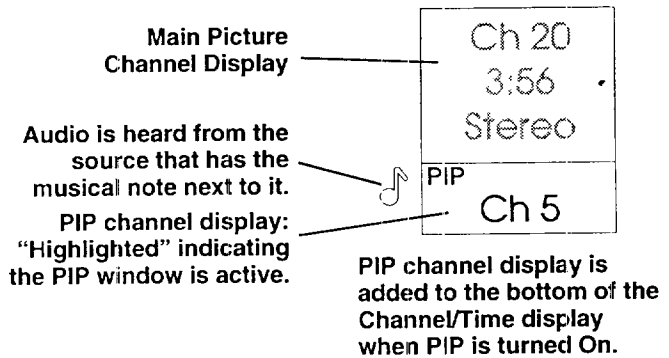

#### Source

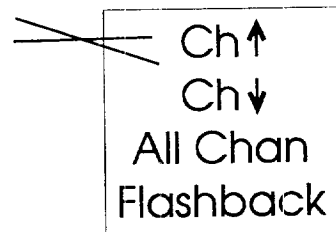

This multi-brand (MBR) remote control operates the common features of most, but not all, models and brands of IR (infrared) controlled TVs, VCRs, cable boxes, video disc players, and audio equipment. The remote may be capable of functions that are not provided by your equipment, for example, on-screen menu operations. If some functions of optional equipment are not controlled by this remote, use the original remote that came with your equipment.

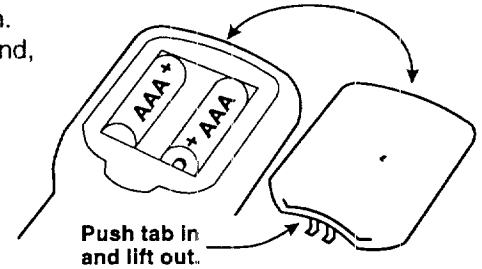
## BATTERY INSTALLATION

Batteries are provided with the remote, but it's up to you to install them. When the remote no longer functions normally, or it appears to have lost memory, replace the batteries with two high-quality, alkaline, size AAA batteries. Match plus with plus (+ with +) and minus with minus (- with -) as shown in the battery compartment.

Once the fresh batteries are installed, your remote returns to normal operation. However, if you programmed it to operate A/V equipment other than Inteq brand, the remote must be reprogrammed for those products. Refer to the "Programming Your Remote" section later in this chapter. The factory preset codes for your Inteq equipment are 101 for TV, 201 for VCR, 353 for CABLE, and 401 for AUX.

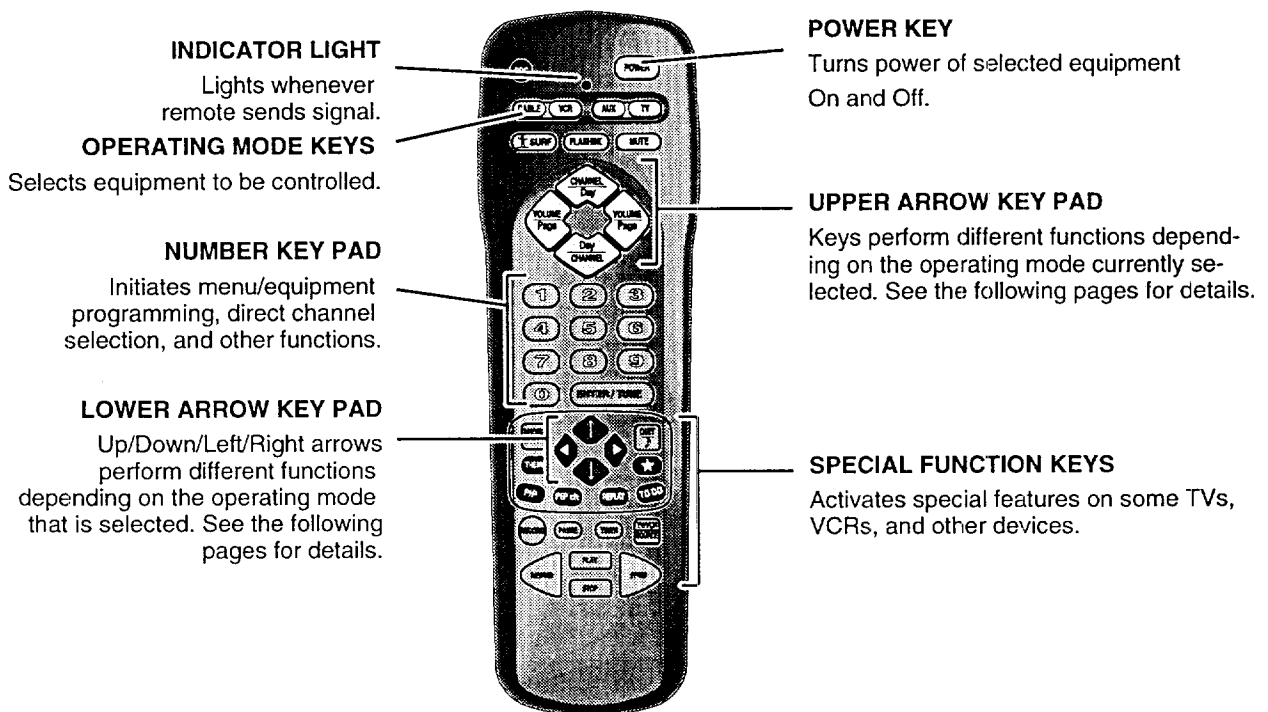
- Do not place heavy objects on top of the remote control keys. Prolonged unintentional operation of the remote shortens battery life.
- Remove the batteries if the remote will not be used for a month or more.

## CHOOSING OPERATING MODE

To control your TV, VCR, cable box, or auxiliary equipment with this remote, you must first choose the "mode" of operation. Press the desired mode key for TV, VCR, CABLE or AUX. Pressing the ★ (Star) key puts the remote into **StarSight** mode. To exit out of the StarSight mode, press TV or one of the other mode keys. Some keys on the remote will always operate a particular product function regardless of which mode the remote is in. For example, PLAY controls the VCR play function.

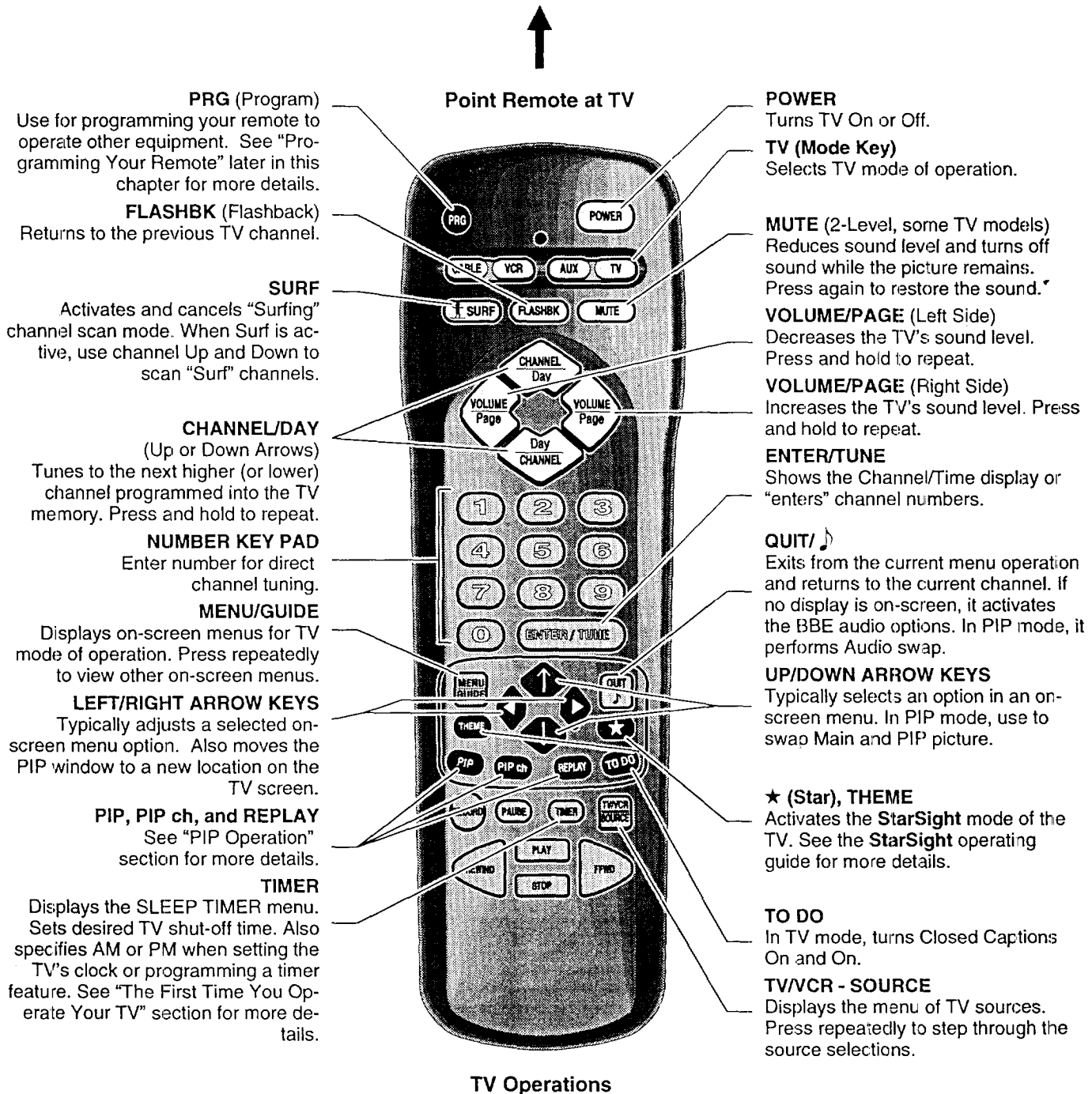

## PROGRAMMING YOUR REMOTE



If you are using *Inteq* products, the remote is programmed for the most commonly used codes. For other brands — or if your remote fails to control your *Inteq* product — you will have to program the remote.

### Basic Programming Modes: TV, VCR, Cable, Aux

1. Locate the three-digit code for your brand (such as Zenith) and type of equipment (such as VCR) in the code table on the following page.
2. Press and hold PRG with a small blunt object for about three seconds until the indicator lights. (Release the button after the indicator is on.) 
3. Press TV, VCR, CABLE, or AUX to select the product you want your remote to control. (If you want, CABLE or AUX may be used for a second TV or VCR or to program your remote for a video disc player or audio equipment.) 
4. Use the number keys to enter the three-digit code(s) for your equipment, then press ENTER/TUNE. The indicator light should flash a couple of times, then turn off to indicate that the code was accepted. If the indicator stays on, repeat steps 3 and 4 or try using a different code. 
5. Write your codes on the label inside the battery compartment for future reference.
6. To erase all code programming and return to the factory preset codes, enter 9-1-1 when programming the remote. 



### Additional Programming Modes: AUX+1, AUX+2, AUX+3

Your remote can control up to seven audio/video appliances using the TV, VCR, CABLE and AUX keys, and the AUX+1, AUX+2, AUX+3 modes.

1. Begin with basic programming steps 1 and 2.
2. Press and hold the AUX key and at the same time, press either 1, 2 or 3. Then release the keys. 
3. Use the number keys to enter the three-digit code for your equipment, then press ENTER/TUNE. 
4. To operate the equipment that you just programmed into this auxiliary mode, press the AUX key and the same number (either 1, 2, or 3) used during programming. The remote is now ready to operate the unit.

### Cable Box Volume



The remote can operate the volume and mute functions of your cable box — if your cable box is equipped with these features.

1. Program the remote for your cable box using basic programming steps 1-4.
2. Perform the programming procedure a second time, but instead of entering the cable box code (in step 4), key in code 3-9-9, then press ENTER/TUNE. This tells the remote to operate the cable box volume/mute functions while you use the remote in cable mode.   


If you no longer want to operate the cable box volume and mute while the remote is in cable mode, reprogram the remote for your cable code. Volume/mute functions are restored to the TV.

### Amplifier Volume Override

If your TV is connected to an external amplifier, and you want to control the volume and mute features of the amplifier rather than those of the TV or cable box:

1. Program your amplifier's code into one of the AUX modes.
2. Select the mode on your remote (TV, VCR, etc.) where you want the amplifier volume control function to reside. For example, if you want to operate the volume and mute of your amplifier while the remote is in TV mode, press TV for this step.
3. Begin the programming procedure described in "Programming Your Remote" and enter code 4-9-9, followed by ENTER/TUNE.   


Now, while you are watching TV, and the remote is in TV mode, the VOLUME Up/ Down and MUTE keys on the remote operate those functions of the amplifier.

4. To restore volume and muting control to your TV or cable box, reprogram the remote for these units into the mode (TV, Cable, etc.) to be restored.

**Note:** When operating a CD or audio tape device with your remote, amplifier volume and mute are automatically selected, if an amplifier code has been programmed into the remote.

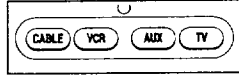

### To perform an Auto Find for the product codes:

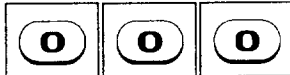

2. Press and hold **PRG** with a small blunt object until the indicator lights.



3. Press the mode key on the remote for the product you want to control: **TV, VCR, CABLE, or AUX.**



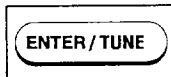
4. Enter **0-0-0**, then press **ENTER** within two seconds. When the indicator light flashes three times and remains lit, Auto Find is active.



5. Press and hold **POWER**, then release it, repeating this action about once a second until the product turns OFF.

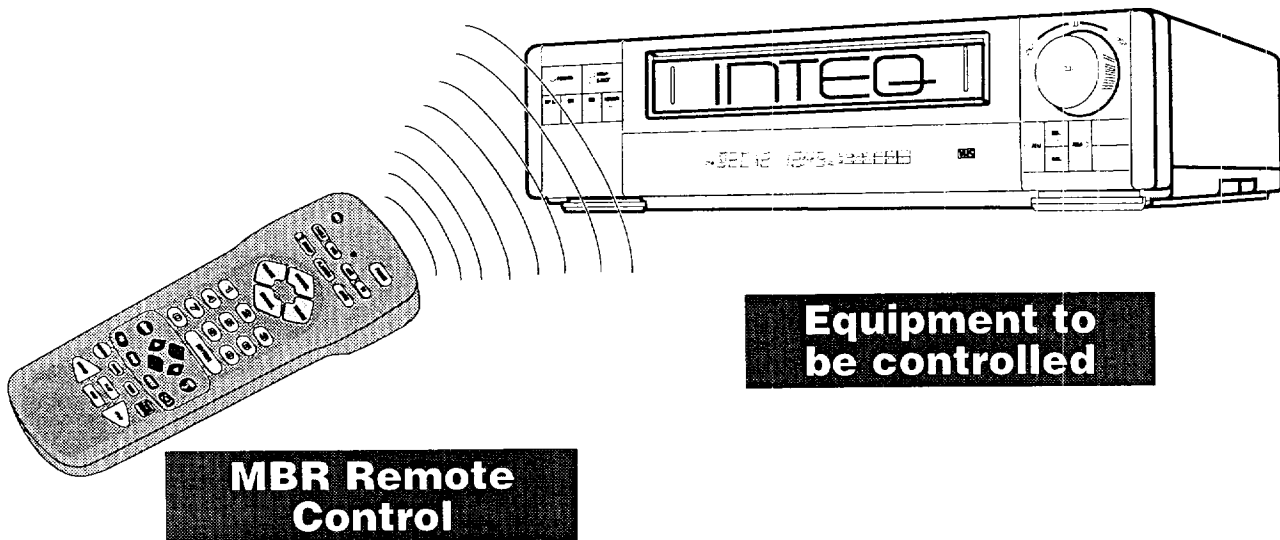


6. Press **ENTER** immediately to save the code. If your remote fails to operate the functions you use most often, you can re-enter Auto Find and search for a better code.



### Programming Notes:

- During Auto Find, the indicator light will flash off each time you press **POWER**, and back on when you release it. If the indicator light stays on when you press **POWER**, Auto Find has tried all available codes. If you finish Auto Find and the product you want to control has not turned off, your remote cannot control that product.
- You may cancel programming at any time by pressing **PRG**.
- The remote cannot be programmed while in the **Star-Sight** mode: Press **TV, VCR, CABLE** or **AUX** before pressing **PRG**.
- If no key on your remote is pressed within 60 seconds, the programming process will stop, and you will have to start again.

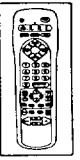

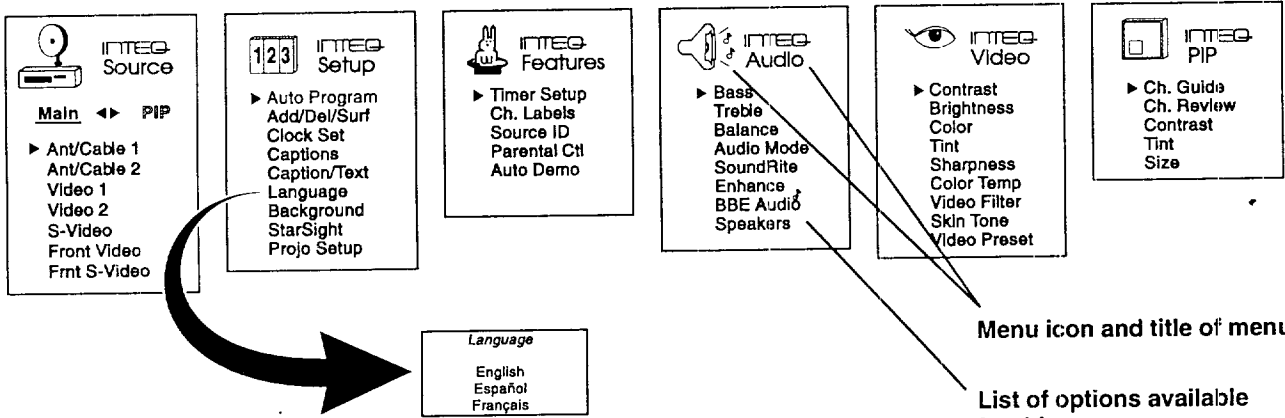
# MBR REMOTE MENUS REFERENCE



## QUICK REFERENCE TO ON-SCREEN MENUS WITH MBR REMOTE

Your TV is **menu** operated; in other words, features and adjustments of the TV are all operated from a list of options that appear on the TV screen. When you select a feature from the list, an adjustment window (or sub-menu) appears so that the adjustment may be completed. And all of these adjustments can be accomplished from the comfort of your favorite chair by using the MBR remote control.

To view the on-screen menus using the MBR remote control, first press TV to make sure the remote is in TV mode. Then press **MENU** repeatedly to sequence through the available menus.



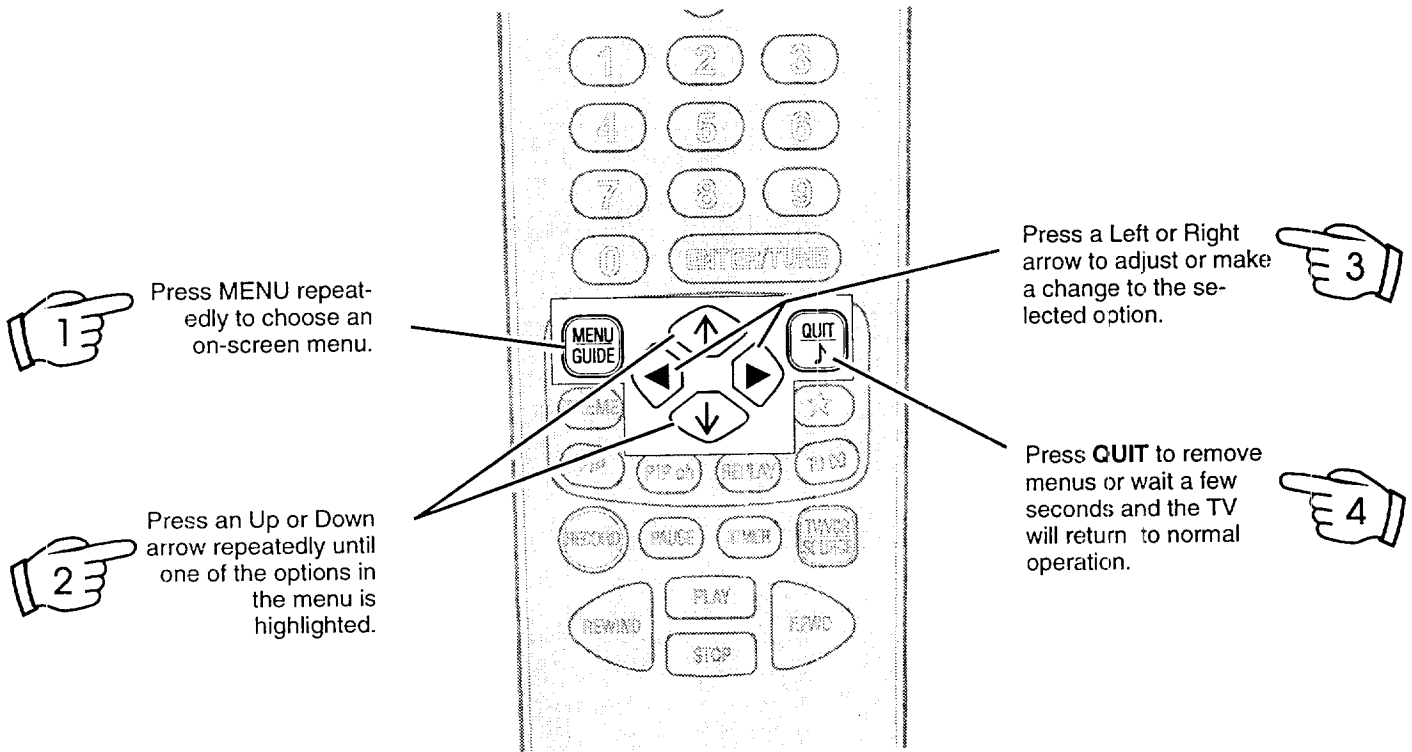

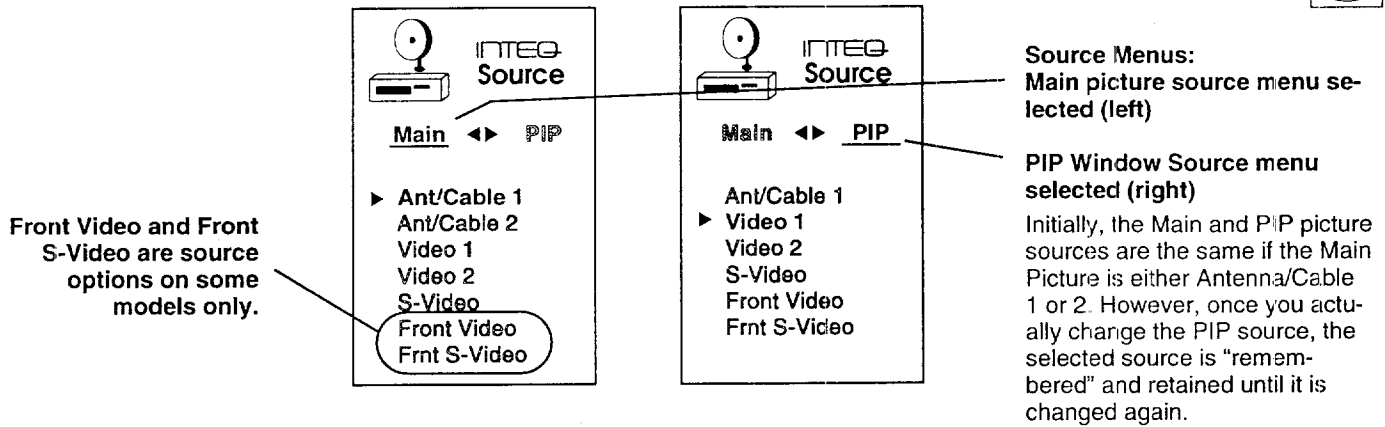
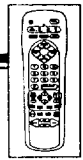

# SOURCE MENU: MBR REMOTE



## MENU OPERATION

1 or Press SOURCE for direct entry to the **Inteq Source** menu, or press MENU repeatedly until the Source Menu is selected.

3 or Press SOURCE repeatedly, or use an Up/Down arrow key until the desired Source is selected.

2 Use a Left/Right arrow key to select either Main picture source menu or PIP picture source menu.

4 Press QUIT to exit from menu operations or wait a few seconds for the TV to return to normal operation.

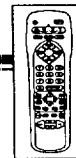
## SOURCE SELECTION

The term "Source" refers to the equipment and antenna wires connected to the jacks on the TV's connection panel on the back of the TV. To place the picture and sound being received by these jacks (or Source) on the TV screen, you "select" the appropriate "source" – Antenna/Cable 1, Video 1, etc. – using the Source menu shown above.

<b>Ant/Cable 1 or 2</b>	Routes the antenna or cable-TV source to the TV for viewing. You see program material from the source equipment that is connected to the corresponding ANT/CABLE: 1 or 2 jack. (If the signal is from a VCR or a cable box, tune the TV to either channel 3 or 4.)
<b>Video 1 or 2</b>	Routes the audio and video from an A/V source (such as a VCR or a video disc player) to the TV for viewing. You see program material from the source equipment that is connected to the corresponding VIDEO 1 or 2 IN jacks.
<b>S-Video</b>	Routes the audio and video from an auxiliary Super-VHS video source (such as a VCR or a video disc player) to the TV for viewing. You see program material from the source equipment that is connected to the corresponding S-VIDEO IN jacks.
<b>Front Video or Frnt S-Video</b>	Routes the audio and video from an auxiliary A/V or Super-VHS video source (such as a VCR or a video disc player) to the TV for viewing. You see program material from the source equipment that is connected to the corresponding FRONT VIDEO or FRNT S-VIDEO IN jacks.

**Note:** Refer to the "Connecting Your TV" chapter to make the proper equipment connections to the TV. For information about PIP sources, refer to the "PIP Operation" section.

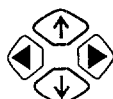

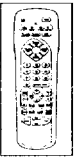

<b>StarSight</b>	Begins the StarSight Setup procedure. Refer to the StarSight operating guide for details. Before you activate the StarSight feature, review the StarSight instruction guide for the information you will need to complete the StarSight activation process.
<b>Projo Setup</b> (Projection TVs only)	Lets you verify and adjust, if needed, the color convergence of the TV picture. If you move your TV from its original location, or if after time, you notice color "fringes" around objects in the picture, you should check the alignment (convergence) of the projected colors. See the "What You Should Do First" chapter for more details.

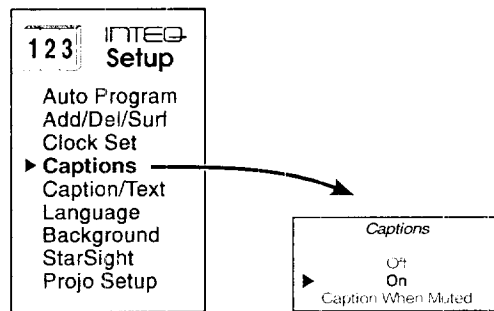

Provides, to the hearing-impaired, words (Captions) on-screen of the audio portion of the broadcast. If a program has captions included, the CC or captions notice will appear for 2 or 3 seconds before the broadcast begins.

- After Captions are turned On, proceed to “Choosing Captions/Text.”
- If you select Captions When Muted, Closed Captions will appear when the Audio is Muted.

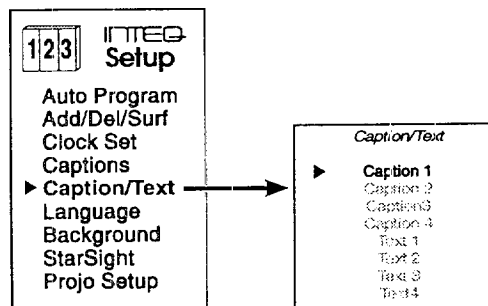

## To Set Sleep Timer By Direct Access:

1. With no menus showing on the TV, press **TIMER** on your remote to directly access the Sleep Timer.
2. Press **TIMER** repeatedly to set the period of time the TV will remain on.

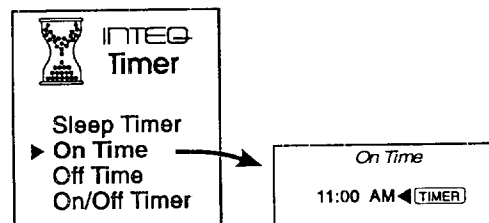

## TIMER SETUP: On/Off Timer

Picture this: It's very early in the morning – maybe the sun is not even up so the room is dark – and you can't find the remote control to turn the TV on to see what the weather is expected to be like for the day. The solution is simple: Make the TV turn itself on by using the **On/Off Timer**.

## To Set Set On/Off Timer:

1. Make sure the TV's clock is set.
2. Use an Up/Down arrow button to highlight **Timer Setup** then press a Left/Right arrow button to view the **Inteq Timer** menu.
3. Use the Up/Down arrow button to highlight **On Time** then press a Left/Right arrow button to view the adjust window.
4. Use the numbered buttons on your remote to enter a time for the TV to turn itself ON, then press **TIMER** on the remote to select AM or PM. (You can also use a Left/Right arrow button to advance the time.)

### To create "custom" channel Labels:

1. Access the Channel Label screen and choose a channel number. (Steps 1 and 2 above.)

3. Use the Up/Down/Left/Right arrow buttons to select a character, then press **ENTER** to set the character in place. (Do this for up to 4 characters.)
4. Press **TIMER** to exit the custom label screen and return to Ch. Labels menu.
5. Press **QUIT** to remove menu.

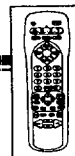

## USING PARENTAL CONTROL (PC)

Parental Control allows you to be selective about the channels and video sources that can be watched on your TV. If there are undesirable programs or channels that you do not want viewed by someone in your household, you can use Parental Control to block specific channels or the video input sources.

### To set the Parental Control:

- Select **Parental Ctl.** then press a Left/Right arrow button to view the Parental Control menu.

#### 1. Select the individual channels to block.

- a. Select Block Ch. (channel) and press a Left/Right arrow button to view the Block Channels screen.
- b. Press SOURCE on your remote control to select Ant/Cable 1 or 2.
- c. Use the Left/Right/Up/Down arrow buttons to move the selector to each channel you want to block and press TIMER to set the channel to "blocked." (A padlock icon appears next to the number.)
- d. Press MENU to return to the **Inteq Par. Ctl.** menu.

#### 2. Block the Video and S-Video sources.

- a. Select Block Video and press a Left/Right arrow button to view the adjust screen.
- b. Press a Left/Right arrow button to select "Blocked." **All Video and S-Video sources will be blocked while PC is active.**

<b>Bass</b>	Increases and decreases the level of low-frequency sound.
<b>Treble</b>	Increases and decreases the level of high-frequency sound.
<b>Balance</b>	Adjusts the balance of sound between the TV's speakers.
<b>Audio Mode</b> (SAP is not an option for the Video or S-Video sources. Audio signals into a video source are assumed to be monaural or stereo.)	<p>Allows you to select STEREO, MONO or 2ND AUDIO/SAP operation.</p> <p><b>Stereo:</b> Directs the sound to the Left and Right speakers as supplied by the program. Stereo is the recommend choice: The TV switches automatically between the STEREO and MONO modes depending on the type of signal being received.</p> <p><b>Mono:</b> Directs the same sound to both Left and Right speakers, even if the program being received is in stereo.</p> <p><b>2nd Audio/ SAP:</b> Directs the sound for the Second Audio Program to both the Left and Right speakers. SAP sound is always monaural. If SAP is selected, you hear the SAP – usually a second language. When the SAP broadcast ends, the TV switches automatically (defaults) to the type of signal being received, STEREO or MONO. The TV switches back to 2ND AUDIO/SAP when the SAP broadcast resumes.</p>
<b>SoundRite</b>	Turn this feature ON to maintain the television's volume at a constant level. In other words, commercials and audio from the auxiliary input source will no longer appear to sound louder than the volume level you have set. (Note that this feature is automatically deactivated if any of the Dolby Enhancements are selected for use.)
<b>Enhancement</b> (Dolby Pro Logic audio systems only)	Provides options for enhancing the TV's audio. Your options are Off, Concert Hall, Theater, Night Club, Stadium, Pseudo Stereo, Pro Logic Phantom, Dolby 3 Stereo, and Dolby Pro Logic Normal. See the information following this chart for more details.
<b>BBE Audio</b>	Use this to compensate for phase and amplitude distortions for a more faithful reproduction of original sound. Select Level 1 (good), Level 2 (better), or set BBE Audio to OFF, according to your personal listening preference.
<b>Speakers</b>	Use to turn TV's internal speakers OFF and ON.



## SELECTING AUDIO ENHANCEMENTS

Your Inteq entertainment machine is engineered with many audio adjustments which can be set for your individual listening taste. However, Inteq has included several pre-set enhancement "effects" which may be used to emulate different viewing environments. These enhancements are Concert Hall, Theater, Night Club, Stadium and Pseudo Stereo. Select the enhancement that sounds best to you.

Instead of selecting an audio "effect," you can enhance the stereo sound from your TV. Select either Dolby Pro Logic Phantom, Dolby 3 Stereo or Dolby Pro Logic Normal. Refer to the following procedures to balance the level of sound being heard from the speakers:

### SPEAKER BALANCE

**When Dolby 3 Stereo Enhancement is selected, balance the speaker sound like this:**

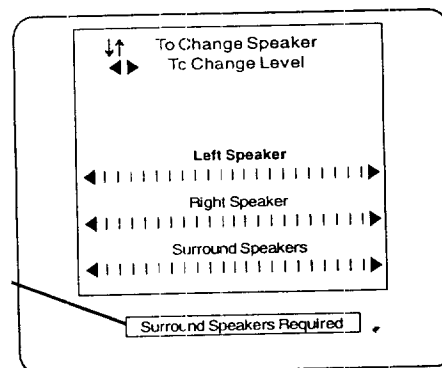
1. Select **Stereo** as the Audio option.
2. Select **Dolby 3 Stereo** as the Enhancement then press MENU to return to the main Audio menu.
3. Adjust Bass and Treble to your preference
4. Select Balance and press the Left/Right arrow key to view the speaker balance screen.
5. Press the Up/Down keys to select a speaker to adjust. The text highlight and an audible "hissing" "bounces" between the speaker and the **Center Reference**.
6. Press the Left/Right keys to set the volume of the "hissing" – for the selected speaker – to about the same level as the "hissing" of the **Center Reference**. Do this for each speaker.

**When Pro Logic Normal or Phantom Enhancement is selected, balance the speaker sound like this:**

1. Turn on the external amplifier and set its volume to approximately the same volume as the TV. (This step is for Pro Logic Normal enhancement only.)
2. Select **Pro Logic Normal** (or **Phantom**) as the Enhancement then press MENU to return to the Audio menu.
3. Adjust the Bass and Treble to your preference.
4. Select Balance and press the Left/Right arrow key to view the Pro Logic speaker balance screen.
5. Press the Up/Down keys to select a speaker to adjust. The text highlight and an audible "hissing" sound will "bounce" between the selected speaker and the **Center Reference**.
6. Press the Left/Right keys until the volume of the "hissing" – for the selected speaker – is about the same level as the "hissing" of the **Center Reference**. Do this for each speaker.

#### Notes:

- To fully appreciate the quality of sound provided by your Inteq entertainment machine and the Dolby Pro Logic audio system, make sure an external amplifier is connected to the TV and the speakers are balanced as described above.
- Optional Surround speakers must be connected for you to hear Surround Sound.

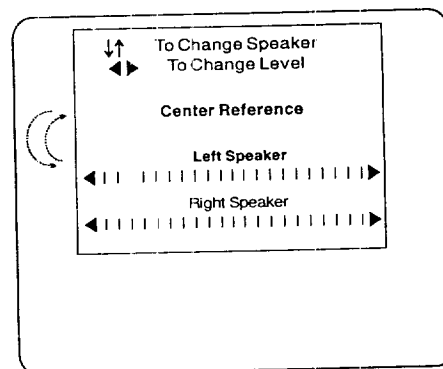

Preset.....	Restores the factory Video Menu settings.
Movie .....	Provides clear, cinema-like effects by optimizing the video adjustments for use in a home theater setting with dim lighting.
Video.....	Reduces bright video game color intensities and graphics for prolonged close-range viewing conditions.
Game	
Sports.....	Provides a bright, sharp picture with vivid color and crisp detail.
Daylight .....	Enhances picture contrast in a bright daylight environment.
Weak Signal.....	Reduces "noise" (snow) in poor quality signal transmissions or video tapes.

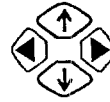

This multi-brand remote control operates the common features of most, but not all, models and brands of IR (infrared) controlled VCRs. Some functions of your particular VCR may not be controlled by this remote. In such cases, use the original remote control for your VCR.

## BATTERY INSTALLATION

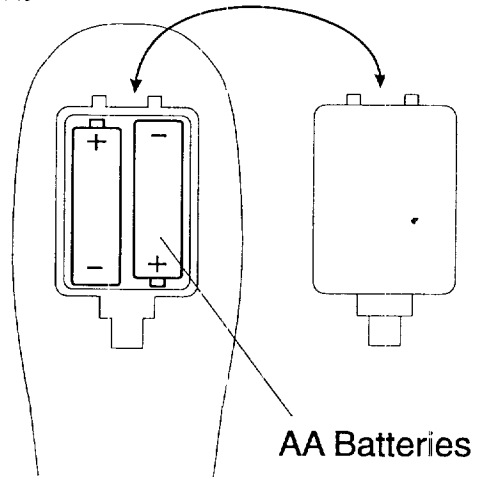
Batteries are provided, but must be installed before using the remote control. When it no longer functions normally, or if it loses memory, replace the batteries with two high-quality, alkaline, size AA batteries. Match positive with positive (+ with +), negative with negative (- with -) as shown inside the battery compartment.

### VCR Brand Code Auto Find Option

Unless your VCR responds to the factory preset code commonly used for In-teq VCRs, you may need to use Auto Find to program the VCR code whenever you replace batteries. See following pages for remote programming Auto Find instructions.

## PROGRAMMING YOUR INTRAQ TRACKBALL REMOTE

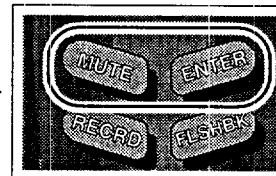
The Inteq Trackball remote is already programmed to work with most Inteq VCRs. If your VCR is not an Inteq, or if your Inteq VCR does not respond to the trackball remote, you will need to program the remote.

### To program the remote to operate a VCR other than an Inteq brand:

1. Make sure the TV and VCR are ON.
2. Refer to the "VCR Codes BY Brand Name" table on the next page. Locate the 3-digit number which corresponds to your brand of VCR.
3. Point the Intraq remote at your TV and simultaneously press the MUTE and ENTER keys until the on-screen **Intraq Setup** display appears near the bottom of TV screen.

Notice that the current VCR brand code (initially 201) is displayed on the screen. Roll the trackball up or down (or use Chan Up/Down) to choose the 3-digit number of your VCR.

4. When your 3-digit number is displayed on the TV screen, point the remote at your VCR and press POWER to see if your VCR turns OFF. If the VCR does not respond, select a different number.



If your VCR turns On and Off successfully, press the trackball (or ENTER) to save the code. The VCR Setup screen will disappear from the TV and the VCR key will blink 3 times upon exiting the Programming Mode and the remote will be in the VCR mode.

5. Now try other controls on your VCR, such as PLAY, REWIND, etc., to make sure that the correct VCR brand code number was selected. (If not, repeat steps 1 to 4.)

### Notes:

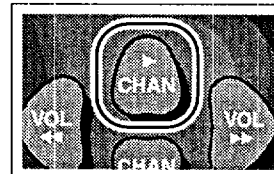
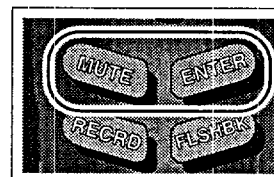
- The MUTE key can be pressed at any time to cancel programming mode. The original VCR brand code will remain unchanged.
- Only the VCR Mode can be programmed. Pressing the VCR or TV mode key has no effect in the programming mode. Similarly, the VOL Up/Down RECRD, and FLSHBK keys have no function in the programming mode.
- The remote will exit programming mode automatically after 60 seconds if no key or trackball movement is detected.

## AUTO FIND: PROGRAMMING YOUR INTRAQ REMOTE TO CONTROL VCR

If you have tried all 3-digit codes listed for your VCR manufacturer, and none of them operate your VCR, you will need to try "AutoFind" to see if a different code will operate your VCR. Proceed as follows:

### To Auto Find the VCR brand code:

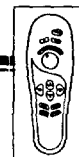
1. Make sure your TV and VCR are turned ON.
2. Simultaneously press the MUTE and ENTER keys until the VCR key lights up.
3. Point the Intraq remote towards your VCR and press CHAN (Up) followed by POWER. If your VCR turns OFF, the correct code was found. Press ENTER to save the code.
4. If your VCR did not turn off, continue the sequence of pressing CHAN (Up) followed by POWER until the VCR finally responds. When your VCR turns OFF, press ENTER to save the code.
5. Now try other controls on your VCR, such as Play, Rewind, etc., to make sure that the correct VCR brand code number was selected. (If not, repeat steps 2 to 4.)



### Notes:

- The MUTE key can be pressed at any time to cancel programming mode. The original VCR brand code will remain unchanged.
- The remote will exit Auto Find automatically after 60 seconds if no key or trackball movement is detected.

## CLEANING THE TRACKBALL

To keep the Intraq remote functioning properly, it is necessary to occasionally clean the trackball device.

### To clean the Trackball:

1. Use a solution of mild dish washing detergent and water.
2. Moisten a clean soft cloth with the solution and lay the cloth flat on a table.
3. Turn the Intraq remote upside down and gently roll the TRACKBALL on the cloth.
4. Allow the remote to air-dry before using it again.

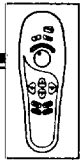

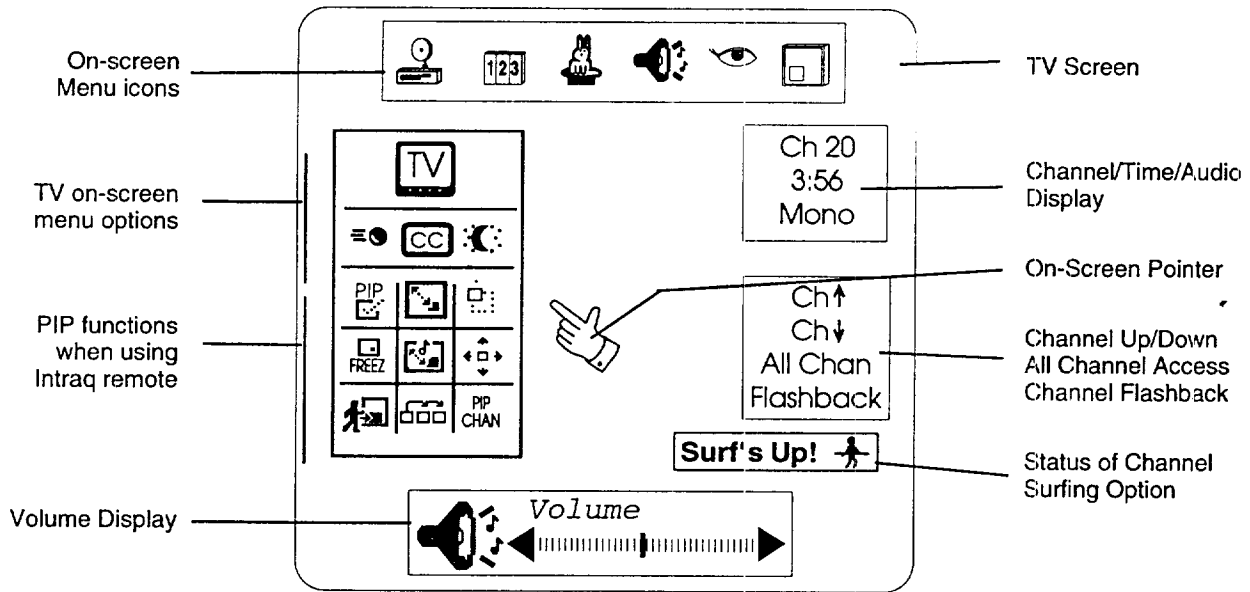

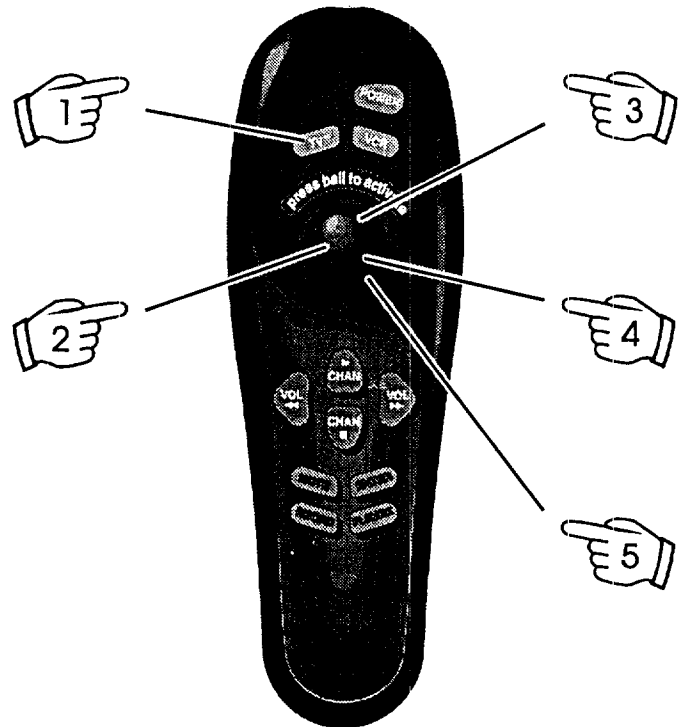
## BASIC MENU OPERATION

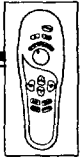
### To use the trackball on-screen menus:

1. Press TV to set the remote in TV mode.
2. Press the trackball to view the on-screen pointer.
3. "Roll" the trackball forward, back, left or right to move the pointer to the Top, Bottom, Left or Right side of TV screen.
4. When the pointer is over the desired display, press the trackball to see your adjustment options.
5. After the adjustments are complete, move the pointer to center of screen and press trackball to remove it or wait a few seconds and the pointer removes itself from the TV screen.

For example, to see the volume Up and Down display, press the trackball to place the pointer on the TV screen. Then roll the trackball backward to move pointer to the bottom of the TV screen.

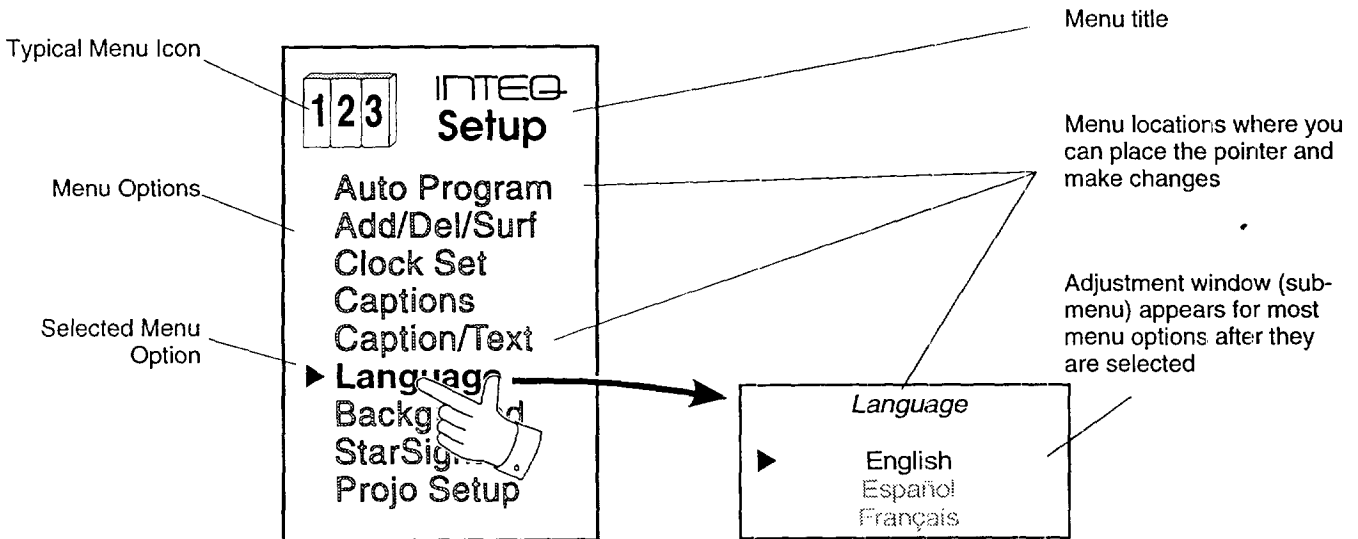


# INTRAQ REMOTE MENUS REFERENCE



## POINT AND PRESS OPERATION

A typical on-screen menu, as it would appear when you use the INTRAQ remote, is shown below. The on-screen menus are accessed by rolling the pointer to the top of the TV screen and pressing on one of the menu icons to see its list of options. These options represent television features that you may or may not wish to use. When a feature is selected, an adjustment window appears so that the adjustment can be completed. Note that the phrase "point and press" is used throughout the Intraq remote control section of this operating guide. This simply means that the on-screen pointer is moved to a menu option and the trackball is pressed to select the option.



### Menu Operation Options

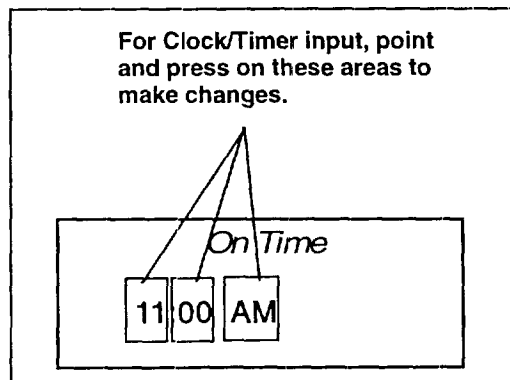
Use the trackball remote to point to the feature you wish to adjust. Then press on the trackball to select the feature. Most times an adjustment window will appear.

### Using the Pointer to Change Menu Options

Depending on the menu showing on the TV, the pointer can be placed in several places to adjust the feature. For example, when setting one of the timer features, you can point and press on the hours, minutes, and AM/PM portions of the adjustment window to make changes.

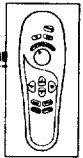
## SOURCE SELECTION

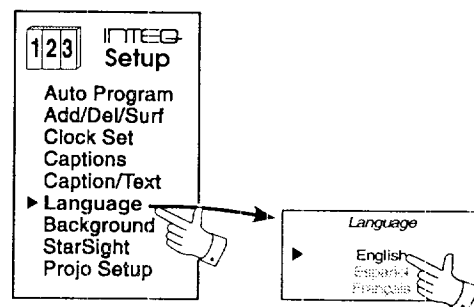

## TIMER SETUP: Sleep Timer

### To Program the Sleep Timer:

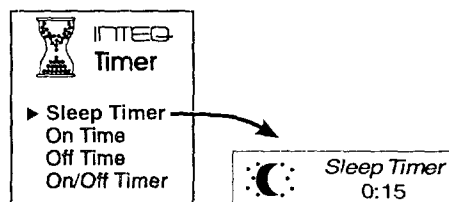
1. Point and press on Timer Setup in the Features menu to view the Timer Setup display.
2. Point and press on Sleep Timer to view the adjust window.
3. Press the trackball repeatedly to choose the length of time the TV will remain on. Options are: Off, 0:15, 0:30, 1:00, 1:30, 2:00, 2:30, 3:00, 3:30 or 4:00.

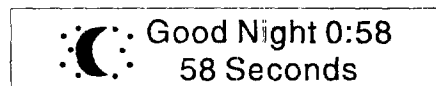

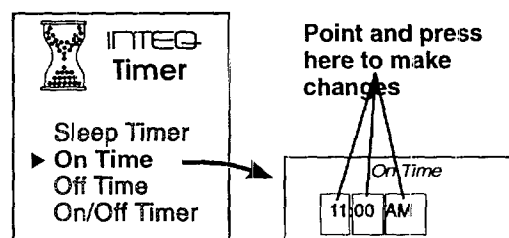

<b>Bass</b>	Increases and decreases the level of low-frequency sound.

<b>Balance</b>	Adjusts the balance of sound between the TV's speakers.
<b>Audio Mode</b> (SAP is not an option for the Video or S-Video sources. Audio signals into a video source are assumed to be monaural or stereo.)	<p>Allows you to select STEREO, MONO or 2ND AUDIO/SAP operation.</p> <p><b>Stereo:</b> Directs the sound to the Left and Right speakers as supplied by the program. Stereo is the recommend choice: The TV switches automatically between the STEREO and MONO modes depending on the type of signal being received.</p> <p><b>Mono:</b> Directs the same sound to both Left and Right speakers, even if the program being received is in stereo.</p> <p><b>2nd Audio/ SAP:</b> Directs the sound for the Second Audio Program to both the Left and Right speakers. SAP sound is always monaural. If SAP is selected, you hear the SAP – usually a second language. 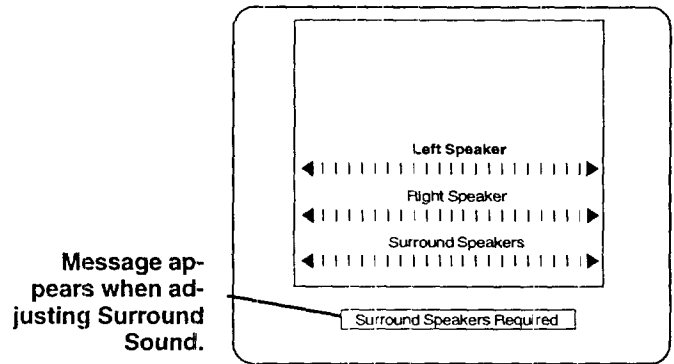

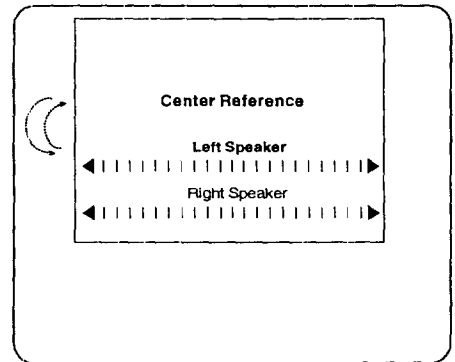

3. Adjust the Bass and Treble to your preference.

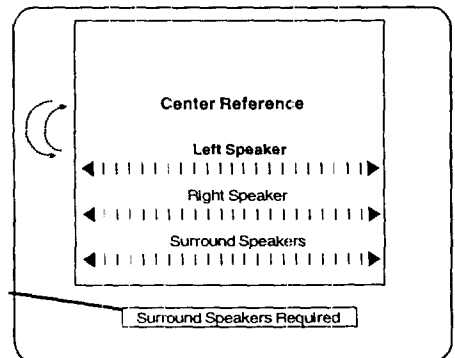

# MAINTENANCE AND TROUBLESHOOTING

## CARING FOR YOUR PROJECTION TV

Your projection TV will look better, have a longer life and perform better if you care for it properly.



First check to see that the TV is off. For added safety, disconnect AC power to your TV.

**NOTE:** If you unplug your TV, you will have to reset the clock to the current time.

### CABINET CARE

**Non-Wood Cabinet or Cabinet Components** Moisten a soft cloth with a mild soap solution or Ivory dishwashing detergent. Wipe the surface with a damp cloth. Then rinse the cloth in clean water and wipe the surface again. Allow the TV to air-dry before turning it on.

**Wood Cabinets or Cabinet Components** Use any good furniture cleaner and polish. Regular care will help preserve the finish.

---

## CARING FOR YOUR DIRECT VIEW TV

Your TV will look better, have a longer life and perform better if you care for it properly.



First check to see that the TV is off. For added safety, unplug the TV from the power outlet.

**NOTE:** If you unplug your TV, you will have to reset the clock to the current time.

### CABINET CARE

**Non-Wood Cabinet or Cabinet Components** Moisten a soft cloth with a mild soap solution or Ivory dishwashing detergent. Wipe the surface with a damp cloth. Then rinse the cloth in clean water and wipe the surface again. Allow the TV to air-dry before turning it on.

**Wood Cabinets or Cabinet Components** Use any good furniture cleaner and polish. Regular care will help preserve the finish.

---

## EXTENDED ABSENCE

Before an extended absence (such as a vacation) you may want to disconnect AC power to your TV. This will protect the projection TV from possible damage from lightning or power line surges. If you have an outdoor antenna, you may

also want to disconnect the antenna from the wall plate connection center

**NOTE:** If you unplug your TV, you will have to reset the clock to the current time.

---

## PICTURE INTERFERENCE

Your picture may be affected by interference caused by one or a number of factors. These include:

**Speckled or Streaked Picture** Can be caused by nearby automobile ignition, electrical appliances, etc. This is most noticeable in weak signal areas.

**Snow in Picture** Caused by insufficient signal. Usually caused by the TV being located too far from the TV station or by an improper antenna installation.

**Ghosts or Reflections** Caused by signals being reflected from surrounding buildings, water tanks, or other high structures.

**Radio Signal** Police, amateur or CB radio transmitters may cause interference.

These interference problems can often be corrected through the use of a better antenna, signal amplifiers, or various filter devices. See your TV dealer for additional information, and accessories available for your projection TV.

## PROJECTION SCREEN CLEANING



Use a soft cloth moistened with warm water and rub lightly in the soiled areas of the screen. **DO NOT USE A TISSUE OR PAPER TOWEL, AS THESE MAY DAMAGE SURFACE.** Wipe only in the vertical (up/down) direction (along the grooves). If there is a dirt buildup, a mild solution of warm water and Ivory dishwashing detergent may be used. Use dry soft cloth to dry the screen. Care should be taken to avoid scratches or damage to the screen surface.

**NOTE:** THE TV SCREEN IS EASILY DAMAGED. AVOID ACCIDENTAL CONTACT WITH THE SCREEN.

## DIRECT VIEW PICTURE GLASS CLEANING

The picture tube face attracts dust particles and should be cleaned regularly. To clean the face, spray a small amount of glass cleaner on a cleaning cloth and wipe the picture tube glass face until clean. Repeat if necessary.

To delay new dust accumulation, wet a soft cloth in lukewarm water in which a little fabric softener or Ivory dishwashing detergent has been mixed. Wring the cloth almost dry. Wipe the glass face. Make sure no drops of moisture are squeezed onto the glass. Do not wipe the glass dry. Allow the glass to air-dry before you turn the TV on again.

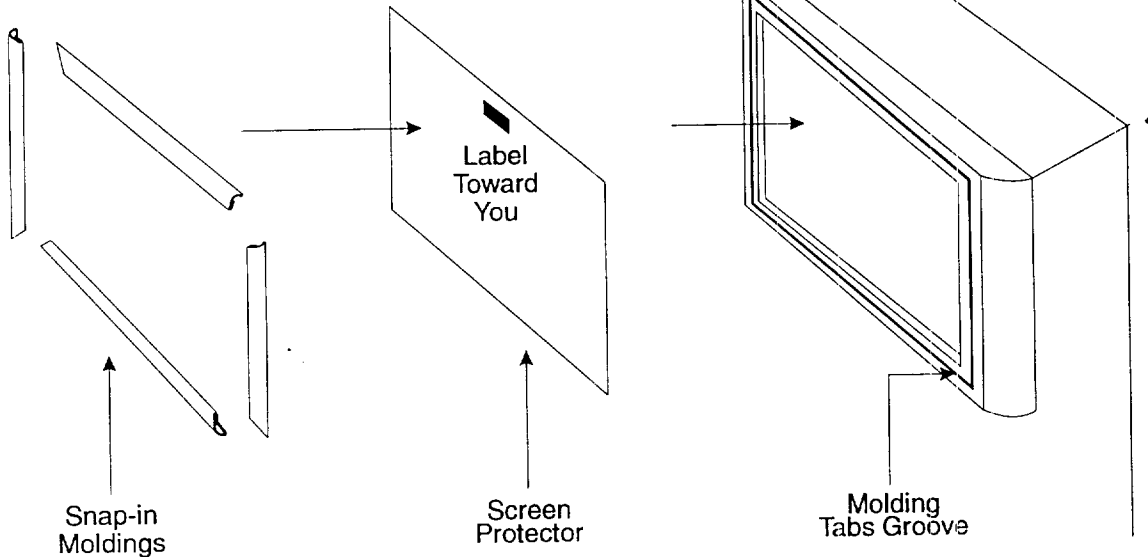
# MAINTENANCE AND TROUBLESHOOTING

## SCREEN PROTECTOR

Some projection TVs are equipped with a screen protector. If it is necessary to remove or adjust the protector, "peel" the moldings away from the TV to separate them from the tabs groove and carefully lift out the screen protector. Be careful not to damage the moldings or scratch the surfaces of the TV screen or the screen protector.



**The TV screen is easily damaged. Avoid accidental contact with the screen.**



**Step 1.** Install one of the long snap-in moldings into the groove at the bottom of the TV and push the molding tabs into the groove as shown at the right. Place screen protector into the slot between the molding and the TV screen with the label on the screen protector facing you. Have someone hold the screen protector in position over the TV screen.



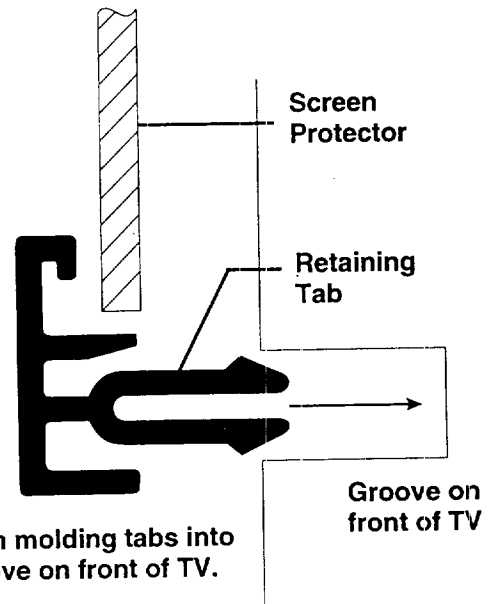
**Be extra careful not to scratch either the TV screen or the screen protector surfaces during installation.**

**Step 2.** Carefully shift the screen protector up, down, left, or right as needed.



**Clean screen protector as described on previous page.**

**Step 3.** Place the remaining three snap-in moldings in position on the top (remaining long piece), left, and right sides of the TV (shorter pieces). Press firmly enough on each snap-in molding to force the retainer tabs into the groove as shown above; each tab must be fully inserted. After installation, remove the label from the front of the screen protector, if desired.



# MAINTENANCE AND TROUBLESHOOTING

## BEFORE CALLING FOR SERVICE

Check these items and see if you can correct the trouble by changing the adjustment of a control or a menu setting. By making these simple checks before calling for service, you may save time and money.

Problem	Try This
Picture OK. Poor sound.	Re-orient antenna. Try another channel — possible station trouble. Adjust AUDIO MENU options. Check Mute feature? Check for local interference. Is antenna/cable connection loose?
Sound OK. Poor picture.	Re-orient antenna. Try another channel — possible station trouble. Adjust VIDEO MENU options. Trouble with cable-TV system? Is antenna/cable connection loose?
No picture or sound.	Is TV on? Is there power in wall outlet? Is TV plugged in? Is antenna hooked up? Is cable hooked up? Trouble with cable-TV system? Check auxiliary audio/video equipment. Check channel selection. Is the channel blocked by PARENTAL CONTROL?
Picture blurred or distorted. Ghost in picture.	Check antenna or cable hook up for broken wires. Try another channel — possible station trouble. Check for local interference.
No color, or poor color.	Is it a color program? Check antenna or cable hook up for broken wires. Adjust VIDEO MENU options.
No sound or sound is low.	VOLUME (VOL) setting may be too low. Check MUTE key operation on remote control. Is Speaker EXT/INT switch set to EXT?
Cannot select certain channels or other channels.	Channels may be skipped in CH. ADD/DEL/SURF option of SETUP MENU. Use AUTO PROGRAM a second time. Is TV in Surf Channel Scan mode with only one channel specified as a Surf channel?
No closed captions	Are captions available? Is CAPTION 1, CAPTION 2, CAPTION 3 or CAPTION 4 selected using the CAPTIONS option on the SETUP MENU?
Black or blue box covers half of screen.	Is text information available? Is TEXT 1, TEXT 2, TEXT 3 or TEXT 4 selected in the CAPTIONS option of the SETUP MENU.
No picture or sound when VIDEO 1 or VIDEO 2 source is selected.	Is audio/video source hooked up properly? Are all wires connected to VIDEO 1 IN or VIDEO 2 IN jacks on connection center?
No stereo sound or weak stereo sound when using a stereo VCR.	Check AUDIO mode. Was stereo sound present before selecting VIDEO 1 or VIDEO 2 source?
Cannot select desired PIP source.	If Ant/Cable 1 or 2 is Main Source, TV makes it PIP source also.
PIP inset frame is black or lacks contrast when selecting VIDEO 1 for PIP inset.	Adjust PIP COLOR AND CONTRAST settings in PIP MENU. Are all wires connected to VIDEO 1 IN jacks on connection center?
PIP inset frame is "snowy" when using ANT/CABLE 1 or 2 for PIP and VIDEO 1 for main picture.	Is TV/VCR switch on the VCR (or remote) in the TV position?
No picture when using VIDEO 1 for PIP inset source and ANT/CABLE 1 or 2 for main picture.	Is TV/VCR switch on the VCR (or remote) in the TV position?
Remote control does not work.	Are batteries okay? Does Indicator light turn On? Is TV turned ON? Is remote in TV mode?

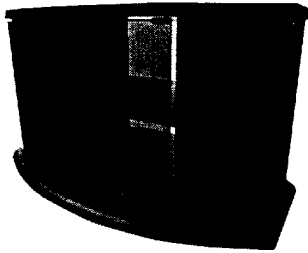
### Notes:

- If your TV fails to respond to the VIDEO PRESET selection, or to any other menu selection, you must reset the TV. Simply disconnect the AC power cord from the power outlet. Wait a few minutes, then plug the TV back into the power outlet. You may have to reset the clock to the current time.

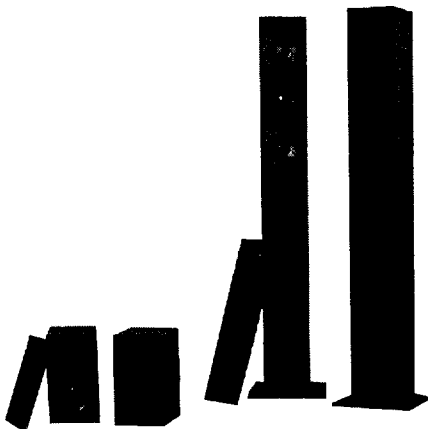

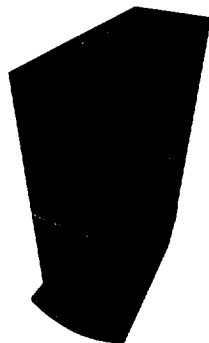

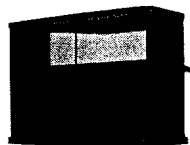

Welcome into the INTEQ family! We believe that you will be pleased with your new INTEQ Color TV. Please read this warranty carefully. It is a "LIMITED WARRANTY" as defined under Federal Law. This warranty gives you specific legal rights, and you may also have other rights that vary from state to state within the U.S.A.

### INTEQ's Responsibility

**Service Labor and Parts** — During a period of one year from effective warranty date, INTEQ will supply new or remanufactured replacement picture tubes or other parts, and will pay for service labor by an INTEQ authorized service center, when such parts or service labor are needed to repair the product as a result of manufacturing defects. Further, INTEQ will supply a new or remanufactured replacement for any picture tube which fails during the second year after effective warranty date because of a manufacturing defect. Replacement parts are warranted for the remaining portion of the original warranty period. The above service labor warranty applies only in the U.S.A.

**On-Site Service** — Warranty service is provided where your INTEQ TV is installed.

**Not Covered** — This warranty covers manufacturing defects and does not cover installation, adjustment of customer controls in the home, installation or repair of home antenna systems, cable converters or cable company-supplied equipment; it also does not cover damage due to misuse, abuse, negligence, acts of God or other causes beyond the control of INTEQ. Any alteration of the product after manufacture voids this warranty in its entirety.
