



Precautions

Safety

- Operate the TV only on 120 V AC.
- One blade of the plug is wider than the other for safety purposes and will fit into the power outlet only one way. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, contact your dealer.
- Should any liquid or solid object fall into the cabinet, unplug the TV and have it checked by qualified personnel before operating it any further.
- Unplug the TV from the wall cutlet if you are not going to use it for several days or more. To disconnect the cord, pull it out by the plug. Never pull the cord itself.

Installing

- To prevent internal heat build-up, do not block the ventilation openings.
- Do not install the TV in a hot or humid place, nor in a place subject to excessive dust or mechanical vibration.

Cleaning

Clean the TV with a soft dry cloth. Never use strong solvents such as thinner or benzine which might damage the finish of the cabinet.

About the manual

This manual covers 11 different models. The menu displays are based on model KV-32TS36, one of the models with the most functions, and the Remote Commander illustrations are based on RM-Y118. If a particular function

does not apply to your model, this will be noted in the manual.

We highly recommend that you read this manual before using your TV. Keep the manual handy for future reference.

Feature

With the following features, you can:

- Receive up to 125 cable channels for a total of 181 possible off-air cable channels with the multi-band VHF/ UHF/CATV tuner.
- Receive the picture and sound of your VCR through the VIDEO IN jacks.
- Receive superior VCR playback pictures when you connect a VCR equipped with an S video output jack to the S VIDEO IN Jack.
- Watch your portable camera images (8mm, video, etc.) by connecting to the VIDEO IN jacks on the front panel.
- Receive stereo programs and Second Audio Program (SAP) broadcasts with the built-in Multichannel TV Sound (MTS) decoder.
- Receive TV or video sound through an audio system by connecting to the VARIABLE/FIX AUDIO OUT jacks.
- Simulate the sound quality of a concert hall or movie theater with the SURROUND system.
- Watch another TV channel, video or cable image as a window picture by using Picture-in-Picture.

- Automatically preset all receivable channels with AUTO PROGRAM.
- Watch the closed caption and the text by using Closed Caption.

With the supplied Remote Commmander, you can:

- Operate the TV, plus Sony and most other maker's video equipment or Sony multi disc player with the Pre-Programmed feature.
- · Switch quickly between two channels by using JUMP.
- Set the TV to automatically shut off after desired time (30, 60, 90 minutes can be set) using the SLEEP timer.
- Set the internal clock to display the CURRENT TIME onscreen.

And enjoy other features giving you a high quality picture...

- Colorpure FilterTM produces fine picture detail without color spill or color noise.
- The New Dynamic Picture™ system adjusts picture contrast automatically to produce more detail in both bright and dark areas of every scene.

Installing Batteries




Battery life

With normal operation, batteries will last up to half a year. If the Remote Commander dose not operate properly, the batteries might be exhausted. Replace both of them with new ones.

To avoid damage from possible battery

Remove the batteries if you do not plan to use the Remote Commander for a fairly long time.



Connecting TV Antenna/Cable


Although you can use either an indoor or outdoor antenna with the TV, an outdoor antenna will provide you with better picture quality. You can receive cable TV by connecting a cable supplied by your local cable company.

Connecting VHF, UHF or VHF/UHF Combination Antenna*, or CATV Cable


75-ohm coaxial cable (round)

When no more channels can be found, the programming stops and the lowest numbered channel is displayed.

To erase unnecessary channels, or to add channels that could not be preset automatically because their signal was too weak, follow the steps in "Erasing Unnecessary Channels — CHANNEL ERASE" (pp.19–20) and "Presetting Only Desired Channels — CHANNEL ADD" (p. 21).

Notes

- If you connect a monaural VCR, connect the audio output of the VCR to the L (MONO) jack of VIDEO 1 IN on the TV.
 The monaural sound will be heard from both speakers.
- For operating instructions, refer to the instruction manual furnished with the VCR.
- If the picture or sound is affected, move the VCR away from the TV.
- If S VIDEO is set to OFF, you cannot watch VCR playback pictures from the S VIDEO IN.
 To set S VIDEO to ON, see "Watching a Video with Your S



About S video input

Video input and output signals can be separated into Y (luminance or brightness) and C (chroma or color) signals. Usually these two signals are combined in a VCR and sent as one signal to a TV. Separation of the Y and C signals prevents them from interfering with one another, thereby inproving picture (especially color) quality.

This TV is equipped with an S video input jack through which these separated signals can be input directly. This way you can connect your S video-equipped VCR separately from a non-S video VCR.





Preparing for use

1 Turn on the TV.

Press the TV/VIDEO button on the TV or on the Remote Commander so that VIDEO appears on the screen.


When you cannot obtain a clear picture and/or sound Make sure that the TV/VTR on the VCR is set to TV. Reselect the channel you want to view with the controls on the TV or the Remote Commander.

Operating your equipment (except for KV-27TS29/2970M)

When using a Sony VCR, Multi-disc player or other manufacture's infrared remote control VCR, you can operate most of the equipments by using the supplied preprogrammed Remote Commander (p. 55).

To return to TV mode

Press the TV or TV/VIDEO button so that a channel number appears on the screen.



Watching a different image while duplicating


You can duplicate your recorded tapes by connecting two VCRs.

The VIDEO 3 OUT jacks only output the signal from the VIDEO 3 IN jacks. Connect a VCR for playback to VIDEO 3 IN jacks, and a VCR for recording to the VIDEO 3 OUT jacks. You can watch a TV program or images from VIDEO 1 IN or VIDEO 2 IN during duplicating.

To watch a different input image

Press TV/VIDEO on the TV or on the Remote Commander to select the input image you want to watch.



By setting AUDIO OUT variable, you can adjust the bass, treble and balance, or select surround or an MTS (Multichannel TV Sound) mode, using the on-screen menus (pp. 34–36).

Connecting active super woofer (supplied with KV-32TS46 only)


Preparing for use

To enjoy the active super woofer sound, make sure the connections are made as illustrated on the next page.

The woofer volume varies according to the TV volume. Adjust the woofer level control properly.

The active super woofer outputs the signal input to its AUDIO IN jacks. If you connect an audio system to the active super woofer's AUDIO OUT jacks, you can enjoy the sound from the audio system and the active super woofer simultaneously.

To make the active super woofer stable, attach the felt feet (supplied) to the bottom.



Notes

- Do not place the woofer on the TV set. To enjoy good sound, place the woofer on a hard object avoiding soft objects like carpets, sofas, etc.
- If you do not use the TV for more than 20 seconds, the active super woofer is turned off automatically to save on power consumption.
- When you release MUTING, the sound of the woofer is heard before that of the TV. This is normal.
- If you set SPEAKER to OFF in the AUDIO menu and select FIX in the AUDIO OUT menu (p.37), the volume of the woofer may be excessive. We recommend that you set SPEAKER to ON when you use the active super woofer.
- You should only connect the KV-32TS46 to the AC outlet on the active super woofer.
