

## 14. Outdoor Antenna Grounding

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the product, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. ## 15. Lightning

















# QUICK SETUP GUIDE

## ① CONNECT THE POWER

AFTER you have connected the necessary cable(s) to the jacks on the back of the TV, plug your TV's power cord into an AC outlet. Make sure you do not plug the TV into a "switched" outlet (an outlet that is controlled by a switch).



Do not plug TV into switched outlet on a VCR or cable-TV decoder



Your TV is designed to operate on normal household current, 120 volt 60 hertz AC. Do not attempt to operate it on DC current.


## ② INSTALL THE BATTERIES INTO THE REMOTE CONTROL

Batteries are provided with your TV.

### To Install the Batteries:

1. Open the battery compartment by pressing in on the tab and lifting the cover off.
2. Place the batteries into the compartment matching plus with plus (+ with +) and minus with minus (- with -), following the markings inside the battery compartment.
3. Replace the compartment cover.

Unless your equipment responds to factory preset codes, you will need to reprogram the remote control with codes from your particular equipment each time you replace batteries. Refer to "Get To Know Your MBR 3457 Remote Control" for details.




Multi-Brand Remote Control

## ③ SELECT YOUR LANGUAGE

The on-screen menus can appear in English, Spanish, or French. The language selections always appear in English regardless of which language you choose.

### To Select a Language:

1. Press **MENU** repeatedly to view the Setup Menu.
2. Select Language.
3. Use the Left/Right arrows to choose a language.
4. Press **QUIT** to remove the menu.



Setup Menu with Language Highlighted



# QUICK SETUP GUIDE

## ④ USE AUTO PROGRAM

Auto Program finds all available channels and stores them in the TV's memory. The first time you turn on your TV, Auto Program will be selected in the Setup Menu.


To Start Auto Program:
1. Press <b>MENU</b> repeatedly to view the Setup Menu.
2. Select Auto Program.
3. Use the Left/Right arrows to advance to the next menu.
4. Select either OFF AIR ANTENNA or CABLE TV.
5. Use the Left/Right arrows to begin the channel search.



Setup Menu with Auto Program Highlighted


## ⑤ SET THE CLOCK

You must set the clock if you are going to use features like the on/off timer.

1. Press <b>MENU</b> repeatedly on your multi-brand remote until the Setup Menu is displayed, press the Up or Down arrow key to select <b>Clock Set</b> , then press a Left or Right arrow key to see the <b>Clock Menu</b> .		
2. Select <b>Clock Mode</b> , and press the Left or Right arrow key to select Auto or Manual. <b>AUTO</b> : TV sets the time automatically (while TV is turned OFF). <b>MANUAL</b> : Use the universal remote to set the time.		
<b>AUTO</b>	or	<b>MANUAL</b>
4. Use Up/Down arrows to select <b>Time Zone</b> , then press a Left/Right arrow to select <b>Auto</b> or a specific time zone.		4. Use Up/Down arrows to select <b>Time Set</b> and use the number keys to set the time.
5. Use the Up/Down arrows to select <b>Daylight Saving</b> then press a Left/Right arrow to select <b>Auto</b> , <b>On</b> or <b>Off</b> .		5. Press <b>TIMER</b> to select <b>AM</b> or <b>PM</b> .
6. Press <b>QUIT</b> to remove the menu.		6. Press <b>QUIT</b> to remove the menu.



**Tip:** In the Auto mode the time could be displaced by an hour if your TV receives a time-set signal from a station which is not in your time zone or if there is a discrepancy with daylight savings time.


# QUICK SETUP GUIDE

## ⑥ PROJO SETUP: CONVERGE COLORS


Convergence is the alignment of your TV's red and blue color lines. When you first install your projection TV or, if you notice color "fringes" around objects in the picture, you may need to adjust the convergence.

To Converge Colors
1. Press <b>MENU</b> repeatedly to see the Setup Menu.
2. Use Up/Down arrows to choose Projo Setup.
3. Press Left/Right arrows to view the convergence lines.
4. Press <b>TV/VCR SOURCE</b> key to select either red or blue lines to converge.
5. Press the Up/Down and Left/Right arrows to place the red (or blue) lines directly on top of the reference lines.
6. Repeat convergence procedure for the other color.
7. Press <b>QUIT/</b> to remove the menu, or wait a few seconds for the TV to return to normal operation.


**Note:** Check the convergence each time you move the TV to a new location.



Follow the steps to align the color lines (red and blue) with the white lines.



Four intersecting white lines indicate the TV is properly converged. No adjustment is necessary.




## ⑦ GET TO KNOW THE ON-SCREEN MENUS

Your new TV automatically demonstrates on-screen menus to control its setup and operational features. Auto Demo shows the menus one-by-one, and begins after a short delay.

To Start Auto Demo:
1. Press <b>MENU</b> repeatedly to view the Special Features menu.
2. Select Auto Demo.
3. Use the Left/Right arrows to turn Auto Demo On or Off.
4. Press <b>QUIT/</b> to remove the menu.

**Notes:**

- Auto Demo continues to operate until you turn it Off in the **Special Features** menu.
- To turn Auto Demo Off, choose Off from the **Special Features** menu as shown at the right.



If you press any key during Auto Demo operation, it will disappear from the TV screen, and then begin again after about 20 seconds.


## ⑧ USE OTHER MENU OPTIONS






Press **ENTER** to remove menus from view, or wait a few seconds and the menu will disappear.




# GET TO KNOW YOUR REMOTE (MBR3457)

## PROGRAMMING YOUR REMOTE

If you're using Zenith products, the remote is already programmed for the most common codes: TV = 101, VCR = 201, CABLE = 353, and AUX = 401. For other brands, or if your remote fails to control your Zenith products, you'll have to program the remote.

Step-By-Step Instructions	Response On Remote
1. Install the batteries if you have not already done so.	
2. Press and hold <b>PRG</b> using a blunt object. Release <b>PRG</b> after the indicator light turns on.	Indicator light stays on to show you're in the programming mode.
3. Press then release the button for the product being programmed. 	Indicator light flashes to show remote is ready to accept a code.
4. Enter 3-digit product code from the chart which follows.  	Indicator light flashes for each digit you enter.
5. Press then release <b>ENTER</b> to save the code.	Indicator light on remote flashes and turns off to show your code was accepted.
6. Point remote at product and press <b>POWER</b> to test the product's operation. If it does not turn on, reprogram the remote using a different code listed for your product.	Product turns On. If none of the codes listed for your product operates it, use Auto Find as described below.
7. Repeat the above steps to program the remote for another product.


## AUTO FIND OPTION (ALTERNATE PROGRAMMING METHOD)

If you've tried all the codes for your product and none operates it, you can use Auto Find to search for the code you need. Follow the steps below for each product you want to program. Please be patient while using this method; the remote may have to search all of the codes shown in the chart on the next page.

To Auto Find a Code
1. Turn On the product you want to operate.
2. Press and hold <b>PRG</b> using a blunt object. Release <b>PRG</b> after the indicator light turns on.
3. Press the key to be programmed: <b>CATV</b> , <b>VCR</b> , <b>AUX</b> , or <b>TV</b> .
4. Enter "0-0-0," then press <b>ENTER</b> within two seconds. Auto Find is active when the indicator light flashes and remains lit.
5. Point the remote at the product.
6. Press and release <b>POWER</b> repeatedly, about once a second, until your product turns Off. The indicator light turns Off when you press <b>POWER</b> and On when you release it.
7. Press <b>ENTER</b> immediately to save the code. The indicator light flashes to indicate the code has been saved.
8. Press <b>POWER</b> to turn On your product.
9. Test your product. If the remote fails to operate the functions you use most often, use Auto Find again to search for a better code. (Auto Find resumes its search after the last code that was entered and saved in step 7.)

### Notes:

- If the indicator light stays on as you press **POWER**, Auto Find has tried all of the codes. If the product you want to control has not turned off, your remote cannot work with it, in which case you must use the product's own remote control.
- To cancel Auto Find, press **PRG** at any time during Auto Find.



## SPECIAL FEATURES

### AUX+1, AUX+2, AUX+3

Your remote can control up to seven products. If you've programmed the remote for four products using the TV, VCR, CABLE, and AUX keys, you can program it for up to three more by using AUX+1, +2, +3.

#### To Program AUX+1, AUX+2, and AUX+3

1. Locate the three-digit code for your product in the code table.
2. Press and hold PRG until the indicator lights.
3. Press AUX and "1" simultaneously to select AUX+1.
4. Enter the three-digit code, then press ENTER. The indicator light should flash, then turn off to indicate the code was accepted. If the light stays on, repeat steps 3 and 4 or try a different code.
5. Repeat steps 2 - 4 for AUX+2 and AUX+3.
6. Write your codes on the label inside the battery compartment for future reference.

Hold down AUX and press 1, 2, or 3 to access AUX +1, +2, or +3 mode.

#### To Program the Cable Box Volume

3. Enter special code 4-9-9, followed by ENTER.





4. Use the Left/Right/Up/Down arrows to select appropriate label to add to the channel number.
5. To create a custom label, press **TIMER** to access the custom labels display. Follow on-screen instructions. Use Up/Down/Left/Right arrows to select each character, followed by **ENTER** to place that character in the customized channel label. Press **TIMER** to exit and return to Ch. Labels display.
6. Repeat steps 3 through 5 for each channel.
7. Press **QUIT/** to remove the menu or wait a few seconds for the TV to return to normal operation.

You must have two equipment sources (one of which is a VCR or video disc player) to get two different pictures for PIP operation.

- Simultaneously show two different channels: one selected with the TV's tuner and the other with the VCR's tuner.
- Simultaneously show a video tape playing in the VCR and a channel selected with the TV's tuner.

# MAINTENANCE AND TROUBLESHOOTING

## CARING FOR YOUR PROJECTION TV

Your TV will look better, have a longer life, and perform better if you care for it properly.



First, check to see that the TV is off. For added safety, unplug the TV from the power outlet.

**Note:** If you unplug your TV, you may have to reset the clock to the current time.

### Cabinet Care

#### Non-Wood Cabinet or Cabinet Components

Moisten a soft cloth with a mild soap solution. Wipe the surface with a damp cloth. Then rinse the cloth in clean water and wipe the surface again. Allow the TV to air-dry before turning it on.

#### Wood Cabinets or Cabinet Components

Use any good furniture cleaner and polish. Regular care will help preserve the finish.

#### Screen Protector And Projection Screen Cleaning

Use a soft cloth moistened with warm water and rub lightly in the soiled areas of the screen. **DO NOT USE A TISSUE OR PAPER TOWEL, AS THESE MAY DAMAGE SURFACE.**

Wipe only in the vertical (up/down) direction (along the grooves). If there is a dirt buildup, a mild soap solution may be used. Use dry soft cloth to dry the screen. Avoid scratching or damaging the screen surface.



**NOTE:** The TV screen is easily damaged. Avoid accidental contact with the screen.

## EXTENDED ABSENCE

Before an extended absence (such as a vacation) you may want to unplug the power cord from the electrical wall outlet. This will protect the TV from possible damage from lightning or power line surges. If you have an outdoor antenna, you may also want to disconnect the antenna lead-in wires on the back of the TV.

**Note:** If you unplug your TV, you may have to reset the clock to the current time.

## TV PICTURE INTERFERENCE

Your TV picture may be affected by interference such as:

### Speckled or Streaked Picture

Can be caused by nearby automobile ignition, electrical appliances, etc. Most noticeable in weak signal areas.

### Snow in Picture

Caused by insufficient signal. Usually caused by the TV being located too far from the TV station or by improper antenna installation.

### Ghosts or Reflections

Caused by signals being reflected from surrounding buildings, water tanks, or other high structures.

### Radio Signal

Caused by police, amateur, or CB radio transmitters.

These interference problems can often be corrected by using a better antenna, signal amplifiers, or various filter devices. See your TV dealer for additional information and available TV accessories.

## VIDEO GAMES AND OTHER FIXED PATTERN DISPLAY CAUTION

If you use your TV for video games or other fixed displays, avoid setting the Brightness control for an excessively bright picture. A fixed display is any image that doesn't change frequently, such as a channel/network identification or other symbol that remains in the same location for long periods of time. A bright, fixed pattern, if left on for long periods of time, can result in a permanent imprint on the TV picture tube. You can reduce this possibility by alternating the use of the fixed pattern display with normal TV picture viewing, by turning down the Contrast control for sustained fixed pattern use, and by turning off the fixed pattern display when not in use.



# MAINTENANCE AND TROUBLESHOOTING

## SCREEN PROTECTOR

Some projection TVs are equipped with a screen protector. If it is necessary to remove or adjust the protector, "peel" the moldings away from the TV to separate them from the tabs groove and carefully lift out the screen protector. Be careful not to damage the moldings.



**Step 1.** Install one of the long snap-in moldings into the groove at the bottom of the TV and push the molding tabs into the groove as shown at the right. Place screen protector into the slot between the molding and the TV screen with the label on the screen protector facing you. Have someone hold the screen protector in position over the TV screen.

**Step 2.** Carefully shift the screen protector up, down, left, or right as needed.




**Be extra careful not to scratch either the TV screen or the screen protector surfaces during installation.**

**Step 3.** Place the remaining three snap-in moldings in position on the top (remaining long piece), left, and right sides of the TV (shorter pieces). Press firmly enough on each snap-in molding to force the retainer tabs into the groove as shown above; each tab must be fully inserted. After installation, remove the label from the front of the screen protector, if desired.

## BEFORE CALLING FOR SERVICE


Check these items and see if you can correct the trouble by changing the adjustment of a control or a menu setting. By making these simple checks before calling for service, you may save time and money.

Problem	Try This
Picture OK. Poor sound.	Re-orient antenna. Try another channel — possible station trouble. Adjust AUDIO MENU options. Check Mute feature? Check for local interference. Is antenna/cable connection loose?
Sound OK. Poor picture.	Re-orient antenna. Try another channel — possible station trouble. Adjust VIDEO MENU options. Trouble with cable-TV system? Is antenna/cable connection loose?
No picture or sound.	Is TV on? Is there power in wall outlet? Is TV plugged in? Is antenna hooked up? Is cable hooked up? Trouble with cable-TV system? Check auxiliary audio/video equipment. Check channel selection. Is the channel blocked by PARENTAL CONTROL?
Picture blurred or distorted. Ghost in picture.	Check antenna or cable hook up for broken wires. Try another channel — possible station trouble. Check for local interference.
No color, or poor color.	Is it a color program? Check antenna or cable hook up for broken wires. Adjust VIDEO MENU options.
No sound or sound is low.	VOLUME (VOL) setting may be too low. Check MUTE key operation on remote control. Are Speakers set to Off?
Cannot select certain channels or other channels.	Channels may be skipped in CH. ADD/DEL/SURF option of SETUP MENU. Use AUTO PROGRAM a second time. Is TV in Surf Channel Scan mode with only one channel specified as a Surf channel?
No closed captions	Are captions available? Is CAPTION 1, CAPTION 2, CAPTION 3 or CAPTION 4 selected using the CAPTIONS option on the SETUP MENU?
Black or blue box covers half of screen.	Is text information available? Is TEXT 1, TEXT 2, TEXT 3 or TEXT 4 selected in the CAPTIONS option of the SETUP MENU.
No picture or sound when VIDEO or S-VIDEO source is selected.	Is audio/video source hooked up properly? Are all wires connected to VIDEO IN or S-VIDEO IN jacks on TV/Source connection center?

### Notes:

- If your TV fails to respond to the VIDEO PRESET selection, or to any other menu selection, you must reset the TV. Simply disconnect the AC power cord from the power outlet. Wait a few minutes, then plug the TV back into the power outlet. You may have to reset the clock to the current time.
- Unplugging the TV does not deactivate the Parental Control.

# YOUR ZENITH TV WARRANTY

## PROJECTION COLOR TV

Welcome into the Zenith family! We believe that you will be pleased with your new Zenith Projection TV. Please read this warranty carefully. It is a "ONE YEAR FULL WARRANTY," plus a limited second year picture tube warranty, as defined under federal law. This warranty gives you specific legal rights, and you may also have other rights that vary from state to state within the U.S.A.

### Zenith's Responsibility

**Service Labor and Parts** — During a period of one year from effective warranty date, Zenith will supply new or remanufactured replacement picture tubes or other parts, and will pay for service labor by a Zenith authorized service center, when such parts or service labor are needed to repair the product as a result of manufacturing defects. Further, Zenith will supply a new or remanufactured replacement for any picture tube which fails during the second year after effective warranty date because of a manufacturing defect. Replacement parts are warranted for the remaining portion of the original warranty period. The above service labor warranty applies only in the U.S.A.

**On-Site Service** — Warranty service is provided where the Projection TV is installed.

**Not Covered** — This warranty covers manufacturing defects and does not cover installation, adjustment of customer controls in the home, installation or repair of home antenna systems, cable converters or cable company-supplied equipment; it also does not cover damage due to misuse, abuse, negligence, acts of God or other causes beyond the control of Zenith. Any alteration of the product after manufacture voids this warranty in its entirety.



Before you ask for Warranty service, check the operating guide section entitled, "Maintenance And Troubleshooting." You might avoid a service call.

### Owner's Responsibility

**Effective Warranty Date** — Warranty begins on the date of original consumer installation. For your convenience, keep the dealers dated bill of sale or delivery ticket as evidence of the purchase date.
