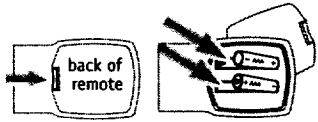


Hook Up Your Antenna to the TV

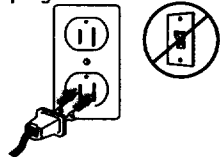
Connect an off-air antenna to your Entertainment Machine.

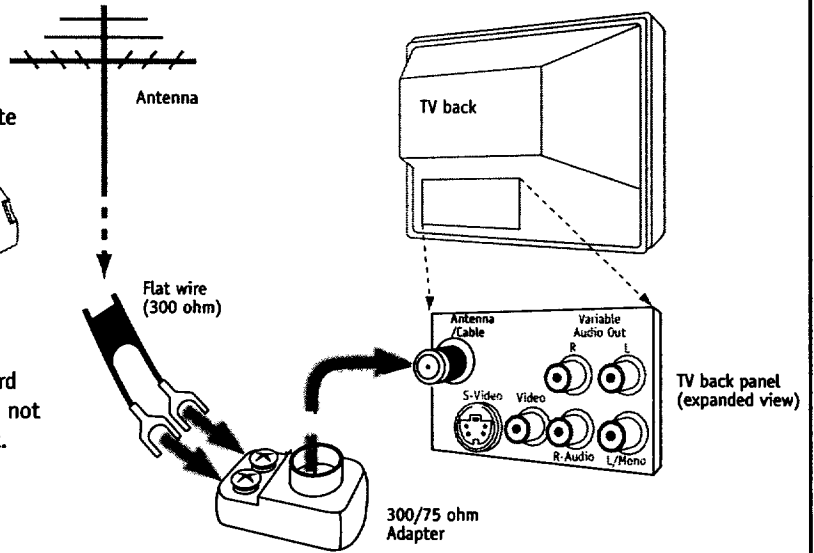
2 Remove the back of the remote and insert two AAA batteries.





3 Plug in your TV into a standard 120V, 60 Hz power outlet. Do not plug it into a switched outlet.




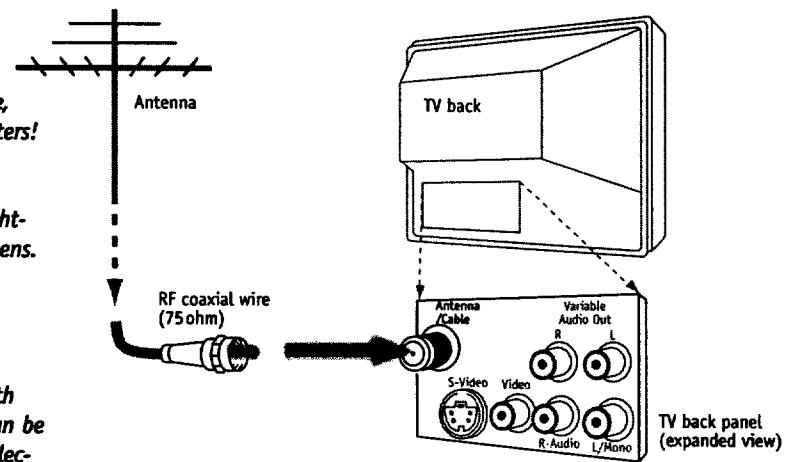
4 Go to page 11 to Auto Program your Entertainment Machine.



 *If you have a 75 ohm RF cable, then you don't need any adapters!*

 *Remember, when screwing RF cables into jacks, clockwise tightens, and counterclockwise loosens.*

 *A 300 to 75 ohm adapter is not included with your Zenith Entertainment Machine, but can be purchased in most consumer electronics stores.*



75 OHM RF CABLE

The wire that comes from an off-air antenna or cable service provider. Each end looks like a hex shaped nut with a wire sticking through the middle, and it screws onto the threaded jack on the back of your TV.

300 TO 75 OHM ADAPTER

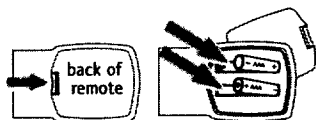
A small device that connects a two-wire 300 ohm antenna to a 75 ohm RF jack. They are usually about an inch long with two screws on one end and a round opening with a wire sticking out on the other end.

Hook Up Your Cable (CATV) to the TV

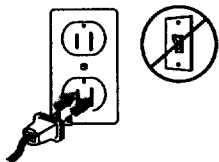

3 Plug in your TV into a standard 120V, 60 Hz power outlet. Do not plug it into a switched outlet.



4 Go to page 11 to Auto Program your Entertainment Machine.



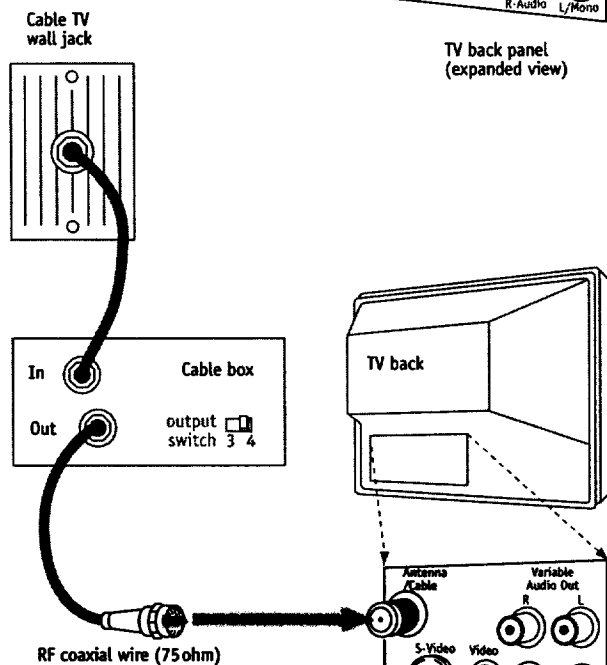
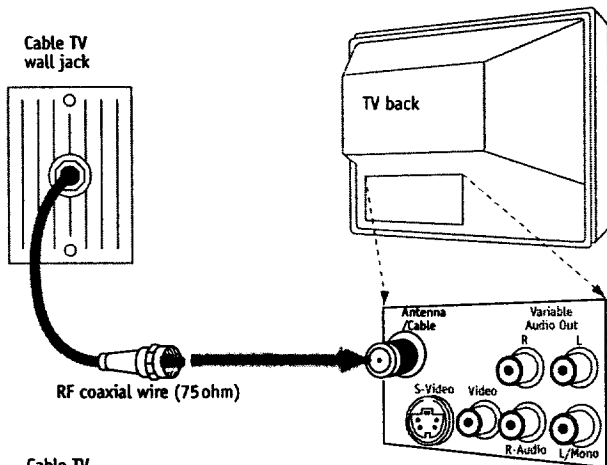
If you're using a cable box, leave your TV on channel 3 or 4 and use your cable box to change channels.



Remember, when screwing RF cables into jacks, clockwise tightens, and counterclockwise loosens.



If you're using a cable box, Auto Program might only find the channel your cable service is on (usually channel 3 or 4). Don't worry, that's all you need!

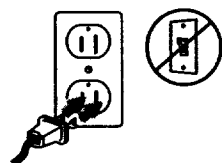
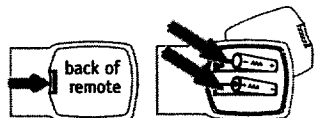


CABLE SERVICE The wire that supplies all your cable TV (CATV) stations.

- 4** Go to page 11 to Auto Program your Entertainment Machine.



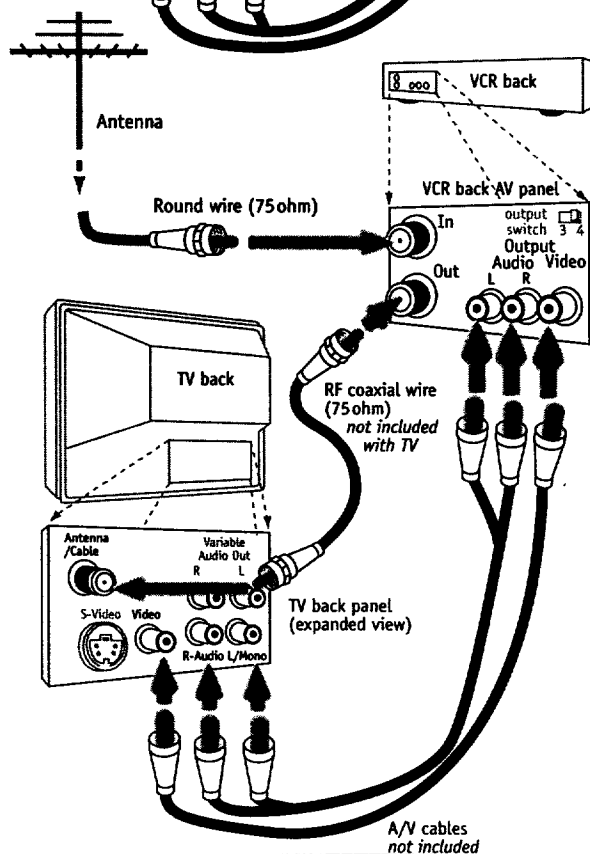
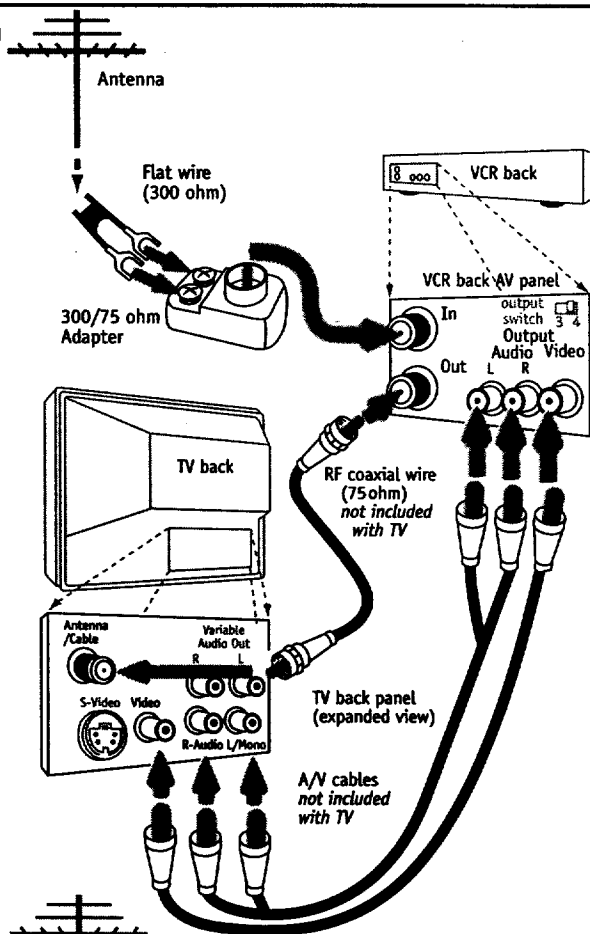

- 4 Go to page 11 to Auto Program your Entertainment Machine.



Leave your VCR and your television tuned to channel 3 and use the cable box to change channels.

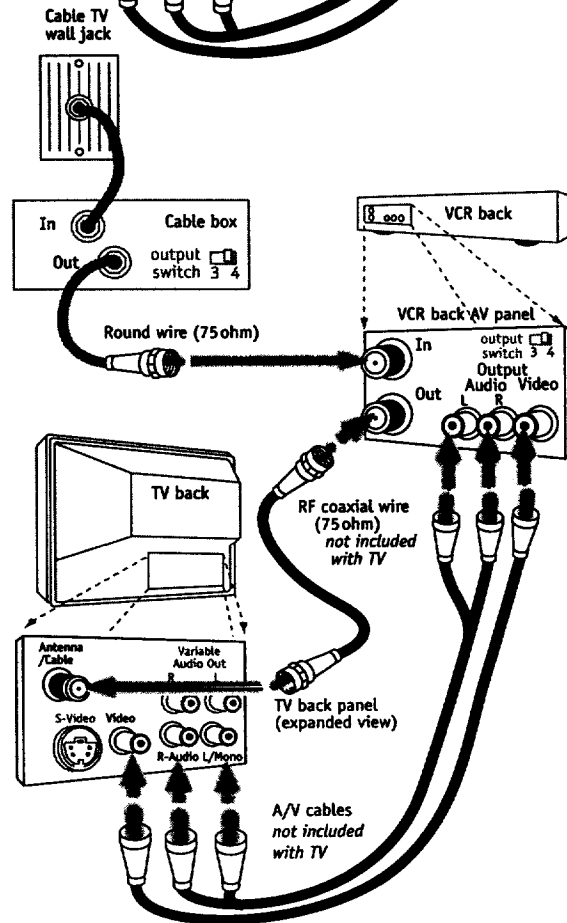
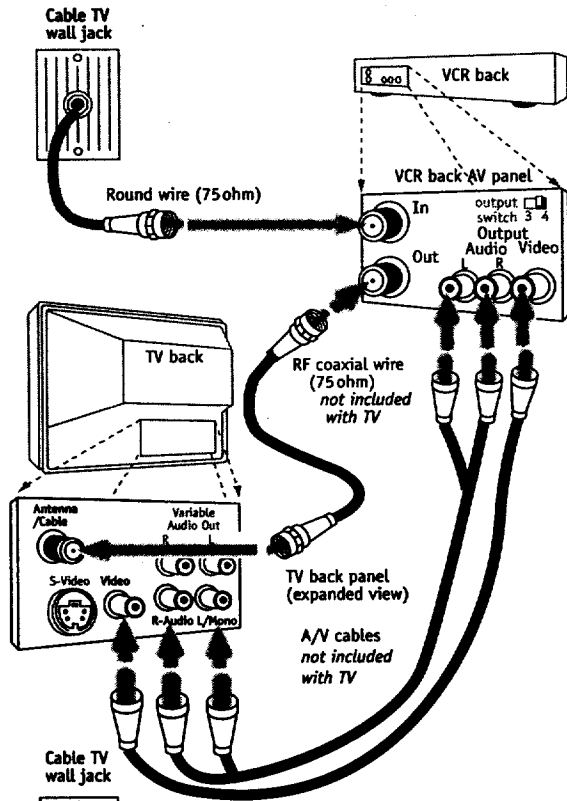

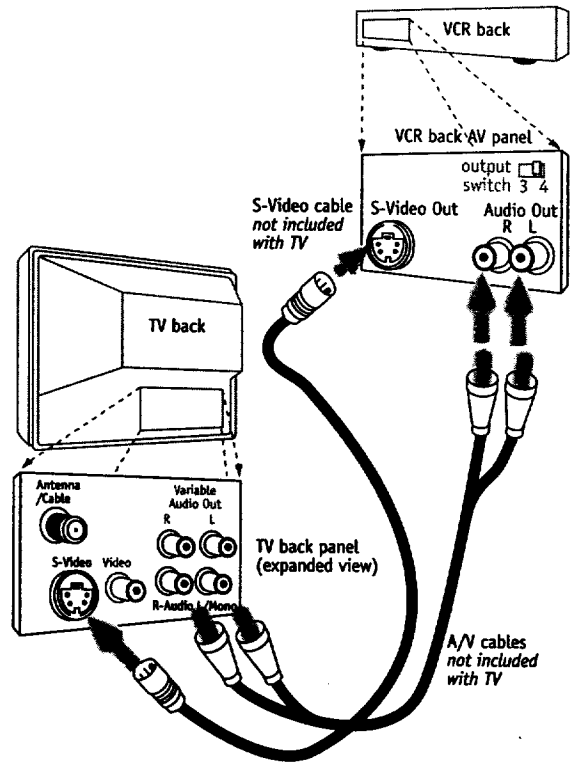

Hook Up Your TV to a Super VHS VCR

- 1 Locate the S-Video Out to TV jack on the back of your S-VHS VCR. Connect the S-VHS cable directly to this jack.
- 2 Connect this cable from the Out to TV jack to the S-Video jack on the back of your TV.
- 3 Find the audio and S-Video jacks on the back of your S-VHS player, and connect them following the instructions provided with your equipment.



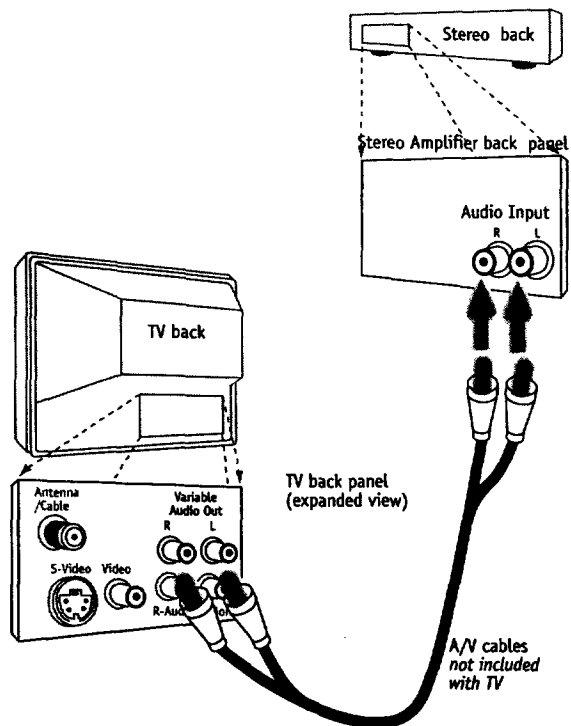
No S-Video cables are included with your Zenith Entertainment Machine, but can be purchased in most consumer electronics stores.. Without an S-Video cable, you will not receive the Super VHS quality picture.

Hook Up Your TV to Stereo Amplifier

For added audio depth and clarity, you can connect your Entertainment Machine to a stereo amplifier!

- 1** Locate the Left/Right Audio Input jacks on the back of your stereo amplifier. Connect the Audio cables directly to these jacks.
- 2** Connect these cables from the Left/Right Variable Audio Input jacks to the corresponding Left/Right Audio Out jacks on the back of your TV.

Connecting your Entertainment Machine to a stereo amplifier.



No Audio cables are included with your Zenith Entertainment Machine, but can be purchased in most consumer electronics stores.

Remote Control Button Functions

A quick list of all the buttons on your remote and what they do.

PRG (PROGRAM)
Used to begin programming procedure.

FLASHBK (FLASHBACK)
Return to the last channel viewed.

SURF
Activates custom channel select mode on your Entertainment Machine. When Surf mode is active, CHANNEL UP/DOWN keys "Surf" through the channels you've selected.

VOLUME (LEFT/RIGHT ARROWS)
Adjusts the sound level on your Entertainment Machine.

MENU
Displays on-screen menus. Press repeatedly to cycle through other menus.

TIMER
Displays the Sleep Timer Menu. See page 21 for more information.

POWER
Turns TV On and Off.

(MODES) CABLE/VCR/AUX/TV
Selects mode of operation for Remote Control

MUTE
Turns sound down (Soft) or off (Mute) while the picture remains.

CHANNEL (UP/DOWN)
Cycles through available channels.

NUMBER KEY PAD
Key-in numbers for direct channel tuning.

ENTER
Shows the Channel/Time display. Press after channel numbers for instant selection.

UP/DOWN ARROW
The UP/DOWN arrows select options.

QUIT/
Escape from most Menu options and toggle between Audio features.

LEFT/RIGHT ARROW
The LEFT/RIGHT arrows adjust options.

TV/VCR SOURCE
Switches between watching TV via the available sources, that is ANTENNA/CABLE and VIDEO IN.

If your remote has Night Vision Glow-In-The-Dark keys, it must be exposed to light before the keys will glow in the dark. Longer exposure—longer glow.

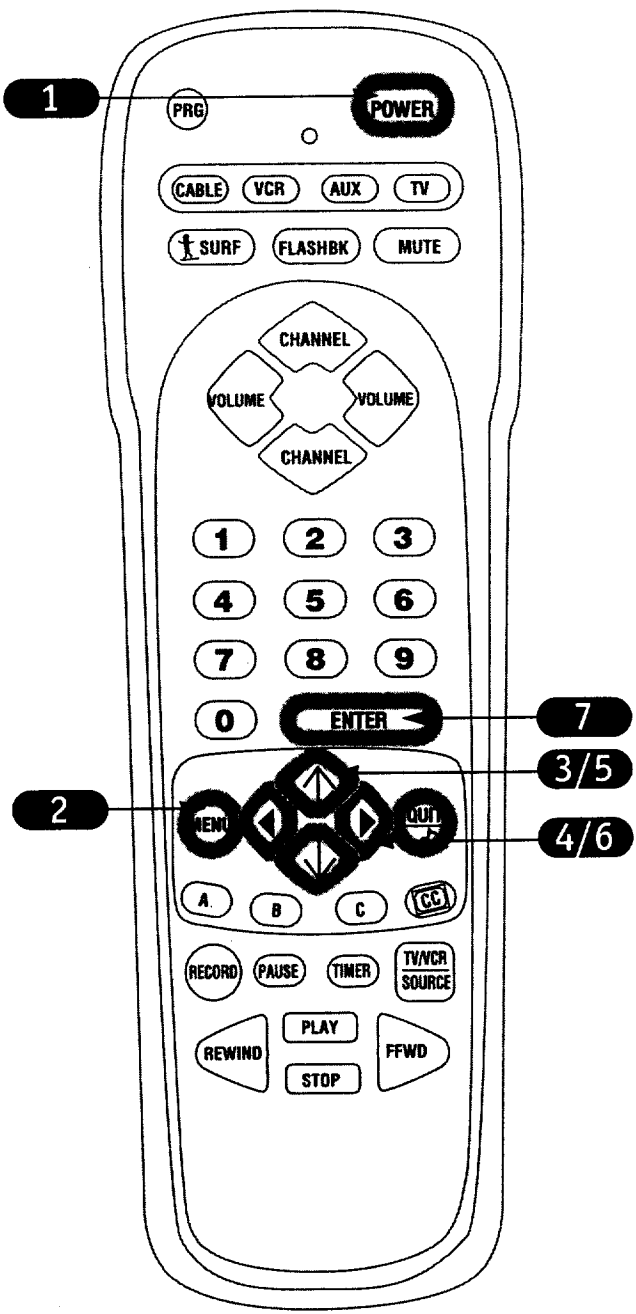
Keys dedicated to VCR functions will still operate your VCR while the remote is in TV mode.

Grey keys indicate that they do not function on your model of TV.

Auto Program

Select your input source, then automatically find and store all the stations available in your area.

- 1** With the remote control in hand, press the POWER key to turn on your Entertainment Machine.
- 2** Press the MENU key so the Setup menu appears.
- 3** Using the UP/DOWN arrows on the remote control, select Auto Program on your screen. (The first selection at the top.)
- 4** Press a RIGHT or LEFT arrow to reach the Auto Program screen.
- 5** Using the UP/DOWN arrows, choose either Cable TV or Off-Air Antenna on your screen.
- 6** Press a RIGHT or LEFT arrow to begin Auto Program.
- 7** Press ENTER or QUIT to return to TV viewing.



AUTO PROGRAM Auto Program is how your Entertainment Machine finds all the channels available in your area and stores them into memory.

An example of using the panel on the front of your Entertainment Machine.

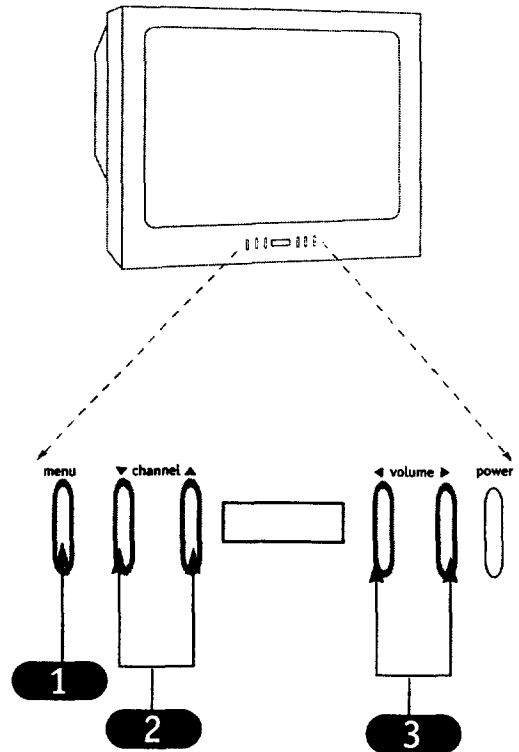
Front Panel Diagram

The front keypads on your Entertainment Machine vary from model to model. Examine the front panel and follow the directions which apply to your machine.

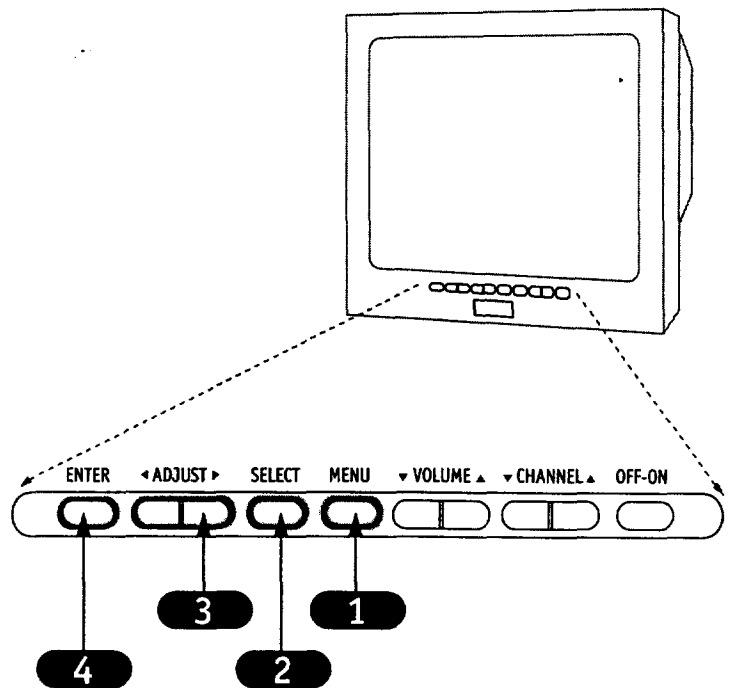
When using the on-screen menus, the buttons on the front keypad correspond to the buttons on the remote control as follows:

- VOLUME = Adjust Left/Right
- CHANNEL = Select Up/Down

- 1** To access the on-screen menus, push the MENU button on the panel. Cycle through the various menus by pushing the button repeatedly.
- 2** Choose the function you wish to change using the CHANNEL UP/DOWN buttons. The Channel buttons act as a "Select" (Up/Down) function.
- 3** The VOLUME buttons act as an "adjustment" (Left/Right) function. Use the VOLUME buttons to make changes or adjustments.



- 1** To access the on-screen menus, push the MENU button on the panel. Cycle through the various menus by pushing the MENU button repeatedly.
- 2** Press the SELECT button repeatedly to highlight the option you want to modify.
- 3** Press either Right or Left on the ADJUST button to modify the option you have chosen.
- 4** Push the ENTER button to return to normal TV viewing.



Menus disappear after five seconds. To get them back, push the MENU button again.

Basic Television Operation

Introducing you to the basics of your Entertainment Machine.

Source

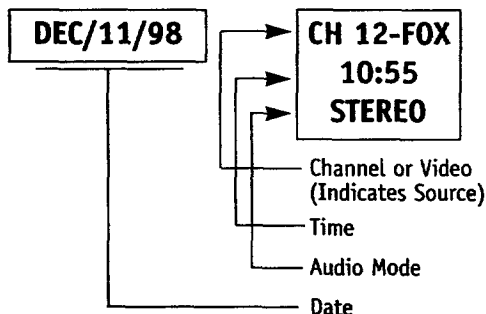
The source button (TV/VCR/Source) on the remote switches between Video input and Cable/Antenna input. On some models A/V input is designated as a channel that is one below the lowest/one above the highest. You'll have to use the Channel Up/Down buttons to access it. The Time/Channel display will read "Video" in place of a channel number.

Cable/Antenna Input: This setting allows you to change cable or antenna channels and to view videocassettes on channel 3 (or 4) in mono sound.

Video Input: This setting allows stereo playback of videocassettes. The television cannot change channels in the Video mode, but the VCR can.



To view the current input source, press ENTER on your remote. The Time/Channel display should appear in the upper right-hand corner of the screen. If the display reads 'Video,' then the source is an A/V input. If the display reads a channel number, then the source is your Cable or Antenna.



This is an example of the Time/Channel display that appears in the top right and left corners of your screen.

Channel Changing

CHANNEL UP/DOWN arrows: Use these arrows to change the channels. Auto Program will have found all channels available to you.

NUMBER Key Pad: To skip to any channel, enter the number of the channel using the NUMBER key pad, then press ENTER.

FLASHBACK: To instantly return to the last channel viewed, press FLASHBACK.

SURF: Switches between the primary channel selection and your customized surf menus. The surf mode will appear in the lower right corner of your screen.



Audio

Volume Right/Left: To adjust the volume level, use the volume Right/Left arrows. To soften the volume of your TV, press MUTE once. To silence your TV instantly, press MUTE twice. To get the sound back, press MUTE again.

Help on combining your Entertainment Machine with more equipment.

Basic Television Operation (cont'd)

There are a number of ways you can choose to integrate your Entertainment Machine with the rest of your equipment. Channels can be changed using the television, the VCR, or the cable box, with advantages to each.

USING THE TELEVISION AS THE TUNER preserves all your channel labels (not available on some models). It also reduces the number of keys on the remote control you need to worry about. (One device, one remote to learn.)

USING THE VCR AS THE TUNER has the advantage of simplifying the recording process. If the VCR is tuned to channel seven, then the VCR will record channel seven.

USING THE CABLE BOX (if you have one) to change the stations sometimes has an advantage, too, especially if your cable provider requires you to use their cable box to descramble their stations.

Setting Up a Tuner

- 1** Based on the advantages listed above, decide what device you want to use as the tuner for your Entertainment Machine.
- 2** Connect the antenna or cable source to the input of your tuner. If you chose your television as the tuner, then you're done. Go watch your Entertainment Machine.
- 3** Connect the output of your tuner to the input of the next device.
- 4** If you used A/V cables for step 3, set the "next device" to Video input. If you used an RF coaxial cable in step 3, then tune the "next device" to match the output channel of your tuner (usually channel 3 or 4).
- 5** Repeat steps 3 and 4 until you reach your Entertainment Machine. Then enjoy!

DEFINITIONS

- TUNER** The television, VCR, or cable box that you use to change channels on your Entertainment Machine.
- A/V CABLES** Audio/Video cables. Three cables bunched together—right audio (red), left audio (white), and video (yellow).
- A/V DEVICE** Any device that produces video or sound (VCR, cable box, or television).

Setting Add/Del/Surf

Customize your channel selection.

- 1** Press the menu button.
- 2** Select the Add/Del/Surf menu (on your TV screen) using the Up/Down select arrows.
- 3** Using either the number pad or the CHANNEL UP/DOWN arrows on the remote, select a channel.
- 4** Using the RIGHT/LEFT select arrows, pick whether that channel is Added, Deleted, or on the Surf list.
- 5** To continue, select another channel. If you are finished, press ENTER or QUIT to return to TV viewing.



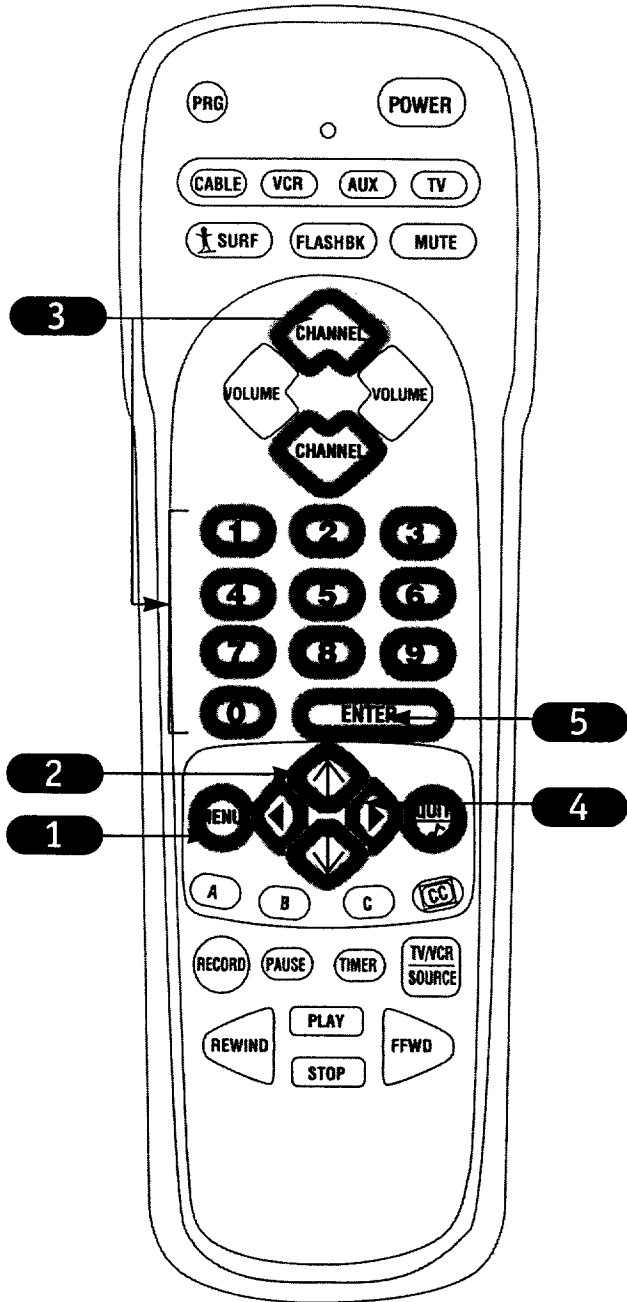
The menu will disappear after five seconds if no buttons are pressed. To get it back, press menu again.



If you delete a channel, it isn't gone for good. Just select the channel again using the number keypad on the remote, or add it later.



Once Auto Program has been activated, CHANNEL UP/DOWN will only cycle through selected channels.



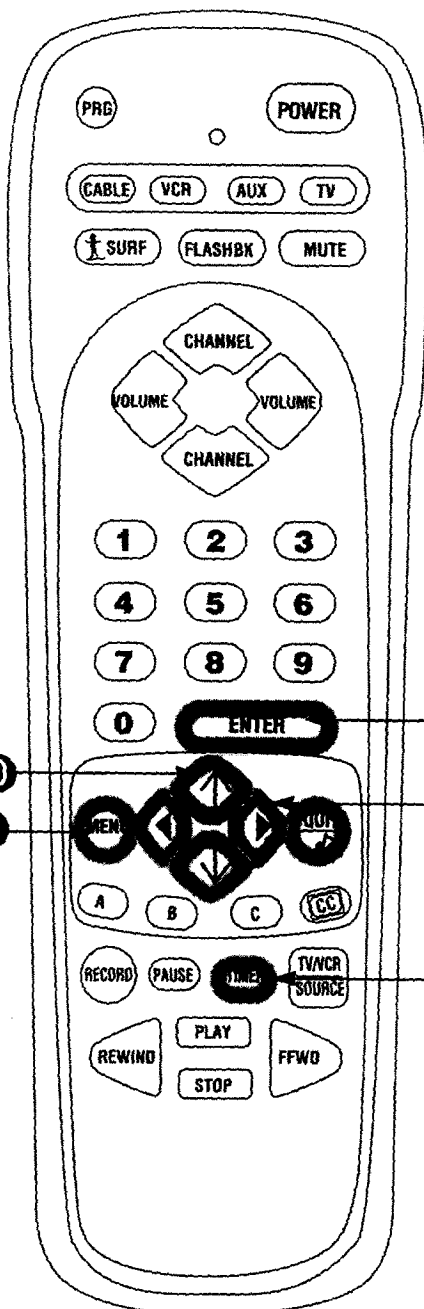
What's New

- ADD** This function lets you add new channels to the list that you'll scroll through when using your remote.
- DELETE** This function lets you remove channels that you don't watch from the list you'll scroll through.
- SURF** The surf function creates a special list of your favorite channels. You can access this group of channels by pushing the surf button on the remote.

Clock Set

Set the clock and date on your Zenith Entertainment Machine.

- 1** Press the MENU key on the remote control so the Setup menu appears.
- 2** Using the UP/DOWN arrows on the remote control, select Clock Set on your screen.
- 3** Press a RIGHT or LEFT arrow to access the Clock Menu.
- 4** Using the UP/DOWN arrows, select Time Set.
- 5** Press a RIGHT or LEFT arrow key to adjust the time.
- 6** Press the TIMER button to select AM or PM.
- 7** Once you have set the correct time, press ENTER exit the Time Set mode.
- 8** Now press an UP/DOWN arrow key to select Date Set.
- 9** Using the LEFT or RIGHT arrows, SELECT the Month, Date or Year.
- 10** Use the UP/DOWN arrow keys to SET either Month, Date, or Year.
- 11** Press ENTER or QUIT to return to TV viewing.



You can use the NUMBER key pad to simply type in the time and date (AM and PM are still selected with the Timer key).

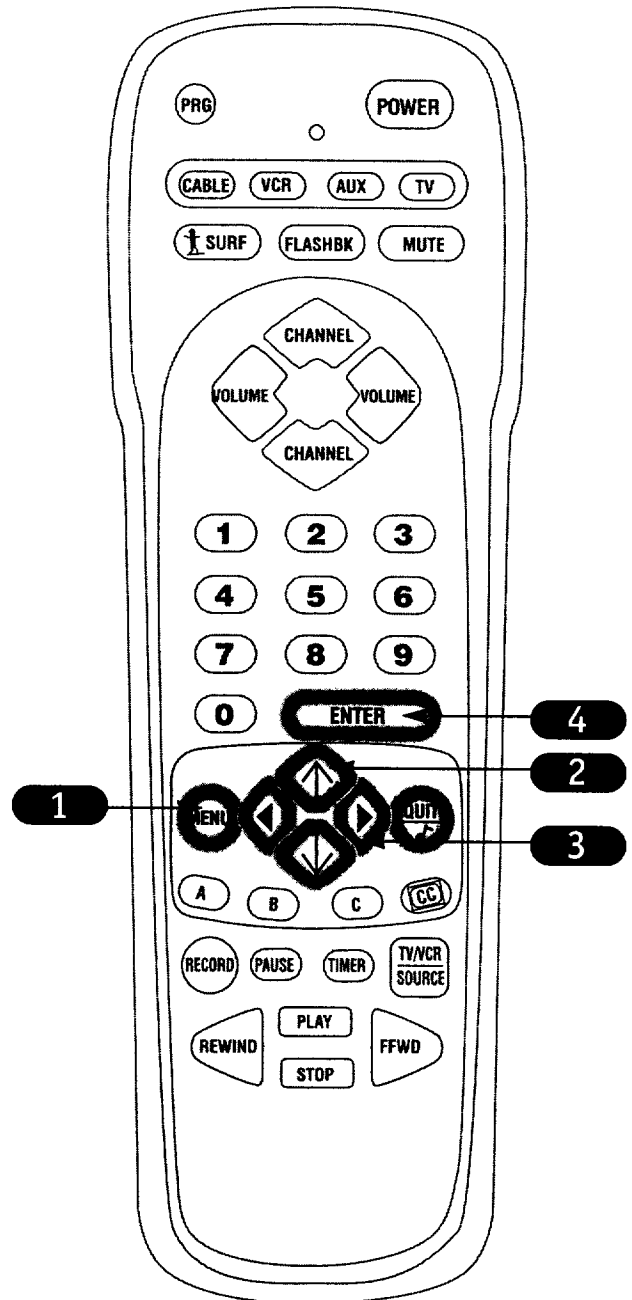
Caption

Turn on closed captioning that appears at the bottom of your screen.

- 1** Press the MENU key on the remote control so the Setup menu appears.
- 2** Using the UP/DOWN arrows on the remote control, select Caption on your screen.
- 3** Press a RIGHT/LEFT arrow to choose any of the following options: On, Caption When Muted, or Off.
- 4** Press ENTER or QUIT to return to TV viewing.



Captions come in handy when the television is on Mute or Soft.

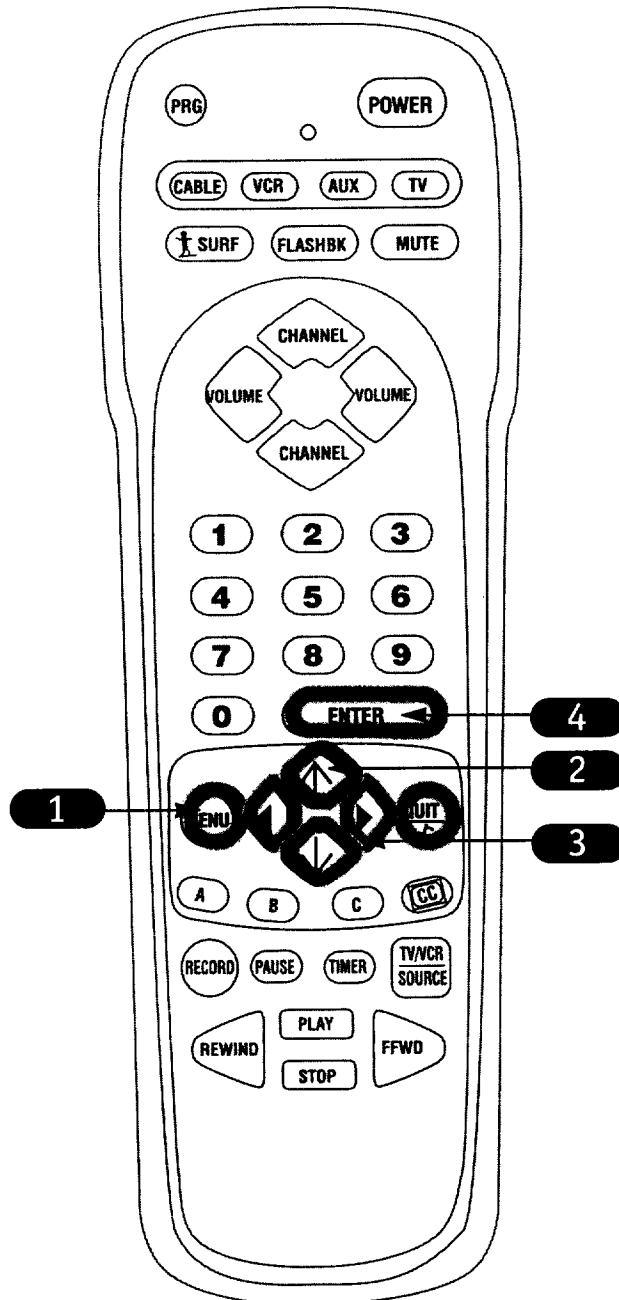


Caption/Text

Caption/Text is a feature which allows your Entertainment Machine to receive various closed caption and text options provided by your broadcaster. Availability and functionality of Caption/Text feature is determined only by your broadcaster and may not be available in your area.

Turn on closed captioning or text that appears on your screen.

- 1** Press the MENU key on the remote control so the Setup menu appears.
- 2** Using the UP/DOWN arrows on the remote control, select Caption/Text on your screen.
- 3** Press a RIGHT/LEFT arrow to choose any of the following options: Caption 1, Caption 2, Caption 3, Caption 4, Text 1, Text 2, Text 3 or Text 4.
- 4** Press ENTER or QUIT to return to TV viewing.



Standard closed captioning is available using the Caption 1 option.

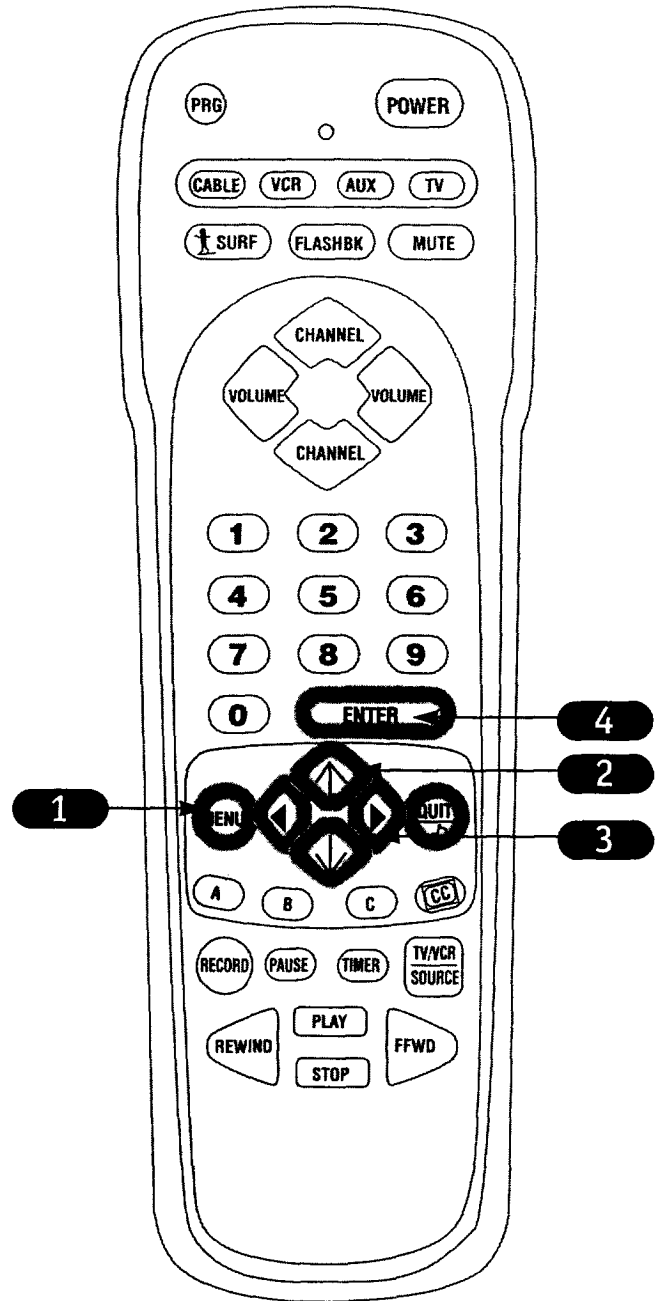


Not all programming has closed captioning or text available.

Choose the language you want all the menus to appear in.

Language Options

- 1** Press the MENU key on the remote control so the Setup menu appears.
- 2** Using the UP/DOWN arrows on the remote control, select Language on your screen.
- 3** Press a RIGHT/LEFT arrow to choose any of the following options: English, Spanish, or French.
- 4** Press ENTER or QUIT to return to regular TV viewing.



Timer

Automatically turn your Zenith Entertainment Machine on or off.

1 Press the MENU key on the remote control repeatedly so the Special Features Menu appears.

2 Using the UP/DOWN arrows on the remote control, select Timer Setup on your screen.

3 Press a RIGHT/LEFT arrow. The Timer Menu screen will appear.

4 Sleep Timer: Use the RIGHT/LEFT arrows to adjust the length of time until the TV shuts down (select a countdown from ten minutes to four hours).

Note: At this point, continue to step five to set the On Time, or press ENTER or QUIT to return to TV viewing.

5 On Time: Using the UP/DOWN arrows on the remote control, select On Time on your screen.

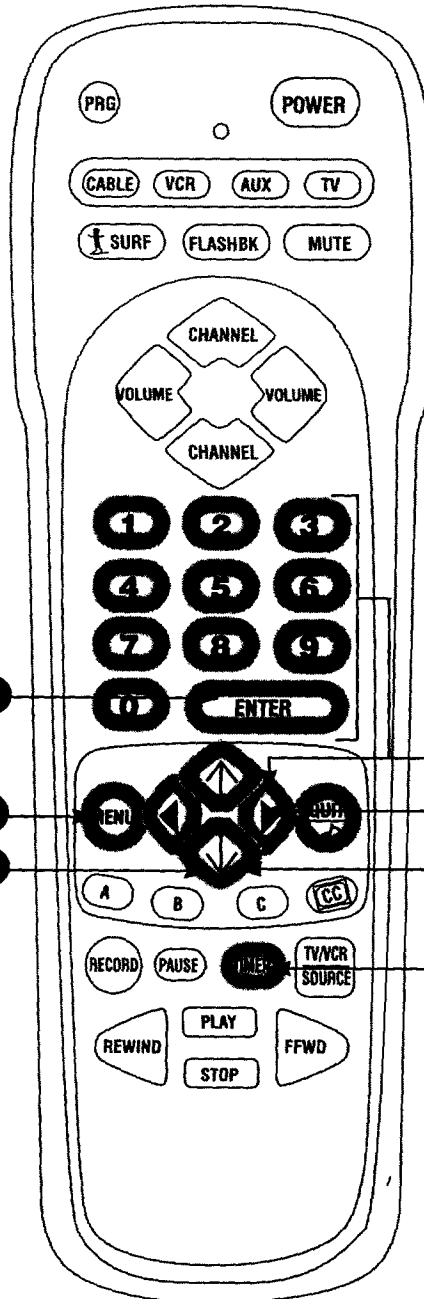
6 Press a RIGHT or LEFT arrow or use the NUMBER key pad to enter the time your TV will automatically turn on.

7 Press the TIMER button to select AM or PM.

8 Press the UP/DOWN arrow keys to select On/Off Timer.

9 Press the LEFT or RIGHT arrow to turn on the On/Off Timer.

10 Press ENTER or QUIT to return to TV viewing or continue programming by repeating the above steps for Off Time.

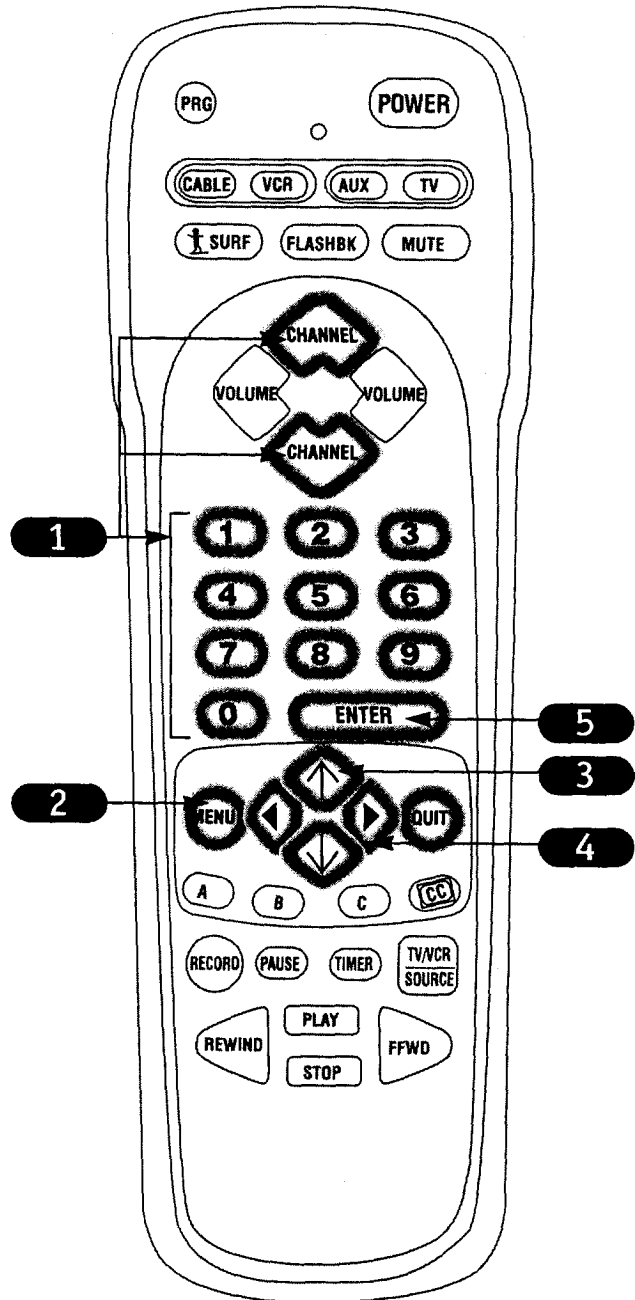


The On/Off timer will not work until the Clock on your television has been set.

Label your television channels.

Channel Labels

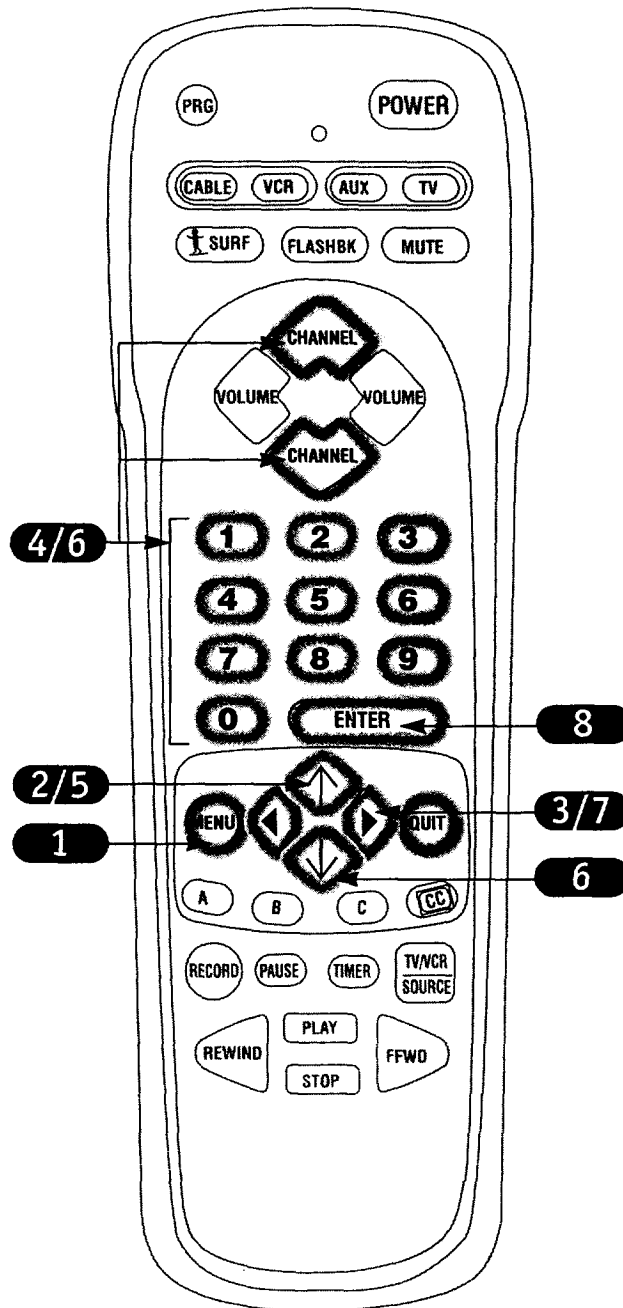
- 1** Using the NUMBER key pad or the CHANNEL UP/DOWN arrows, select the channel you wish to label.
- 2** Press the MENU key on the remote control repeatedly so the Special Features menu appears.
- 3** Using the UP/DOWN select arrows on the remote control, select Ch. Labels on your screen.
- 4** Using the RIGHT/LEFT adjust arrows, choose the channel label that best describes that channel.
- 5** Choose another channel to label using the process described in steps 1 and 4, or press ENTER or QUIT to return to TV viewing.



Parental Controls

Keep control of the kids' viewing habits, even when you're not around.

- 1** Press the MENU key on the remote control repeatedly so the Special Features menu appears.
- 2** Using the UP/DOWN arrows, select Parental Ctl.
- 3** Press the RIGHT/LEFT arrows and the Parental Ctl. screen will appear.
- 4** Block Ch.: Use the NUMBER key pad or the CHANNEL UP/DOWN arrows to choose a channel. Press the RIGHT/LEFT arrows to block or unblock the channel.
- 5** Set Hours: Using the UP/DOWN arrows on the remote control, select Set Hours. Press a RIGHT/LEFT select arrow to adjust length of time your TV will automatically block a channel.
- 6** Password: Press the DOWN arrow to select Password. Enter a four digit code using the NUMBER key pad on your remote. Enter it again to confirm password.
- 7** After your password is confirmed, 'Lock On/Off' will be selected. Use the RIGHT/LEFT arrows to turn parental control on or off.
- 8** Press Enter or Quit to return to TV viewing.
- 9** Return to the Parental Control menu to unblock a channel.



Parental control will still work even if the TV has been unplugged. The Lockout time will always reset itself when the TV is plugged in.



Remember your password! You can't enter the Parental Control menu without it until after the lockout time has passed.

Auto Demo

Your Entertainment Machine will show you all the menu options.

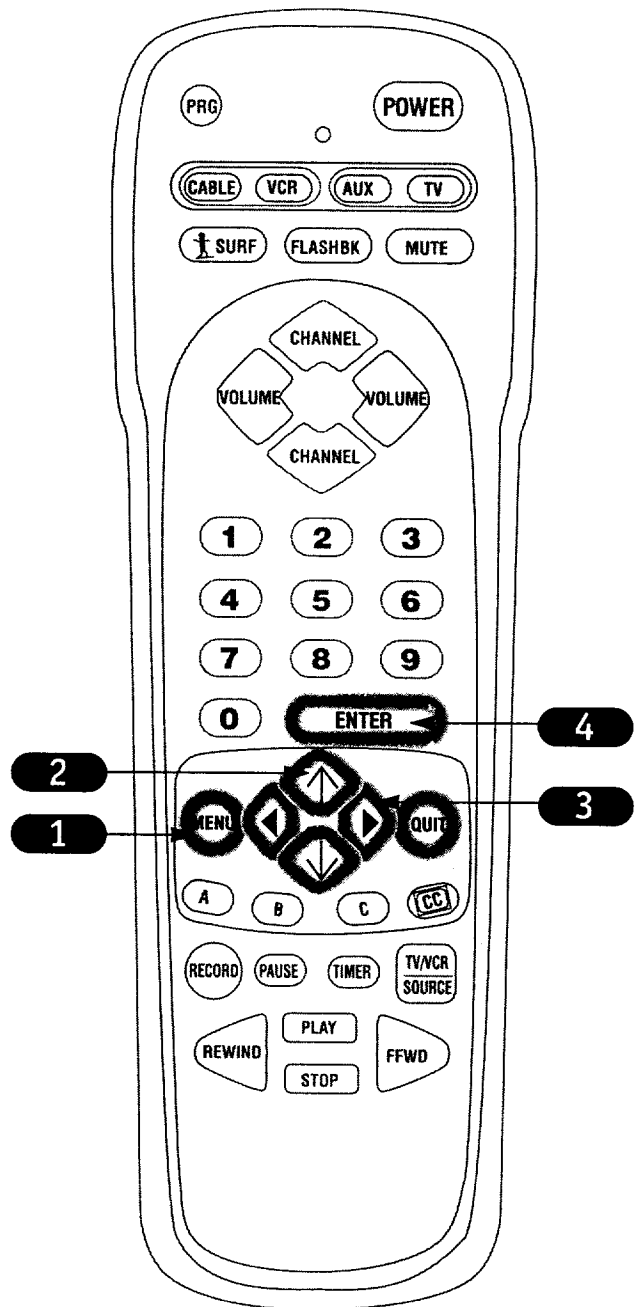
- 1** Press the MENU key on the remote control so the Special Features menu appears.
- 2** Using the UP/DOWN select arrows on the remote control, select Auto Demo on your screen.
- 3** Turn Auto Demo on or off using the RIGHT/LEFT adjust arrows.
- 4** Press ENTER to return to TV viewing.



Auto Demo will continually show you every menu and display that your Zenith Entertainment Machine has. It will even attempt to show you what it does.



To turn Auto Demo off, select it in the Set Up menu and shut it off with the RIGHT/LEFT adjust arrows.



Audio Menu

Choose between stereo sound, mono sound, or SAP.

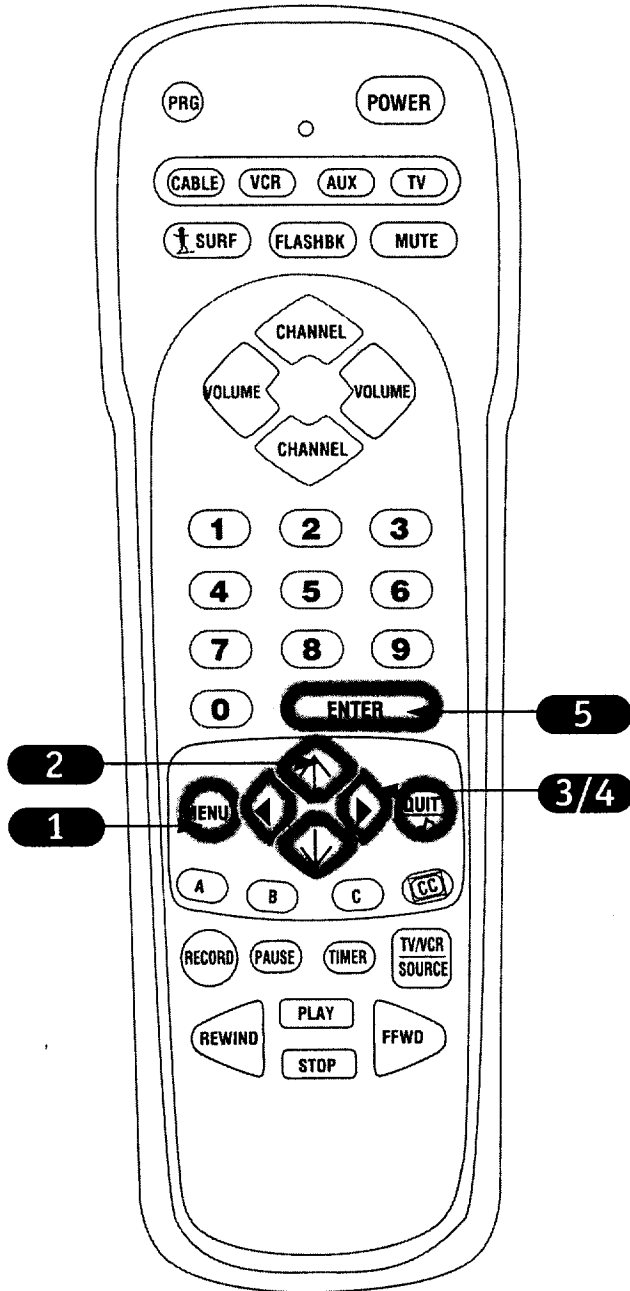
- 1** Press the MENU key on the remote control so the Audio menu appears.
- 2** Using the UP/DOWN arrows on the remote control, select the setting you want to change. Choose from:
 - **Bass:** Increases/decreases lower-end sounds.
 - **Treble:** Increases/decreases higher-end sounds.
 - **Balance:** Allows you to put the sound more to the left or right channel.
 - **Audio Mode:** Choose from Stereo sound, Mono, or 2nd Audio/SAP.
 - **Front Surr:** Turn the front surround sound speakers on or off.
 - **Sound Rite:** Scans for changes in sound level during commercials, then adjusts the sound to match your current level.
 - **Speakers:** Turn the regular speakers on or off.
- 3** Press a RIGHT/LEFT arrow to change the option you have selected.
- 4** Use the RIGHT/LEFT arrows to adjust the sound setting to whatever you prefer.
- 5** Press ENTER or QUIT to return to TV viewing, or press the UP arrow and return to the Audio Menu to adjust another option.



Not all programming is broadcast in stereo sound, or Second Audio Programming/SAP.



QUIT toggles between Audio features.



STEREO SOUND

Stereo (Stereophonic) sound refers to audio that's divided into right and left sides.

MONO SOUND

Mono (monaural) sound is one channel of sound. On more than one speaker all the speakers play the same audio.

2ND AUDIO/SAP

Second Audio Programming (SAP) is another, separate, audio channel available with some programming. Choosing SAP often refers to listening to audio in another language, such as Spanish or French.

Video Menu

Use the Video menu to customize how your picture looks.

1

Press the MENU key repeatedly and the Video menu will appear. Your options are:

- **Contrast:** Adjusts the level of difference between white and black in the TV picture. The more contrast, the brighter the picture appears.
- **Brightness:** Increases or decreases the amount of white in the TV picture.
- **Color:** Adjusts levels of all colors in the TV picture.
- **Tint:** Balances between amounts of red and green in the TV picture.
- **Sharpness:** Raises or lowers the definition of the TV picture. The lower the level, the softer the images will appear.
- **Color Temp:** Adjust the color qualities of the entire picture at once: Cool or Warm.
- **Picture Preference:** Choose either Custom or Preset. Custom allows you to set the picture the way you want. Preset moves all the above options back to their original levels.

Using the UP/DOWN arrows on the remote control, select Contrast on your screen.

3

Using the RIGHT/LEFT arrows, adjust the contrast level to your preference.

4

Press ENTER, QUIT or MENU one more time to return to TV viewing, or repeat from step four to set the other menu options.

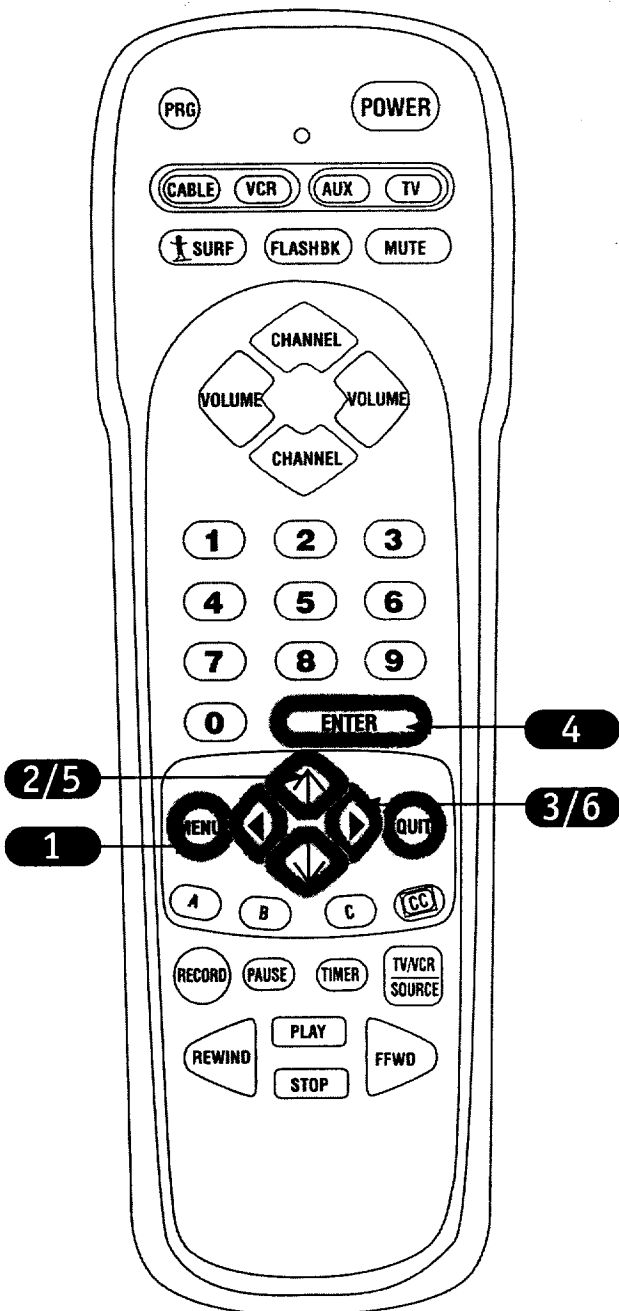

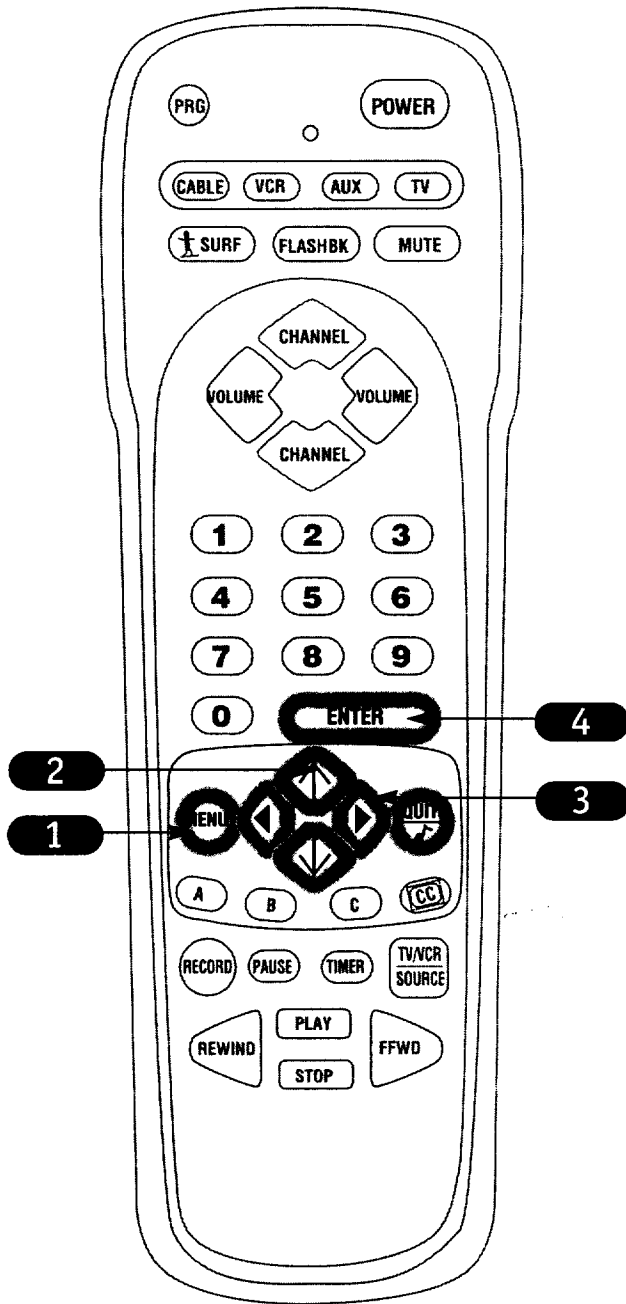

Source Menu

- 1 Press the MENU key on the remote control repeatedly so the Source menu appears.
- 2 Using the UP/DOWN arrows on the remote control, select Main Source on your screen.
- 3 Press a RIGHT or LEFT arrow to choose one of the following options: "Antenna/Cable" or "Video or S-VHS".
- 4 Press ENTER or QUIT to return to TV viewing.



Programming the Remote

Program your remote to work with a vast range of A/V devices.

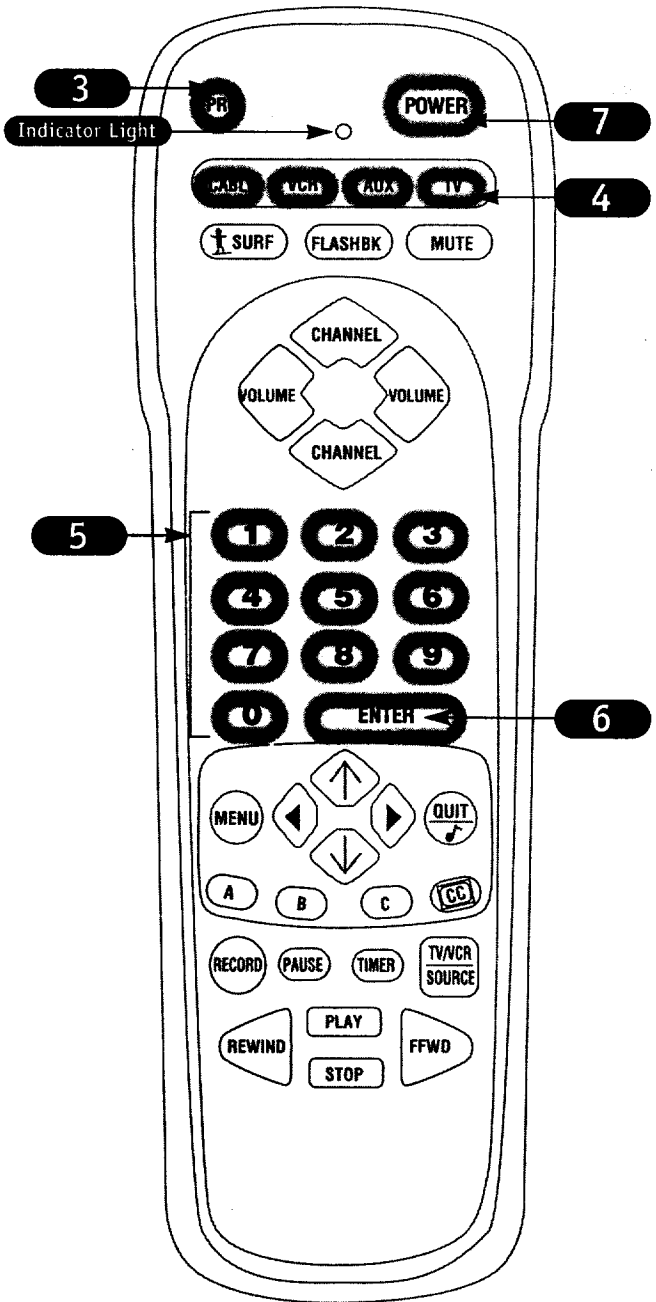
- 1** The device you want to program should be ON.
- 2** On the chart in this manual, find the type of device you're programming and then find the brand name. Make a note of the three-digit code—you'll need it soon.
- 3** Press and hold the PRG key. It's recessed so it doesn't get pushed accidentally. When the indicator light turns on, you can release the button.
- 4** Push the button with the name of the device you're programming (VCR, CABLE, AUX, TV).
- 5** Using the number pad, enter the three digit code found on the chart in the Reference section.
- 6** Press ENTER to save the code. The indicator light will flash three times and turn off if the code was accepted.
- 7** Aim the remote at the device and push the POWER button. It should turn off. If not, try the other codes listed and continue from step three.

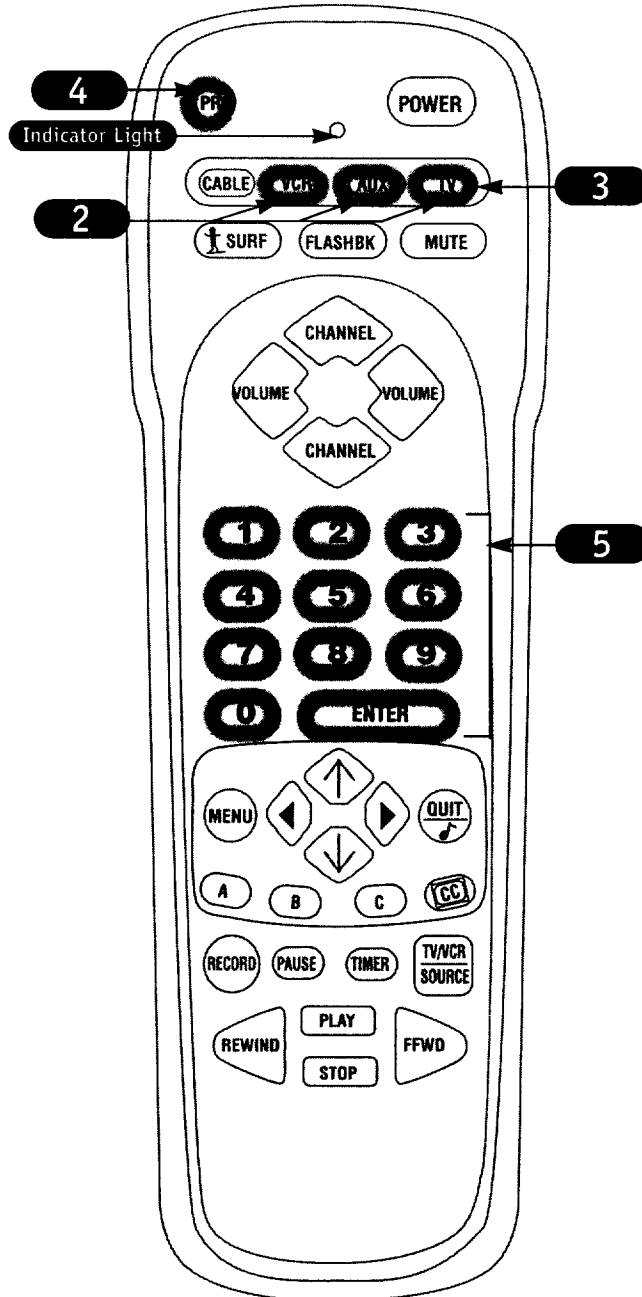

Amplifier Volume Override

Control the volume on your sound amplifier without leaving TV mode.

- 1** Program the code that operates your amplifier into the CABLE or AUX mode, as described on the "Programming Your Remote" page.
- 2** Select the mode in which you want volume to appear (e.g. TV).
- 3** Press and hold PRG on your remote until the indicator light stays lit.
- 4** Press 4-9-9; then ENTER on the remote. The indicator light will flash three times if code is accepted.
- 5** Audio system volume/mute now appears in the mode selected.



Your volume and mute keys now control your amplifier, while all the other keys still operate the Entertainment Machine. To put everything back to normal, reprogram all buttons with their original codes (see the "Programming Your Remote" section).



If you can't find the code for your amplifier, use the Auto Find feature.

AUX+1, AUX+2, AUX+3

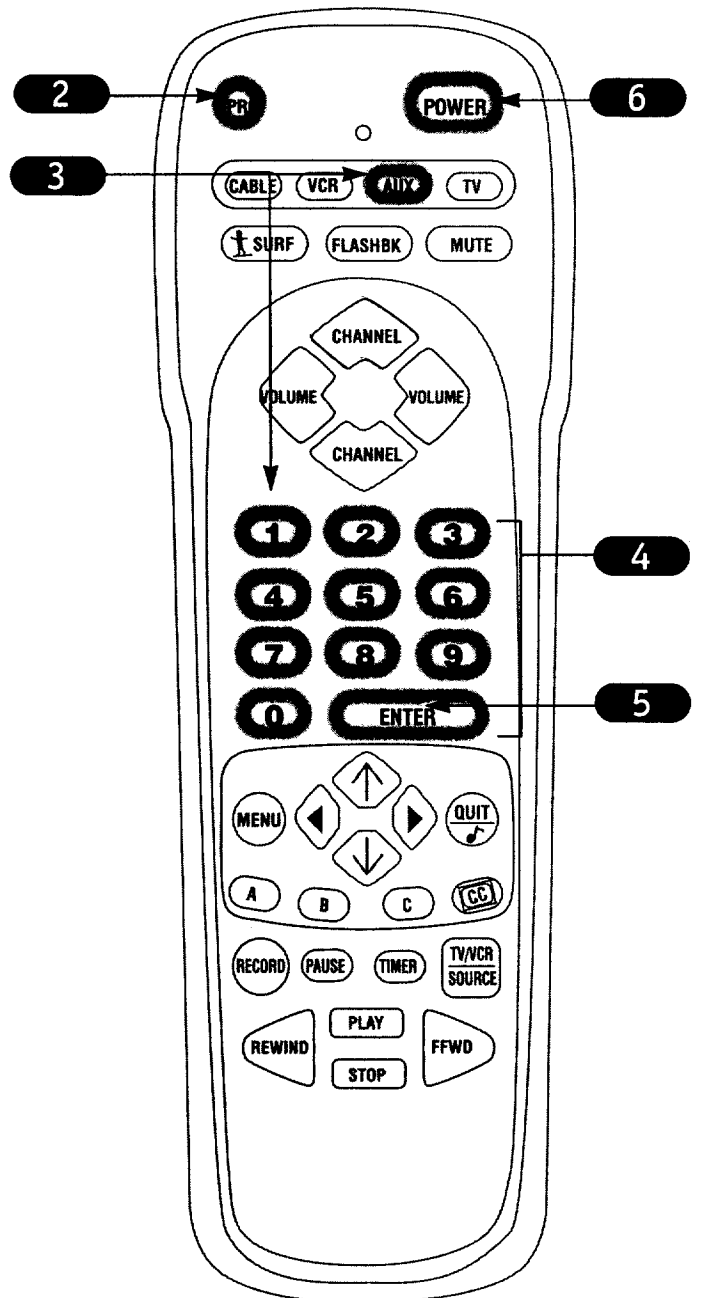
- 1** Refer to the chart in this manual to find the type and brand name of the device you're programming.

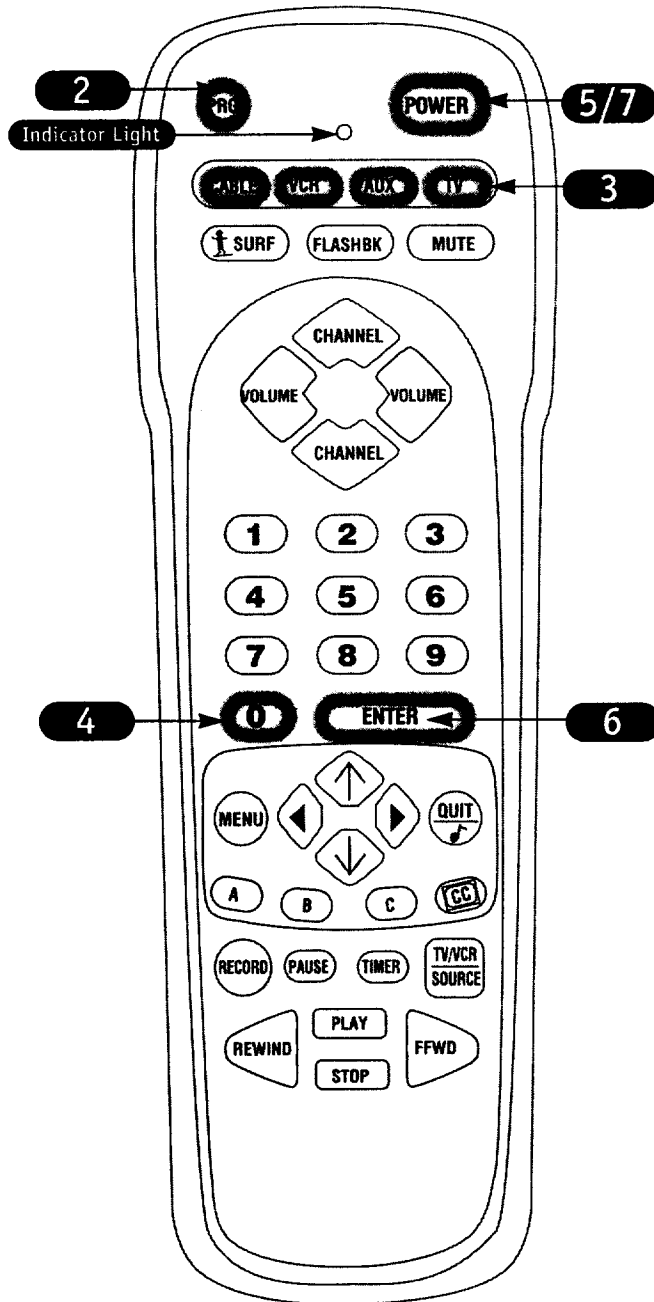

Remote Control Auto-Find

If Programming the Remote did not find your code, try this procedure to automatically find the code for your device. If your remote becomes inoperable, go back to "Programming your Remote" and enter the Zenith TV code for step five.

- 1** Turn on the device you're programming for the remote control.
- 2** Press and hold the PRG key until the indicator light turns on.
- 3** Press the key for the device you're trying to program (CABLE, VCR, AUX, TV).
- 4** Enter the code 0-0-0 (zero-zero-zero), then press the ENTER key right away.
- 5** Aim the remote at the correct device and press the POWER button. Allow a second to pass, then push the POWER button again. **Repeat until the device turns off.** (This is a trial and error process, so it may be necessary to repeat these steps until the remote finds your code.)
- 6** Push ENTER to save the code.
- 7** Press POWER to turn the device back on.



Use the remote control to search all possible codes.



You can quickly get out of Auto Find by pressing the Quit button.



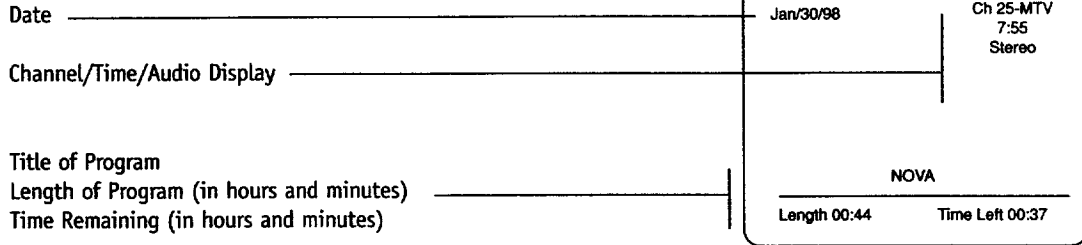
If the indicator light stays on while you push Power, instead of turning off, all the codes have been tried and your device can't be programmed.

XDS Service (Some Channels Only)

Receive detailed program information on most Public Broadcasting stations.

XDS = Extended Data Service

Some broadcasters are including on the signal they provide additional information (data) about the program. This additional information appears on your TV screen when you press ENTER; if the channel has XDS.

Showing XDS Data

Select a channel. Press ENTER to display XDS data; if available.

XDS Channel Labels

XDS can provide a channel label automatically. For the programs to display an XDS channel label, select the dashes (- - -) for that channel from the Channel ID option in the Setup Menu.



At this time, XDS data is only being provided by some broadcasters; it is only available on some channels.



You must set the Clock in the Setup Menu before the time will appear on the Channel/Time Display or on the XDS display.

Maintenance

Early malfunctions can be prevented. Careful and regular cleaning can extend the amount of time you will have with your new Entertainment Machine. Be sure to turn the power off and pull out the plug before you begin any cleaning.

Screen Cleaning

1. Here's a great way to keep the dust off your screen for a while. Wet a soft cloth in a mixture of luke-warm water and a little fabric softener or dish washing detergent. Wring the cloth until it's almost dry, and then use it to wipe the screen.
2. Make sure the excess water is off the screen, and then let it air-dry before you turn on your Entertainment Machine.

Cabinet Cleaning

1. Use a soft cloth with a mild soap solution to wipe the cabinet (avoid using any cleaner that says "industrial strength" or "will wash the white off of rice" on the label).
2. Rinse the cloth and wipe the cabinet again.
3. Let the cabinet air-dry before turning the Entertainment Machine on.

Wood Cabinets

Use a quality wood cleaner and polish. This will protect the Entertainment Machine from dirt and dust, as well as keep the cabinet looking new.

Extended Absence

If you leave your Entertainment Machine dormant for a long time (such as a vacation), it's a good idea to unplug the power to protect against possible damage from lightning or power surges. If you use an off-air antenna, you may also want to disconnect it from the back of your TV before leaving.



If you unplug your Zenith Entertainment Machine, you may have to reset the clock using the Clock Set menu described earlier.

Troubleshooting

Some quick and easy tips to fixing problems yourself.

Snowy picture and lousy sound.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Check your antenna connection or location.
Multiple images or 'ghost shadows.'	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Check your antenna direction and/or location. • Make sure the wire from your antenna to your Entertainment Machine is properly connected.
Interference: Sharp lines across the screen and lousy sound.	<p><i>The following may cause image problems or distortion: Electrical appliances, powerful lights, cars, trucks; computers or portable phones; Medical equipment</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If possible increase the distance between your Entertainment Machine and the offending appliance. Or shut one of them off.
Normal picture but no sound.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Check volume control. • Make sure the TV is not Muted. • Try another channel. The problem may be the broadcast, not your Entertainment Machine. • Are the Audio A/V cables properly installed? • Are the wires for external speakers (if you have external speakers) properly installed?
No picture and lousy sound.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Are you in TV or Cable tuning mode (See Auto Program on page 11), and should be in the other? • Make sure output channels on all A/V equipment are on the same channel (3 or 4). • Check that all connections are tight.
No picture and no sound — The thing is just DEAD!	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Is the AC power plugged in? • Check that your AC power outlet works. (Test it by plugging in something else or try another plug.) • Make sure your brightness and audio controls are set properly. • Try another channel. The problem may be with the broadcast, not your Entertainment Machine.
No color, but the sound is O.K.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Check the color control in the Video menu. • Try another channel. The problem may be with the broadcast.

Picture has two horizontal black bars, one on top and one on bottom.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Your program is in letterbox. Glossary

A complete list of definitions for words found in this guide.

75 OHM RF CABLE	The wire that comes from an off-air antenna or cable service provider. Each end looks like a hex shaped nut with a wire sticking through the middle. It screws onto the threaded jack on the back of your TV.
300 TO 75 OHM ADAPTER	A small device that connects a two-wire 300 ohm antenna to a 75 ohm RF jack. They are usually about an inch long with two screws on one end and a round opening with a wire sticking out on the other end.
A/V CABLES	Audio/Video cables. Three cables bunched together—right audio (red), left audio (white), and video (yellow). A/V cables are used for stereo playback of videocassettes and for higher quality picture and sound from other A/V devices.
A/V DEVICE	Any device that produces video or sound (VCR, cable box, or television).
ADD	This function lets you add new channels to list that you'll scroll through when using your remote.
AMPLIFIER	An external machine that amplifies sound from a television, CD player, VCR, or other A/V device.
ANTENNA	The physical receiver of television signals sent over the air. A large metal piece of equipment does not always have to be visible for your home to be using an antenna.
AUTO PROGRAM all the	Auto Program enables your Entertainment Machine to automatically find channels available in your area.
BLOCK	Restrict or censor a channel for a set length of time.
DELETE	This function lets you remove channels that you don't watch from the list you'll scroll through using your remote.
INPUT	Refers to the jack that receives a signal from a TV, VCR or other A/V device.

JACK	A connection on the back of a TV, VCR, or any other A/V device.
MONO SOUND	Mono (monaural) sound is one channel of sound. On more than one speaker, all the speakers play the same audio.

SECOND AUDIO PROGRAMMING/SAP	Second Audio Programming (SAP) is another separate, audio channel available with some programming. Choosing SAP often refers to listening to audio in another language, such as Spanish or French.
SIGNAL	Picture and sound traveling through cable, or on the air, to your television screen.
STEREO SOUND	Stereo (stereophonic) sound refers to audio that's divided into right and left sides.
TUNER	Device that picks up the signal and turns them into picture and sound.

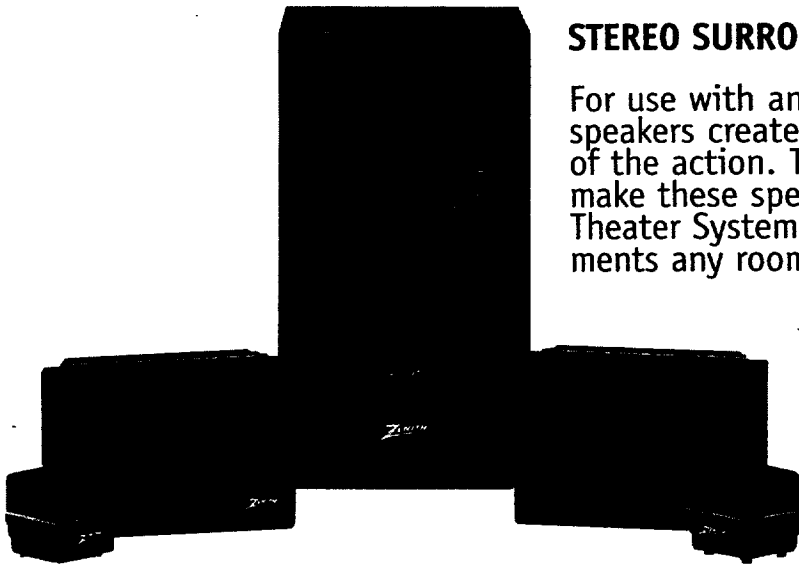

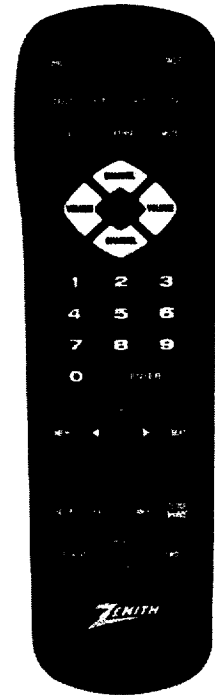

- Parts** New or remanufactured replacements for factory-defective parts will be supplied by a Zenith authorized service center for one year from effective warranty date (color picture tube — two years). Such replacement parts are warranted for the remaining portion of the original warranty period.
