- 4. Follow Instructions-Follow all safety and operation instructions.
- Cleaning-Unplug TV/VCR from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.
- 6. Attachments-Do not use attachments not recommended by the TV/VCR manufacturer as they may cause hazards.
- 7. Water and Moisture-Do not use this TV/VCR near water, for example, near a bath tub, wash bowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool, and the like.
- 8. Accessories-Do not place this TV/VCR on an unstable cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table. The TV/VCR may fall, causing serious injury to someone, and serious damage to the appliance. Use only with a cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table recommended by the manufacturer, or sold with the TV/VCR. Any mounting of the appliance should follow the manufacturer's instructions and should use a mounting accessory recommended by the manufacturer. An appliance and cart combination should be moved with care.

Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the appliance and

cart combination to overturn.



- 9. Ventilation-There are slots and openings in the TV/VCR cabinet to provide ventilation and protect it from overheating These openings must not be blocked or covered. Do not place the TV/VCR on a bed, sofa, rug, or similar surface that will cause the ventilation openings to be blocked. Never place the TV/VCR near or over a radiator or heat register. Never place the TV/VCR in a built-in installation such as a bookcase or rack unless proper ventilation space is provided for it according to the instructions in this owner's manual.
- 10. Power Sources-This TV/VCR should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your appliance dealer or local power company. For TV/VCRs intended to operate from battery power, or other sources, refer to the operating instructions.
- 11. Grounding or Polarization-This TV/VCR is equipped with a polarized alternating-current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug.
- 12. Power-Cord Protection-Route power supply cords so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed on or against them. Take special care to keep all TV/VCR plug and cord-exit points clear of contact with other items.



- 13.Outdoor Antenna grounding-If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the TV/VCR, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Article 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA No. 70, provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode. (Fig. A)
- 14.Lightning-During a lightning storm, or before leaving it unattended and unused for a long period of time, unplug the TV/VCR from the wall outlet, and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the TV/VCR from lightning and power-surges.
- 15.Power Lines-An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching power lines or circuits, as contact with them might be fatal.
- 16.Overloading-Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.
- 17.Object and Liquid Entry-Never push objects of any kind into this TV/VCR through openings as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short out parts that could result in a fire or electric shock. Never spill liquid of any kind on the TV/VCR,
- 18.Servicing-Do not attempt to service this TV/VCR yourself as opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.

- 19.Damage Requiring Service-Unplug this TV/VCR from the wall outlet and refer servicing to qualified service personnel under the following conditions:
 a.When the power-supply cord or plug is damaged or frayed.
 - b. If liquid has been spilled, or objects have fallen into the TV/VCR.

 - d.If the TV/VCR does not operate normally by following the operating instructions.  - e.if the TV/VCR has been dropped or damaged in any way.
 - f. When the TV/VCR exhibits a distinct change in performance it needs to be serviced.
- 20.Replacement Parts-When replacement parts are required, be sure the service technician has used replacement parts specified by the manufacturer that have the same characteristics as the original part. Unauthorized substitutions may result in fire, electric shock, injury to persons or other hazards.
- 21.Safety Check-Upon completion of any service or repairs to this TV/VCR, ask the service technician to perform routine safety checks to determine that the TV/VCR is in proper operating condition.
- 22.Heat- This TV/VCR product should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other products (including amplifiers) that produce heat.

Location

For safe operation and satisfactory performance of your TV/VCR, keep the following in mind when selecting a place for its installation:

- Shield it from direct sunlight and keep it away from sources of intense heat.
- Avoid dusty or humid places.
- For proper heat dissipation, avoid places with insufficient ventilation. Do not block the ventilation holes at the top and bottom of the unit. Do not place the unit on a carpet because this will block the ventilation holes.
- Install unit in a horizontal position.
- Avoid locations subject to strong vibration.
- Do not place the TV/VCR near strong magnetic fields.
- Avoid moving TV/VCR to locations where temperature differences are extreme.

- Rotary 4-head Record/Playback System–Four heads ensure excellent picture quality and special effects playback.
- Index Search–Fast-forwards to start of next recording.
- Slow Motion–View recorded program at slower than normal speed. Control the playback speed slowness by pressing the F.FWD button to go faster, or the REW button to go slower.
- Infrared remote control
- Bilingual on-screen menu display selectable in English or Spanish
- Real time counter-This shows the elapsed recording or playback time in hours, minutes, and seconds. The "--" indication will appear when the tape is rewound further than the tape counter position "0:00:00".

VIDEO CASSETTE

This TV/VCR will operate with any cassette that has the <u>VHS</u> mark. For best results, we recommend the use of high-quality tapes. Do not use poor quality or damaged tapes.

PRECAUTIONS

- Avoid moisture. Moisture condensation may occur inside the unit when it is moved from a cold place to a warm place, or after heating a cold room or under conditions of high humidity. If a tape is played in a TV/VCR which has moisture, it may damage the tape and TV/VCR. Therefore when you suspect that condensation has occurred inside the unit, turn the POWER button ON and allow at least 2 hours for the unit to dry out.
- Avoid extreme heat, high humidity and magnetic fields.
- Do not tamper with the cassette mechanism.
- Do not touch the tape with your fingers.

TAPE SPEEDS

You may choose to record at two different tape speeds:

- SP-Standard Play
- SLP- Super Long Play

NOTE: You can play back a tape recorded in LP (Long Play) mode.

INSERTING A CASSETTE

Position cassette with the view-window facing up, as pictured below. Insert cassette into cassette slot by pushing in gently, but continuously, on the center of the cassette back until cassette is drawn into the TV/VCR.

Once cassette is fully inserted, the TV/VCR will automatically turn on.



REMOVING A CASSETTE

- 1) With the TV/VCR in the Stop mode, press the EJECT button on the remote control, or press the STOP/EJECT button on the TV/VCR. The cassette will eject.
- 2) Pull the cassette out of the cassette compartment.
- 3) Store the cassette in its case as shown.



ERASE PREVENTION

You can prevent accidental erasing of recording by breaking off the tab on the back edge of the cassette.



If you decide to record on the tape again, cover the hole with plastic tape.



NOTES:

- We do not recommend that you use a "universal" remote control to operate this TV/VCR. Not all of the functions may work. Call the manufacturer of the universal remote control, not Sears, if you have problems with it.
- Depending on your antenna system, you may need other connectors in addition to the coaxial cable supplied with this unit. See Antenna/Cable Connections section of this manual.

- REMOTE CONTROL -



1 EARPHONE(earphone) jack-

Connects to earphones (not supplied) for personal listening. The size of jack is 1/8" monaural (3.5mm).

2 AUDIO(audio) input jack-

Connect to the audio output jack of your audio equipment, video camera or another VCR.

3 VIDEO(video) input jack-

Connect to the video output jack of your video camera or another VCR.

4 STOP(stop/eject) button-

Press to stop the tape motion.

EJECT(stop/eject) button-

Press in the Stop mode to remove tape from TV/VCR (TV/VCR Front panel only).

Select the setting modes from the on-screen menu. Press to enter digits when setting program. (For example: Setting clock or timer program)

5 REW(rew) button-

Press to rewind the tape, or to view the picture rapidly in reverse during the PLAY mode. Press to select a mode from a particular menu. (For example: Language or user's set up)

6 PLAY(play) button-

Press to start the PLAY mode.

Select the setting modes from the on-screen menu. Press to enter digits when setting program. (For example: Setting clock or timer program)

7 F.FWD(ff) button-

Press to rapidly advance the tape, or to view the picture rapidly in forward during playback mode.

When setting program (For example: Setting clock or timer program), press to determine your selection and proceed to the next step you want to input. Press to determine setting modes from on-screen menu. Press to select a mode from a particular menu. (For example: Language or user's set up)

8	REC(ORD)(rec) button-
	Press for manual recording.
	OTR button- Activates One Touch Recording.
	(Only on the TV/VCR)

9 RECORD indicator-Flashes during recording. Lights up in the Stand-by mode for Timer Recording.

10 Remote Sensor Window-Receives the infrared signals from the remote control.

11 CHANNEL(ch) UP/DOWN buttons-Press to select the desired channels for viewing or recording.

TRACKING function– Press to minimize video 'noise' (lines or dots on screen) during playback mode.

12 VOLUME(vol)+/-(UP/DOWN) buttons--Adjust the volume level.

13 PWR(power) button-

Press to turn TV/VCR on and off. Press to activate timer recording.

14 Cassette slot-

Insert the cassette here.

15 Number buttons-

Press to select desired channels for viewing or recording. To select channels from 1 to 9, first press the 0 button and then 1 to 9.

100+ button– When selecting cable channels which are higher than 99, press this button first, then press the last two digits. (To select channel 125, first press the "100+" button then press "2" and "5").

16 MENU button-

Press to display the main menu on the TV screen.

- REAR VIEW -

17 DISPLAY button-

Display the counter or the current channel number and current time on the TV screen.

18 SPEED button-

Press to choose the desired recording speed: SP/SLP.

19 T-PROG. CLEAR button-

Press to cancel a timer program setting. (See page 29.)

COUNTER RESET button- Press to reset counter to 0:00:00.

20 GAME button-

Sets the game mode and external input mode at the same time.

21 SLOW button-

Press to start slow motion playback. The slow speed can be controlled by pressing the F.FWD button (faster) or the REW button (slower). (only on the remote control).

22 PAUSE/STILL button-

Press to temporarily stop the tape during the recording or to view a still picture during playback.

23 MUTE button-

Mutes the sound. Press it again to resume sound.

24 CHANNEL RETURN button-

Press to go back to the previously viewed channel. For example, pressing this button once will change channel display from 3 (present channel) to 10 (previously viewed channel), and pressing it a second time will return from 10 to 3.

25 WAKE UP/SLEEP button-

Sets the Wake up or Sleep Timer.

26 Power cord-

Connect to a standard AC outlet (120V/60Hz).

27 ANT. terminal-

Connect to an antenna or cable system.



PREPARATION FOR USE

Antenna/Cable Connections

VHF/UHF COMBINED ANTENNA

The VHF/UHF Dipole Antenna (not supplied) is detachable. Insert the stem of the antenna into the hole on the upper-back portion of the TV/VCR.

Connect the VHF/UHF Dipole Antenna or VHF/UHF Combination Antenna to the Antenna terminal of the TV/VCR as shown in the diagram below.

For the best reception, fully extend the VHF/UHF Dipole Antenna and make the necessary adjustments. (Avoid touching the top section when adjusting.)



NOTE:

The connection of an indoor antenna may not always give acceptable TV reception.

VHF/UHF OUTDOOR ANTENNAS

In some areas it will be necessary to use an outdoor antenna. If you have separate UHF and VHF antennas, you will need a VHF/UHF combiner (not supplied) to make the connection to the Antenna terminal of the TV/VCR. If you have a VHF/UHF 75 ohm combination antenna, you can make the connection to the Antenna terminal of the TV/VCR without needing a VHF/UHF combiner.



CABLE WITHOUT CONVERTER/ DESCRAMBLER BOX

If your cable system does not require a converter box, simply connect the 75 ohm coaxial cable (not supplied) from the cable system wall outlet to the Antenna terminal of your TV/VCR.



Note to CATV system installer:

This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

CABLE WITH CONVERTER/ DESCRAMBLER BOX OR SATELLITE BOX

You cable system may require a converter box, or if you use a satellite system, you will need a satellite box. in each case, you must connect a 75 ohm coaxial cable (not supplied) from the cable system wall outlet to the box, and another 75 ohm coaxial cable from the box to the Antenna terminal of your TV/VCR. See below.



TO RECORD A SCRAMBLED/UNSCRAMBLED CHANNEL

- 1. Set the TV/VCR channel selector to the output channel(3 or 4) of the cable or satellite box.
- 2. Select the channel to be recorded or viewed on the cable or satellite box.

Installing the Batteries

- 1) Open the battery compartment cover by pressing the cover on the remote unit in the direction of the arrow.
- Insert 2 "AA" penlight batteries into the battery compartment in the direction indicated by the polarity (+/-) markings.
- 3) Replace the cover.



External Input Mode

When using an external input signal (another VCR or video camera), connect the player's

audio/video output cables to the AUDIO IN/VIDEO IN jacks of your TV/VCR. Then press the CHANNEL UP or DOWN button until "AUX" appears on the screen.



CHANNEL MEMORY PROGRAMMING

Use this feature to program the TV/VCR tuner to scan and memorize all the channels you receive in vour area.

You can use this feature to memorize cable channels only if your cable system connects directly from its wall outlet to the Antenna terminal of your TV/VCR. You cannot use this feature when the TV/VCR is connected to a cable or satellite box.



5 After scanning

The tuner stops on the lowest memorized channel. If you want to recall the selected channels, you can select the desired channel directly with the remote control number buttons or CHANNEL UP - 13 or DOWN.

5 Exit the channel setup mode

Press the MENU button on the remote control to return to TV mode.

NOTE: Press the CHANNEL UP or DOWN button to confirm that channel(s) have been deleted or added.

Channel Set Up Again

Make sure:

Press the POWER button to turn on the TV/VCR.

1 Select "CHANNEL SET UP" Press the MENU button on -MENUthe remote control. Press the PLAY or STOP button to point to "CHANNEL SET UP". Then, press the F.FWD button.



2 Begin auto preset Press the PLAY or STOP button to point to "AUTO PRESET".

- CHANNEL SET UP -ADD / DELETE CH (TV) AUTÓ PRESET

Then, press the F.FWD

button. The tuner scans and memorizes all the active channels in your area.

3 After scanning

The tuner stops on the lowest memorized channel.

Selecting the Language

Make sure:

 Press the POWER button to turn on the TV/VCR. NOTE: This feature only changes the on-screen menu language. It does not change the language you hear spoken on the TV.

1 Select "LANGUAGE" Press the MENU button on the remote control. Press the PLAY or STOP button to point to "LANGUAGE".

NOTE: If for some reason the menu is in Spanish, press the MENU button on the remote control, press the PLAY button to point to "IDIOMA [ESPAÑOL]", then press the F.FWD button, then press the MENU button on the remote control.

Daylight-Saving Time

If you select this feature, the TV/VCR's clock immediately advances one hour in April and reverses one hour in October.

- First Sunday of April : At 2 AM the clock immediately changes to 3 AM. Any timer programming you have set to occur between 2 AM and 3 AM will not record.
- Last Sunday of October : At 2 AM the clock immediately changes to 1 AM.

Make sure:

Clock Set Up (Auto / Manual)

Set the clock accurately for proper automatic timer recording. If a Public Broadcasting Station (PBS) is available in your area, follow "AUTO CLOCK SETTING". If there isn't one, then follow "MANUAL CLOCK SETTING".

AUTO CLOCK SETTING

You can have the TV/VCR set the clock time and date automatically via the Extended Data Service (XDS) of your local Public Broadcasting Station (PBS) channel.

Make sure:

- TV/VCR power must be turned on.
- Antenna connections are correct.
- Cable converter box is turned on if your TV/VCR is connected to one.
- The channel is properly set in advance. (See page 14.)

NOTES:

- Auto clock setting only needs to be set once. But it can be done again if the clock's time has become incorrect for some reason.
- If the TV/VCR is connected directly to a cable converter box or satellite box, the local PBS station must be selected on the cable box itself. The TV/VCR must be set to the output channel of the cable or satellite box (usually channel 3 or 4), to be able to set up or correct the clock automatically.
- The TV/VCR cannot control the channels of the cable or satellite box.

1 Select "SETTING CLOCK" Press the MENU button on the remote control.

Press the PLAY or STOP button to point to "SETTING CLOCK".

Turn the TV/VCR off. The Auto Clock functions automatically when the TV/VCR is off.

If you choose [AUTO]:

- The TV/VCR must scan each channel for a couple of seconds to determine if it is transmitting an XDS signal.
- If the time automatically set by [AUTO] is incorrect, it may have accessed the XDS signal from a PBS channel outside your time zone. In this case, you must manually enter the correct PBS channel.
- If [AUTO] cannot locate a XDS signal, you must set the clock manually.

To view the Counter or Clock/Channel information, press the DISPLAY button once for Counter mode and twice for Clock/Channel mode. When the Closed-Caption mode is OFF, press the

DISPLAY button to clear the Counter or Clock/Channel information. When the Closed-Caption mode is ON, the On-Screen display disappears after 5 seconds.

SPECIAL FEATURES

Degaussing

Magnetism from nearby appliances might affect the color of the TV picture.

If this happens, move this unit away from the appliance. If the color is still not correct, disconnect the power cord from the AC outlet, then reconnect it after 30 minutes.

Real Time Tape Counter

This shows the elapsed recording or playback time in hours, minutes, and seconds. (The displayed time will not change on a blank tape or blank portions on the tape.)

The "-" indication will appear when the tape has rewound further than "0:00:00" on the tape counter.

Auto Rewind-Eject

- When the end of a tape is reached during recording, playback, or fast-forward, the tape will automatically rewind to the beginning. After rewinding finishes, the TV/VCR will eject the tape and turn itself off.
- This function will operate when Repeat Play is turned off.
- The tape will not auto-rewind during timer recording or One Touch Recording.

TV OPERATION

Watching a TV Program

1 Turn on the TV/VCR Press the POWER button to turn on the TV/VCR.

2 Select the channel number

- · When setting the Picture Control, the Game mode will be cancelled.

Closed Caption System

You can view specially labeled (cc) TV programs, movies, news and prerecorded tapes with either a dialogue caption or text display.

- CAPTION mode: When you choose the Caption mode, program dialogue will be captioned at the bottom of the screen.
- TEXT mode: By choosing the text mode, you can watch half-screen text information.
- NOTE: Within Caption or Text mode, you have a choice of selecting "1" or "2". Selection "2" usually offers captions or text in a second language, if one is available.

NOTE:

Not all programs are broadcast with closed captions. Your television is designed to provide error free closed captions from high quality antenna, cable and VCR signals. Conversely, poor quality signals are likely to result in caption errors or no captions at all. Common signal conditions that may cause caption errors are listed below:

- Automobile ignition noise.
- · Electric motor brush noise.
- Weak snowy reception on TV screen.
- Multiplex signal reception displaying picture ghosts or airplane flutter.
- Playback of poorly recorded or worn VCR tapes.

NOTE: If there is a black box on the TV screen, the TV/VCR is set to TEXT mode. To clear screen, select [CAPTION1], [CAPTION2] or [OFF].



1 Select "CAPTION" Press the MENU button on the remote control. Press the PLAY or STOP button to point to "CAPTION".



2 Select your desired caption menu Press the F.FWD or REW button until your desired caption menu appears. ([CAPTION1], [CAPTION2], [TEXT1] or [TEXT2])

The On-Screen Display will disappear after 5 seconds.

- This is also true when the MUTE button is pressed, and when the PAUSE/STILL button is pressed while recording.
- If there is a power failure of any kind, the unit will retain its memory for this feature.

V-CHIP Set Up

V-CHIP enables parents to prevent their children from watching inappropriate material on TV. V-CHIP reads the ratings for programming (except for news and sports programs, unedited movies on premium cable channels, and Emergency Broadcast System signals), then denies access to programming if the program's rating meets the limitations you select. In this case, "PROTECTED PROGRAM by ..." message appears on the TV screen.

To block ratings, follow the steps below.

 Programming may be rated by the Motion Picture Association of America (MPAA) or according to the Television Parental Guidelines. In order to block any inappropriate programming, set your limits in both places (MPAA RATING and TV RATING).

TV RATING SET UP

Tracking Adjustment

- Tracking adjustment will be set automatically (Digital Tracking function) when you start playback.
- However when playing prerecorded tapes or tapes recorded on units other than your own, noise lines (black and white streaks) may appear on the playback picture. If this occurs, you can adjust the tracking control manually by pressing the CHANNEL UP or DOWN button until the streaks disappear. To return to the DTR function, stop the tape once and start playback again.
- You can reduce the noise lines by pressing the CHANNEL UP or DOWN button in slow mode, too. Tracking adjustment in Slow mode will not be set automatically.

NOTE:

 In Still mode, press the SLOW button and press the CHANNEL UP or DOWN button until streaks disappear. To return to Still mode, press the PAUSE/STILL button again.



SLOW MOTION

Press the SLOW button to reduce the playback speed. The TV/VCR mutes the sound during slow motion. You can control the speed by pressing the F.FWD button (faster) or the REW button (slower). Press the PLAY button to return to normal playback. NOTE: If it is left in the Slow mode for more than five minutes, the TV/VCR will automatically go into the Stop mode.

Picture Search

This feature is very useful in finding or skipping over a particular scene on a tape. In this mode, the sound will be muted.

- You may view a video tape at a high speed in either a forward or reverse direction by pressing the F.FWD or REW button. (in the SP / LP / SLP modes).
- Press it again and the TV/VCR will now search in super high speed (in the LP / SLP modes only).

NOTE: Tapes recorded in the SP or LP mode will display a noise bar on the TV screen and the picture may appear in Black and White. This is normal.

STILL PICTURE

You can view a still picture on the TV screen during playback (the Still mode). Press the PAUSE/STILL button during playback. Only tapes recorded in the SLP mode will show the least amount of lines.Press the PLAY button to return to playback.

NOTES:

- You can advance the picture one frame at a time by pressing the PAUSE/STILL button during the Still mode.
- If it is left in the Pause mode for more than five minutes, the TV/VCR will automatically switch to the Stop mode.

Vertical Hold Control

In the Pause/Still mode only, when the picture begins to vibrate vertically, stabilize the picture by pressing the CHANNEL UP or DOWN button. NOTE: If there are video noise lines on the screen, reposition or reduce them. Refer to Tracking Adjustment section.

SPECIAL PLAYBACK

- TV/VCR power must be turned on.
- Insert a prerecorded tape.
- · Before playback, follow steps below.

Rental Playback

This function enables you to improve the picture guality when playing back worn cassettes such as rented tapes.

1 Select "USER'S SET UP" Press the MENU button on the remote control. Press the PLAY or STOP button to point to "USER'S SET UP".

Then, press the F.FWD button.

2 Set "RENTAL" to [ON] Press the PLAY or STOP button to point to "RENTAL". Press the F.FWD or REW button until [ON] appears.

NOTE: You cannot mark a blank spot on the tape.

This function advances the tape to a specific position when you enter the amount of playback time you want to skip.

- Time Search can be set up to a maximum of 9 hours 50 minutes (9:50) by 10 minutes at a time.
- This function will not operate in recording mode.

 This function will not operate without a tape in the TV/VCR.

Time Search Example

To skip a program that is 2 hours and 50 minutes of tape length, in either direction, from the present tape position.

The time counts down as the searching progresses. When 0:00 is reached, the tape will start playback automatically.

TO CANCEL THE TIME SEARCH MODE

Press the STOP/EJECT button on the TV/VCR or the remote control. This will delete the selected time.

INDEX SEARCH

This feature provides a method of indexing the starting point so that it can be easily returned to in either fast forward or rewind mode.

- The index mark will be made automatically when the REC button is pressed. It will also be marked at the starting point of Timer recording and OTR.
- The index mark will not be recorded if the PAUSE/STILL button is pressed and released during recording.
- The time gap between making the index marks on the tape should be greater than 1 minute for SP recording, 2 minutes for LP recording and 3 minutes for SLP recording.

Example: You are watching program number 4 and want to fast forward to program number 7. You must skip three programs.

OTR (One Touch Recording)

- Insert a cassette tape with its erase prevention tab in place. (If necessary, rewind or fast forward the tape to the point you want to begin recording.)

NOTE:

- This function CANNOT be done from the remote control.
- Recording starts immediately when the REC/OTR button is pressed.
- When the REC/OTR button is pressed 18 times, the TV/VCR returns to the Normal Recording mode.
- To stop the OTR operation, press the STOP button on the TV/VCR or on the remote control.
- To show the remaining time, press the DISPLAY button on the remote control so that "OTR" appears on the TV screen. (It will show up momentarily then disappear.)

Connect your TV/VCR and a Source (Playing) VCR using the following diagram.



- 1) Insert a pre-recorded video cassette into the Source (Playing) VCR or camcorder.
- Insert a blank video cassette, or one you want to record over, into the TV/VCR's cassette compartment.
- Press the SPEED button on remote control for the TV/VCR to select the desired recording speed (SP/SLP).
- Press the CHANNEL UP or DOWN button on the TV/VCR until "AUX" appears on the screen.
- 5) Press the REC(ORD) button on the TV/VCR.
- 6) Begin playback of the tape in the source (Playing) VCR or camcorder.

NOTE: For best results during copying, use the TV/VCR's front panel controls whenever possible. The remote control might affect the source (Playing) VCR's playback operation.

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TO CORRECT A PROGRAM

- While setting a program; press the REW button to go back one step and enter the correct numbers using the PLAY or STOP button.
- After setting a program;
- 1) Press the PWR(POWER) button.
- 2) Repeat steps [1] [2] on page 27.
- 3) Press the F.FWD button (or press the REW button to go back one step) until the part you want to correct begins flashing, then make the changes pressing the PLAY or STOP button.
- 4) Press the PWR(POWER) button to set automatic timer recording.

TO CANCEL AN AUTOMATIC TIMER RECORDING

After setting a program;

- 1) Press the PWR(POWER) button.
- 2) Repeat steps [1] ~ [2] on page 27 and select a program you want to cancel.
- 3) Press the T-PROG. CLEAR button.
- 4) Press the MENU button on the remote control to return to TV mode.
- While recording is in progress;
- 1) Press the PWR(POWER) button.
- 2) Press the STOP/EJECT button on the TV/VCR.

TO CHECK THE BEGIN/END TIME

- 1) Press the PWR(POWER) button so that the REC indicator goes off.
- 2) Press the MENU button on the remote control.
- Confirm "TIMER PROGRAMMING" is pointed to.
- Press the F.FWD button. The details of programs appear on the TV screen.
- 5) Press the MENU button on the remote control to return to TV mode.

AUTO TIMER RECORDING REMINDERS:

- Make sure the channel you want to record is properly set in advance.
- It is not necessary to press the REC(ORD) button for timer recording.
- Recording begins automatically at the Start time.
- If you are recording using a Timer mode, you cannot operate the unit manually.
- The erase-prevention tab on the cassette must be in place (or you must put tape over the hole).

- If the erase-prevention tab is removed, the cassette will be ejected when the PWR(POWER) button is pressed to off.
- If the tape runs out before the end time, the TV/VCR will switch to the Stop mode immediately, and the tape will be ejected.

Auto Return

With this function, after timer recording is finished, the tape will automatically rewind to the start of the recorded program(s).

1 Select "USER'S SET UP" Press the MENU button on the remote control. Press the PLAY or STOP button to point to "USER'S SET UP". Then, press the F.FWD button.



2 Set "AUTO RETURN" to [ON]

Press the PLAY or STOP button to point to "AUTO RETURN". Press the F.FWD or REW button until [ON] appears.



3 Auto Return will begin

When all the timer recordings are completed, the TV/VCR will rewind to the beginning of the recorded program(s).

NOTE:

 If you press the PWR(POWER) button while tape is rewinding, the Auto Return will stop.

4 Watch the recorded program Press the PLAY button.

TO CANCEL THE AUTO RETURN MODE

Repeat steps [1] and [2], select [OFF] using the F.FWD or REW button.

If there is a power failure of any kind, the unit will retain its memory for this feature.

Wake Up Timer

The Wake Up Timer function turns on the TV/VCR after a desired period of time without using the PWR(POWER) button.

NOTE:

- Use the remote control for this procedure.
- Clock must be set to the correct time before setting the timer.
- If you want to select [TAPE], you must insert a cassette tape in the TV/VCR. The tape will start playback automatically on your desired time.



Press the PLAY or STOP button until to point to "TV/TAPE".

Press the F.FWD or REW button, and select [TV] or [TAPE].



3 Set wake up time Press the PLAY or STOP button until it points to "TIME".

Press the F.FWD or REW button until your desired wake up time appears.

Each additional push will increase (or decrease) the time by 10 minutes.

4 Exit the Wake Up Timer setting Press the MENU button on the remote control to return to TV mode.

TO CANCEL THE WAKE UP TIMER

Repeat step [1] but select [OFF].

Sleep Timer

The Sleep Timer function turns off the TV/VCR automatically after a desired period of time. **NOTE:**

• This function does not operate during Recording mode.

1 Select "SLEEP TIMER"

Press the WAKE UP/SLEEP button on the remote control until "SLEEP TIMER" appears.

2 Set sleep time

Press the PLAY, STOP, F.FWD or REW button until your desired sleep time appears.

Each additional push will increase the time by 30 minutes up to 120 minutes.



Press the MENU button on the remote control to exit the Sleep Timer setting.

TO CANCEL THE SLEEP TIMER

Press the WAKE UP/SLEEP button on the remote control until "SLEEP TIMER" appears. Then, press the PLAY, STOP, F.FWD or REW button and select [OFF].

To view the time left for sleep timer press the WAKE UP/SLEEP button twice; then press the MENU button on the remote control to exit the sleep timer setting.

MAINTENANCE

CABINET CLEANING

- Wipe the front panel and other exterior surfaces of the TV/VCR with a soft cloth immersed in lukewarm water and wrung dry.
- Never use a solvent or alcohol. Do not spray insecticide liquid near the TV/VCR. Such chemicals may cause damage and discoloration to the exposed surfaces.

HEAD CLEANING

- Playback picture may become blurred of interrupted while the TV program reception is clear. Dirt accumulated on the video heads after long periods of use, or the usage of rental or worn tapes can cause this problem.
 If a streaky or snowy picture appears during playback, the heads of your TV/VCR may need to be cleaned.
- 1. Please visit your local Audio/Video store and purchase a good quality VHS Video Head Cleaner.
- 2.If a Video Head Cleaner does not solve the problem, consult the nearest Sears Service Center. Professional video head cleaning requires highly technical attention.

NOTES:

- Remember to read the instructions included with the head cleaner **before use**.
- Clean heads only when problems occur.

SERVICING

 Should your TV/VCR become inoperative, do not try to correct the problem by yourself. There are no user-serviceable parts inside. Turn off, unplug the power cord, and take the unit to the nearest Sears Service Center. To locate the nearest Sears Service Center, call 1-800-488-1222.
