

### Important Safeguards

#### WARNING

To guard against injury, the following basic safety precautions should be observed in the installation, use, and servicing of the set.

#### Use

#### **Power Sources**

This set should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the serial/model plate. If you are not sure of the type of electrical power supplied to your home, consult your dealer or local power company. For those sets designed to operate from battery power, refer to the operating instructions.



#### **Grounding or Polarization**

This set is equipped with a polarized AC power cord plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other), or with a three-wire grounding type plug (a plug having a third pin for grounding).

Follow the instructions below:

### For the set with a polarized AC power cord plug

This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to have a suitable outlet installed. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug by forcing it in.



#### Alternate Warning For the set with a three-wire grounding type AC plug

This plug will only fit into a groundingtype power outlet. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug into the outlet, contact your electrician to have a suitable outlet installed. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the grounding plug.



#### Overloading

Do not overload wall outlets, extension cords or convenience receptacles beyond their capacity, since this can result in fire or electric shock. Always turn the set off when it is not to be used. ### Installation

#### Antennas

#### **Outdoor Antenna Grounding**


If an outdoor antenna is installed, follow the precautions below. An outdoor antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can come in contact with such power lines or circuits.

WHEN INSTALLING AN OUTDOOR ANTENNA SYSTEM, EXTREME CARE SHOULD BE TAKEN TO KEEP FROM CONTACTING SUCH POWER LINES OR CIRCUITS AS CONTACT WITH THEM IS ALMOST INVARIABLY FATAL.

Be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Section 810 of the National Electrical Code (NEC) in USA and Section 54 of the Canadian Electrical Code in Canada provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

#### Antenna Grounding According to the NEC

Refer to section 54-300 of Canadian Electrical Code for Antenna Grounding.



#### Lightning


For added protection for this television receiver during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna. This will prevent damage to the receiver due to lightning and power-line surges.

### Service

#### **Damage Requiring Service**

Unplug the set from the wall outlet and refer servicing to qualified service personnel under the following conditions:

 When the power cord or plug is damaged or frayed.



• If liquid has been spilled into the set.



If the set has been exposed to rain or water.



 If the set has been subject to excessive shock by being dropped, or the cabinet has been damaged.



• If the set does not operate normally when following the operating instructions. Adjust only those controls that are specified in the operating instructions. Improper adjustment of other controls may result in damage and will often require extensive work by a qualified technician to restore the set to normal operation.



 When the set exhibits a distinct change in performance — this indicates a need for service.

#### Servicing

Do not attempt to service the set yourself since opening the cabinet may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.



### **Replacement Parts**

When replacement parts are required, be sure the service technician certifies in writing that he has used replacement parts specified by the manufacturer that have the same characteristics as the original parts. Unauthorized substitutions may result in fire, electric shock, or other hazards.

# Introduction

### **Trinitron® Color TV Features**


Some of the features you will enjoy include:

- □ **FLAT CRT** New technologically advanced screen for optimal picture quality.
- □ **Parental Control** A tool for parents to help monitor what their children watch on TV by establishing rating limits.
- **Favorite Channel** Instant access to your favorite channels with the touch of a button.
- Picture in Picture (PIP) Allows you to view two channels simultaneously (KV-27FV16, KV-27FS16, KV-32FS16 only).
- Universal Remote Control Program your remote control to operate your connected cable box, VCR, digital satellite receiver, or DVD player.
- **Energy Star<sup>®</sup>** A recognized symbol of energy efficiency.
- **S VIDEO** A video input that offers enhanced picture quality.
- Direct MTS Allows direct access to changing your Multi-Channel TV Sound: Stereo, Mono, or Auto-SAP (Second Audio Program), with the touch of a button.
- Trilingual Menus Choose between English, French, or Spanish menus.
- □ **Front Panel Controls** Allows for access to the on-screen menus without the use of a remote control.

### **Batteries for the Remote Control**

Insert two AA (R6) batteries (supplied) into the remote control using the following illustration as a guide.



- Under normal conditions, batteries will last up to six months. If the remote control does not operate properly, the batteries might be worn out.
- If you will not be using the remote control for an extended period of time, remove the batteries to avoid possible damage from battery leakage.
- Your remote control can be programmed to operate most video equipment, (see page 36).

### **About this Manual**

This manual provides instructions to help you enjoy your new TV. It shows you how to connect to an antenna or cable, cable box, VCR, DVD, satellite receiver, stereo system or camcorder. Once you are connected, follow the instructions and use the remote control to access the on-screen menus.

The TV front and rear panels illustrated in this manual are for KV-27FS12, KV-27FS16, KV-32FS12, and KV-32FS16. The rear panel shown on pages 7 and 13 is for KV-27FV16. Your front and rear panels may not look exactly like those illustrated.


# **Connecting Your TV**

Read this chapter before setting up your TV for the first time. This section covers basic connections in addition to any optional equipment you may be connecting.

### **Basic Connections**

### TV with indoor or outdoor antenna, or CATV cable

Depending on the cable available in your home, choose one of the connections below:




If you are connecting to an indoor or outdoor antenna, you may need to adjust the orientation of the antenna for best reception.

### **Cable Box Connections**

Some pay cable TV systems to use scrambled or encoded signals that require a cable box to view all channels.


### **Cable Box**



- 1 Connect the coaxial cable from your cable service to the IN jack on your cable box.
- **2** Connect a coaxial cable (not supplied) from the OUT jack on your cable box to the VHF/UHF jack on your TV.
  - If you will be controlling all channel selection through your cable box, you should consider using the Channel Fix feature, (see page 26).

### **Cable Box and Cable**


For this set up, you can switch between scramble channels (through your cable box), and normal (CATV) channels by using the  $\stackrel{\text{ANT}}{\longrightarrow}$  button.



- If you are connecting a cable box through the AUX input and would like to switch between the AUX and normal (CATV) input, you should consider using the Channel Fix feature, (see page 26).
- Your Sony remote control can be programmed to operate your cable box, (see page 36).
- Mon using PIP, you cannot view the AUX input in the window picture.

### **Connecting Additional Equipment**

**TV and VCR** 




- 1 Connect the coaxial cable from your TV antenna or cable service to the IN jack on your VCR.
- **2** Connect a coaxial cable (not supplied) from the OUT jack on your VCR to the VHF/UHF jack on the TV.
  - To watch video programs from your VCR, tune your TV to channel 3 or 4 (as set on the rear of your VCR).

### (Optional connection)

- **3** If your VCR is equipped with video outputs, you can get better picture quality by connecting A/V cables (not supplied) from AUDIO and VIDEO OUT on your VCR to AUDIO/VIDEO IN on your TV.
  - For optimum picture quality, use S VIDEO instead of the yellow A/V cable. S VIDEO does not provide sound, the audio cables must still be connected.
  - You can use the WIDEO button to switch between the VHF/UHF and VIDEO inputs.

### **TV and Cable Box**




- 1 Connect the coaxial cable from your cable service to the IN jack on your cable box.
- **2** Connect a coaxial cable (not supplied) from the OUT jack on your cable box to the VHF/UHF jack on the TV.
  - To view channels from your cable box, tune your TV to channel 3 or 4 (as set on the rear panel of your cable box) and use the cable box's remote control to change channels.
  - If you will be controlling all channel selection through your cable box, you should consider using the Channel Fix feature, (see page 26).

### TV, Cable box, and Cable


### KV-27FS16, KV-27FV16, KV-32FS16 only

For this set up, you can switch between scrambled channels (through your cable box) and normal (CATV) channels by pressing  $\stackrel{\text{\tiny AN}}{\longrightarrow}$ .

### TV, VCR, and Cable box




- 1 Connect the coaxial cable from your cable service to the IN jack on your cable box.
- **2** Connect a coaxial cable (not supplied) from the OUT jack on your cable box to the IN jack on your VCR.
- **3** Connect a coaxial cable (not supplied) from the OUT jack on your VCR to the VHF/UHF jack on the TV.
  - If you will be controlling all channel selection through your cable box, you should consider using the Channel Fix feature, (see page 26).

#### (Optional connection)

- **4** If your VCR is equipped with video outputs, you can get better picture quality by connecting A/V cables (not supplied) from AUDIO and VIDEO OUT on your VCR to AUDIO/VIDEO IN on your TV.
  - For optimum picture quality, use S VIDEO instead of the yellow A/V cable. S VIDEO does not provide sound, the audio cables must still be connected.
  - You can use the button to switch between the VHF/UHF and VIDEO inputs.

### **TV and Satellite Receiver**




- **1** Connect the cable from your satellite antenna to SATELLITE IN on your satellite receiver.
- **2** Connect the coaxial cable from your cable or antenna to the VHF/UHF jack on your TV.
- **3** Using A/V cables, connect AUDIO and VIDEO OUT on your satellite receiver to AUDIO and VIDEO IN on your TV.

For optimum picture quality, use S VIDEO instead of the yellow A/V cable.

- S VIDEO does not provide sound, the audio cables must still be connected.
- You can use the button to switch between the VHF/UHF and satellite receiver inputs.


### TV, Satellite Receiver, and VCR



- 1 Connect the cable from your satellite antenna to SATELLITE IN on your satellite receiver.
- **2** Connect the coaxial cable from your cable or antenna to the IN jack on your VCR.
- **3** Using a coaxial cable, connect the OUT jack on your VCR to the VHF/UHF jack on your TV.
- **4** Using A/V cables, connect AUDIO and VIDEO OUT on your satellite receiver to AUDIO and VIDEO IN on your VCR.
- **5** Using A/V cables, connect AUDIO and VIDEO OUT on your VCR to AUDIO and VIDEO IN on your TV.
  - To view from the satellite receiver or VCR, select the video input to which your satellite receiver or VCR is connected by pressing TWIDEO on the remote control.

### **Connecting a Camcorder**


Using A/V cables, connect AUDIO and VIDEO OUT on your camcorder to AUDIO and VIDEO IN on your TV.



If you have an S VIDEO equipped camcorder, you can use an S VIDEO cable for optimum picture quality.

### **Connecting a DVD Player**


- **1** Using A/V cables, connect AUDIO R and L OUT on your DVD player to AUDIO R and L IN on your TV.
- **2** Using A/V cables, connect VIDEO OUT on your DVD player to VIDEO IN on your TV.



For optimum picture quality, use S VIDEO instead of the yellow A/V cable. S VIDEO does not provide sound, the audio cables must still be connected.

### **Connecting an Audio System**

Using A/V cables, connect AUDIO OUT on your TV to one of the unused line inputs (e.g. TV, AUX, TAPE2) on your stereo.



### **Connecting Two VCRs for Tape Editing**

### KV-27FV16 only

MONITOR OUT gives you the ability to use a second VCR to record a program being played by the primary VCR to perform tape editing.



- 1 Connect the VCR for playback by using the setup instructions on page 5 of this manual.
- **2** Using A/V cables, connect AUDIO and VIDEO IN on your VCR for recording to MONITOR AUDIO and VIDEO OUT on your TV.

# Using the Remote Control and Basic Functions

This section shows you how to use the more advanced buttons on the remote control and how to use the on-screen menus.

### **Using the Remote Control**

	TV/VTR	Press when you are finished using a VCR and you want to switch to the TV input. Your VCR power will remain on.
SONY		Moves the cursor in the on- screen menus. Press the arrow buttons to move the cursor. Press the center button to select or access an option.
	PICTURE MODE	Cycles through the available Video Mode settings.

### Using the Remote Control and Basic Functions

SLEEP	Turns the TV off automatically in approximately 15, 30, 45, 60, 90, or 120 minutes. Cancel by pressing until SLEEP OFF appears.
MTS/SAP	Cycles through the Multi-channel TV Sound (MTS) options: Stereo, Mono, and Auto-SAP (Second Audio Programming).
DISPLAY	Press once to show current time, (if set) and channel number.
DV/SAT	Cycles through available Steady Sound settings, (see page 23).
JUMP	Alternates between the last two channels selected with the <b>(0-(9)</b> buttons.
GUIDE	Brings up the custom guide of your satellite receiver.
MENU	Displays the on-screen menu. Press again to exit the menu at any time.
RESET	Press to return to factory settings while in an on-screen menu.
CODE SET	Use to program your remote control to operate connected video equipment, (see page 36).



### **Setting Up the TV Automatically**

After you have finished connecting your TV, you can perform Auto Program to set up your channels.

**1** Press of to turn on the TV. The Initial Setup screen appears.




**2** Press  $\stackrel{CH}{+}$  on the remote control or in the TV front panel to perform Auto Program.

### To perform Auto Program again

- **1** Press  $\overset{\text{MENU}}{\bigcirc}$ .
- 2 Press ⇔ to highlight Channel ( 🗐 ).
- **3** Press  $\diamondsuit$  to highlight Cable. Press  $\Rightarrow$  or  $\boxdot$  to select.
- **4** Press ↔ or ↔ to select ON or OFF according to how you connected your TV. Press ↔ or ⊕.
- **5** Press ♦ to highlight Auto Program. Press ♦ or ⊕ to search for channels.
  - The Initial Setup screen appears each time you turn on the TV until you perform Auto Program.

### **Using Picture in Picture (PIP)**

The Picture-in-Picture (PIP) feature allows you to view two channels simultaneously, one in the full size "main" picture and one in a smaller "window" picture.



### Dual Tuner PIP KV-27FS16, KV-27FV16, KV-32FS16 only

These models are equipped with dual tuners. This means that PIP is "ready to use."

PIP	Press to display and change the size of the window picture. To cancel, press until the window picture turns off.
	Press repeatedly to cycle through available video inputs.
	Press to alternate sound between the main picture and the window picture.
	Press to change the channel in the window picture.
POSITION	Press to move the location of the window picture.
FREEZE	Press to freeze the window picture. Press again to restore the picture.
SWAP	Press to swap the main picture with the window picture.
