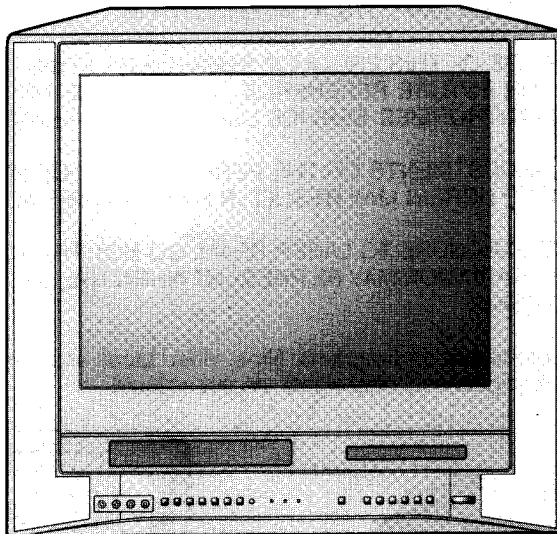

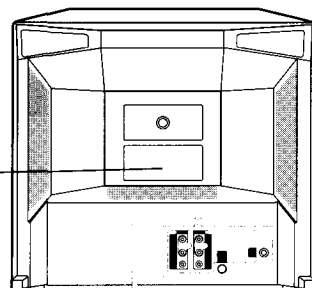

IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDS

1. READ INSTRUCTIONS

All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the unit is operated.

2. RETAIN INSTRUCTIONS

The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.

3. HEED WARNINGS

All warnings on the unit and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.

4. FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS

All operating and use instructions should be followed.

5. CLEANING

Unplug this unit from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.

6. ATTACHMENTS

Do not use attachments not recommended by the unit's manufacturer as they may cause hazards.

7. WATER AND MOISTURE

9. VENTILATION

Slots and openings in the cabinet and in the back or bottom are provided for ventilation, and to ensure reliable operation of the unit, and to protect it from overheating. These openings must not be blocked or covered. The openings should never be blocked by placing the unit on a bed, sofa, rug, or other similar surface. This unit should never be placed near or over a radiator or heat source. This unit should not be placed in a built-in installation such as a bookcase or rack unless proper ventilation is provided or the manufacturer's instructions have been adhered to.

10. POWER SOURCES

This unit should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the rating plate. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your appliance dealer or local power company. For units intended to operate from battery power, or other sources, refer to the respective pages on this Owner's Manual for their operating instructions.

11. GROUNDING OR POLARIZATION

This unit is equipped with a polarized alternating-current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Instead of the polarized alternating-current line plug, your unit may be equipped with a 3-wire grounding-type plug (a plug having a third (grounding) pin). This plug will only fit into a grounding-type power outlet. This too, is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug into the outlet, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the grounding-type plug.

12. POWER-CORD PROTECTION

Power-supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the appliance.

13. LIGHTNING

To protect your unit from a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the unit due to lightning and power line surges.

IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDS

14. POWER LINES

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall onto or against such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits, as contact with them might be fatal.

15. OVERLOADING

Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords, as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.

16. OBJECT AND LIQUID ENTRY

Do not push objects through any openings in this unit, as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short out parts that could result in fire or electric shock. Never spill or spray any type of liquid into the unit.

17. OUTDOOR ANTENNA GROUNDING

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the unit, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Section 810 of the National Electrical Code (NEC), ANSI/NFPA 70, provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

18. SERVICING

Do not attempt to service this unit yourself as opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.

For example:

- a. When the power-supply cord or plug is damaged.
- b. If liquid has been spilled, or objects have fallen into the unit.
- c. If the unit has been exposed to rain or water.
- d. If the unit does not operate normally by following the operating instructions. Adjust only those controls that are covered by the operating instructions, as an improper adjustment of other controls may result in damage and will often require extensive work by a qualified technician to restore the unit to its normal operation.
- e. If the unit has been dropped or the cabinet has been damaged.
- f. When the unit exhibits a distinct change in performance, this indicates a need for service.

19. REPLACEMENT PARTS

When replacement parts are required, be sure the service technician uses replacement parts specified by the manufacturer or those that have the same characteristics as the original part.

Unauthorized substitutions may result in fire, electric shock or other hazards.

20. SAFETY CHECK

Upon completion of any service or repairs to this unit, ask the service technician to perform safety checks to determine that the unit is in proper operating condition.

21. WALL OR CEILING MOUNTING

The product should be mounted to a wall or ceiling only as recommended by the manufacturer.

22. HEAT

The product should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other products (including amplifiers) that produce heat.

23. DISC TRAY

Keep your fingers well clear of the disc tray as it is closing. It may cause serious personal injury.

24. CONNECTING

When you connect the product to other equipment, turn off the power and unplug all of the equipment from the wall outlet. Failure to do so may cause an electric shock and serious personal injury. Read the owner's manual of the other equipment carefully and follow the instructions when making any connections.

25. LASER BEAM

Do not look into the opening of the disc tray or ventilation opening of the product to see the source of the laser beam. It may cause sight damage.

26. DISC

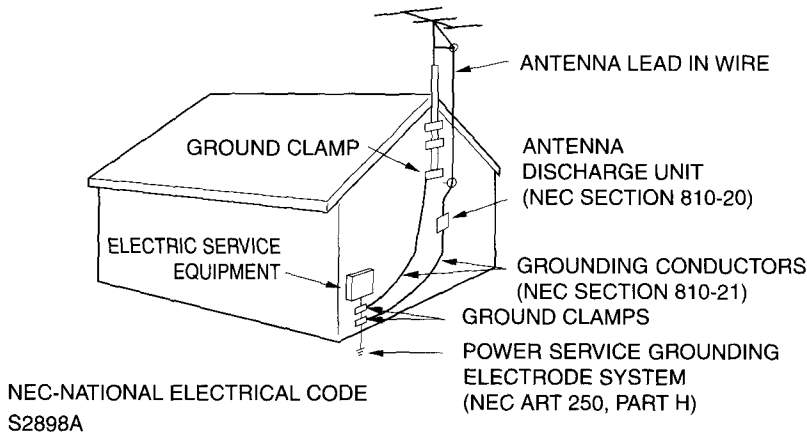
Do not use a cracked, deformed, or repaired disc. These discs are easily broken and may cause serious personal injury and product malfunction.

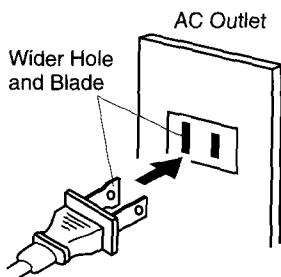
EXAMPLE OF ANTENNA GROUNDING AS PER THE NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE

Polarized AC Cord Plug
(One blade is wider than the other.)

TO USE AC POWER SOURCE

Use the AC polarized line cord provided for operation on AC. Insert the AC cord plug into a standard 120V 60Hz polarized AC outlet.

Notes:

- Never connect the AC line cord plug to other than the specified voltage (120V 60Hz). Use the attached power cord only.
- If the polarized AC cord does not fit into a non-polarized AC outlet, do not attempt to file or cut the blade. It is the user's responsibility to have an electrician replace the obsolete outlet.
- If you cause a static discharge when touching the unit and the unit fails to function, simply unplug the unit from the AC outlet and plug it back in. The unit should return to normal operation.
- If the AC cord plug is plugged in for the first time, wait for about 5 seconds before pressing the power button on the front panel.

Precautions

Notes on handling

- When shipping the unit, the original shipping carton and packing materials come in handy. For maximum protection, repack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.
- Do not use volatile liquids, such as insect spray, near the unit. Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the unit for a long time. They will leave marks on the finish.
- The top and rear panels of the unit may become warm after a long period of use. This is not a malfunction.
- When the unit is not in use, be sure to remove the disc and the video cassette turn off the power.
- If you do not use the unit for a long period, the unit may not function properly in the future. Turn on and use the unit occasionally.

Notes on locating

- Place the unit on a level surface. Do not use it on a shaky or unstable surface such as a wobbling table or inclined stand. The loaded disc or the video tape may come off the proper position and cause damage to the unit.
- When you place this unit near a TV, radio, or VCR, the playback picture may become poor and the sound may be distorted. In this case, place the unit away from the TV, radio, or VCR.

Notes on cleaning

Use a soft, dry cloth for cleaning.

- For stubborn dirt, soak the cloth in a weak detergent solution, wring well and wipe. Use a dry cloth to wipe it dry.
Do not use any type of solvent, such as thinner and benzene, as they may damage the surface of the unit.
- If you use a chemical saturated cloth to clean the unit, follow that product's instructions.

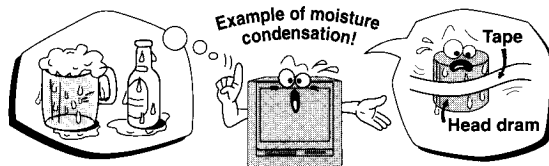
To obtain a clear picture

The unit is a high technology, precision device. If the video head, the head drum, the optical pick-up lens and disc drive parts are dirty or worn down, the picture quality becomes poor. To obtain a clear picture, we recommend regular inspection and maintenance (cleaning or parts replacement) every 1,000 hours of use depending on the operating environment. For details, contact your nearest dealer.

Notes on moisture condensation

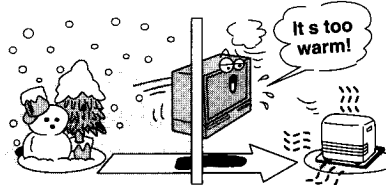
Moisture condensation damages the unit. Please read the following carefully.

Moisture condensation occurs, for example, when you pour a cold drink into a glass on a warm day. Drops of water form on the outside of the glass. In the same way, moisture may condense on the head drum or the optical pick-up lens inside this unit, one of the most crucial internal parts of the unit.



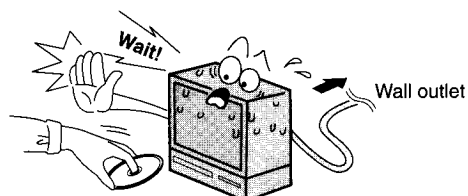
■ **Moisture condensation occurs during the following cases.**

- When you bring the unit directly from a cold place to a warm place.
- When you use the unit in a room where you just turned on the heater, or a place where the cold wind from the air conditioner directly hits the unit.
- In summer, when you use the unit in a hot and humid place just after you move the unit from an air conditioned room.
- When you use the unit in a humid place.



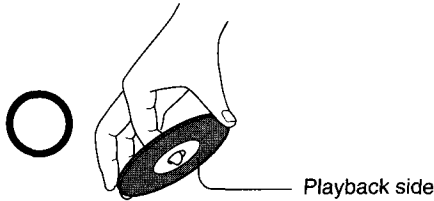
■ **Do not use the unit when moisture condensation may occur.**

If you use the unit in such a situation, it may damage discs and internal parts. Remove the disc or the video tape, connect the power cord of the unit to the wall outlet, turn on the unit, and leave it for two or three hours. After two or three hours, the unit will have warmed up and evaporated any moisture. Keep the unit connected to the wall outlet and moisture condensation will seldom occur.



On handling discs

- Do not touch the playback side of the disc.

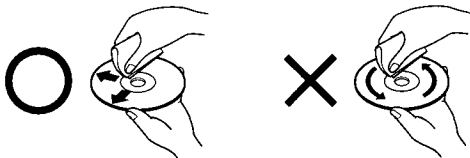


- Do not attach paper or tape to discs.



On cleaning discs

- Fingerprints and dust on the disc cause picture and sound deterioration. Wipe the disc from the center outwards with a soft cloth. Always keep the disc clean.



- If you cannot wipe off the dust with a soft cloth, wipe the disc lightly with a slightly moistened soft cloth and finish with a dry cloth.
- Do not use any type of solvent such as thinner, benzene, commercially available cleaners or antistatic spray for vinyl LPs. It may damage the disc.

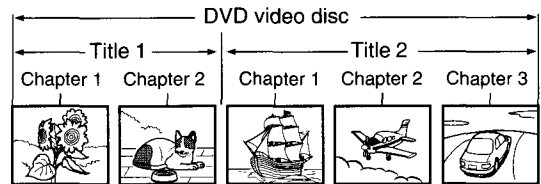
On storing discs

- Do not store discs in a place subject to direct sunlight or near heat sources.
- Do not store discs in places subject to moisture and dust such as a bathroom or near a humidifier.
- Store discs vertically in a case. Stacking or placing objects on discs outside of their case may cause warping.

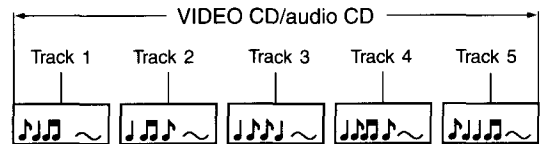
Structure of disc contents

Normally, DVD video discs are divided into titles, and the titles are sub-divided into chapters. VIDEO CDs and audio CDs are divided into tracks.

Each title, chapter or track is assigned a number, which is called "title number", "chapter number" or "track number" respectively.

There may be discs that do not have these numbers.

Notes on discs (continued)

About this owner's manual

This owner's manual explains the basic instructions of this unit. Some DVD video discs are produced in a manner that allows specific or limited operation during playback. As such, the unit may not respond to all operating commands. This is not a defect in the unit. Refer to instruction notes of discs.

"⊗" may appear on the TV screen during operation. A "⊗" means that the operation is not permitted by the unit or the disc.

Notes on region numbers

The region number of this unit is 1. If region numbers, which stand for their playable area, are printed on your DVD video disc and you do not find  or , disc playback will not be allowed by the player. (In this case, the unit will display a message on-screen.)

On VIDEO CDs

This unit supports VIDEO CDs equipped with the PBC (Version 2.0) function. (PBC is the abbreviation of Playback Control.) You can enjoy two playback variations depending on types of discs.

- **VIDEO CD not equipped with PBC function (Version 1.1)**




Sound and movie can be played on this unit in the same way as an audio CD.

- **VIDEO CD equipped with PBC function (Version 2.0)**

In addition to operation of a VIDEO CD not equipped with the PBC function, you can enjoy playback of interactive software with search function by using the menu displayed on the TV screen (Menu Playback). Some of the functions described in this owner's manual may not work with some discs.

Inserting Batteries

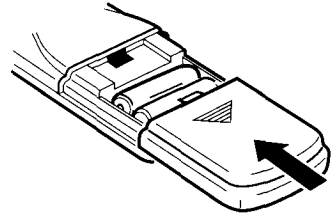
- 1** Slide the battery compartment cover in the direction of the arrow.



- 2** Install two "AAA" batteries (supplied), paying attention to the polarity diagram in the battery compartment.



- 3** Replace the compartment cover.



Battery precautions:

The precautions below should be followed when using batteries in this device:

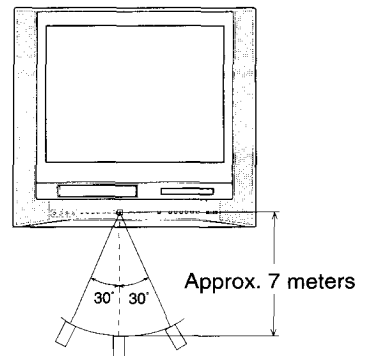
1. Use only the size and type of batteries specified.
2. Be sure to follow the correct polarity when installing the batteries as indicated in the battery compartment. Reversed batteries may cause damage to the device. To avoid a potential short circuit, insert the "-" end first.
3. Do not mix different types of batteries together (e.g. Alkaline and Carbon-zinc) or old batteries with fresh ones.
4. If the device is not to be used for a long period of time, remove the batteries to prevent damage or injury from possible battery leakage.
5. Do not try to recharge batteries not intended to be recharged; they can overheat and rupture. (Follow battery manufacturer's directions.)

Remote control basics

- Press **POWER** to turn the unit on or off.
- Select your desired operating mode (TV/VCR or DVD) using **TV/VCR** or **DVD**.
- Tap **CH ^** or **CH v** to move through the channels one channel at a time.
- The **Direction** buttons (**↑/↓/←/→**) are also used to navigate on-screen menu system.
- You can directly access specific channels using **Direct channel selection** buttons.

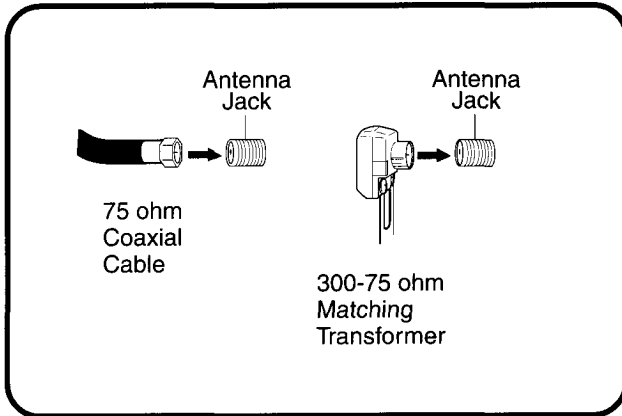

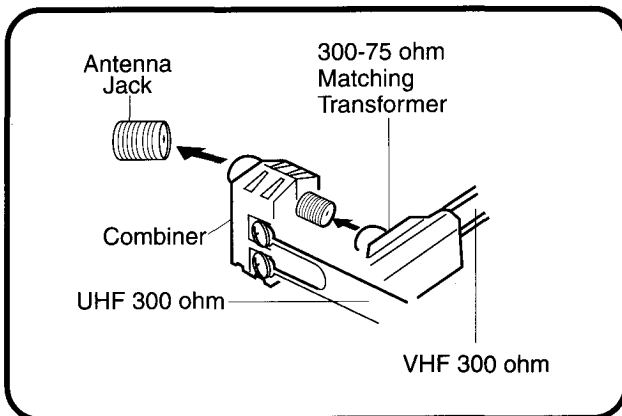
Combination VHF/UHF Antenna (Single 75 ohm Cable or 300 ohm Twin-lead Wire)



Connect the 75 ohm Cable from the Combination VHF/UHF Antenna to the Antenna Jack.

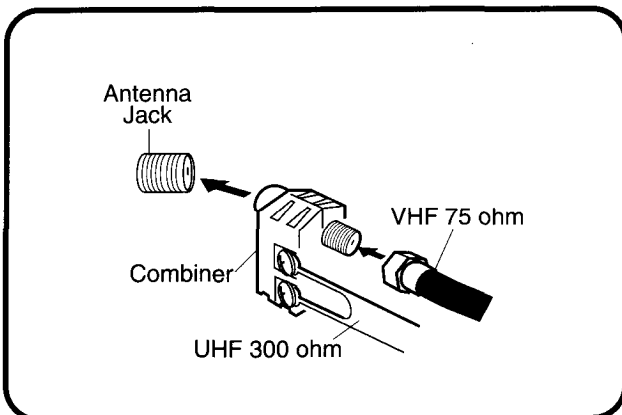
If your Combination VHF/UHF Antenna has a 300 ohm Twin-lead Wire, the use of the 300-75 ohm Matching Transformer may be necessary.

Combination VHF/UHF Antenna (Separate VHF and UHF 300 ohm Twin-lead Wires)



Connect the UHF 300 ohm Twin-lead Wire to the Combiner (not supplied). Connect the VHF 300 ohm Twin-lead Wire to the 300-75 ohm Matching Transformer. Attach the Transformer to the Combiner, then attach the Combiner to the Antenna Jack.

Separate VHF/UHF Antennas (75 ohm VHF Cable and 300 ohm UHF Twin-lead Wires)

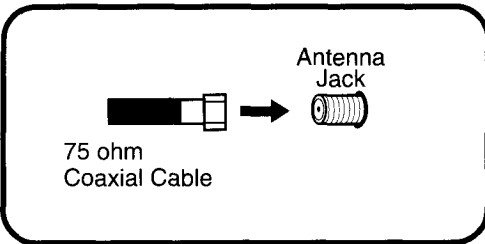


Connect the VHF 75 ohm cable and UHF 300 ohm Twin-lead Wire to the Combiner (not supplied). Attach the Combiner to the Antenna Jack.

Cable TV Connections

This unit has an extended tuning range and can tune most cable channels without using a Cable TV Converter box. Some cable companies offer "premium pay channels" in which the signal is scrambled. Descrambling these signals for normal viewing requires the use of a descrambler device which is generally provided by the cable company.

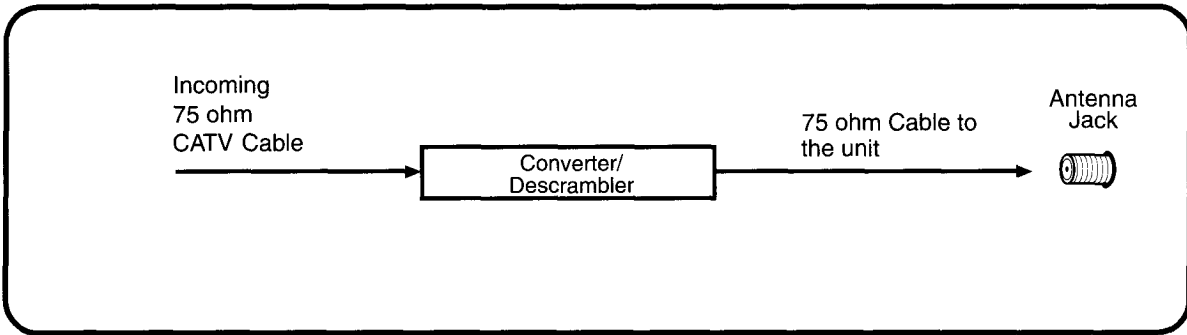
For subscriber to basic cable TV service



For basic cable service not requiring a Converter/Descrambler box, connect the CATV 75 ohm Coaxial Cable directly to the Antenna Jack on the back of the unit.

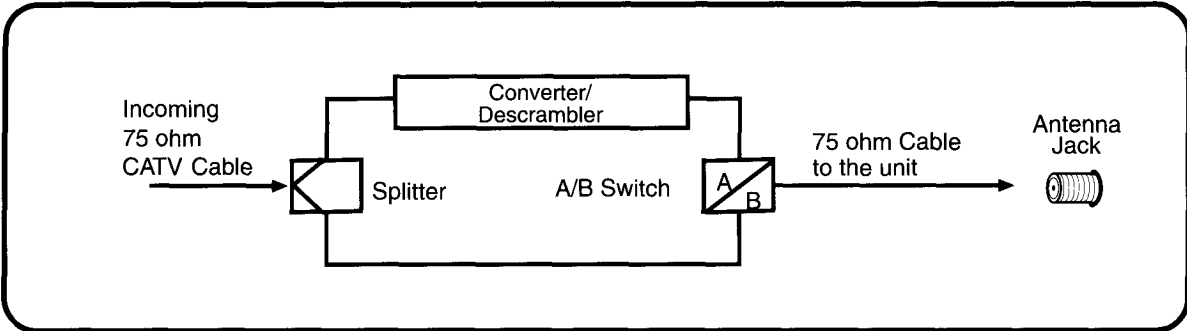
For subscriber to scrambled cable TV service

If you subscribe to a cable TV service which requires the use of a Converter/Descrambler box, connect the incoming 75 ohm Coaxial Cable to the Converter/Descrambler box. Using another 75 ohm Coaxial Cable, connect the output jack of the Converter/Descrambler box to the Antenna Jack on the unit. Follow the connections shown below. Set the unit to the output channel of the Converter/Descrambler box (usually channel 3 or 4) and use the Converter/Descrambler box to select channels.



For subscribers to unscrambled basic cable TV service with scrambled premium channels

If you subscribe to a cable TV service in which basic channels are unscrambled and premium channels require the use of a Converter/Descrambler box, you may wish to use a signal Splitter and an A/B Switch box (available from the Cable company or an electronics supply store). Follow the connections shown below. With the switch in the "B" position, you can directly tune any unscrambled channels on your unit. With the switch in the "A" position, tune your unit to the output of the Converter/Descrambler box (usually channel 3 or 4) and use the Converter/Descrambler box to tune scrambled channels.

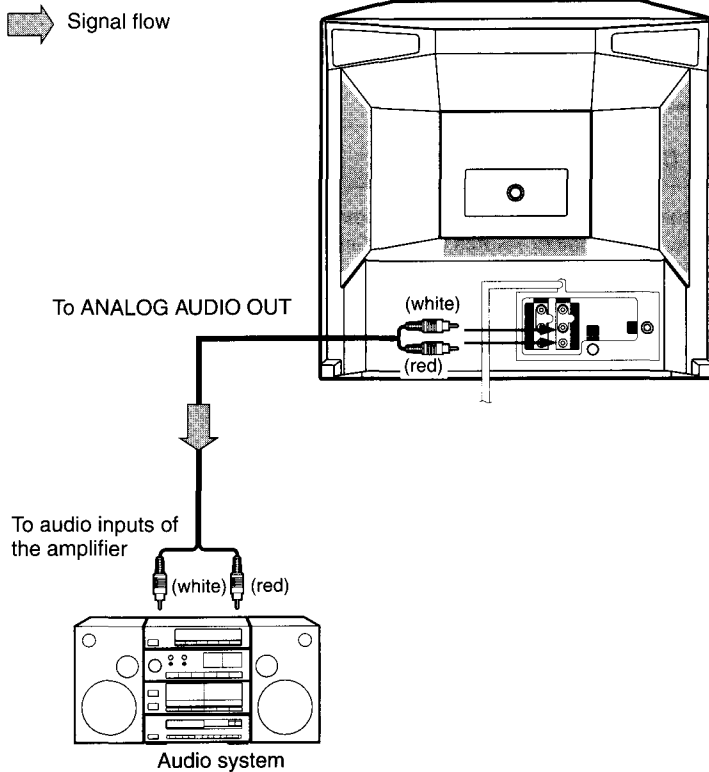



- Refer to the owner's manual of the connected equipment as well.
- When you connect the unit to other equipment, be sure to turn off the power and unplug all of the equipment from the wall outlet before making any connections.
- If you place the unit near a tuner or radio, the radio broadcast sound might be distorted. In this case, place the unit away from the tuner and radio.
- The output sound of the unit has a wide dynamic range. Be sure to adjust the receiver's volume to a moderate listening level. Otherwise, the speakers may be damaged by a sudden high volume sound.
- Turn off the amplifier before you connect or disconnect the unit's power cord. If you leave the amplifier power on, the speakers may be damaged.

You can enjoy high quality dynamic sounds of DVD video discs or audio CDs by connecting the unit to optional audio equipment.

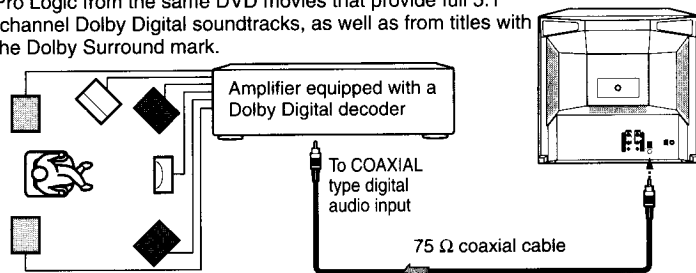

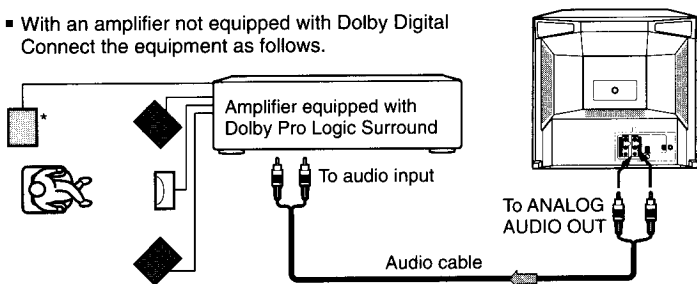

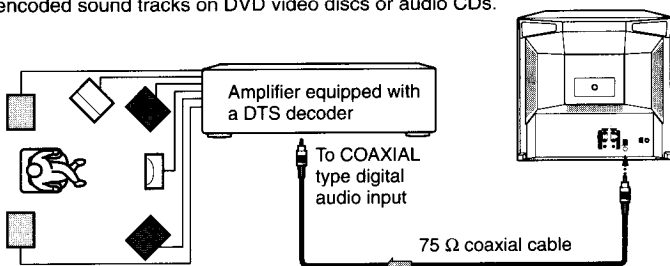

If you have a DTS decoder or processor, you can obtain the full benefit of 5.1 channel DTS encoded sound tracks on DVD video discs or audio CDs.

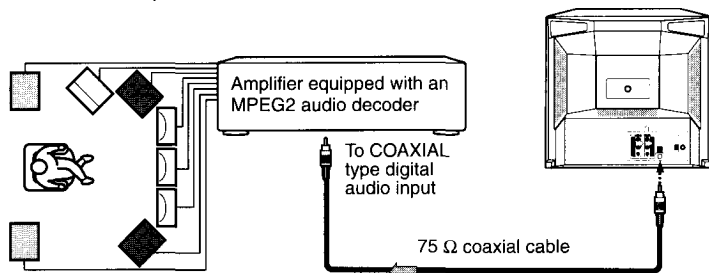
Warning:

- When you are connecting (via the BITSTREAM/PCM AUDIO OUT jack) an AV decoder that does not have Dolby Digital, Digital Theater Systems (DTS) or MPEG2 decoding function, be sure to set "Audio Out Select" to "PCM" from the on-screen displays **63** **68**. Otherwise, high volume sound may damage your hearing as well as the speakers.
- When playing DTS-encoded discs (unit), excessive noise may be output from the analog stereo jacks. To avoid possible damage to the audio system, you should take proper precautions when the ANALOG AUDIO OUT (L/R) jacks of the unit are connected to an amplification system. 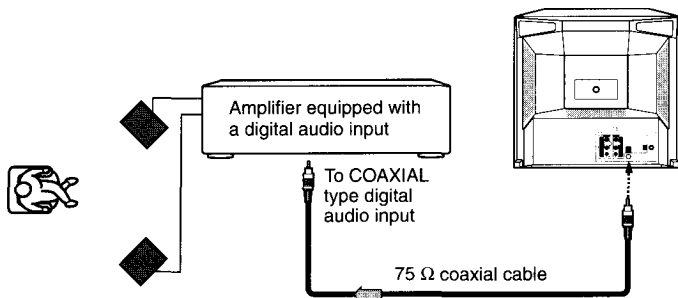

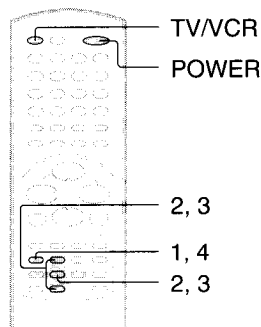

- DO NOT connect the BITSTREAM/PCM AUDIO OUT jack of the unit to the AC-3 RF input of a Dolby Digital Receiver. This input on your A/V Receiver is reserved for Laserdisc use only and is incompatible with the BITSTREAM/PCM AUDIO OUT jack of the unit.
- Connect the BITSTREAM/PCM AUDIO OUT jack of the unit to the "COAXIAL" input of a Receiver or Processor.
- Refer to the owner's manual of the connected equipment as well.
- When you connect the unit to other equipment, be sure to turn off the power and unplug all of the equipment from the wall outlet before making any connections.
- The output sound of the unit has a wide dynamic range. Be sure to adjust the receiver's volume to a moderate listening level. Otherwise, the speakers may be damaged by a sudden high volume sound.

Clock setting

The Auto Clock function will automatically set the built-in clock (Month, Day, Year and Time) when the unit is connected to an Antenna or Cable system and it is turned off. As the unit searches for a receivable station in your area and it receives a broadcast signal for Auto Clock, the Auto Clock needs several minutes to set itself.

Sleep

To set the unit to turn off after a preset amount of time, press **SLEEP** on the remote control. The clock will count down 10 minutes for each press of **SLEEP** (120, 110, ...10, 0). After the sleep time is programmed, the display will appear briefly every ten minutes to remind you that the sleep timer is operating. Closed Caption

Press this button to switch between normal TV and the two closed caption modes (captions and full screen text). Closed captioning will display text on the screen for hearing impaired viewers.



WHAT IS CLOSED CAPTIONING?

This television has the capability to decode and display Closed Captioned television programs. Closed Captioning will display text on the screen for hearing impaired viewers or it will translate and display text in another language.

CLOSED CAPTIONING WITH A VCR

Closed Captioned programs can be recorded and played back on a VCR with the Closed Captioned text intact. The Closed Captioned text will disappear during Cue (Fast Forward Search), Review (Rewind Search) and Pause Modes or if the VCR tracking is not adjusted properly.

TO VIEW CLOSED CAPTIONS

Press CLOSED CAPTION on the remote control to switch between normal TV and the two Closed Caption Modes (Captions and Full Screen Text).

Captions: This Closed Caption Mode will display text on the screen in English or another language (depending on the setting of the Closed Captions CH. 1 or 2). Generally, Closed Captions in English are transmitted on Captions Channel 1 and Closed Captions in other languages are transmitted on Captions Channel 2.

The Text Closed Caption Mode will usually fill the screen with a programming schedule or other information. After selecting a Closed Caption Mode, it will stay in effect until it is changed, even if the channel is changed. If the Captions signal is lost due to a commercial or a break in the signal, the Captions will reappear when the signal is received again. If the channels are changed, the Captions will be delayed approximately 10 seconds.

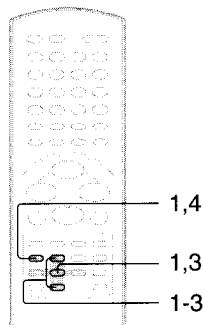
The Captions will appear in places on the screen where they will least interfere with the picture, usually on the bottom of the screen. News programs will usually show three-line Closed Captions which scroll onto the screen. Most other shows provide two or three lined Captions placed near the character who is speaking so the viewer can follow the dialogue. Words in italics or underlined describe titles, words in foreign languages or words requiring emphasis. Words that are sung usually appear enclosed by musical notes. For television programs broadcasting with Closed Captions, look in your TV guide for the Closed Captions symbol (CC).

Notes:

- If using an indoor antenna or if TV reception is very poor, the Closed Caption Decoder text may not appear. In this case, adjust the antenna for better reception or use an outdoor antenna.
- When activating the Closed Captioned Decoder, there will be a short delay before the Closed Captioned text appears on the screen.
- Closed Captioned text is only displayed in locations where it is available.
- If the Call display is on, the Closed Captioning text will not appear.
- If no caption signal is received, no captions will appear, but the television will remain in the Caption Mode.
- Misspellings or unusual characters may occasionally appear during Closed Captioning. This is normal with Closed Captioning, especially with live programs. This is because during live programs, captions are also entered live. These transmissions do not allow time for editing.
- When Captions are being displayed, on-screen displays, such as volume and mute may not be seen or may interfere with Closed Captions.
- Some cable systems and copy protection systems may interfere with the Closed Captioned signal.

Tuner setting

This unit is equipped with a channel memory feature which allows channels to skip up or down to the next channel set into memory, skipping over unwanted channels. Before selecting channels, they must be programmed into the unit's memory. In addition to normal VHF and UHF channels, this unit can receive up to 113 Cable TV channels. To use this unit with an antenna, set the TV/CATV menu option to the TV mode. When shipped from the factory, this menu option is in the CATV mode.

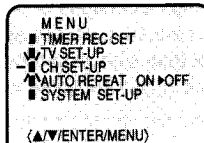
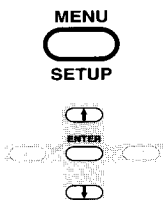

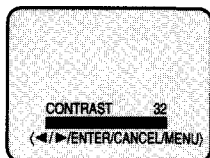
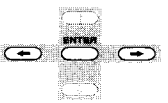
BRIGHTNESS

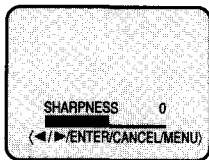
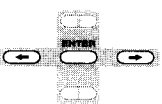
TINT

Press **ENTER** until "TINT" appears on the screen, then press **←** or **→** to adjust the tint of the picture. This determines how accurately the colors are reproduced by the TV. Adjusting the tint for natural facial tone is the best method of obtaining accurate color reproduction of the entire picture.



SHARPNESS

Press **ENTER** until "SHARPNESS" appears on the screen, then press **←** or **→** to adjust the sharpness of the picture.



CANCEL

Pressing **CANCEL** while making picture adjustments will return all adjustments to the factory preset levels.

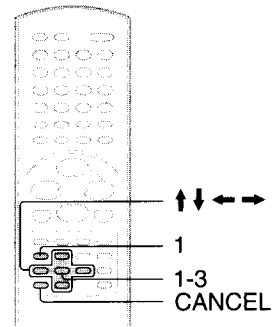

- If you play a prerecorded tape after the DVD playback, you must set the unit to TV/VCR mode using the TV/VCR button.
- This unit selects the playback tape speed SP or SLP automatically.

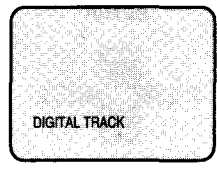
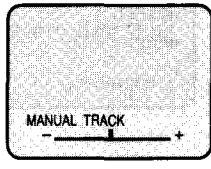

Digital tracking controls

When a tape is played, the Digital Auto Tracking system automatically adjusts the tracking to obtain the best possible picture. If noise bars appear during playback, adjust the tracking manually as follows:

- Press **TRK +/-** to obtain the best possible picture. "MANUAL TRACK" will appear for 4 seconds on the screen. To resume automatic tracking, press **D.TRACKING**. "DIGITAL TRACK" will appear for 4 seconds on the screen.

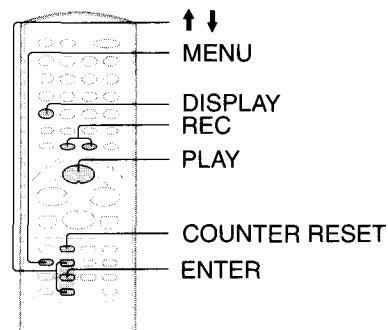


Notes:

- "SP" is more appropriate as less noise appeared during search and still playback for tape recorded in SP.
- The audio output is muted during SPEED SEARCH, STILL, FRAME ADVANCE and SLOW MOTION.
- During picture search mode there will be noise bars which are caused by the system.
- The Special Playback will automatically change to playback after approx. 5 minutes to protect the video tape against excessive wear.

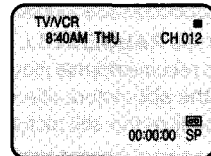
Using the real time tape counter

The On-Screen Real Time Tape Counter shows the tape running time in Hours, Minutes and Seconds. You can easily determine how long the tape has been running or how much time is left on the tape.

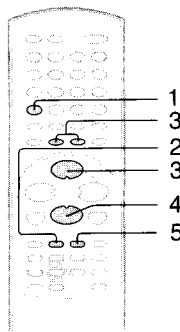

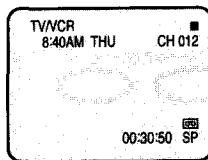


Zero return function

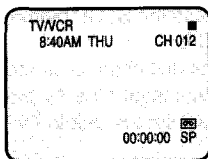

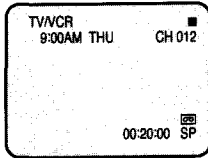

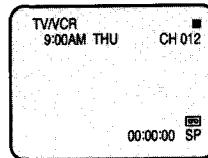

Video head cleaning

Video head clogging

The video heads are the means by which the unit reads the picture from the tape during playback. In the unlikely event that the heads become dirty enough to be clogged, no picture will be played back. This can easily be determined if, during playback of a known good tape, there is good sound, but no picture (picture is extremely snowy). If this is the case, have the unit checked by qualified service personnel.

Playback (VCR)

Video head cleaning

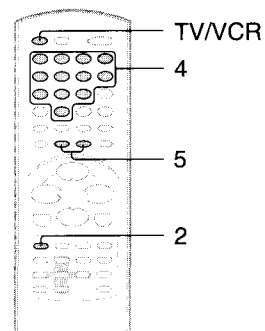
Video head cleaning is needed when the playback picture becomes unclear. This signifies that the heads are getting dirty and can occur when playing poor quality or damaged tapes. If the heads require cleaning, use an equivalent high quality chemical non-abrasive (wet) head cleaning tape or have them cleaned professionally. If playing a head cleaning tape in the unit once does not improve the picture, play it several times before requesting service.

Notes:

- DO NOT ATTEMPT TO CLEAN THE VIDEO HEADS OR SERVICE THE UNIT BY REMOVING THE REAR COVER.
- Video heads may eventually wear out and should be replaced when they fail to produce clear pictures.
- To help prevent video head clogging, use only good quality VHS tapes. Discard worn out tapes.

- If power is switched off during recording, the TV and the DVD sections go off and the VCR continues to record. Press the STOP button to halt the recording and turn off the VCR.
- The unit channel cannot be changed during recording.
- If you record the TV program after the DVD playback, you must set the unit to TV/VCR mode using the TV/VCR button.



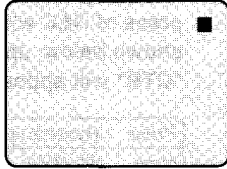

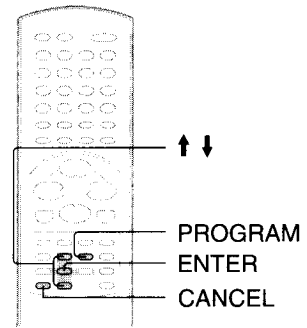
- The VCR section cannot be used while the **TIMER REC** indicator is lit. If you want to use the VCR operation, press both **TIMER REC** buttons at the same time to deactivate the timer.
- When the clock is not set, you cannot select "TIMER REC". In this case, set the clock (see page 20-22).
- After a power failure or disconnection of the power plug, all programmed recording setting and time display will be lost upon resumption of power. In this case, reset the clock (see pages 20-22) and reprogram any timer recordings.
- If you want to correct the digits while setting, press the **CANCEL** button until the item you want to correct, then press **↑** or **↓** to correct the desired setting.
- If programming is performed without a tape in the unit, or with a tape without an erase prevention tab, the Timer Recording is not possible. If a tape without an erase prevention tab is in the unit, the tape will be ejected.

Notes:

- Press **CANCEL** to move cursor backward for correction.
- To record from external source set the channel to "L1" or "L2". "L1" or "L2" will appear next to CH 125 (or 69).

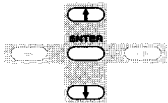
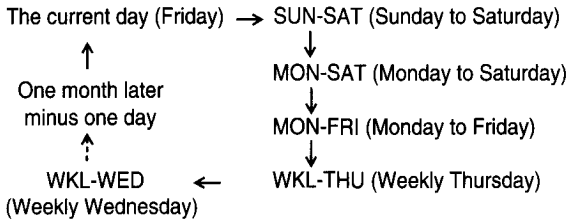

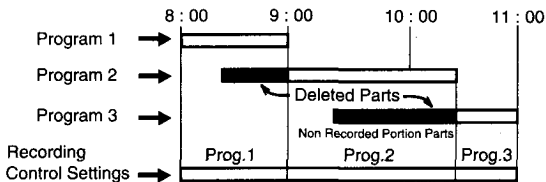

If the programs overlap another

Do not overlap timer programs as portions of the conflicting programs will be lost. The first recording time has priority over the next recording time as shown in the diagram below.



Notes:

- The daily/weekly recording can be made continuously until the recording is canceled or the tape reaches the end.
- During timer recording the automatic rewinding mechanism does not function.
- You can correct or cancel the programmed setting in program confirm mode.

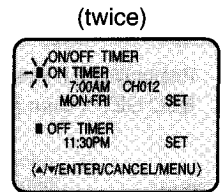
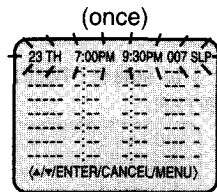

Stereo recording and playback / Separate Audio Program (SAP)



Stereo recording and playback

The VHS Hi-Fi audio system permits high fidelity recording of MTS STEREO TV broadcasts.

When a MTS STEREO broadcast is received, "STEREO" will appear on the screen and the program can be viewed or recorded in stereo. The Hi-Fi stereo recording procedure is the same as for normal recordings.



Note:

When using a CATV system, stereo TV programs may be transmitted over a mono cable channel. In this case "STEREO" will not appear and the sound will be in mono.

AUDIO SELECT



Output selection

When viewing an MTS stereo TV program, or playing a prerecorded VHS Hi-Fi stereo videotape, press **AUDIO SELECT** to select how the audio will be heard through the speakers. Normally set to the Hi-Fi stereo position, this button can be set to the MONO position if the stereo broadcast or videotape audio is of poor quality. The "R" and "L" positions allow the audio from the Right or Left Hi-Fi channel to be heard over both TV speakers. This button has no effect when viewing a MONO videotape or TV program. Each time when you press the button, OUTPUT SELECTION display appears on the screen for several seconds. Refer to the chart below.

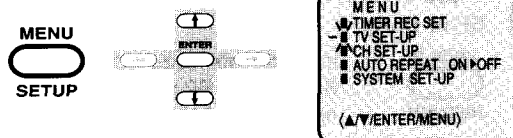

Separate Audio Program (SAP)

Your unit is fitted with a SAP broadcast system which enables you to switch to a separate audio program when viewing a selected channel.

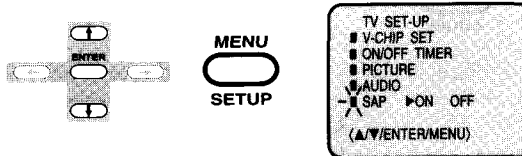
This function applies only when the program is broadcast in multi-languages through the SAP broadcast system.

1 Press MENU. Press ↑ or ↓ to select "TV SET-UP", then press ENTER.



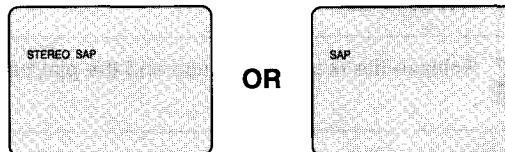

Listening to SAP

When the unit is turned on or a channel selection is made, make certain the letters "SAP" appears on the screen. This means that the "Separate Audio Program" broadcasting is available.



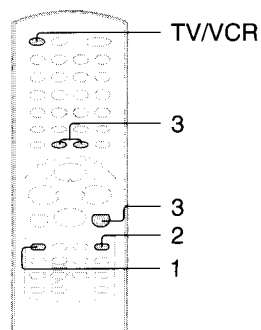
Notes:

- When playing back a tape that is not recorded in Hi-Fi stereo mode, the audio will automatically be monaural.
- When listening to a VHS Hi-Fi video tape or MTS broadcast through the VHF/UHF jack (Audio/Video cord not connected), the sound will be monaural.

Other functions (VCR)

Duplicating a video tape

If you connect the unit to another VCR or Camcorder, you can duplicate a previously recorded tape. Make all connections before turning on the power.



Duplicating a video tape

Preparation:

- Press **TV/VCR** to select the TV/VCR mode.
- Load a cassette tape with the erase prevention tab intact.
- Load a previously recorded tape into the playback VCR or Camcorder.

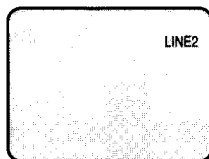

It is recommended that you set the Speed to the SP mode on the recording VCR for best results.

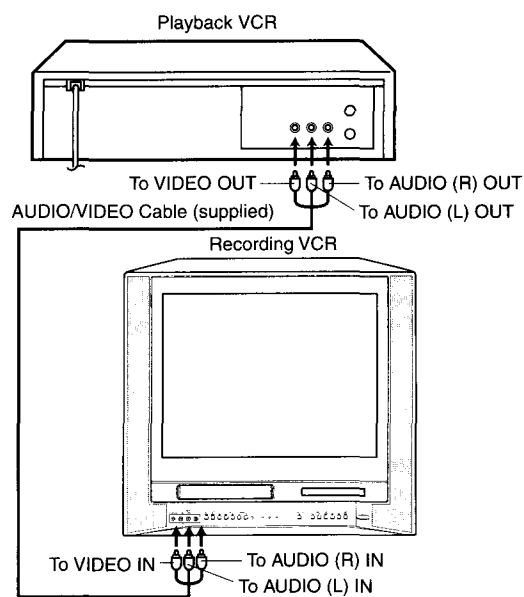

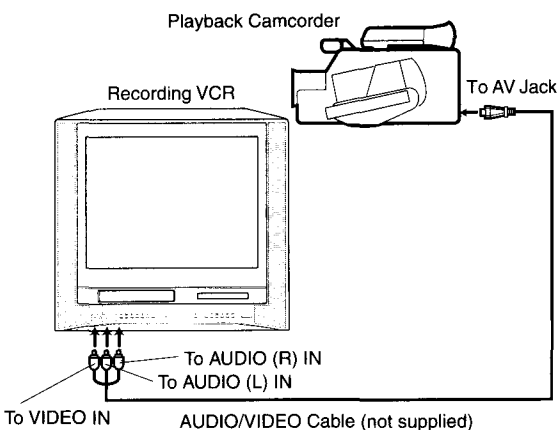

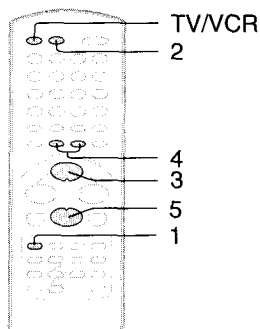

Recording a DVD/CD disc

You can record disc material in DVD, Audio CD, etc. onto a video tape with this unit.



Duplicating a DVD or CD disc

Preparation:

- Press **TV/VCR** to select the TV/VCR mode.
- Load a cassette tape with the erase prevention tab intact.
- Load a DVD/CD disc.

1 Press **SP/SLP** to select the desired tape speed **SP** or **SLP**.



2 Press **DVD** to select the DVD mode.



3 Press **PLAY** to start playback.



4 Press both **REC** to start recording.



The unit will change to the VCR mode automatically and the playback picture or sound will be duplicated on the video cassette tape.

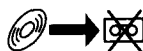
5 Press **STOP** if you finish recording.



If you wish to stop a DVD/CD disc, press unit to change the DVD mode, then press **STOP**.

- You may not record the beginning of the disc, so start to playback the disc, then start to record.
- You cannot record the disc with copy guard function. The following icon and text will show up on the TV screen.

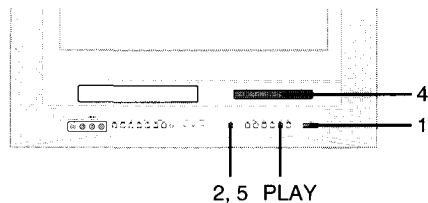

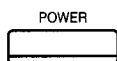
Basic playback

Preparation:

When you want to enjoy the sound of discs from the audio system, turn on the audio system and select the input connected to the unit.

1 Press POWER.

The unit turns on.



2 Press DVD to select the DVD mode.

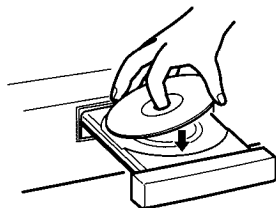

The disc tray opens.



4 Place the disc on the disc tray.

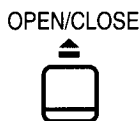


With the playback side down.

- There are two different disc sizes. Place the disc in the correct guide on the disc tray. If the disc is out of the guide, it may damage the disc and cause the unit to malfunction.
- Do not place a disc which is unplayable in this unit.

5 Press OPEN/CLOSE to close the disc tray.

Playback starts.



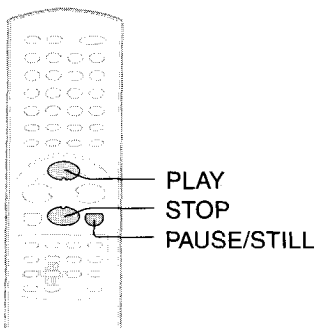
If you insert a DVD video disc that contains a top menu, a menu may appear. See "Locating a title using the top menu." [52](#)

- You may need to press **TOP MENU** or **DVD MENU** to display disc menu (depending on the actual DVD video disc.)

■ To start playback in the stop mode

Press **PLAY**.





■ To obtain a higher quality picture

Occasionally, some picture noise not usually visible during a normal broadcast may appear on the TV screen while playing a DVD video disc because the high resolution pictures on these discs include a lot of information. While the amount of noise depends on the unit, you should generally reduce the sharpness adjustment on the unit.

■ About

The icons on the heading bar show the playable discs for the function described under that heading.

: You can use this function with DVD video discs.

: You can use this function with VIDEO CDs.

: You can use this function with audio CDs.

■ To pause playback (still mode)

Press **PAUSE/STILL** during playback.

•PAUSE/STILL



To resume normal playback, press **PLAY**.

- The sound is muted during still mode.

■ To stop playback

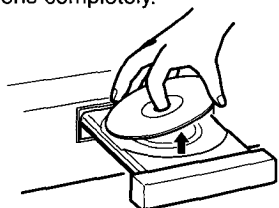
■ To remove the disc

Press **OPEN/CLOSE**.

Remove the disc after the disc tray opens completely.



Be sure to press **OPEN/CLOSE** to close the disc tray after you remove the disc.

■ About the screen saver

If you pause a picture of a DVD video disc and leave it still for a long while, the screen saver of the unit automatically appears (when "Screen Saver" is set to "On" **[66]**). To turn off the screen saver, press **PLAY**.

Notes:

- Do not move the unit during playback. Doing so may damage the disc.
- Use the OPEN/CLOSE button to open and close the disc tray. Do not push the disc tray while it is moving. Doing so may cause the unit to malfunction.
- Do not push up on the disc tray or put any objects other than discs on the disc tray. Doing so may cause the unit to malfunction.
- In many instances, a menu screen will appear after playback of a movie is completed. Prolonged display of an on-screen menu may damage your television set, permanently etching that image onto its screen. To avoid this, be sure to press the STOP button on your remote control once the movie is completed.
- During the DVD playback if you change the operating mode from DVD to TV/VCR, the DVD will change to the still mode. If the user is in the TV/VCR mode for more than 5 minutes, DVD will change to "resuming" stop mode automatically.

■ Playing a Disc while the VCR section is recording or standing by for timer recording

1) Start to record.

Follow step 1~5 on page 40.

- If the unit is standing by for recording, turn on the unit.

2) Press **DVD** to select DVD mode.

3) Play a disc.

Follow step 2 ~ step 5 on page 48.

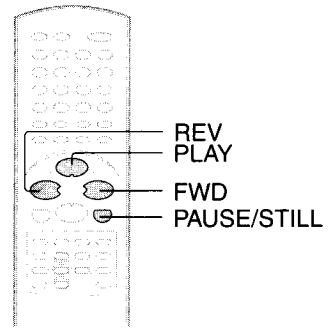

You can play discs at various speeds, and resume playback from the location where you stopped playback.



Playing in fast reverse or fast forward directions

Press **REV** or **FWD** during playback.



REV: Fast reverse playback
FWD: Fast forward playback

Each time you press **REV** or **FWD**, the playback speed changes.

■ To resume normal playback

Press **PLAY**.



Notes:

- The unit mutes sound and subtitles during reverse and forward scan of DVD video discs. However, the unit plays sound during fast forward or fast reverse play of audio CDs.
- The playback speed may differ depending on the disc.



Playing frame by frame

Press **PAUSE/STILL** during still playback.



Each time you press **PAUSE/STILL**, the picture advances one frame.

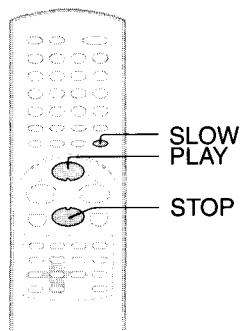

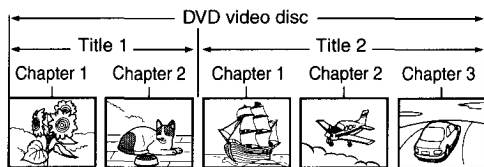

- There may be a difference in the location where playback resumes depending on the disc.

Locating a specific title, chapter, or track

Normally, DVD video discs are divided into titles, and the titles are sub-divided into chapters. VIDEO CDs and audio CDs are divided into tracks. You can quickly locate any specific title, chapter, or track.



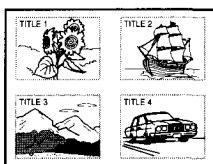

- a) Select the first character by pressing the ↑/↓ buttons.
- b) Press the ← / → buttons to shift and select the second character by pressing the ↑/↓ buttons.
- c) Press the ENTER button.

- 3) Press the ↑/↓ buttons to select the parental lock level, then press the ENTER button.



You cannot play DVD video discs rated higher than the level you selected unless you cancel the parental lock function.

Reception disturbances

Most types of television interference can be remedied by adjusting the height and position of the VHF/UHF antenna. Outdoor antennas are recommended for best results. The most common types of television interference are shown below. If one of these symptoms appear when the unit is connected to a Cable TV system, the disturbance may be caused by the local Cable TV company broadcast.

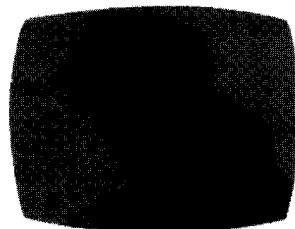
IGNITION

Black spots or horizontal streaks may appear, the picture may flutter or drift. Usually caused by interference from automobile ignition systems, neon lamps or AC powered tools and appliances such as drills or hair dryers.



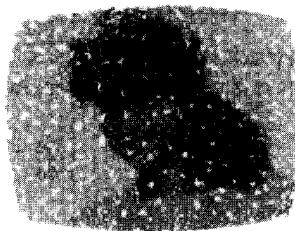
GHOSTS

Ghosts are caused by the television signal following two paths. One is the direct path and the other is reflected by tall buildings, hills or other large objects. Changing the direction or position of the antenna may improve the reception.



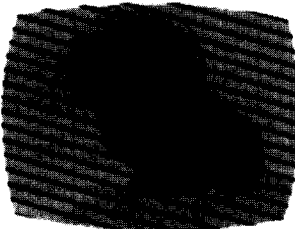
SNOW

If the TV/VCR/DVD is located far from the TV station, in a fringe reception area where the signal is weak, small dots may appear in the picture. If the signal is extremely weak, the installation of a larger external antenna may be necessary.



RADIO FREQUENCY INTERFERENCE (RFI)

Caused by two-way radios, this type of interference produces moving ripples or diagonal streaks in the picture. Some cases may cause a loss of contrast in the picture. Changing the direction and position of the antenna or installing an RFI filter may improve the picture.



PICTURE SIZE VARIATION

A slight picture size variation is normal when you adjust the CONTRAST or BRIGHTNESS settings.



CARE AND MAINTENANCE

To prevent fire or shock hazard, disconnect the unit from the power source before cleaning.

The finish on the cabinet may be cleaned with mild soap and a soft, damp cloth and cared for as other furniture. Use caution when cleaning or wiping the plastic parts.
