Rear View of the VCR



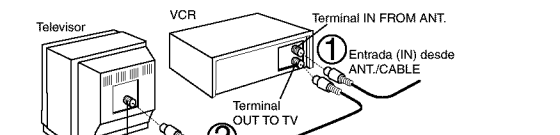

INSTALLATION

1 POWER SOURCE CAUTION
Operate only from a power source indicated on the unit or in this manual. If necessary, have your Electric Utility Service Company or Video Products Dealer verify the power source in your home.

2 POLARIZED OR GROUNDING PLUG
As a safety feature, this Video product comes with either a polarized power cord plug (one blade is wider than the other), or a three-wire grounding type plug.

POLARIZED PLUG CAUTION:
This plug will only fit into an outlet one way. If you cannot fully insert the plug, try reversing it. If it will not fit, have an electrician install the proper wall outlet. Do not defeat the safety feature by tampering with the plug.

GROUNDING PLUG CAUTION:
This plug will only fit into a three-hole grounding outlet. If necessary, have an electrician install the proper outlet. Do not defeat the safety feature by tampering with the plug.

3 POWER CORD
Make sure power cords are routed so that they are not likely to have anything rest on them, roll over them, or be in the way of walking traffic. 4 DO NOT BLOCK VENTILATION HOLES

1 SAFE ANTENNA AND CABLE CONNECTION
If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the equipment, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against built up static charges and voltage surges.

Section 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA 70 (in Canada, part 1 of the Canadian Electrical Code) provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes and requirements for the grounding type plug.

2 KEEP ANTENNA CLEAR OF HIGH VOLTAGE POWER LINES OR CIRCUITS
An outside antenna system should be located well away from power lines, electric light or power circuits and where it should not come into contact with these power sources if it should happen to fall. When installing an outside antenna, extreme care should be taken to avoid touching power lines, circuits or other power sources as this could be fatal.

Because of the hazards involved, antenna installation should be left to a professional.

3 USING THE VIDEO UNIT
If the unit has been in storage or moved to a new location, refer first to the INSTALLATION section of these safeguards.

4 IF EQUIPMENT IS EXPOSED TO RAIN, MOISTURE, OR STRONG IMPACT, unplug the unit and have it inspected by a qualified service technician before use.

5 DURING AN ELECTRICAL STORM
During a lightning storm, whether indoors or outdoors, or before leaving the unit unused for extended periods of time, disconnect all equipment from the power source as well as the antenna and cable system.

6 WHEN THE UNIT IS PLUGGED IN

- Connect VIDEO OUT jack on Playing VCR to VIDEO IN jack on Recording VCR. To monitor the dubbing, also connect a TV as shown.

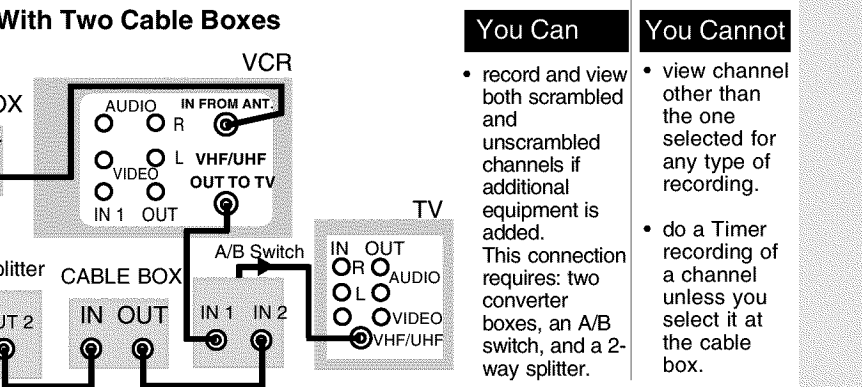
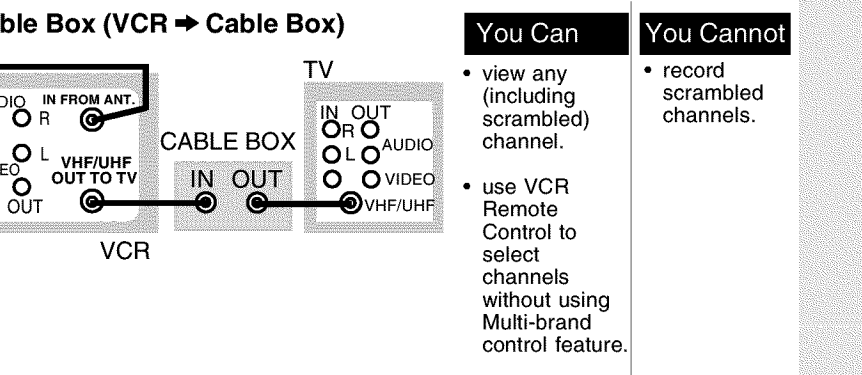
Advanced Connections

Audio/Video Connection

If your TV has AUDIO IN and VIDEO IN terminals, you can connect your VCR to them to receive higher quality picture and sound.



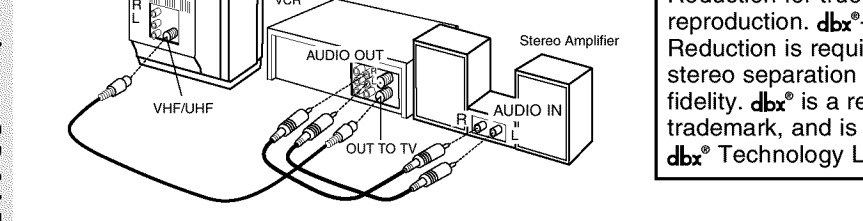
- Connect the VCR's VIDEO OUT jack to the TV's VIDEO IN jack.
- Connect VCR's L/R AUDIO OUT jacks to the TV's L/R AUDIO IN jacks.
- Set the VIDEO/TV selector of your TV (Monitor/Receiver) to "VIDEO."

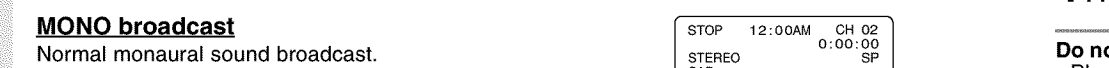
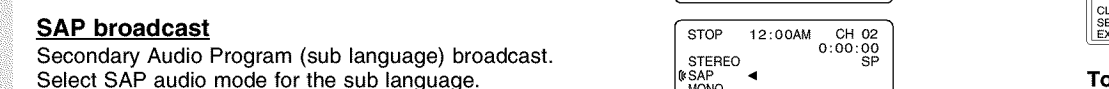
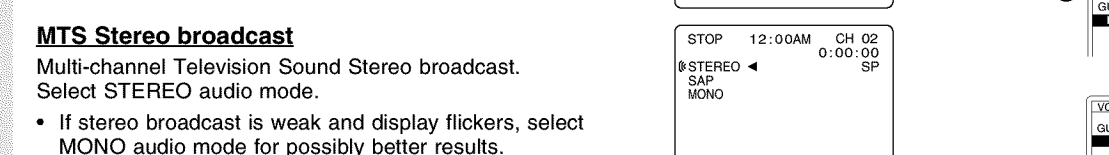
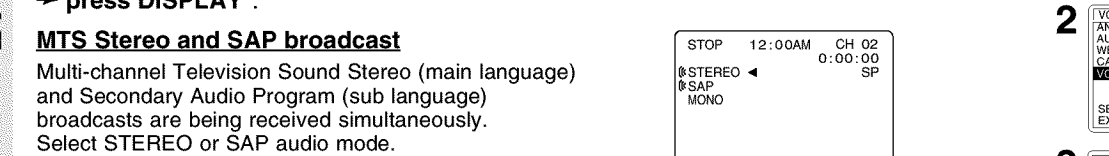
Make the Audio/Video Connection as shown on page 3. You can use a TV connected to Stereo amp and speakers instead of a Stereo TV.

Receivable Broadcast Types

The following are possible audio broadcast types and on-screen displays. The signal being received is indicated with an "S" mark while the selected audio mode is indicated with an arrow.



Audio Mode for Recording

- Press SAP/ HI-FI to display audio mode. (Display disappears after 5 seconds.)
- Press SAP/ HI-FI repeatedly to select desired mode. Refer to "Receivable Broadcast Types" above.
- Do a recording. See p. 5 of "Basic Operations" Instruction book.

- Notes**
- Only tapes recorded in Hi-Fi stereo will playback with true stereo sound. Standard stereo tapes will playback in monaural sound.
 - To listen to Hi-Fi stereo playback, the VCR AUDIO (L/R) jacks must be connected to a stereo TV or an external stereo amp and speakers. (See top of this page.)
 - If tracking is adjusted during playback, Hi-Fi audio may revert to normal audio.
 - Hi-Fi and normal audio playback volume level may differ.

***Important:** If a remote control button does not work when pressed, press the VCR button on the remote and try the button again.

Timer Recording Using VCR Plus+ System

VCR Plus+ System is ... This feature sets most items of a Timer Recording when you enter a PlusCode programming number found in TV GUIDE and selected newspaper TV listings.

Initial Setup....
To use VCR Plus+ system, clock and channels must be set (p. 4 of "Basic Operations" book).

Channel Setup....
Broadcast/ cable stations are assigned a VCR Plus+ (GUIDE CH) number. See the Channel Listing (directory) page of TV GUIDE, etc. In the Channel Setup below, you will be entering your local channel number (RECEIVE CH) for each GUIDE CH number.

Example : if NBC's assigned GUIDE CH were 05, and your TV received NBC on channel 04, you would enter 04 across from GUIDE CH 05 in step 3 of "VCR Plus+ System Channel Setup".

VCR Plus+ System Programming

- For [VCR-TV] or [VCR-cable box-TV] connection only.
- Press PROG/VCR+ button to display PROGRAM. You'll need a local TV channel listing (e.g. TV GUIDE) which includes the assigned VCR Plus+ numbers.
 - Press ACTION to display menu, and Press ◀ to select CHANNEL.
 - Press NUMBER keys to enter PlusCode number and press PROG/VCR+ button to set.
 - Press ▲ to select VCR Plus+ CH SET UP, and press ► to set.
 - Press ► to move cursor to right, press ▲ to enter number, press ► to set, press ▼ to scroll up/down.
 - Press ▲▼ to change record speed and press ► to set.
 - Press PROG/VCR+ button to end program.
 - Press PROG/VCR+ button again to exit.
 - Press ADD/DLT to delete the program.
 - Press ACTION twice to end setup.

To Make Corrections, press ▲▼ and ► to move to error, then ▲▼ to change, or ADD/DLT to erase number.

Do normal Timer Record if...

- PlusCode number is not listed for program.
- program (e.g. sports event) may run over set stop time.

See page 6 of "Basic Operations" book to:

- cancel a timer recording in progress.
- review, replace, or clear program contents.

Important for DSS/Cable Box Users

- When recording via DSS, the receiver must be left on. When recording via cable or antenna, DSS receiver must be off.
- When recording via a cable box, leave box on and tuned to channel to be recorded.

Tape Operation

- Set to playback a recording over and over.
- Press ACTION to display menu.
 - Press REPEAT PLAY to select REPEAT PLAY and press ► to set ON or OFF.
 - Continue to record, playback, etc.
 - Press STOP.
 - Press CA/ZERO in Stop mode to start ZERO SEARCH.

***Unit will go into FF or REW mode and stop at the last point the Counter was set to 0:00:00.**

Timer Recording Using VCR Plus+ System

COMMERCIAL→ADVANCE® marks start and end points of commercials within recordings over 15 minutes long. The VCR automatically advances through marked commercials at high speed. Or, you may set to manual. Because stations broadcast differently, the effectiveness of this feature may vary. See bottom of page for answers to commonly asked questions about this feature.

COMMERCIAL→ADVANCE® Marking

- With C/A RECORD: ON, the VCR auto rewinds after a recording is made and marks start and end points of all detected commercial blocks. After marking, the tape is returned to end of recording. Commercials are not erased.
- Press ACTION* to display MENU.
 - Press ▲ to select C/A and display SET UP COMMERCIAL ADV.
 - Press ▲▼ to select C/A RECORD and press ► to set "ON" or "OFF".
 - Press ACTION again to return to normal screen.
- Notes**
- The mode set in step 3 remains unless a power outage occurs in which case the factory setting will be restored.
 - If playback is started in the middle of a commercial, only a single commercial is shown, or a single commercial is longer than 1 minute, a commercial may not be skipped. Press FF to quickly advance through the commercial.
 - Part of a recorded program may be skipped over if the program portion between commercials is less than one minute or there are frequent dark and quiet scenes in the program. To correct, press PLAY during the skip, rewind tape to just prior to where skipping started, then press PLAY again for normal playback. When the end of the commercials is detected, auto advance will resume.

When STOP is pressed during normal recording, press :

- 1 key (NOW) → to mark now. "NOW MARKING COMMERCIALS" appears.
- 2 key (LATER) → to mark after power is turned off. (If tape is rewound and another recording is started before power is turned off, correct marking may not occur.)
- 3 key (ACTION) (CANCEL) → marking is canceled.

OFF: The VCR will not mark commercials. Select when editing or dubbing a tape, or when opting not to use this feature.

4 Press ACTION again to return to normal screen.

The most commonly asked questions about COMMERCIAL→ADVANCE® are answered below.

| Question | Answer |
|--|--|
| How fast does the VCR advance through commercials? | The VCR advances through a 3-minute commercial block in about 8 to 12 seconds if the tape speed is SLP. In SP, it takes about 25 to 35 seconds. |
| Are commercials advanced through only when I playback a recording? | Yes. The commercials are not marked until after the recording is finished. |
| Are commercials still recorded on the tape in case I choose to view them sometime? | Yes. By setting the C/A PLAYBACK to MANUAL, see top of this page, you can view or advance through commercials as desired. |
| Does COMMERCIAL→ADVANCE® work in all recording speeds? | Yes. COMMERCIAL→ADVANCE® works in SP, LP, and SLP. |
| Does the VCR advance through commercials each time I playback tapes which were recorded using COMMERCIAL→ADVANCE®? | Yes. As long as C/A PLAYBACK is set to AUTO, see top of this page, the VCR should advance through commercials each time the tape is played back. |
| After marking commercials, does the VCR stop at the end of the tape, or rewind to the beginning? | The tape stops at the end of the recording so that any additional timer recordings can be performed. |
| Can I play my COMMERCIAL→ADVANCE® recordings in non-COMMERCIAL→ADVANCE® VCRs? | Yes. COMMERCIAL→ADVANCE® marked recordings will play in non-COMMERCIAL→ADVANCE® VCRs, but commercials will not be advanced through. |
| Does the marking process interfere with other programmed recordings? | No. If the interval between 2 or more timer programs is not sufficient to mark the recording, marking will be done after all recordings are complete and the power goes off. |
| What happens if I cancel the marking in progress so I can use the VCR? | Marking will be resumed when the VCR's power is turned off as long as the tape has not been ejected. |
| What if part of my program is advanced through along with the commercials? | Please see the 3rd note on top of this page. |

Additional Notes:

- Because of the various ways in which commercials are broadcast, the VCR may not be able to recognize all commercials.
- If a timer recording is scheduled for the middle of the night, please be aware that the VCR will make some noise as it rewinds and fast forwards the tape while marking commercials.

Tape Operation

MOVIE→ADVANCE® Playback

MOVIE→ADVANCE® helps you locate certain parts of prerecorded movies (rented or purchased). The feature works in two ways:

- You can go to the beginning of the movie.
- You can skip from one preview to the next.

MOVIE→ADVANCE® works only on tapes recorded in SP speed with the record tab removed.

- Insert a tape without record tab.
- Press SEARCH/ M/A SKIP to display SEARCH.
- Press SEARCH/ M/A SKIP twice to select MOVIE and press ▲▼ to select GO TO START MOVIE or GO TO PREVIEW.

Select "GO TO START MOVIE" if you want to advance directly to beginning of the movie. → continue with step 4.

Select "GO TO PREVIEW" if you want to view the first (next) preview.

→ go to "To Search for Preview" at right.

- Start preview searching.
 - In step 3 at left, select Go To PREVIEW.
 - Press FF.
- Press next preview searching.
 - If you want to playback, press PLAY.
 - When a preview is detected, VCR will start playback.

When the movie is found...

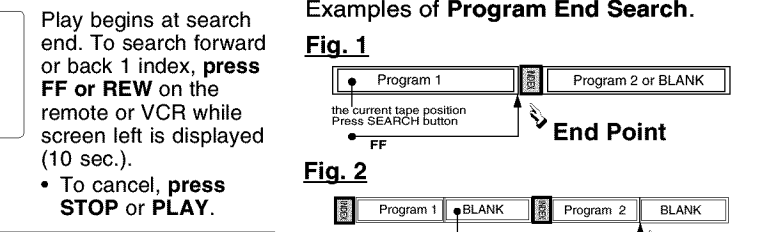
- Press PLAY to start playback.
- To cancel, press STOP.

Search System

For each recording, an invisible index mark is placed on the tape. A program index and information are also included for timer recordings. These marks are used to access or scan recordings.

Index Search

- Press SEARCH/ M/A SKIP to display SEARCH in Stop or Play mode, and then press NUMBER keys to select recording number. Press FF or REW on the remote to start search.
- Play begins at search end. To search forward or back 1 index, press FF or REW on the remote or VCR while screen left is displayed (10 sec.). To cancel, press STOP or PLAY.



To Calculate Index Number

Example 1: To go to rec. 2 from rec. 4, enter 3 and press REW.

Example 2: To go to rec. 6 from rec. 2, enter 4 and press FF.

Upon locating end point,

- search continues 7 sec. past end point,
- tape rewinds to 10 sec. before end point,
- tape plays to end point and stops.

NOTE: ↓ indicates start points of each recording.

Note

- If Index Search is started very close to an index mark, that index mark may not be counted in the search.

***Important:** If a remote control button does not work when pressed, press the VCR button on the remote and try the button again.

Notes

- If Program End Search is started very close to an index mark, that mark may be skipped over.
- To cancel, press PLAY or STOP.
