Installation, Care, and Service

Installation

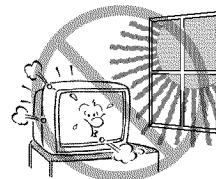
Follow these recommendations and precautions and heed all warnings when installing your TV:

- 15) Never modify this equipment. Changes or modifications may void: a) the warranty, and b) the user's authority to operate this equipment under the rules of the Federal Communications Commission.

- 16) **DANGER: RISK OF SERIOUS PERSONAL INJURY, DEATH, OR EQUIPMENT DAMAGE!** Never place the TV on an unstable cart, stand, or table. The TV may fall, causing serious personal injury, death, or serious damage to the TV.



- 17) Never place or store the TV in direct sunlight; hot, humid areas; areas subject to excessive dust or vibration; or locations with temperatures at or below 41°F (5°C).



- 18) Always place the TV on the floor or a sturdy, level, stable surface that can support the weight of the unit.

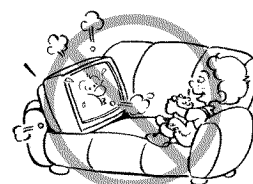


- 19) Never place items such as vases, aquariums, or candles on top of the TV.

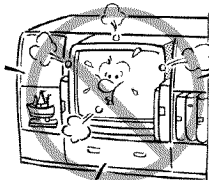


- 20) Never block or cover the slots or openings in the TV cabinet back, bottom, and sides. Never place the TV:

- on a bed, sofa, rug, or similar surface;
- too close to drapes, curtains, or walls; or
- in a confined space such as a bookcase, built-in cabinet, or any other place with poor ventilation.

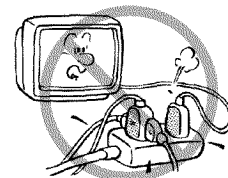


The slots and openings are provided to protect the TV from overheating and to help maintain reliable operation of the TV.

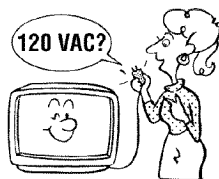


- 21) Never allow anything to rest on or roll over the power cord, and never place the TV where the power cord is subject to wear or abuse.

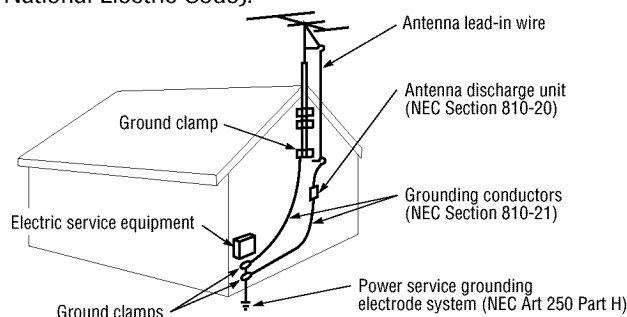
- 22) Never overload wall outlets and extension cords.



- 23) Always operate this equipment from a 120 VAC, 60 Hz power source only.



- 24) Always make sure the antenna system is properly grounded to provide adequate protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges (see Section 810 of the National Electric Code).



25) **! DANGER: RISK OF SERIOUS PERSONAL INJURY OR DEATH!**

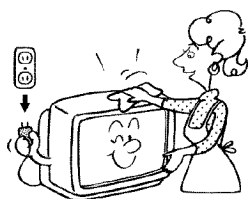
- Use extreme care to make sure you are never in a position where your body (or any item you are in contact with, such as a ladder or screwdriver) can accidentally touch overhead power lines. Never locate the antenna near overhead power lines or other electrical circuits.
- Never attempt to install any of the following during lightning activity:
 - a) an antenna system; or b) cables, wires, or any home theater component connected to an antenna or phone system.

Care

For better performance and safer operation of your TOSHIBA TV, follow these recommendations and precautions:

- 26) Always sit approximately 10–25 feet away from the TV and as directly in front of it as possible. The picture can appear dull if you sit too far to the left or right of the TV, or if sunlight or room lights reflect on the screen. Turn the TV off to check for reflections on the screen, and then remove the source of reflections while viewing the TV.

- 27) Always unplug the TV before cleaning. Never use liquid or aerosol cleaners.

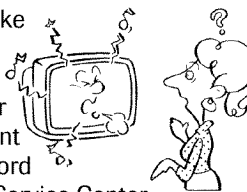


- 28) **! WARNING: RISK OF ELECTRIC SHOCK!** Never spill liquids or push objects of any kind into the TV cabinet slots.

- 29) [This item applies to projection TVs only.] If the air temperature rises suddenly (for example, when the TV is first delivered), condensation may form on the lenses. This can make the picture appear distorted or the color appear faded. If this happens, turn off the TV for 6 to 7 hours to allow the condensation to evaporate.

- 30) For added protection of your TV from lightning and power surges, always unplug the power cord and disconnect the antenna from the TV if you leave the TV unattended or unused for long periods of time.

- 31) During normal use, the TV may make occasional snapping or popping sounds. This is normal, especially when the unit is being turned on or off. If these sounds become frequent or continuous, unplug the power cord and contact a Toshiba Authorized Service Center.

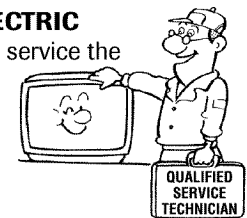


- 32) **Possible Adverse Effects on TV Picture Tube:** If a fixed (non-moving) pattern remains on the TV screen for long periods of time, the image can become permanently engrained in the picture tube and cause subtle but permanent ghost images. **This type of damage is NOT COVERED BY YOUR WARRANTY.** Never leave your TV on for long periods of time while it is displaying the following formats or images:

- **Fixed Images**, such as PIP/POP windows, stock tickers, video game patterns, TV station logos, and websites.
- **Special Formats** that do not use the entire screen. For example, viewing letterbox style (16:9) media on a normal (4:3) display (gray bars at top and bottom of screen); or viewing normal style (4:3) media on a widescreen (16:9) display (gray bars on left and right sides of screen).

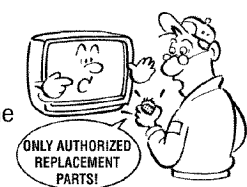
Service

- 34) If you have the TV serviced:

- Upon completion of service, ask the service technician to perform routine safety checks to determine that the TV is in safe operating condition.



- 35) When the TV reaches the end of its useful life, ask a qualified service technician to properly dispose of the TV. Improper disposal may result in a picture tube implosion and possible personal injury.

Introduction

Welcome to Toshiba

Congratulations! You have purchased one of the finest TVs on the market. The goal of this manual is to guide you through setting up and operating your Toshiba TV as quickly as possible.

This manual applies to models 32HFX72 and 36HFX72. Before you start reading, check your model number by looking at the rear of the TV.

Instructions in this manual are based on using the remote control. You can also use the controls on the TV if they have the same name as those on the remote control.

Please read all the safety and operating instructions carefully, and keep the manual for future reference.

Exploring your new TV

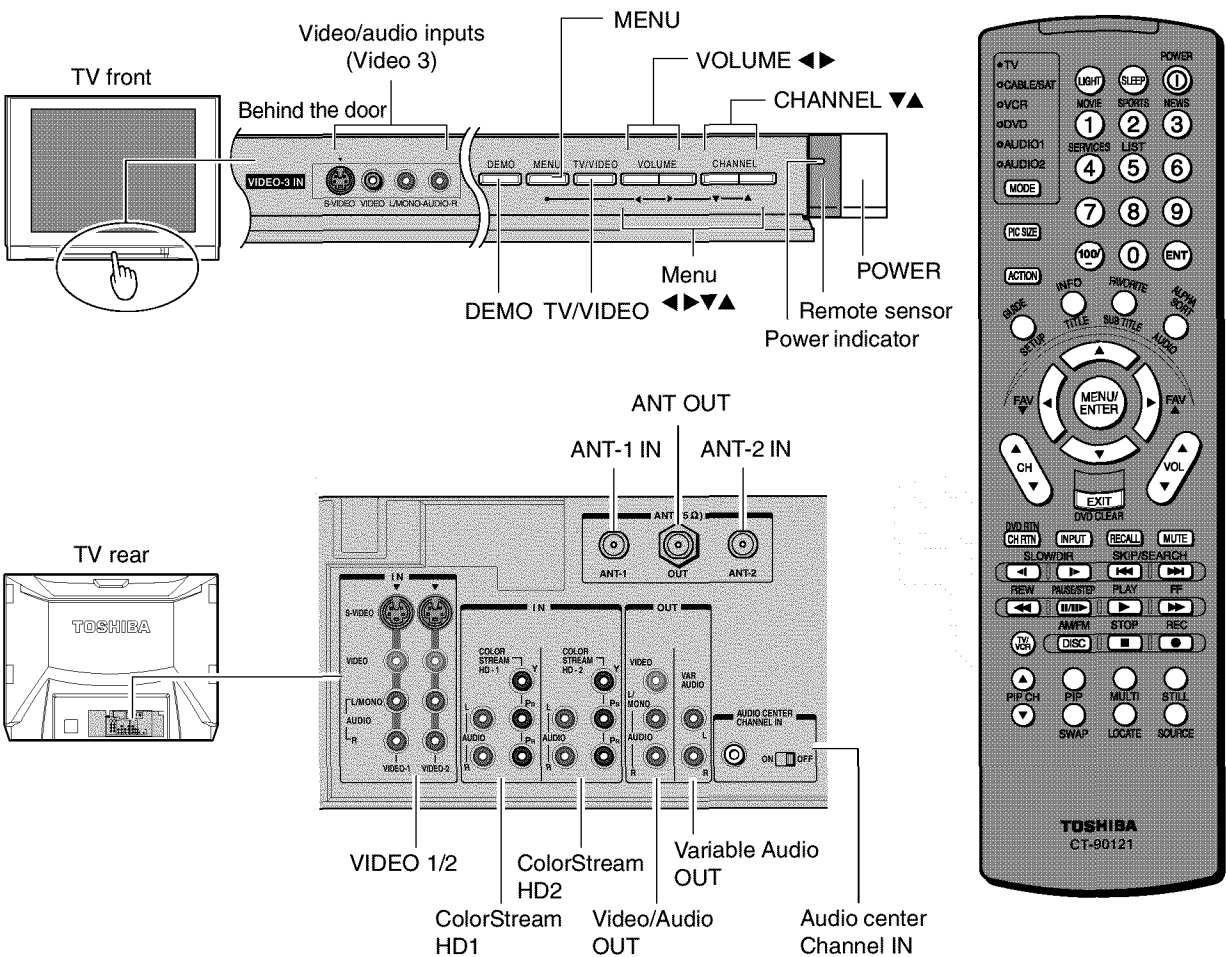
You can operate your TV using the buttons on the front panel or the remote control. The back panel and front panel (behind the door) provide all the terminal connections you will need to connect other equipment to your TV. See “Connecting your TV” on page 7.

Note regarding Quick Connect Guide

The **Quick Connect Guide** automatically appears on-screen the first time the TV is turned on. This feature provides on-screen instructions to guide you through initial setup of your TV.

To stop the **Quick Connect Guide**, either press EXIT or turn off the TV.

See page 25 for details.



Connecting your TV

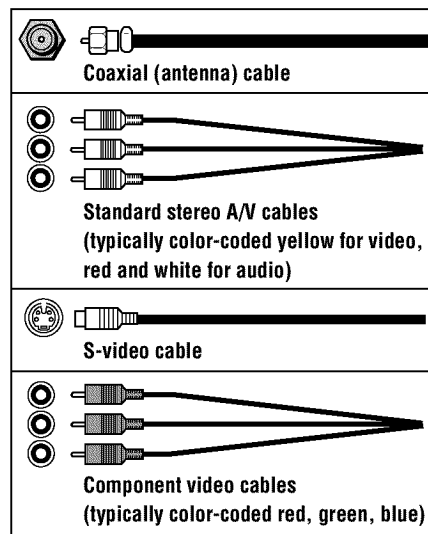
Note: Cables are not supplied with your TV.

- **Coaxial cable** is the cable that comes in from your antenna, cable TV service, or cable converter box. Coaxial cable uses "F" connectors.
- **Standard stereo A/V cables** usually come in sets of three, and are typically color-coded according to use: yellow for video, red for stereo right audio, and white for stereo left (or mono) audio. Your TV's standard A/V inputs are color-coded in the same manner as the cables.
- **S-Video cable** is for use with video equipment that has S-Video connectors.
- **Component video cables** come in sets of three (typically color-coded red, green, and blue), and are for use with video equipment that has component video connectors. Your TV's ColorStream® (component video) inputs are color-coded in the same manner as the cables.

NOTE REGARDING PICTURE QUALITY

When connecting video equipment to your Toshiba TV:

- **For GOOD picture quality:** Use a standard yellow video cable.
- **For BETTER picture quality:** If your equipment has S-video connectors, use an S-video cable *instead of* a standard yellow video cable. (You still must connect the standard red and white audio cables for full system connection, but *do not connect a standard yellow video cable at the same time* or the picture performance will be unacceptable.)
- **For BEST picture quality:** If your equipment has component video connectors, use component video cables *instead of* a standard yellow video cable or S-video cable. (You still must connect the standard red and white audio cables for full system connection.)



CAUTION:

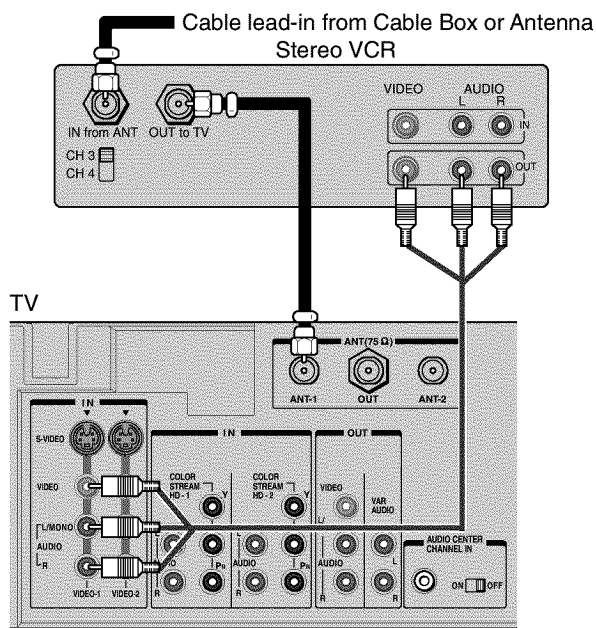
Do not plug in any power cords until you have finished connecting all equipment.

Connecting a VCR

This connection allows you to watch local channels and video programs, play or record on the VCR while watching TV, and record from one channel while watching another channel.

You will need:

- two coaxial cables (one or more may be provided by your cable company)
- one set of standard A/V cables



Note:

If you have a mono VCR, connect L/Mono to VCR Audio OUT using only one audio cable.

If you have an S-VHS VCR, use an S-video cable (in the S-video jacks) instead of the standard video cable.

Do not connect a standard video cable and an S-video cable to Video-1 (or Video-2) at the same time.

The unauthorized recording, use, distribution, or revision of television programs, videotapes, DVDs, and other materials is prohibited under the Copyright Laws of the United States and other countries, and may subject you to civil and criminal liability.

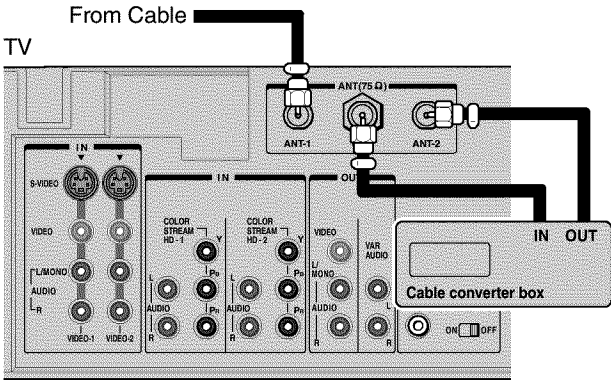
Connecting a cable converter box

This connection allows you to watch basic and premium cable channels.

To use the TV's features, select ANT-1. To view premium channels, select ANT-2, tune the TV to channel 3 or 4 (whichever channel is vacant in your area), and use the converter box to change channels.

You will need:

- three coaxial cables (one or more may be provided by your cable company)



Note:

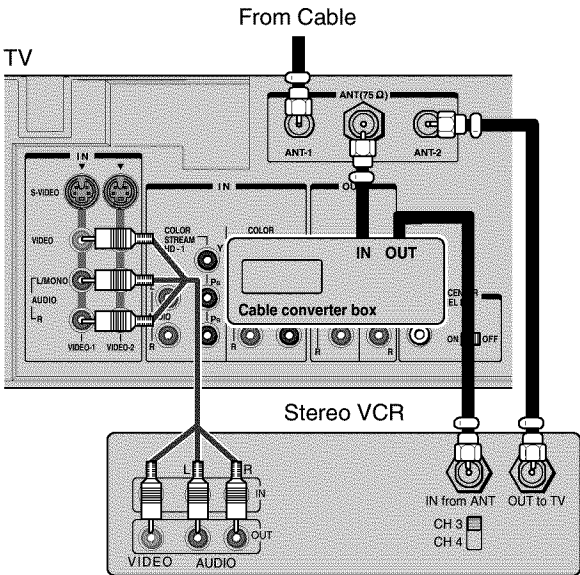
When you use a converter box with your TV, the remote control will not operate some features, such as programming your favorite channels, labeling channels, and locking channels.

Connecting a cable converter box and VCR

This connection allows you to watch and record basic and premium cable channels, watch videotapes, and record one channel while watching another channel. To use the TV's features, select ANT-1. To view premium channels or record with the VCR, select ANT-2, tune the TV to channel 3 or 4 (whichever channel is vacant in your area), and use the converter box to change channels.

You will need:

- four coaxial cables (one or more may be provided by your cable company)
- one set of standard A/V cables



Note:

If you have a mono VCR, connect L/Mono to VCR Audio OUT using only one audio cable.

If you have an S-VHS VCR, use an S-video cable (in the S-video jacks) instead of a standard video cable. Do not connect a standard video cable and an S-video cable to Video-1 (or Video-2) at the same time.

When you use a converter box with your TV, the remote control will not operate some features, such as programming your favorite channels, labeling channels, and locking channels.

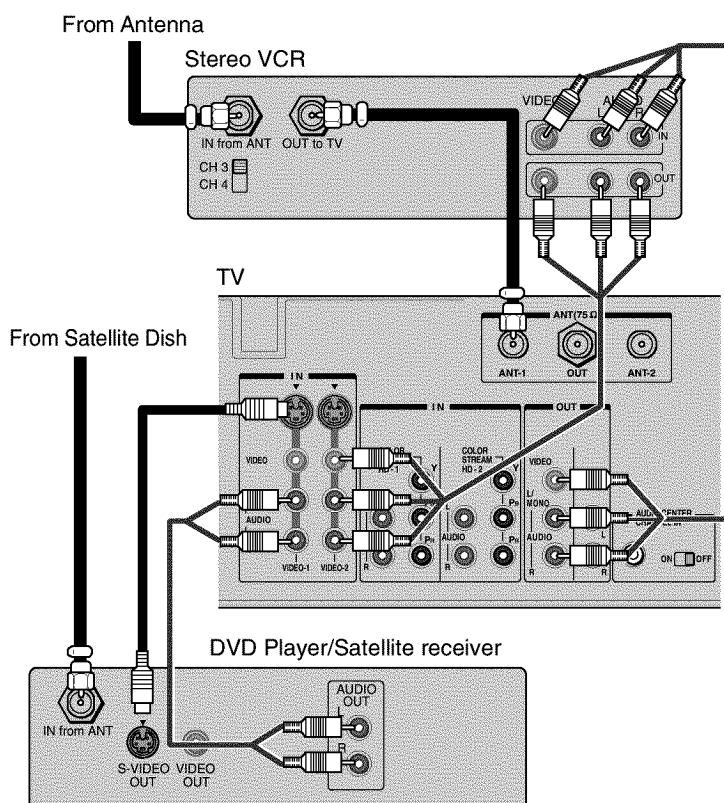
The unauthorized recording, use, distribution, or revision of television programs, videotapes, DVDs, and other materials is prohibited under the Copyright Laws of the United States and other countries, and may subject you to civil and criminal liability.

Connecting a DVD player or satellite receiver and a VCR

This connection allows you to watch DVD/satellite, VCR, and TV programs, and record one TV channel while watching another channel.

You will need:

- two (or three, if satellite receiver is used) coaxial cables (one or more may be provided by your cable or satellite company)
- one set of standard A/V cables
- one pair of audio cables
- one S-video cable (between the TV and DVD player/satellite receiver)



Note:

For the highest possible picture quality from a DVD player/satellite receiver without component video, use an S-video cable between the TV and DVD player/satellite receiver. (If your DVD player or satellite receiver is component video-compatible, see page 10).

Do not connect both an S-video cable and a standard video cable between the TV and DVD player/satellite receiver at the same time, or the picture performance will be unacceptable.

Do not connect the DVD player/satellite receiver and VCR to the same video channel on the TV. (See the illustrations, which show the DVD player/satellite receiver connected to Video-1 on the TV, and the VCR connected to Video-2 on the TV.)

The unauthorized recording, use, distribution, or revision of television programs, videotapes, DVDs, and other materials is prohibited under the Copyright Laws of the United States and other countries, and may subject you to civil and criminal liability.

Connecting a DVD player with ColorStream® (component video) and a VCR

This connection allows you to watch DVD, VCR, and TV programs, and record TV programs.

Your TV has ColorStream® (component video) inputs. Connecting your TV to a DVD player with component video (such as a Toshiba DVD player with ColorStream®) can greatly enhance picture quality and realism.

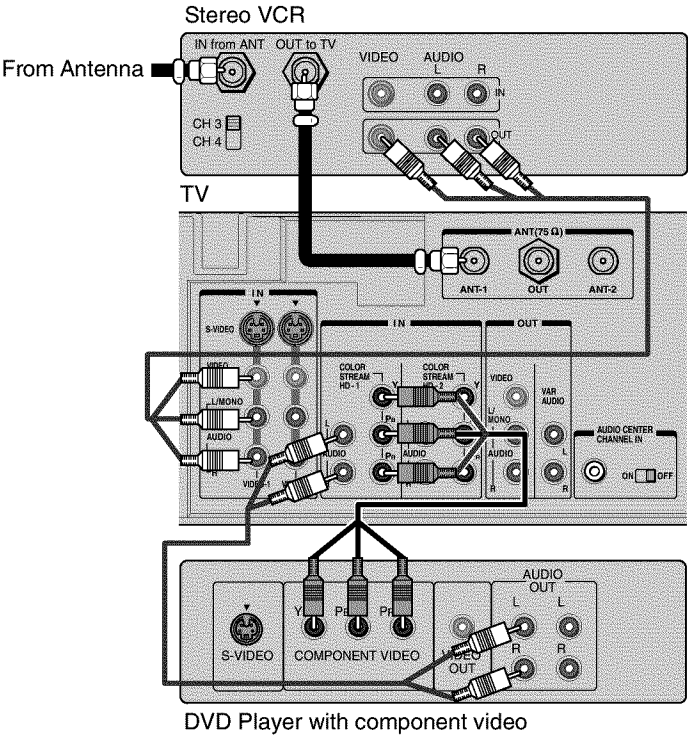
- To record one TV program while watching another TV program, tune the VCR to the channel to record, and tune the TV to the channel to watch.
- To record a TV program while watching a DVD, tune the VCR to the channel to record, and select ColorStream HD1 on the TV (see “Selecting the antenna input” on page 23).

You will need:

- two coaxial cables (one or more may be provided by your cable company)
- two sets of standard A/V cables
- one pair of audio cables
- one set of component video cables (one S-video cable for a DVD player without component video; see notes at right)

Note:
For the highest possible picture quality, use component video cables between the TV and DVD player. You can connect the component video cables from the DVD player to either ColorStream jack on the TV (HD1 or HD2).
The ColorStream HD1 and HD2 jacks can be used with Progressive (480p) and Interlaced (480i, 1080i) scan systems.
If your DVD player does not have component video, use the S-video connections (plus the standard audio connections) instead of the ColorStream connections; however, do not connect both S-Video and standard video cables between the TV and DVD player at the same time.

The unauthorized recording, use, distribution, or revision of television programs, videotapes, DVDs, and other materials is prohibited under the Copyright Laws of the United States and other countries, and may subject you to civil and criminal liability.



Connecting a DTV receiver/set-top box with ColorStream® (component video) and a VCR

This connection allows you to watch DTV (digital TV), VCR, and TV programs, and record DTV and TV programs.

Your TV has ColorStream (component video) inputs. Connecting your TV to a DTV receiver with component video can greatly enhance picture quality and realism.

- To record and watch a DTV program, select LINE IN on the VCR, and select ColorStream HD2 (or VIDEO 1 for a non-ColorStream connection) on the TV (see “Selecting the antenna input” on page 23).
- To record a TV program while watching a DTV program, tune the VCR to the channel to record, and select ColorStream HD2 on the TV.
- To record and watch the same TV program, tune the VCR to the channel to record, and select VIDEO 1 on the TV.
- To record one TV program while watching another TV program, tune the VCR to the channel to record, and tune the TV to the channel to watch.

You will need:

- three coaxial cables (one or more may be provided by your satellite company)
- two sets of standard A/V cables
- one pair of audio cables
- one set of component video cables (one S-video cable for a DTV receiver without component video; see notes at right)

Note:

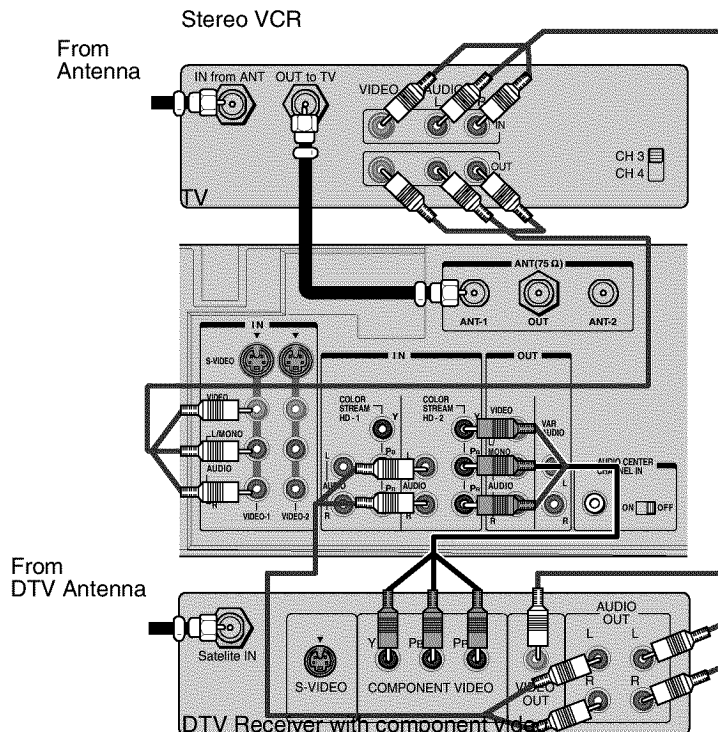
For the highest possible picture quality, use component video cables between the TV and DTV receiver. You can connect the component cables from the DTV receiver to either ColorStream jack on the TV (HD1 or HD2).

The ColorStream HD1 and HD2 jacks can be used with Progressive (480p) and Interlaced (480i, 1080i) scan systems.

If your DTV receiver does not have component video, use the S-video connections (plus the standard audio connections) instead of the ColorStream connections. Do not connect both an S-video and a standard video cable between the TV and DTV receiver at the same time.

To monitor recording, set the TV to VIDEO 1.

The unauthorized recording, use, distribution, or revision of television programs, videotapes, DVDs, and other materials is prohibited under the Copyright Laws of the United States and other countries, and may subject you to civil and criminal liability.



Connecting an audio system

This connection allows you to use an audio amplifier to adjust the audio level. This also allows you to use external speakers.

To control the audio, turn on the TV and the stereo amplifier, and turn off the built-in speakers (see "Turning off the built-in speakers" on page 50).

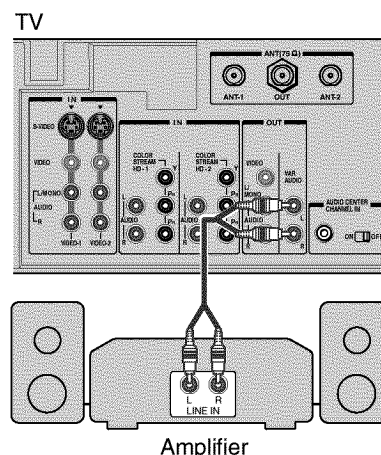
You will need:

- one pair of audio cables

Note:

To hear sound when using an external audio amplifier, the volume of both the TV and the amplifier must be set above 0 (zero).

For example, if the volume of the TV is set to 0, you will not be able to hear any sound, even the volume of the amplifier is at its highest level.



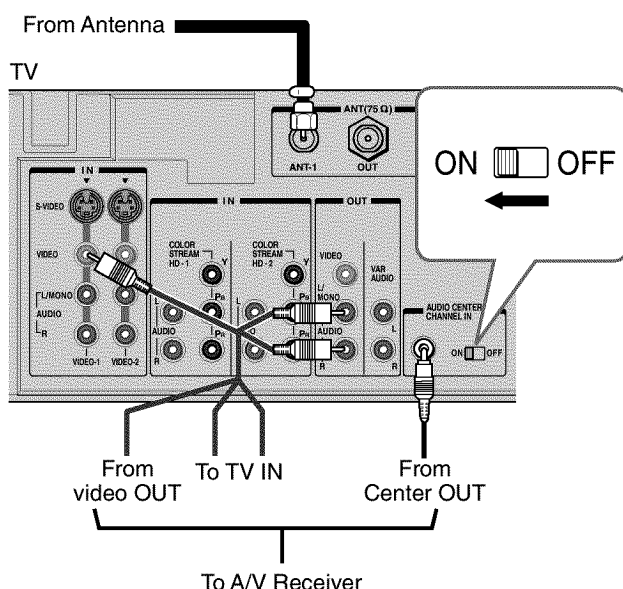
Connecting an A/V receiver

This connection allows you to use an audio/video (A/V) receiver to enhance your TV's sound.

If you have a system with Dolby Pro Logic® surround sound, you can add to the realism of the sound by using the TV's internal speakers as center channel speakers.

You will need:

- one coaxial cable
- one set of standard A/V cables
- one single audio cable for the audio center channel



Note:

Refer to the instructions provided with your A/V receiver for details about your surround sound system.

When the Audio Center Channel ON/OFF switch is in the ON position, the TV speakers will function only as center channel speakers.

Adjust the volume for the center channel speakers using the center level control on the A/V receiver.

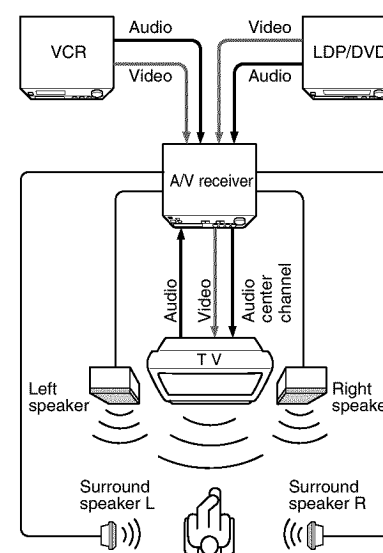
To use the TV speakers as normal speakers, set the Audio Center Channel ON/OFF switch to the OFF position.

Caution:

To avoid damaging the speakers:

- Turn off the TV before connecting or disconnecting the Audio Center Channel audio cable.
- Do not connect from the A/V receiver's Center Speaker OUT (amplified signal) to the TV's Audio Center Channel IN.

Using the remote control

Preparing the remote control for use

Your Toshiba TV remote control has one dedicated TV mode and five universal modes: VCR, Cable/SAT, DVD, Audio1, and Audio2. The target devices and default devices being programmed for each mode are as follows:

Target device/Mode mapping

Mode	Device
TV	Toshiba TV
CABLE/SAT	Universal Cable, Satellite
VCR	Universal VCR, DVD, LD, Cassette
DVD	Universal DVD, VCR, LD, Cassette

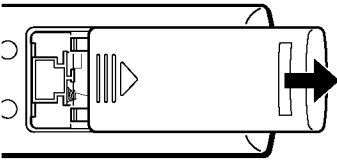

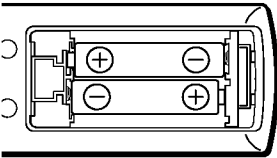
Installing the remote control batteries

To install the batteries:

- Slide the battery cover off the back of the remote control.



- Install two “AA” size alkaline batteries. Match the + and – signs on the batteries to the signs on the battery compartment.

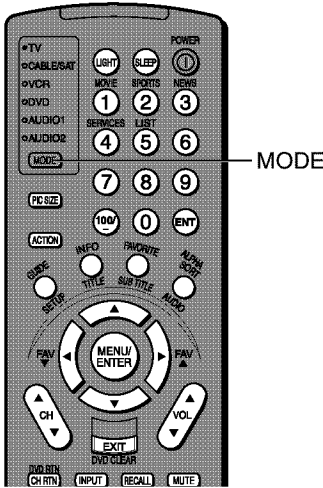


- Slide the battery cover back on to the remote control until the lock snaps.

Note:

Your TV’s remote control may not operate certain features on your VCR, cable TV converter, or other electronic device.

Refer to the owner’s manuals for your other devices to determine their available features. If your TV’s remote control does not operate a specific feature on a device, use the remote control that came with the device.



Caution:

- Dispose of batteries in a designated disposal area. Do not throw batteries into a fire.
- Do not mix battery types or combine used batteries with new ones.
- If the remote control does not operate correctly, or if the operating range becomes reduced, replace both batteries with new ones.
- If the batteries are dead or if you will not use the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries to prevent battery acid from leaking into the battery compartment.

Programming the remote control for use with your audio/video devices

Device code setup

1. Refer to the Device code table on pages 19–20 to find the code for the brand of your device.
If more than one number is listed, try each one separately until you find the one that works.
2. Press MODE until the Mode indicator of the device (CABLE/SAT, VCR, DVD, AUDIO1, AUDIO2) lights up.
3. While holding down the RECALL button, press the Channel Number buttons to enter the four-digit code of your brand of device. If a valid code is entered, the mode indicator will blink twice. If an invalid code is entered, the mode indicator will blink one long blink.
4. Point the remote control at the device and press POWER to test the code.
If the device turns on, you have entered the correct code.
If the device does not respond to the remote control, you may have entered the wrong code. Repeat steps 3 and 4 using another code.
5. Press MODE to select the TV mode to control the TV.

Note:

- Every time you replace the batteries, you must reprogram the remote control.
- Some newer VCRs are capable of working on either of two remote codes. These VCRs have a switch labeled "VCR1/VCR2."

If your VCR has this kind of switch and does not respond to any of the codes for your VCR brand, set the switch to the other position (VCR1 or VCR2) and reprogram the remote control

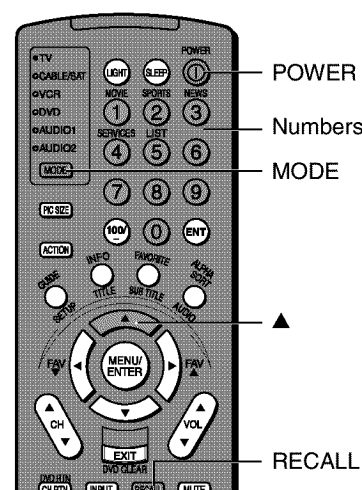
Searching and sampling the code of a device (8500)

If you do not know the device code for a particular target unit, you can cycle the remote control through the available codes for that device mode and sample the functions to find the code that properly operates the target device. The keys available to be sampled, provided they are applicable to that mode, are 0, 1, 2, 3, POWER, VOL ▲, CH ▲, PLAY, and STOP. Invalid keys will be ignored while in program mode.

To cycle through each available device code and sample its functions:

1. Press MODE to select the mode you want to set up.
2. While holding down the RECALL button, press 8 –5 –0 –0.
The remote control will enter program mode.
3. Point the remote control at the target device and press POWER (or other function buttons that are available to be sampled).
4. If the device responds to the remote control:
Press RECALL to store the device code.
The mode indicator will blink twice and the remote control will exit the program mode.
If the device does not respond to the remote control:
Press ▲, and then press POWER.
Repeat this step until the device responds to the remote control, and then press RECALL.

Note: When a search cycle is completed, the mode indicator will blink three times. The remote control will begin to cycle through the available codes again. If no key is pressed within 10 seconds while programming, the remote control will exit the program mode and return to the previous code.



Using the volume lock feature (8000)

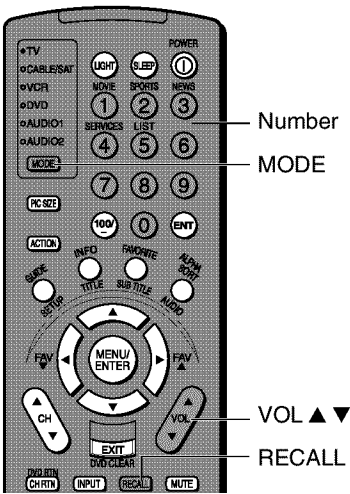
For the TV, CABLE/SAT, VCR, and DVD modes, the volume controls (VOL ▲▼ and MUTE) can be programmed (locked) to the selected device mode. This feature does not apply to the AUDIO1/2 modes.

For example, to lock the volume controls to always jump to the CABLE/SAT mode:

- 1. Repeatedly press MODE to select the CABLE/SAT mode.
- 2. While holding down the RECALL button, press 8 -0 -0 -0.
- 3. Press VOL ▲.
- The Mode indicator will blink two times (locked).

To reset the volume controls to the original device code:

- 1. While holding down the RECALL button, press 8 -0 -0 -0.
- 2. Press VOL ▼.
- The Mode indicator will blink four times (unlocked).

Operational feature reset (8900)

This feature clears all setup features not related to “Device code set up” and resets the Volume Lock to “TV.”

To reset the features:

- While holding down the RECALL button, press 8 -9 -0 -0.
- The Mode indicator will blink two times, and then pause and blink two more times.

Learning about the remote control

The buttons used for operating the TV only are described here. For a complete list of the remote control's functions, see the "Remote Control functional key chart" on pages 15 –16.

POWER turns the TV on and off

SLEEP allows access to the automatic TV shut-off function (page 46)

LIGHT The first press of the LIGHT button lights the keypad and turns on the Illumination mode. With the Illumination mode on, pressing any other key lights the keypad for 5 seconds (10 seconds if you're in programming mode). Subsequent presses of the LIGHT button toggle between turning the Illumination mode on and off.

Channel Numbers (0-9, 100) allow direct access to channels (page 26)

MODE cycles through the six device modes: TV, CABLE/SAT, VCR, DVD, AUDIO1, and AUDIO2. The mode indicator light will remain lit for 10 seconds (page 17).

PIC SIZE cycles through the three picture formats: Normal, Letterbox and Compression (page 30)

MENU allows access to on-screen programming menus (page 22)

ENTER sets programming menu information (page 22)

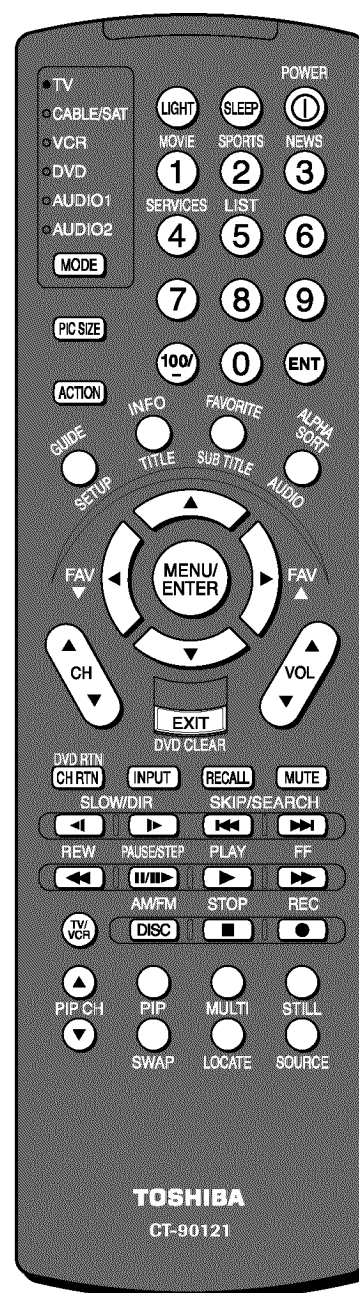

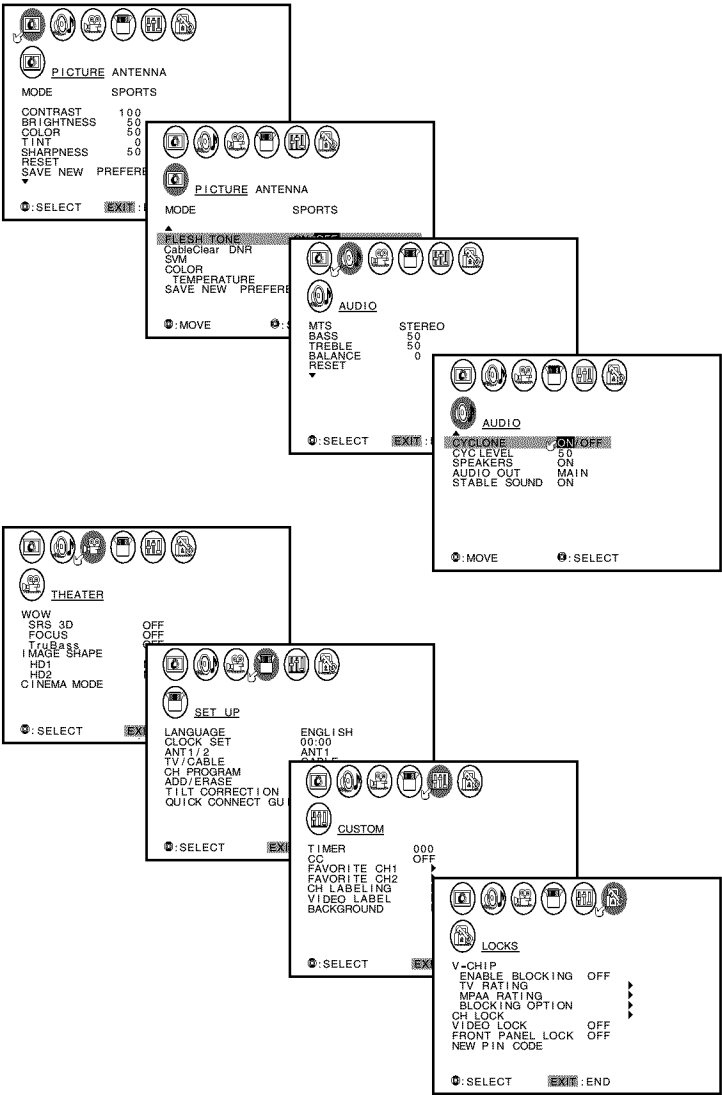

Learning about the menu system

After you have installed the batteries and programmed the remote control, you will need to set some preferences on the TV using the menu system. You can access the menus using the buttons on your TV or remote control.

- 1. Press MENU to display menu.
- 2. Press ◀ or ▶ to select menu.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ select an item.
- 4. Press ◀ or ▶ to select or adjust a setting.

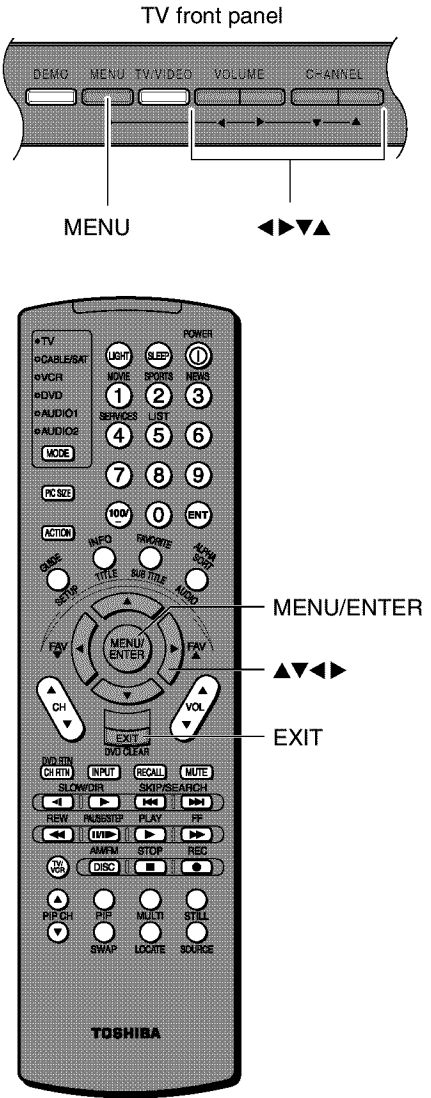


Note regarding Quick Connect Guide

The **Quick Connect Guide** automatically appears on-screen the first time the TV is turned on. This feature provides on-screen instructions to guide you through initial setup of your TV.

To stop the **Quick Connect Guide**, either press **EXIT** or turn off the TV.

- Press ENTER to activate the function settings in the menus.
- The main menu display will disappear automatically if you do not make a selection within 15 seconds. If you want to close all the on-screen displays instantly, press EXIT.

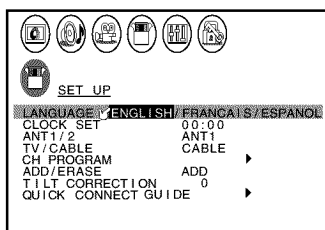

Changing the on-screen display language

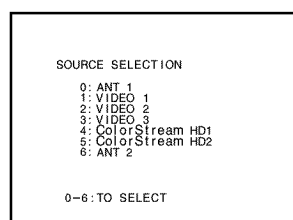

Selecting the antenna input

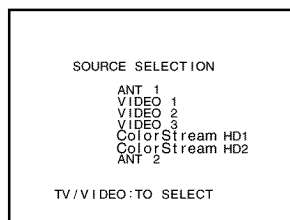

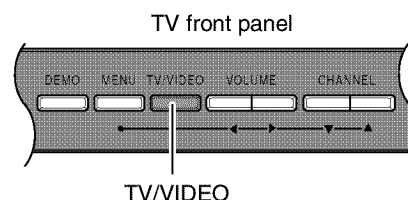
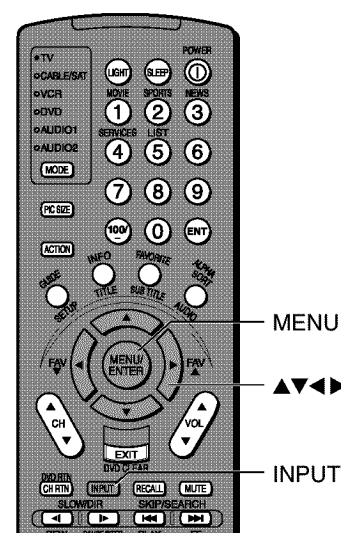
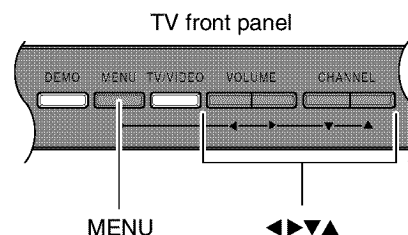
1. Press INPUT on the remote control or TV/VIDEO on the TV (see illustrations below). The current signal source displays in purple.

Pressing INPUT on the remote control displays the current signal source (press INPUT again or 0-6 to change)

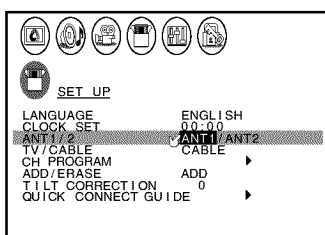


Pressing TV/VIDEO on the TV changes the current signal source



To select the antenna input using the menu system:

1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ to highlight the SET UP menu.

3. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight either ANT 1 or ANT 2, depending on the antenna terminal you wish to use.

Adding channels to the TV's memory

When you press Channel ▲ or ▼, your TV will stop only on the channels stored in the TV's channel memory.

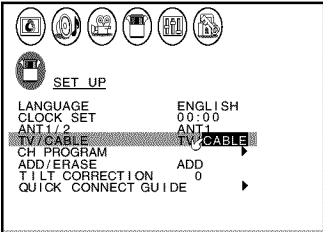
Follow the steps below and on the next page to program all active channels into the TV's memory.

Programming channels automatically

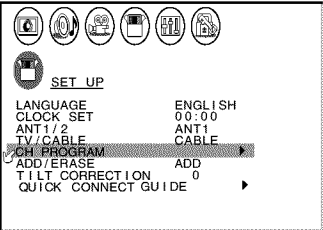
Your TV can automatically detect all active channels in your area and store them in its memory. After the channels are stored automatically, you can manually add or erase individual channels (see below).

To program channels automatically:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ until the TV/CABLE is highlighted.
- 3. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight either TV or CABLE, depending on which you use. If you use an antenna, highlight TV; if you use cable, highlight CABLE.



- 4. Press ▼ to select CH PROGRAM.



- 5. Press ◀ or ▶ to start channel programming. The TV will automatically cycle through all the TV or Cable channels (depending on which you selected), and store all active channels in the channel memory.
- While the TV is cycling through the channels, the message “Programming Now—Please Wait” appears.
- 6. When channel programming is complete, the message “Completed” appears.
- 7. Press Channel ▲ or ▼ to view the programmed channels.

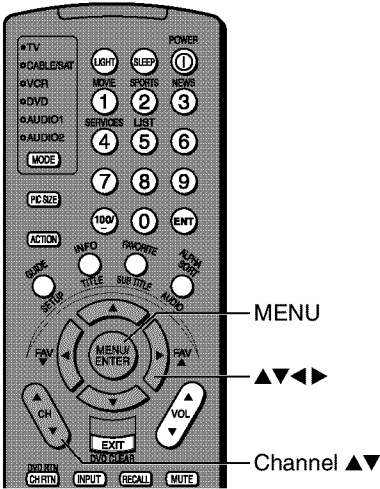
Adding and erasing channels manually

After you have programmed the channels automatically, you can manually add or erase specific channels.

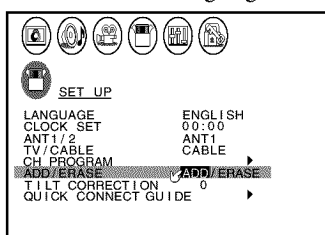
To add or erase channels:

- 1. Select the channel you want to add or erase. If you are adding a channel, you must select the channel using the Channel Number buttons.
- 2. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.

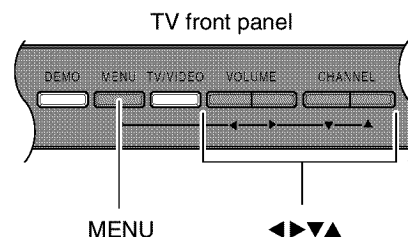

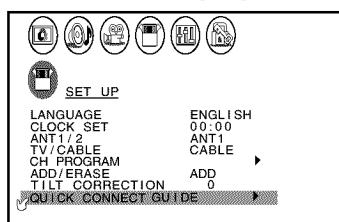


Using the Quick Connect Guide

The Quick Connect Guide automatically starts the first time the TV is turned on. This feature provides on-screen instructions to guide you through initial setup of your TV.

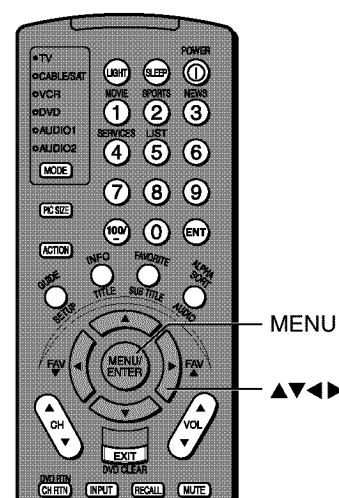

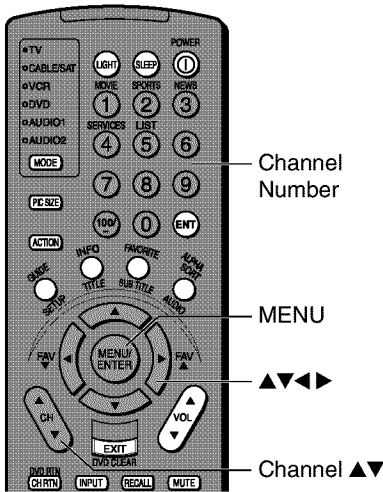
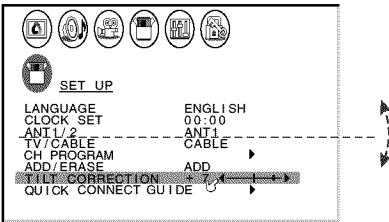


Adjusting the tilt correction feature

When you install the TV or change the direction of the TV, the picture may suffer from color shading and/or tilt of the picture because of terrestrial magnetism. If so, the following adjustment should be made for the best possible picture.

To adjust the tilt correction:

- 1. Press MENU, then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight TILT CORRECTION.
- 3. Press ◀ or ▶ to correct any tilt of the picture between +10 and -10.



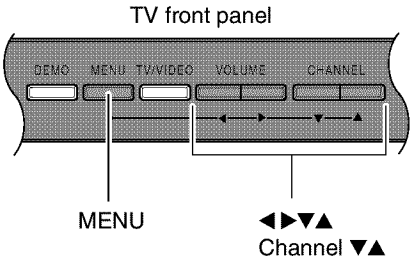
Changing channels

To change to a specific channel (programmed or unprogrammed):

Press the Channel Number buttons (0–9 and 100). For channels 100 and higher, press the 100 button, and then the next two numbers. For example, to select channel 125, press 100, 2, 5.

To change to the next programmed channel:

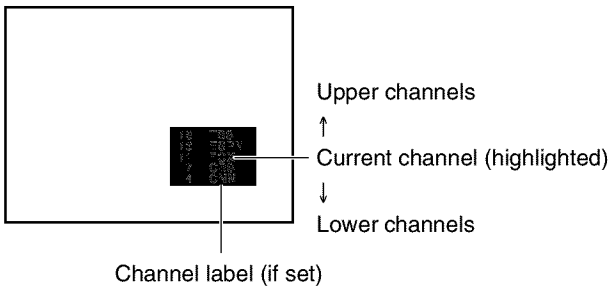

Changing channels using SpeedSurf

To use SpeedSurf to change to a specific programmed channel:

- 1. Press and hold Channel ▲ or ▼ for about one second. The TV will enter the SpeedSurf mode.

Adjusting the channel settings

Switching between two channels using Channel Return

The Channel Return feature allows you to switch between two channels without entering an actual channel number each time.

1. Select the first channel (or video mode) you want to view.
2. Select a second channel using the Channel Number buttons (0–9, 100).
3. Press CH RTN. The previous channel will display.

Each time you press CH RTN, the TV will switch back and forth between the last two channels that were selected.

Switching between two channels using SurfLock™

The SurfLock™ feature temporarily “memorizes” one channel in the CH RTN button, so you can return to that channel quickly from any other channel by pressing CH RTN.

To memorize a channel in the CH RTN button:

1. Select the channel you want to program into the CH RTN button.
2. Press and hold CH RTN for about 2 seconds until the message “Channel Memorized” appears (flashing) on the screen. The channel has been programmed into the CH RTN button.
3. Continue to change channels until your desired channel is selected.
4. Press CH RTN. The memorized channel will be selected.

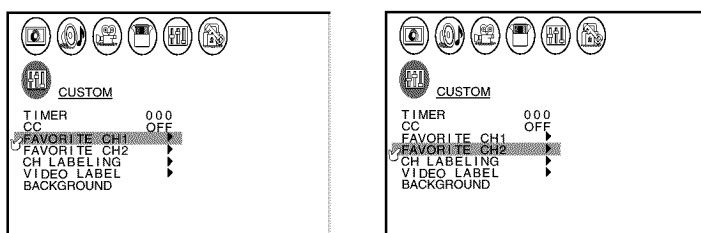
The TV will return to the memorized channel one time only. Once you press CH RTN and then change channels again, the CH RTN button memory will be cleared and the button will function as Channel Return, by switching back and forth between the last two channels that were selected.

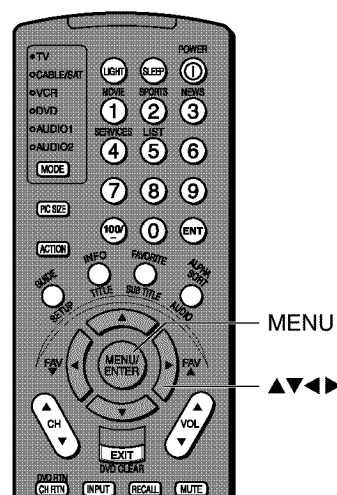
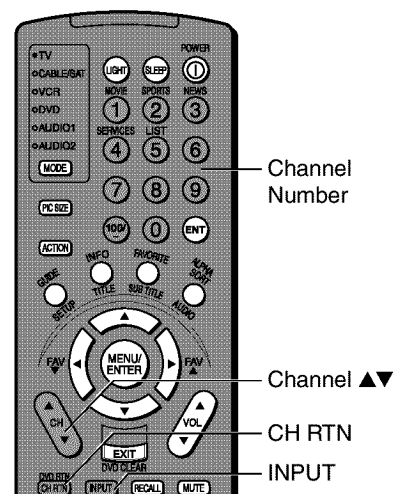
You can preset up to 9 of your favorite channels each for FAVORITE CH1 and FAVORITE CH2 modes using the Favorite Channel Programming feature. Because this feature scans through only your favorite channels, it allows you to skip other channels you do not normally watch.

To program your favorite channels:

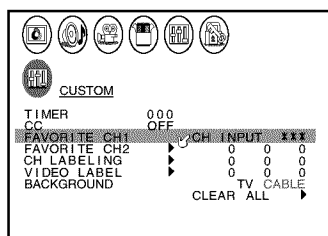

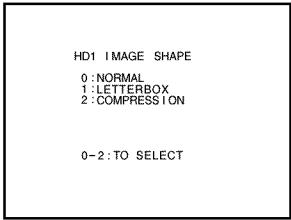
Viewing the wide-screen picture formats

You can view programs that have the conventional TV picture format (4:3 aspect ratio) and the wide-screen format (16:9 aspect ratio). This feature is available for TV or DVD video signals input from the ColorStream HD1 and HD2 jacks.

Selecting the image shape

- 1. Make sure the ColorStream HD1 or HD2 mode is selected. (See page 44 for details.)
- 2. Press PIC SIZE repeatedly to select either Normal, Letterbox, or Compression image shape, as described below.

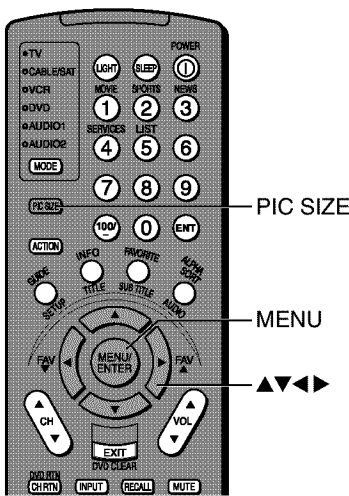
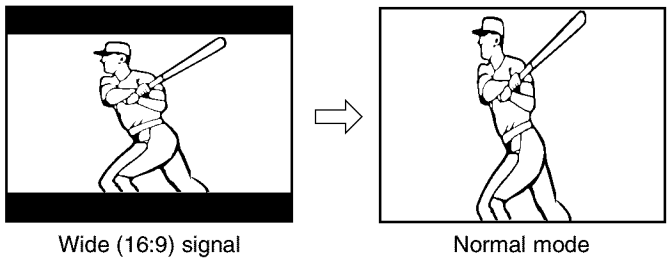

While the above menu is on-screen, select the desired picture size by pressing the corresponding number button (0–2).

Normal mode

The Normal picture size displays the picture in the conventional 4:3 aspect ratio. A wide (16:9) picture signal is stretched vertically to fill the screen.

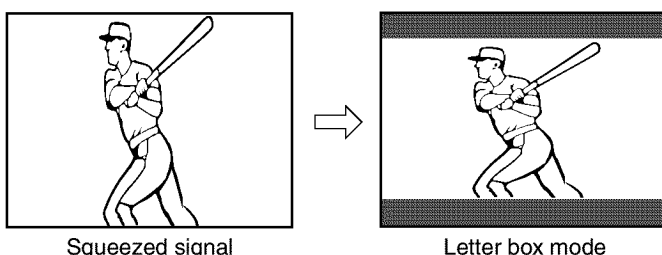

Letterbox and Compression modes

The Letterbox and Compression modes display the wide picture (16:9) with bars at top and bottom. The picture retains its true proportion.

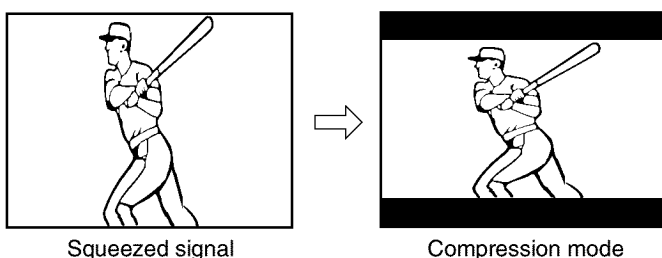
Letterbox (recommended mode):

- The picture is vertically compressed, with gray bars at top and bottom.
- The picture quality is lower than in the Compression mode because of a reduction in the scanning lines.
- There is a slightly lower chance of permanently engraining stationary patterns in the picture tube than in Compression mode because there is a small amount of raster in the bars at the top and bottom.



Compression:

- The picture is vertically compressed, with black bars at the top and bottom.
- The exact image is reproduced and the picture quality is better because of more effective use of scanning lines.
- There is a greater chance of permanently engraining stationary patterns in the picture tube than in the Letterbox mode, since there is no raster in the bars at the top and bottom.

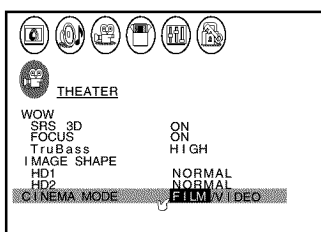


Selecting the cinema mode

When you view a DVD movie (3-2 pulldown processed) from a DVD player connected to the ColorStream (component video) inputs on the TV, smoother and more natural motion can be obtained by setting the CINEMA MODE to FILM.

To set the CINEMA MODE to FILM:

1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the THEATER menu appears.
2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight CINEMA MODE.
3. Press ◀ or ▶ to select FILM.

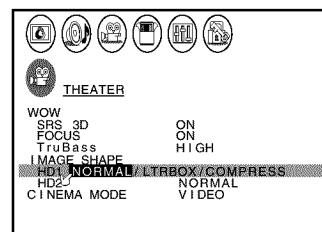

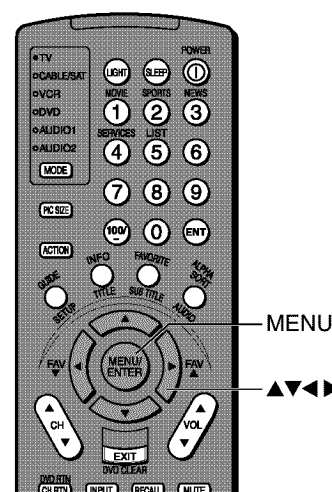

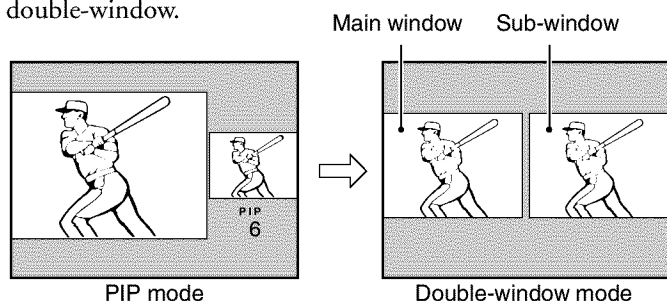


Watching PIP/double-window

Using the Multi-Window feature

- 1. Press FAVORITE to scan the channels you programmed in the TV memory using the favorite channel function (page 27).

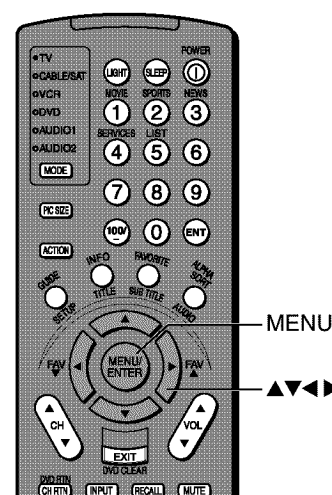
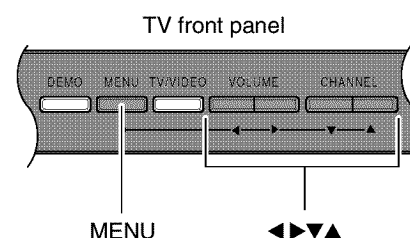


The PICTURE quality adjustments you make (contrast, brightness, color, tint, and sharpness) can be saved in the TV's memory with the SAVE NEW PREFERENCE feature (see page 42). You can keep these settings or choose factory set options, as described under "Selecting the picture mode" above.

Note:

If you select one of the factory-set picture modes (SPORTS, STANDARDS, or MOVIE) and then change a picture quality setting (for example, increase the contrast), the picture mode automatically changes to PREFERENCE in the Picture menu.

To save your new picture quality settings, you must select SAVE NEW PREFERENCE (see page 42) before closing the Picture menu or the TV will return to the previous picture mode.

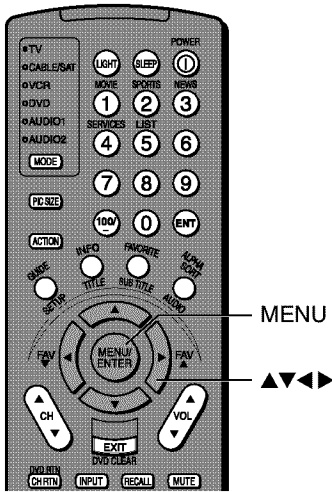
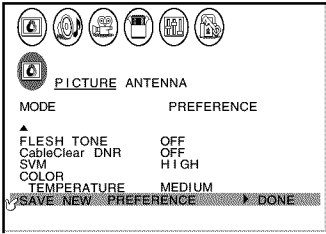


Saving new preference

You can save the PICTURE qualities (contrast, brightness, color, tint, and sharpness) you adjusted in the picture preference mode.

To save your new preferences:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the PICTURE menu appears.

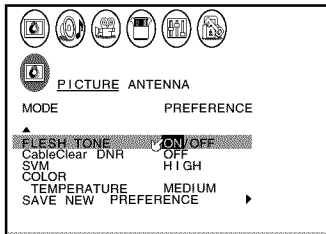

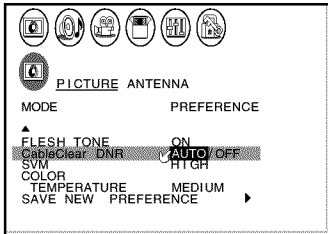

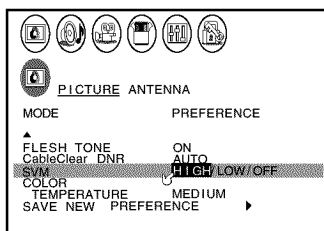

Selecting the Scan Velocity Modulation (SVM)

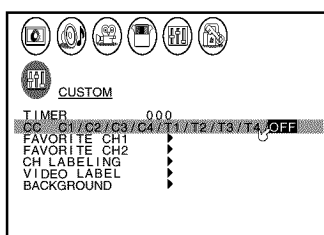
Using the closed caption feature

The closed caption feature has two options:

- **Captions**—An on-screen display of the dialogue, narration, and sound effects of TV programs and videos that are closed captioned (usually marked as “CC” in TV listings).
- **Text**—An on-screen display of information not related to the current program, such as weather or stock data (when provided by individual stations).

To view captions or text:

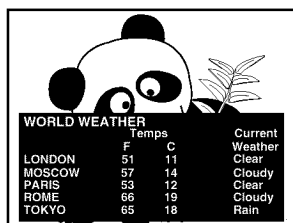

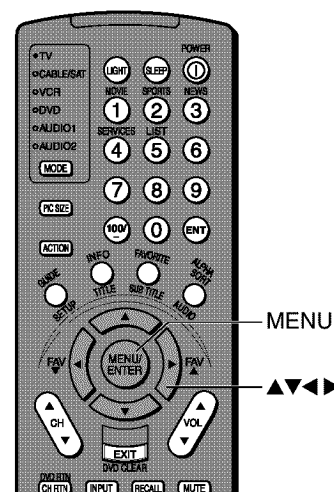

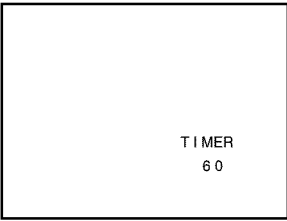

Setting the sleep timer

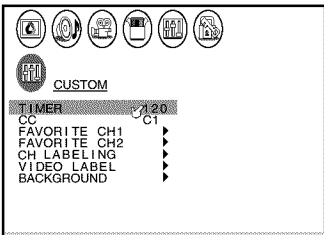

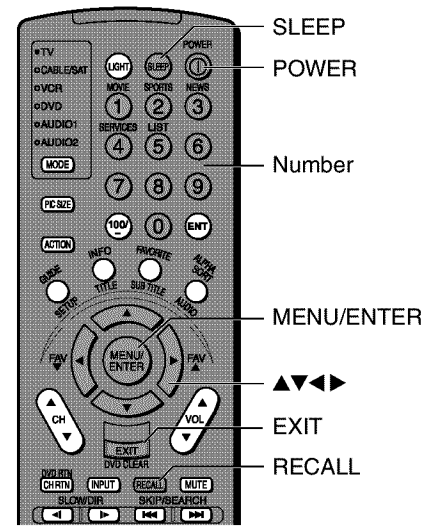

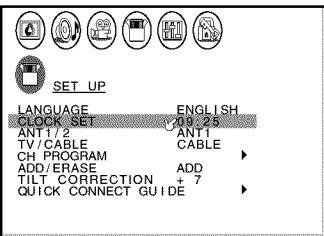

Selecting stereo/SAP broadcasts

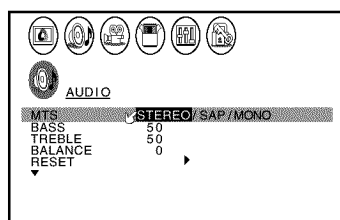
The multi-channel TV sound (MTS) feature allows you to listen to high-fidelity stereo sound while watching TV. MTS can also transmit a second audio program (SAP) containing a second language, music, or other audio information (when provided by individual stations).

When the TV receives a stereo or SAP broadcast, the word STEREO or SAP appears on-screen every time the TV is turned on, the channel is changed, or the RECALL button is pressed.

The MTS feature is not available when the TV is in VIDEO mode.

To listen to stereo sound:

1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the AUDIO menu appears.
2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight MTS.
3. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight STEREO.

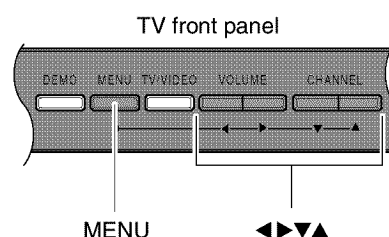
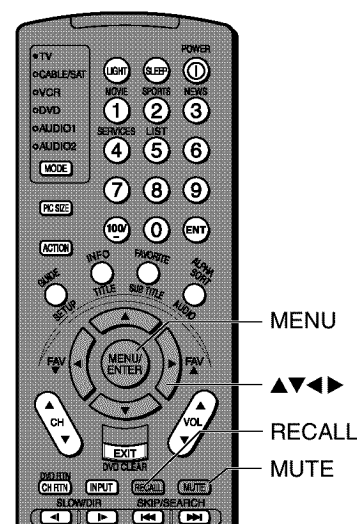


You can leave your TV in STEREO mode because it will automatically output the type of sound being broadcast (stereo or monaural). The word “STEREO” or “SAP” displays in yellow in the menu when the TV receives the signal.

If the stereo sound is noisy, select MONO to reduce the noise.

To listen to SAP (if available):

1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the AUDIO menu appears.
2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight MTS.
3. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight SAP. You will hear the station's second audio program (if available) from the speakers, while viewing the original program's picture (see note at right).



Note :

A second audio program (SAP) can be heard only on those TV stations that offer it.

For example, a station might broadcast music as a second audio program. If you have SAP on, you will see the current program on the screen but hear music instead of the program's normal audio.

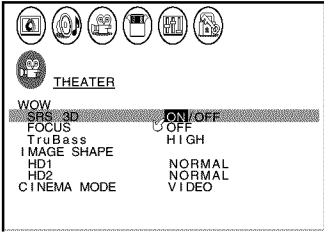
However, if you have SAP on, and the station you are watching is not currently broadcasting a second audio program, you will see the picture but not hear any sound. If this happens, put the TV in STEREO mode so you can hear the station's normal audio.

Using the WOW surround sound feature

The WOW surround sound feature expands the audio listening field wider and deeper to create exceptional sound quality from the TV’s speakers. WOW consists of the three features: SRS 3D, FOCUS and TruBass. The feature uses stereo signals from a TV broadcast or video input.

To adjust the WOW feature:

- 1. Select STEREO mode (See “Selecting stereo/SAP broadcasts” on page 47).
- 2. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the THEATER menu appears.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the desired WOW feature you want to adjust, then press ◀ or ▶ to adjust the item.



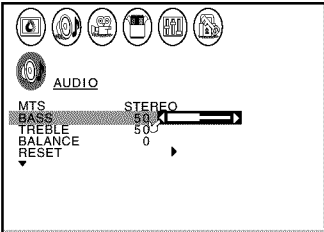
- SRS 3D — To turn on or off the surround sound effect.
- FOCUS — To turn on or off the vocal emphasis effect.
- TruBass — To select your desired bass expansion level (HIGH, LOW or OFF).

Adjusting the sound quality

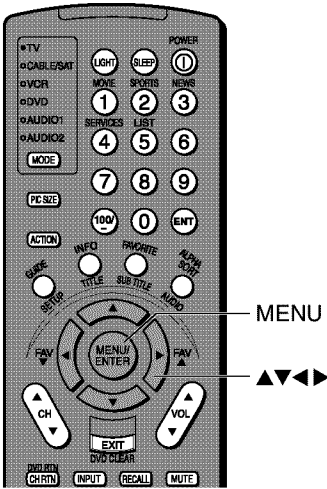

Understanding the auto power off feature

The TV will automatically turn itself off after approximately 15 minutes if it is tuned to a vacant channel or a station that completes its broadcast for the day. This feature does not work in VIDEO mode.

Understanding the last mode memory feature

If the power is cut off while you are viewing the TV, the Last Mode Memory feature turns on the TV automatically when the power is resupplied.

If the power is going to be off for a long time and you are going to be away from your TV, unplug the power cord to prevent the TV from turning on in your absence.
