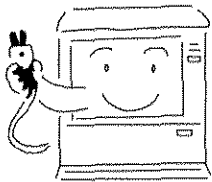

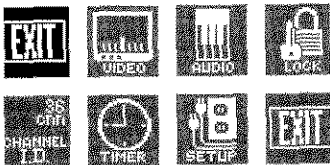

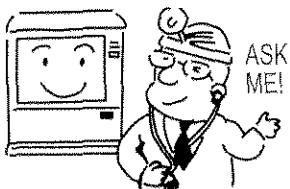

POWER SOURCE

- This solid state color TV is designed to operate on 120 volts 60Hz, AC household current.
- Insert power cord into a 120 volt 60Hz outlet.
- To prevent electric shock, do not use the television's plug with an extension cord, receptacle, or other outlet unless the blades and ground terminal can be fully inserted to prevent blade exposure.
- Never connect the TV to 50Hz, direct current, or anything other than the specified voltage.

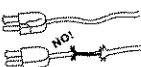
Please fill out your warranty card and mail it at once to HITACHI. This will enable HITACHI to notify you promptly in the improbable event that a safety problem should be discovered in your product model.

FOR YOUR PERSONAL SAFETY

1. This television set is equipped with a polarized alternating-current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other.) This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug.



2. When the power cord or plug is damaged or frayed, unplug the television set from the wall outlet and refer servicing to qualified service personnel.



3. Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in fire or electric shock.



4. Do not allow anything to rest on or roll over the power cord, and do not place the TV where the power cord is subject to traffic or abuse. This may result in a shock or fire hazard.



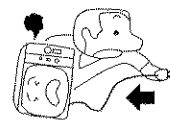
5. Do not attempt to service the television set yourself as opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.



6. Never push objects of any kind into the television's cabinet slots as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short out parts that could result in a fire or electric shock. Never spill liquid of any kind on the television set.



7. If the television set has been dropped or the cabinet has been damaged, unplug the television set from the wall outlet and refer servicing to qualified service personnel.



8. If liquid has been spilled into the television set, unplug it from the wall outlet and refer service to qualified service personnel.



9. Do not subject your television set to impact of any kind. Be careful not to damage the picture tube surface.



10. Unplug the television set from the wall outlet before cleaning. Use a damp cloth for cleaning. Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners.



11-1. Do not place the television set on an unstable cart, stand, or table. The television set may fall, causing serious injury to a child or an adult, and serious damage to the appliance. Use only with a cart or stand recommended by the manufacturer, or sold with the television set. Wall or shelf mounting should follow the manufacturer's instructions, and should use a mounting kit approved by the manufacturer.



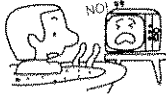
11-2. An appliance and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the appliance and cart combination to overturn.



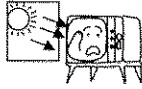

- Never expose the set to rain or water. If the set has been exposed to rain or water, unplug set from wall outlet and refer to qualified service personnel.

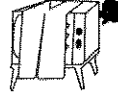


13. Choose a place where light (artificial or sunlight) does not shine directly on the screen.

14. Avoid dusty places, since accumulated dust inside the chassis may cause failure of the set when high humidity persists.



15. The set has slots or openings in the cabinet for ventilation purposes which provide reliable operation of the receiver and protect the TV from overheating. These openings must not be blocked or covered.



- Never cover the slots or openings with cloth or other material.

- Never block the bottom ventilation slots of the set by placing it on a bed, sofa, rug, etc.



- Never place the set near or over a radiator or heat register.

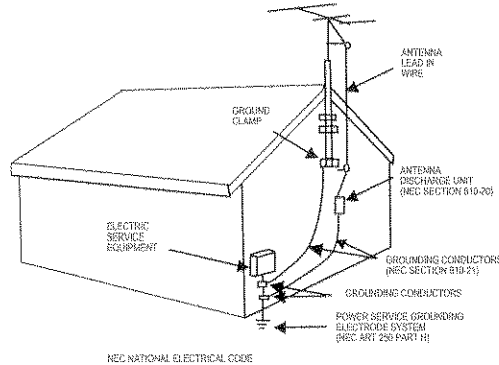


- Never place the set in a "built-in" enclosure, unless proper ventilation is provided.



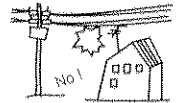
PROTECTION AND LOCATION OF YOUR TELEVISION SET

16. If an outside antenna is connected to the television set, be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Section 810 of the National Electrical Code, NFPA No. 70-1975, provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna discharge unit connection to grounding electrode, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

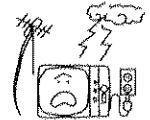


EXAMPLE OF ANTENNA GROUNDING AS PER NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE INSTRUCTIONS.

17. An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electrical lights or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.



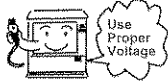
18. For added protection for the television set during a lightning storm, or when it is unused for long periods of time, unplugging it from the wall outlet and disconnect antenna. This will prevent damage due to lightning and power-line surges.



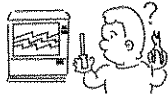
16-1. Note to CATV system installer: (Only for television sets with CATV reception) This reminder is provided to call CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

OPERATION OF YOUR TELEVISION SET

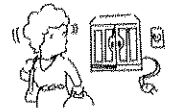
19. This television set should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply at your home, consult your television dealer or local power company. For television sets designed to operate from battery power, refer to the operating instructions.



20. If the television set does not operate normally by following the operating instructions, unplug the television set from the wall outlet and refer servicing to qualified service personnel. Adjust only those controls that are covered in the instructions as improper adjustment of other controls may result in damage and will often require extensive work by a qualified service technician to restore the television set to normal operation.



21. If your television set is to remain unused for a period of time, (such as when going on a holiday), turn the television set OFF and unplug it from the wall outlet.



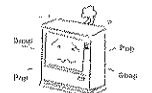

22. If you are unable to restore normal operation by following the detailed procedure in your operating instructions, do not attempt any further adjustments. Unplug the set and call your dealer or service technician.



23. Whenever the television set is damaged or fails, or if there is a distinct change in performance that indicates a need for service, unplug the set and have it checked by a qualified service technician.

24. It is normal for some television sets to make occasional snapping or popping sounds, particularly when being turned on or off. If the snapping or popping is continuous or frequent, unplug the set and consult your dealer or service technician.



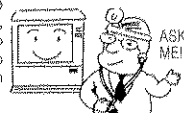
FOR SERVICING AND MODIFICATION

25. Do not use attachments not recommended by the television set manufacturer as they may cause hazards.



26. When replacement parts are required, be sure the service technician has used replacement parts specified by the manufacturer that have the same characteristics as the original part. Unauthorized substitutions may result in fire, electric shock, or other hazards.

27. Upon completion of any service or repairs to the television set, ask the service technician to perform routine safety checks to determine that the television is in safe operating condition.



Introduction

Your new television features all solid state components. It is designed to give you many years of enjoyment. It was thoroughly tested and adjusted at the factory for best performance. Care and Cleaning

Picture Tube (Turn TV Off)

Use a mild soap solution or window cleaner with a soft clean cloth. DO NOT USE ABRASIVE CLEANERS. Avoid excessive moisture and wipe dry.

Plastic Cabinets

Wipe the cabinet with a soft cloth dampened with water or a mild detergent solution and wipe dry with a soft clean cloth. Avoid excessive moisture. Do not use benzene, thinner or other petroleum based products.

Remote Control

Wipe the cabinet with a soft cloth dampened with water or a mild detergent solution and wipe dry with a soft clean cloth. Do not use benzene, thinner or other petroleum based products.

Television Location

This television is intended to be used with a stand or entertainment center. Consult your dealer for available options. Locate for comfortable viewing. Avoid placing where sunlight or other bright lights (including reflections) will fall on the screen. Use of some types of fluorescent lighting may reduce remote control transmitter range.

Adequate ventilation is essential to prevent internal component failure. Keep away from excessive heat or moisture. To ensure optimum color purity do not position magnetic equipment (motors, fans, external speakers) nearby.

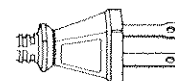
Optional Cable Connections

The Audio/Video connections between components can be made with shielded video and audio cables. For best performance, video cables should utilize 75 ohm coaxial shielded wire. Cables are available from your dealer or electronic supply house.

Before you purchase any cables, be sure you know what type of output and input connectors your various components require. Also determine the length of cable you'll need.

AC Power Supply Cord

CAUTION: TO PREVENT ELECTRIC SHOCK, MATCH WIDE BLADE OF PLUG TO WIDE SLOT OF AC OUTLET AND FULLY INSERT. DO NOT USE A PLUG WITH A RECEPTACLE OR OTHER OUTLET UNLESS THE BLADE CAN BE FULLY INSERTED TO PREVENT BLADE EXPOSURE. FOR SOME MODELS THAT ARE NON-POLARIZED, THE USE OF AN AC ADAPTOR CONNECTOR MAY BE NECESSARY.

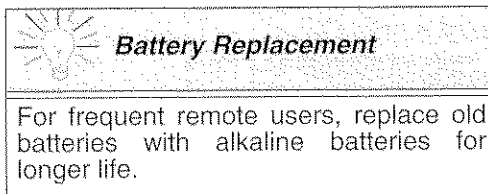


Polarized Plug

Remote Control Battery Installation

Batteries: Use two "AA" batteries.

1. Remove the battery compartment cover on back of the remote.
2. Install the batteries in the battery compartment. (Polarity (+) or (-) must be correct.)
3. Reattach the battery cover.



Precaution on Battery Use

Incorrect installation can cause battery leakage and corrosion that will damage the remote control.

Observe the Following Precautions:

1. Batteries must be replaced as a pair.
2. Do not combine a used battery with a new one.
3. Do not mix battery types (Example: "Zinc Carbon" with Alkaline").
4. Do not attempt to charge, short-circuit, disassemble, heat or burn used batteries.
5. Battery replacement is necessary when remote control reacts sporadically or stops operating the television.



Cable / Antenna

For proper reception, either a cable or antenna connection is required.

Cable Connection

Connect the cable supplied by your local cable company.

Note: *A cable converter box may be required for proper reception. Check with your local Cable company for compatibility requirements.*

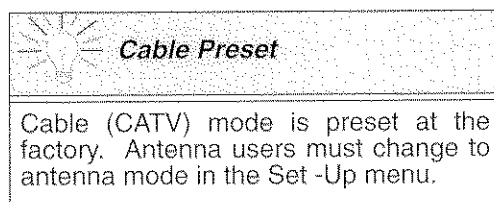
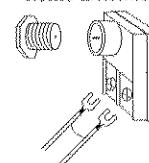

- Antenna must be selected as the signal source in the SET-UP menu.

Incoming cable from home antenna

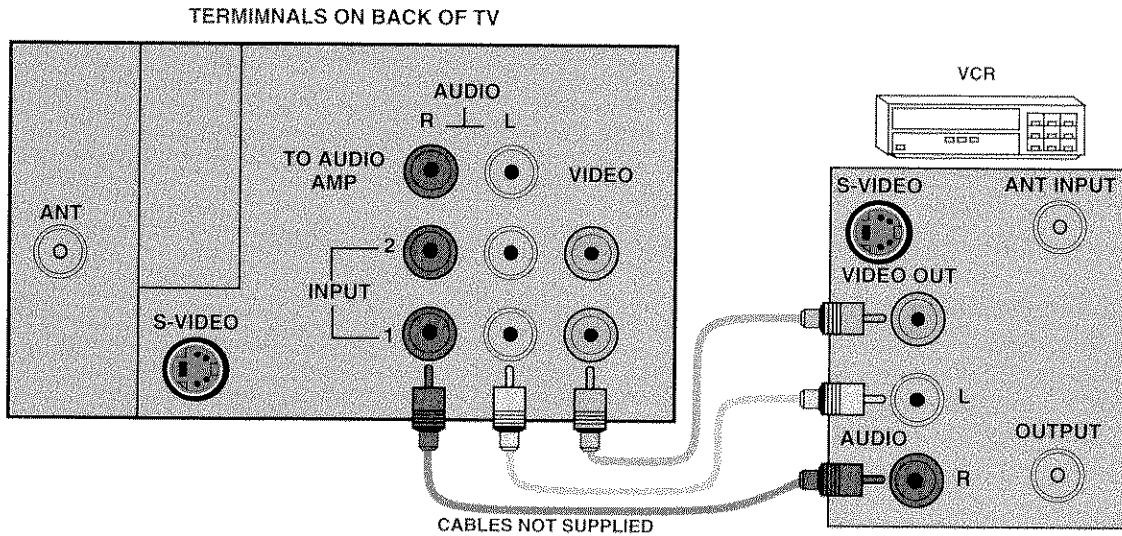


Installation

Optional Equipment Connections

Audio / Video Connections

VCRs, video disc players, video game consoles, and SAT equipment can also be connected to the video inputs. See the optional equipment manual for details.



Procedure

1. Connect equipment as shown to rear Audio/Video input jacks.
2. Select the video mode by pressing **INPUT** button.
3. Operate optional equipment as instructed in equipment manual.

NOTE: The S-VIDEO connection is optional and overrides other VIDEO connection.
Use INPUT 1, AUDIO R and L with S-VIDEO connection.

Installation

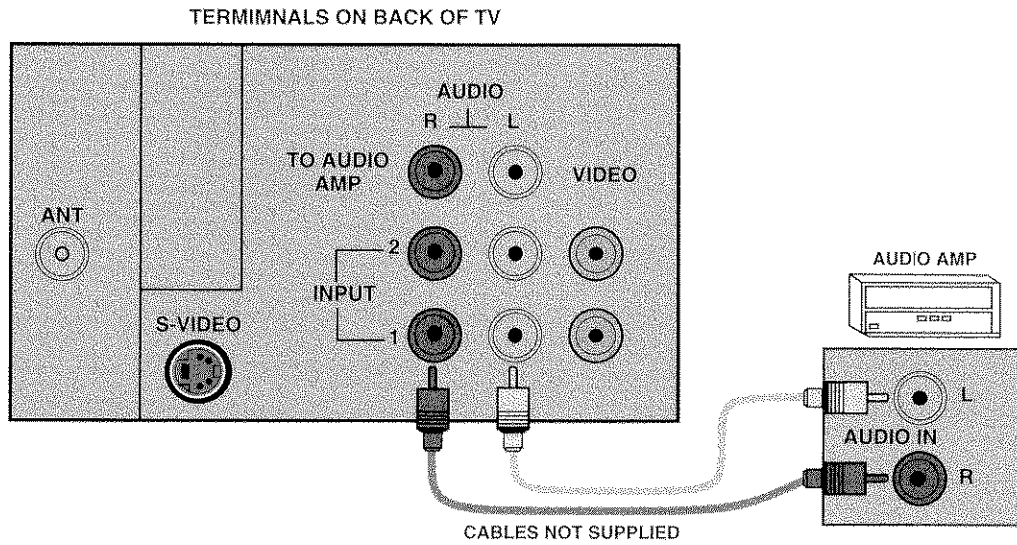
Amplifier Connection (TO AUDIO AMP)

Connect to an external audio amplifier input for listening to TV from a stereo system speakers.

Audio Adjustments

1. Select INTERNAL SPEAKER ON located in the AUDIO menu on screen.
2. Set amplifier volume to minimum.
3. Adjust TV volume to desired level.
4. Adjust amplifier volume to match the TV.
5. Select INTERNAL SPEAKERS OFF&VAO from AUDIO menu.
6. Volume, mute, bass, treble and balance are now controlled from the TV.

Note: *TO AUDIO AMP terminals should not be connected directly to external speakers. In OFF&FAO the volume is controlled by the external amplifier.*



Picture in Picture (PIP) Operation

This television includes a two tuner Picture In Picture (PIP) feature. This allows watching two (2) live broadcasts at the same time with or without an external video source (VCR).

Without a VCR

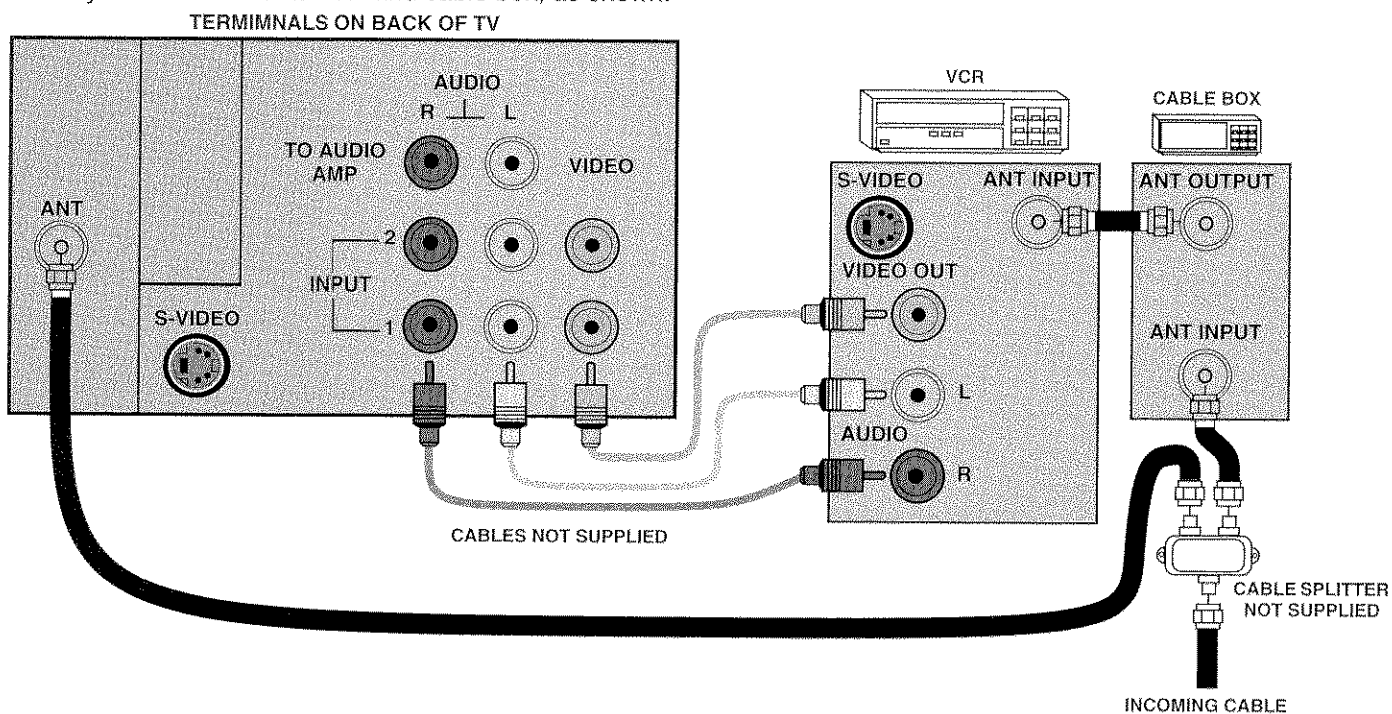
Procedure

- Connect incoming cable to antenna (ANT) input on back of TV.
- Press the **PIP** button on the remote control to display the PIP frame.
- Choose channels for the *PIP* frame by pressing the remote control **PIP CH ▲▼** buttons.
- Choose channels for the *Main Picture* by pressing the remote control **CH ▲▼** buttons or by using the numeric keypad.

Note: *The audio is from the Main Picture only.*

With a VCR and Cable Box

Connect your television to a VCR and cable box, as shown.



Note: *The Remote Control must be programmed with supplied codes to operate the VCR and cable box. (See "Programming the Remote" on page 16.)*


Procedure

Press the **PIP** button on the remote control to display the PIP frame.

To view scrambled channels through your cable box in the PIP frame:

- Press the **INPUT** button on the remote control to select the video input to which your VCR is connected.
- Verify the **CABLE BOX** and **VCR** are **ON** and the **VCR** tuned to channel 3 or 4.
- Choose channels for the *PIP* frame by pressing the **CABLE** button on the remote control and using the numeric keypad or **CH ▲▼** buttons.
- Choose channels for the *Main Picture* by pressing the **TV** button on the remote control and using the numeric keypad or **CH ▲▼** buttons.

Note: *The audio is from the Main Picture only.*

 **SWAP and RECALL Buttons**

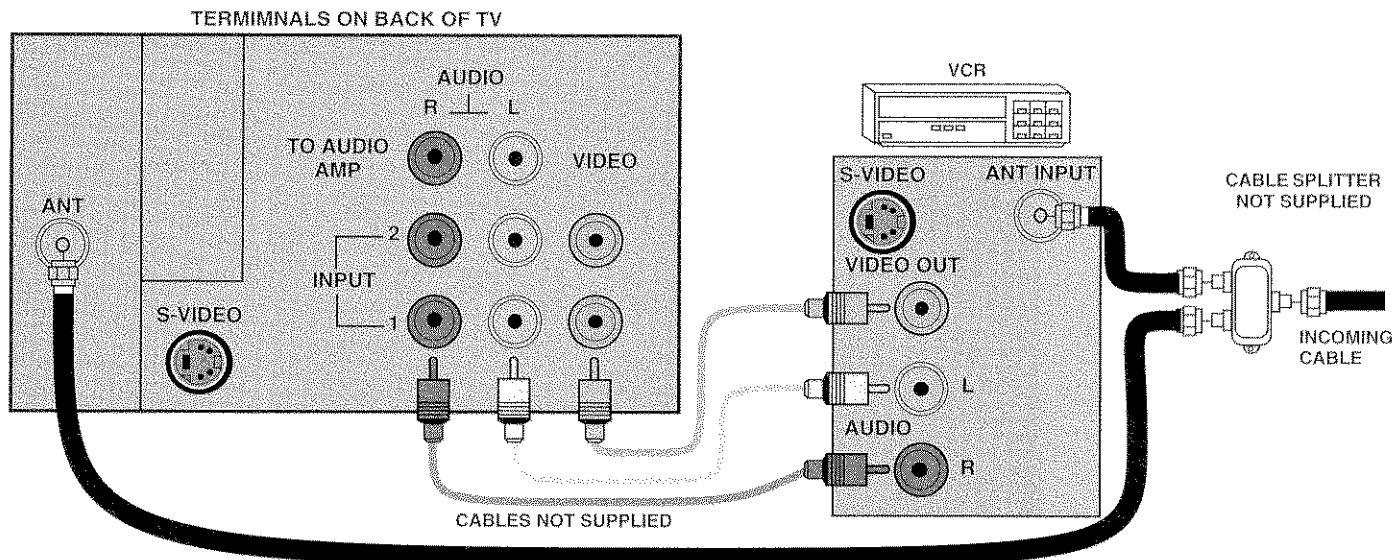
The **SWAP** button switches the PIP and the main picture source. The **RECALL** button shows the status of the onscreen PIP and the main picture.

Picture in Picture (PIP) Operation

With a VCR - No Cable Box

This television includes a two tuner Picture In Picture (PIP) feature. This allows watching two (2) live broadcasts at the same time without or with an external video source (VCR).

Connect your television to a VCR, as shown.

Procedure

Press the **PIP** button on the remote control to display the PIP frame.

Special Buttons

Recall Button

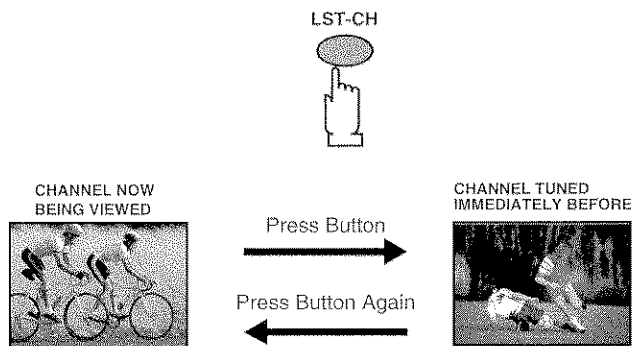
Press the **RECALL** button to check:

1. Audio mode status
2. CH number or video input selected
3. Channel Caption (Station Identifier)
4. Clock time
5. Sleep timer status



LST-CH Button

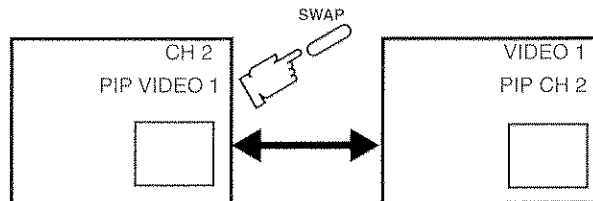
Pressing the **LST-CH** button will switch between the last two channels viewed.



Note: When scanning channels with the **CHANNEL ▲ ▼** buttons, pressing the **LST-CH** button will switch between the last two channels scanned.

Swap Button

Press the **SWAP** button (when the PIP frame is displayed) to interchange what is being viewed on the main picture with that of the PIP frame.



Note: The audio is from the Main Picture only.

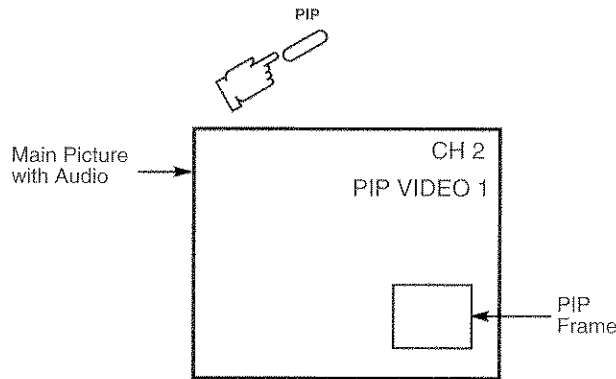
Special Buttons

PIP (Picture in Picture) Button

This feature allows the viewer to monitor one channel program while watching another. The monitored source (PIP) can be a different channel or a different video source (such as a VCR) when connected to the input jacks.

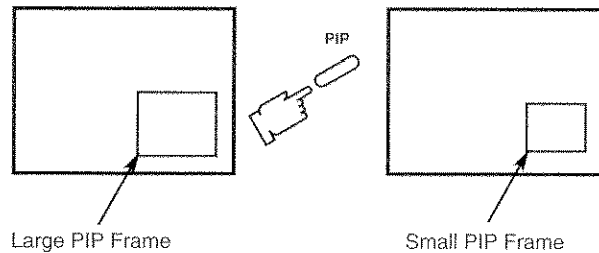
PIP Operation

1. Press the **PIP** button (set must be ON). The PIP frame will appear at the position it was last displayed. The main picture video source and PIP video source will display on screen momentarily. Audio will be that of main picture.



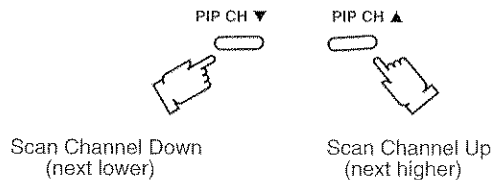
Note: *When the Main Picture is in Video mode with no signal, the PIP will not operate properly.*

2. Press the **PIP** button again to size PIP frame or twice to cancel PICTURE IN PICTURE feature.



PIP CH Buttons

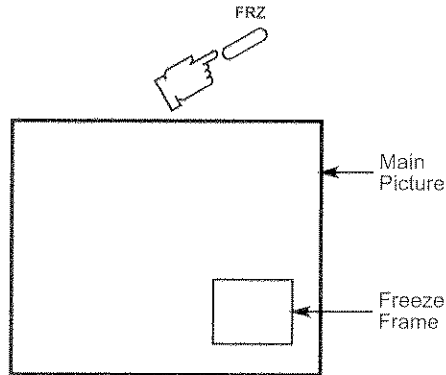
Press the **PIP CHANNEL ▲ ▼** button while the PIP frame is displayed to sequentially scan through channels.



Special Buttons

Frz (Freeze) Button

Press the **FRZ** button to stop action in the PIP frame.

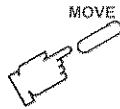

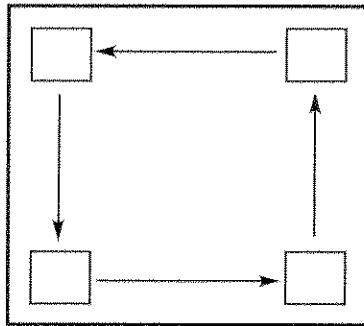
- Pressing the **FRZ** button when the PIP frame is displayed, will freeze action from the PIP frame. Press the **FRZ** button again to continue action.
- Press the **PIP** button as needed to delete PIP frame.

Move Button

The PIP frame may be located at any corner of the Main Picture by pressing the **MOVE** button (when the PIP frame is displayed).



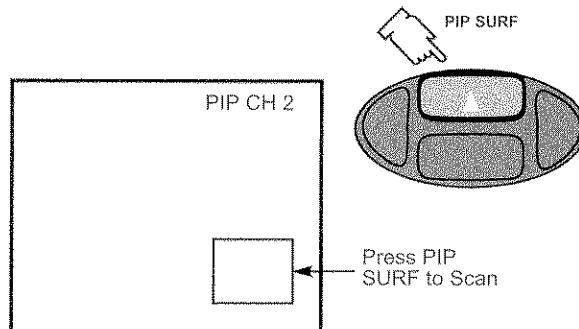
Note: As **MOVE** button is pressed (when the PIP frame is displayed), the PIP frame will move counterclockwise as illustrated.



PIP SURF Button

While the PIP frame is displayed, pressing the **PIP SURF** button will continuously scan channels in sequence as programmed into channel scan memory.

- Press the **PIP** button to stop PIP SURF feature on desired picture for PIP frame.
- Press the **SWAP** button to interchange what is being viewed on the main picture with that of the PIP frame.



Programming the Remote

VCR Functions

This remote is designed to operate different brands of VCRs. You must first program the remote to match the remote system of your VCR.

Procedure

1. Turn ON your VCR.
2. Aim the remote control at the front of your VCR.
3. While holding down the VCR button on the remote, enter the 2-digit preset code that matches your VCR. (See "Component Codes" on page 17 ~ page 18.) The remote will turn off your VCR when the correct 2 digit preset code is entered. When this occurs, the remote control is programmed for your VCR. If the VCR does not turn off after 25 seconds, try a different code, if available.
4. The remote will now control your VCR.

Notes

- If your VCR will not operate remotely after performing the above procedures, this means that your VCR's code has not been coded into the remote. Please consult your VCR's operating guide.
- The remote control will remember the codes you have programmed in until the batteries are removed from the remote control. After replacing the batteries repeat the programming procedure stated above.
- If your VCR does not have a remote power function, the remote will issue the CHANNEL UP function.
- The **MENU** button will act as the VCR MENU button for HITACHI VCRs.
- The **INPUT** button will act as your VCR +100 button, if required.

Cable/Satellite Box Functions

This remote is designed to operate different brands of cable boxes and Satellite boxes. You must first program the remote to match the remote system in your cable/satellite box.

Procedure

1. Turn ON your cable/satellite box.
2. Aim the remote control at the front of your cable/satellite box.
3. While holding down the **CABLE** button on the remote, enter the 2 digit preset code (See "Component Codes" on page 18 ~ page 19) that matches your cable/satellite box. The remote will turn off your cable/satellite box when the correct 2 digit code is entered. When this occurs, the remote control is programmed for your cable/satellite box. If the cable/satellite box does not turn off after 5 seconds, try another 2 digit preset code, if available.
4. The remote will now control your cable/satellite box.

Notes

- If your cable/satellite box will not operate remotely after performing the above procedures, this means that your cable/satellite box code has not been coded into the remote. Please consult your cable/satellite box operating guide.
- The remote control will remember the codes you have programmed in until the batteries are removed from the remote control. After replacing the batteries, repeat the entire programming procedure stated above.
- If your cable/satellite box does not have a remote power function, the remote will issue the CHANNEL UP function.
