



### POWER SOURCE

- This solid state color TV is designed to operate on 120 volts 60Hz, AC household current.
- Insert power cord into a 120 volt 60Hz outlet.
- To prevent electric shock, do not use the television's plug with an extension cord, receptacle, or other outlet unless the blades and ground terminal can be fully inserted to prevent blade exposure.
- Never connect the TV to 50Hz, direct current, or anything other than the specified voltage.

Please read it carefully and apply the knowledge you obtain from it to the proper operation of your HITACHI television receiver.

Please fill out your warranty card and mail it at once to HITACHI. This will enable HITACHI to notify you promptly in the improbable event that a safety problem should be discovered in your product model.

### FOR YOUR PERSONAL SAFETY

This television set is equipped with a polarized alternating-current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other.) This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plua.



5. Do not attempt to service the television yourself set opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer all servicing to qualified service bersonnel.






### PROTECTION AND LOCATION OF YOUR TELEVISION SET

- 16. If an outside entenna is connected to the television set, be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built- up static charges. Section 810 of the National Electrical Code, NFPA 70-1975, provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size grounding conductors, location of antenna discharge unit connection to grounding electrode, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

18. For added protection for the television set during a lightning storm, or when it is unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect antenna. This will prevent damage due to lightning and power-line surges.



### OPERATION OF YOUR TELEVISION SET

19. This television set should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply at your home, consult your television dealer or local power company. For television sets designed to operate from battery power, refer to the operating instructions.



20 If the television set does not operate normally by following the operating instructions, unplug the television set from the wall outlet and refer servicing to qualified service personnel. Adjust only those controls that are covered in the instructions as improper adjustment of other controls may result in damage and will often require extensive work by a qualified service technician to restore the normal television set to operation.



21. If your television set is to remain unused for a period of time, (such as when going on a holiday), turn the television set OFF and unplug it from the wall outlet.

22. If you are unable to restore normal operation by following the detailed procedure in your operating instructions, do not attempt any further adjustments. Unplug the set and call your dealer or service technician.



23. Whenever the television set is damaged or fails, or if there is a distinct change in performance that indicates a need for service, unplug the set and have it checked by a qualified service technician. 24. It is normal for some television sets to make occasional snapping or popping sounds, particularly when being turned on or off. If the snapping or popping is continuous or frequent, unplug the set and consult your dealer or service technician.



### FOR SERVICING AND MODIFICATION

# Introduction

Your new television features all solid state components. It is designed to give you many years of enjoyment. It was thoroughly tested and adjusted at the factory for best performance. In order for you to take full advantage of your new television, please read and follow the installation and operating instructions contained in this manual.

### **Customer Record**

The model and serial number of this product are located on the back of the TV. You should note the model and serial number in the space provided and retain as a permanent record of your purchase. This will aid in identification in the event of theft or loss.



# Care and Cleaning

# Picture Tube (Turn TV Off)

Use a mild soap solution or window cleaner with a soft clean cloth. DO NOT USE ABRASIVE CLEANERS. Avoid excessive moisture and wipe dry.

# **Plastic Cabinets**

Wipe the cabinet with a soft cloth dampened with water or a mild detergent solution and wipe dry with a soft clean cloth. Avoid excessive moisture. Do not use benzene, thinner or other petroleum based products.

# **Remote Control**

Wipe the cabinet with a soft cloth dampened with water or a mild detergent solution and wipe dry with a soft clean cloth. Do not use benzene, thinner or other petroleum based products.

### **Television Location**

This television is intended to be used with a stand or entertainment center. Consult your dealer for available options. Locate for comfortable viewing. Avoid placing where sunlight or other bright lights (including reflections) will fall on the screen. Use of some types of fluorescent lighting may reduce remote control transmitter range.

Adequate ventilation is essential to prevent internal component failure. Keep away from excessive heat or moisture. To ensure optimum color purity do not position magnetic equipment (motors, fans, external speakers) nearby.

# **Optional Cable Connections**

The Audio/Video connections between components can be made with shielded video and audio cables. For best performance, video cables should utilize 75 ohm coaxial shielded wire. Cables are available from your dealer or electronic supply house.

Before you purchase any cables, be sure you know what type of output and input connectors your various components require. Also determine the length of cable you'll need.

# **AC Power Supply Cord**

**CAUTION:** TO PREVENT ELECTRIC SHOCK, MATCH WIDE BLADE OF PLUG TO WIDE SLOT OF AC OUTLET AND FULLY INSERT. DO NOT USE A PLUG WITH A RECEPTACLE OR OTHER OUTLET UNLESS THE BLADE CAN BE FULLY INSERTED TO PREVENT BLADE EXPOSURE. 


Polarized Plug

# **Remote Control Battery Installation**

Batteries: Use two "AA: batteries.

- 1. Remove the battery compartment cover on back of the remote.
- 2. Install the batteries in the battery compartment. (Polarity (+) or (-) must be correct.)
- 3. Reattach the battery cover.



# Precaution on Battery Use

Incorrect installation can cause battery leakage and corrosion that will damage the remote control.

# **Observe the Following Precautions:**

- 1. Batteries must be replaced as a pair.
- 2. Do not combine a used battery with a new one.
- 3. Do not mix battery types (Example: "Zinc Carbon" with Alkaline").
- 4. Do not attempt to charge, short-circuit, disassemble, heat or burn used batteries.
- 5. Battery replacement is necessary when remote control reacts sporadically or stops operating the television.

## Cable / Antenna

For proper reception, either a cable or antenna connection is required.

# **Cable Connection**

Connect the cable supplied by your local cable company.

Note: A cable converter box may be required for proper reception. Check with your local Cable company for compatibility requirements.


# Cable Preset


# **Amplifier Connection (TO AUDIO AMP)**

Connect to an external audio amplifier input for listening to TV from a stereo system speakers.

# **Audio Adjustments**

- 1. Select INTERNAL SPEAKER ON located in the AUDIO menu on screen.
- 2. Set amplifier volume to minimum.
- 3. Adjust TV volume to desired level.
- 4. Adjust amplifier volume to match the TV.
- 5. Select INTERNAL SPEAKERS OFF&VAO from AUDIO menu.
- 6. Volume, mute, bass, treble and balance are now controlled from the TV.

Note: TO AUDIO AMP terminals should not be connected directly to external speakers. In OFF&FAO the volume is controlled by the external amplifier.

# Picture in Picture (PIP) Operation

This television includes a two tuner Picture In Picture (PIP) feature. This allows watching two (2) live broadcasts at the same time with or without an external video source (VCR).

# Without a VCR


## Procedure

- Connect incoming cable to antenna (ANT) input on back of TV.
- Press the PIP button on the remote control to display the PIP frame.
- Choose channels for the PIP frame by pressing the remote control PIP CH ▲▼ buttons.
- Choose channels for the *Main Picture* by pressing the remote control **CH** ▲▼ buttons or by using the numeric keypad.

Note: The audio is from the Main Picture only.

# With a VCR and Cable Box

Connect your television to a VCR and cable box, as shown.

Note: The Remote Control must be programmed with supplied codes to operate the VCR and cable box. (See "Programming the Remote" on page 16.)

# **Procedure**

Press the PIP button on the remote control to display the PIP frame.

To view scrambled channels through your cable box in the PIP frame:

- Press the INPUT button on the remote control to select the video input to which your VCR is connected.
- Verify the CABLE BOX and VCR are ON and the VCR tuned to channel 3 or 4.
- Choose channels for the *PIP* frame by pressing the **CABLE** button on the remote control and using the numeric keypad or **CH** ▲▼ buttons.
- Choose channels for the *Main Picture* by pressing the **TV** button on the remote control and using the numeric keypad or **CH** ▲ ▼ buttons.

Note: The audio is from the Main Picture only.

# The SWAP button switches the PIP and the main picture source. The RECALL button shows the status of the onscreen PIP and the main picture.





- Press the INPUT button on the remote control to select the video input to which your VCR is connected.
- Verify the VCR is on.
- View the external video source in the PIP frame.
- Choose channels for the *Main Picture* by pressing the **TV** button on the remote control and using the numeric keypad or **CH** ▲ ▼ button.



### **Cursor Button**

Press to adjust audio menus, video menus and select operating features.

Press to select channels.

# **Light Button**

Press to light up VOL, LST-CH, MUTE and CH buttons.

# Sleep Button

Press to turn TV off in 30, 60 or 90 minutes.





# **LST-CH Button**


Pressing the LST-CH button will switch between the last two channels viewed.



Note: When scanning channels with the CHANNEL ▲ ▼ buttons, pressing the LST-CH button will switch between the last two channels scanned.

# **Swap Button**

Press the **SWAP** button (when the PIP frame is displayed) to interchange what is being viewed on the main picture with that of the PIP frame.



Note: The audio is from the Main Picture only.


# **Special Buttons**

# PIP (Picture in Picture) Button

This feature allows the viewer to monitor one channel program while watching another. The monitored source (PIP) can be a different channel or a different video source (such as a VCR) when connected to the input jacks.


# **PIP Operation**

1. Press the **PIP** button (set must be ON). The PIP frame will appear at the position it was last displayed. The main picture video source and PIP video source will display on screen momentarily. Audio will be that of main picture.




Note: When the Main Picture is in Video mode with no signal, the PIP will not operate properly.

2. Press the PIP button again to size PIP frame or twice to cancel PICTURE IN PICTURE feature.




# **PIP CH Buttons**

Press the PIP CHANNEL ▲ ▼ button while the PIP frame is displayed to sequentially scan through channels.



# Frz (Freeze) Button

Press the FRZ button to stop action in the PIP frame.



# Notes:


- Pressing the FRZ button when the PIP frame is displayed, will freeze action from the PIP frame. Press the FRZ button again to continue action.
- Press the PIP button as needed to delete PIP frame.

# **Move Button**

The PIP frame may be located at any corner of the Main Picture by pressing the MOVE button (when the PIP frame is displayed).




Note: As MOVE button is pressed (when the PIP frame is displayed), the PIP frame will move counterclockwise as illustrated.



# PIP SURF Button

While the PIP frame is displayed, pressing the PIP SURF button will continuously scan channels in sequence as programmed into channel scan memory.

- Press the PIP button to stop PIP SURF feature on desired picture for PIP frame.
- Press the SWAP button to interchange what is being viewed on the main picture with that of the PIP frame.



# **Programming the Remote**

# **VCR Functions**

This remote is designed to operate different brands of VCRs. You must first program the remote to match the remote system of your VCR.

# **Procedure**

- 1. Turn ON your VCR.
- 2. Aim the remote control at the front of your VCR.
- 3. While holding down the VCR button on the remote, enter the 2-digit preset code that matches your VCR. (See "Component Codes" on page 17 ~ page 18.) The remote will turn off your VCR when the correct 2 digit preset code is entered. When this occurs, the remote control is programmed for your VCR. If the VCR does not turn off after 25 seconds, try a different code, if available.
- 4. The remote will now control your VCR.

### Notes

- If your VCR will not operate remotely after performing the above procedures, this means that your VCR's code
  has not been coded into the remote. Please consult your VCR's operating guide.
- The remote control will remember the codes you have programmed in until the batteries are removed from the remote control. After replacing the batteries repeat the programming procedure stated above.
- If your VCR does not have a remote power function, the remote will issue the CHANNEL UP function.
- The MENU button will act as the VCR MENU button for HITACHI VCRs.
- The INPUT button will act as your VCR +100 button, if required.

# Cable/Satellite Box Functions

This remote is designed to operate different brands of cable boxes and Satellite boxes. You must first program the remote to match the remote system in your cable/satellite box.

### **Procedure**

- 1. Turn ON your cable/satellite box.
- 2. Aim the remote control at the front of your cable/satellite box.
- 3. While holding down the **CABLE** button on the remote, enter the 2 digit preset code (See "Component Codes" on page 18 ~ page 19) that matches your cable/satellite box. The remote will turn off your cable/satellite box when the correct 2 digit code is entered. When this occurs, the remote control is programmed for your cable/satellite box. If the cable/satellite box does not turn off after 5 seconds, try another 2 digit preset code, if available.
- 4. The remote will now control your cable/satellite box.

# Notes

- If your cable/satellite box will not operate remotely after performing the above procedures, this means that
  your cable/satellite box code has not been coded into the remote. Please consult your cable/satellite box
  operating guide.
- The remote control will remember the codes you have programmed in until the batteries are removed from the remote control. After replacing the batteries, repeat the entire programming procedure stated above.
- If your cable/satellite box does not have a remote power function, the remote will issue the CHANNEL UP function.
