For better performance and safer operation of your TOSHIBA TV, follow these recommendations and precautions:

- 27) Always sit approximately 10–25 feet away from the TV and as directly in front of it as possible. The picture can appear dull if you sit too far to the left or right of the TV, or if sunlight or room lights reflect on the screen. Turn the TV off to check for reflections on the screen, and then remove the source of reflections while viewing the TV.
- 28) Always unplug the TV before cleaning. Never use liquid or aerosol cleaners.



WARNING: RISK OF ELECTRIC SHOCK!

Never spill liquids or push objects of any kind into the TV cabinet slots.

- 30) [*This item applies to projection TVs only*.] If the air temperature rises suddenly (for example, when the TV is first delivered), condensation may form on the lenses. This can make the picture appear distorted or the color appear faded. If this happens, turn off the TV for 6 to 7 hours to allow the condensation to evaporate.
- 31) For added protection of your TV from lightning and power surges, always unplug the power cord and disconnect the antenna from the TV if you leave the TV unattended or unused for long periods of time.
- 32) During normal use, the TV may make occasional snapping or popping sounds. This is normal, especially when the unit is being turned on or off. If these sounds become frequent or continuous, unplug the power cord and contact a Toshiba Authorized Service Center.
- 33) Possible Adverse Effects on TV Picture Tube: If a fixed (non-moving) pattern remains on the TV screen for long periods of time, the image can become permanently engrained in the picture tube and cause subtle but permanent ghost images. This type of damage is NOT COVERED BY YOUR WARRANTY. Never leave your TV on for long periods of time while it is displaying the following formats or images:
 - **Fixed Images**, such as PIP/POP windows, stock tickers, video game patterns, TV station logos, and websites.
 - **Special Formats** that do not use the entire screen. For example, viewing letterbox style (16:9) media on a normal (4:3) display (gray bars at top and bottom of screen); or viewing normal style (4:3) media on a widescreen (16:9) display (gray bars on left and right sides of screen).


Introduction

- This owner's manual applies to models 32A33, 32A43, and 36A43, and there are slight differences among them.
- Model 32A43 is used in this manual for illustration purposes.
- Instructions in this manual are based on using the remote control; however, you can use the buttons on the front panel of the TV if they have the same name as those referred to on the remote control.
- Check the model number on the back of your TV before using this manual. Write your model and serial numbers in the space provided on the front cover of this manual for your records.

Exploring your new TV

- You can operate your TV using the buttons on the front panel or remote control.
- The back panel provides all the inputs you will need to connect other equipment to your TV. Models 32A43 and 36A43 have additional audio/video inputs on the front panel (referred to as "VIDEO-3").


Front of TV



Selecting a location for your TV

- Place the TV either on the floor or on the TV stand listed in the "Specifications" section.
- Place the TV in a location where light does not directly hit the screen.
- Place the TV far enough from the walls to allow proper ventilation. Inadequate ventilation may cause overheating, which can damage the TV.

Before installing your TV, please read the important safety information on pages 2-4.



Connecting your TV

Note: Cables are not supplied with your TV.

- Coaxial cable is the cable that comes in from your antenna, cable TV service, or cable converter box. Coaxial cable uses "F" connectors.
- Standard stereo A/V cables usually come in sets of three, and are typically color-coded according to use: yellow for video, red for stereo right audio, and white for stereo left (or mono) audio. Your TV's standard A/V inputs are color-coded in the same manner as the cables.
- S-Video cable is for use with video equipment that has S-Video connectors.
- Component video cables come in sets of three (typically color-coded green, blue, and red), and are for use with video equipment that has component video connectors. Your TV's ColorStream[®] (component video) inputs are color-coded yellow, blue, and red. Plug the green component video cable into the yellow VIDEO-2 input (see "Back of TV" on page 6).

NOTE REGARDING PICTURE QUALITY

When connecting video equipment to your Toshiba TV:

- For GOOD picture quality: Use a standard yellow video cable.
- For BETTER picture quality: If your equipment has S-video connectors, use an S-video cable *instead of* a standard yellow video cable. You still must connect the standard red and white audio cables for full system connection, but *do not connect* a standard yellow video cable at the same time or the picture performance will be unacceptable.
- For BEST picture quality: If your equipment has component video connectors, use component video cables *instead of* a standard yellow video cable or S-video cable. You still must connect the standard red and white audio cables for full system connection.

Connecting a VCR

With this connection you can:

- · watch local TV channels and videotapes
- record one channel while watching the same or another channel

You will need:


- · two coaxial cables
- one set of standard A/V cables (If your VCR has S-video, you can use an S-video cable instead of the standard video cable. See "Note Regarding Picture Quality" above.)




If you have a mono VCR, connect L/Mono to VCR Audio OUT using only one audio cable.

The VIDEO-2 inputs on the back of the TV can be used for connecting a second piece of video equipment such as a DVD player. The VIDEO-3 inputs* on the front of the TV can be used for connecting a third piece of video equipment such as a camcorder. See "Note Regarding Picture Quality" above.

*Model 32A33 does not have VIDEO 3 inputs.







Connecting a cable converter box

With this connection you can:

· watch basic and premium cable channels

Tune the TV to channel 3 or 4 (whichever channel is vacant in your area), and then use the cable converter box to change channels.


You will need:

two coaxial cables

Note:

When you use a cable converter box with your TV, you may not be able to use the remote control to program certain features (for example, blocking channels).

Connecting a cable converter box and a VCR

With this connection you can:

- watch videotapes

Tune the VCR to channel 3 or 4 (whichever channel is vacant in your area), place the TV in VIDEO 1 mode, and then use the converter box to change channels.

You will need:

- · one cable signal splitter
- · four coaxial cables
- one set of standard A/V cables (If your VCR has S-video, you can use an S-video cable instead of the standard video cable. See "Note Regarding Picture Quality" on page 7.)

Note:

If you have a mono VCR, connect TV L/Mono Audio IN to VCR Audio OUT using only one audio cable.

When you use a cable converter box with your TV, you may not be able to use the remote control to program certain features (for example, blocking channels).

Connecting a satellite receiver and a VCR

With this connection you can:

- watch videotapes
- · watch satellite and TV channels


You will need:


- · three coaxial cables
- two sets of standard A/V cables (If your satellite receiver has S-video, you can use ah-S-video cable from the satellite receiver instead of the standard video cable. See "Note Regarding Picture Quality" on page 7.)

Note:

To watch satellite programs, the TV must select VIDEO-1 (see "Selecting the signal source" on page 16).

To watch VCR programs, the TV must select VIDEO-2 (see "Selecting the signal source" on page 16).





Connecting a DVD player with ColorStream® (component video) and a VCR

Your TV has ColorStream[®] (component video) inputs. Connecting your TV to a DVD player with component video (such as a Toshiba DVD player with ColorStream®) can greatly enhance picture quality and performance.

With this connection you can:

- · watch TV channels, DVDs, and videotapes
- record TV channels
- · record one channel while watching the same or another channel

You will need:

- two coaxial cables
- one set of standard A/V cables from the VCR (If your VCR has S-video, you can use an S-video cable instead of the standard video cable. See "Note Regarding Picture Quality" on page 7.)
- · one set of component video cables from the DVD player
- · one pair of standard audio cables from the DVD player

Note:

To watch the VCR, the TV must select VIDEO 1 (see page 16).

To watch the DVD player, the TV must select VIDEO 2 (see "Selecting the signal source" on page 16).

The ColorStream inputs on the TV are for use with DVD players with 480i interlaced scanning only. If you have a 480p progressive scan DVD player, you must switch the DVD player to 480i interlaced mode first, and then connect it to the TV's ColorStream inputs. Failure to do this will cause a poor picture or no picture to display.

You can connect a high-definition set-top receiver only if the output is switched to 480i interlaced mode first. This TV will not accept or display 480p or 720p progressive scan signals or 1080i interlaced high-definition signals.

Connecting two VCRs

With this connection you can:

- · watch TV channels and videotapes
- · record TV channels
- · record one TV channel while watching the same or another channel
- · record (dub/edit) from one VCR to the other VCR while watching a videotape


You will need:

- two coaxial cables
- two sets of standard A/V cables (If VCR1 has S-video, you can use an S-video cable between VCR1 and the TV instead of the standard video cable. See "Note Regarding Picture Quality" on page 7.)

Note:


Do not connect the same VCR to both the OUT and the IN connections on the TV at the same time.

To record (dub/edit) from VCR 1 to VCR 2, the TV must select VIDEO 1 (see page 16), and VCR 2 must select LINE IN.

Using the remote control

Preparing the remote control for use

Your TV remote control can operate your TV and most cable converter boxes, satellite receivers, VCRs, DVD players, and HTIBs (home theater in a box), even if they are different brands.

If you have a Toshiba device:


Your TV remote control is preprogrammed to operate most Toshiba devices. See page 14.

If you have a non-Toshiba device or a Toshiba device that the remote control is not preprogrammed to operate:

You can program the TV remote control so it will operate the other device. See pages 12-14.

Installing the remote control batteries

1 Remove the battery cover from the back of the remote control.



Caution:


Dispose of batteries in a designated disposal area. Do not throw batteries into a fire.

Do not mix battery types or combine used batteries with new ones.

Remove dead batteries immediately to prevent battery acid from leaking into the battery compartment.

If you do not intend to use the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries.

2 Install two "AA" size batteries, making sure to match the + and – signs on the batteries to the signs on the battery compartment.



3 Reinsert the battery cover in the remote control until the tab snaps.



If your Toshiba TV remote control does not operate all the features of your other device, use the original remote control for that device.



Programming the remote control to operate a cable converter box, satellite receiver, VCR, DVD player, or HTIB (home theater in a box)

Your Toshiba TV remote control is preprogrammed to operate most Toshiba devices. To program your TV remote control to operate a non-Toshiba device (or a Toshiba device that it is not preprogrammed to operate), follow the steps below. For details on using the remote control to operate the device, see page 14.



- **1** In the remote control code table (below and on the next page), find the code for your device. If more than one code is listed, try each one separately until you find one that works.
- 2 Set the **Device Switch** to the type of device you are programming the remote control to operate—**CBL/SAT** (for a cable converter box or satellite receiver), **VCR** (for a VCR or TV/VCR combo), or **DVD** (for a DVD player or HTIB [home theater in a box]).
- **3** While holding down **RECALL**, press the **Channel Number** buttons to enter the 3-digit code for your device.
- **4** To test the code, turn on the device, point the remote control at it, and press **POWER**.
 - -If the correct code was entered, the device will turn off.
 - -If the device does not respond, repeat steps 1-4 using another code.
 - -If the device does not respond to another code, you will need to use the remote control that came with the device.
- $5 \hspace{0.1in} \text{Remember to set the Device Switch back to TV to control the TV.}$
- **6** For future reference, write down the code(s) you used:

Note:

Every time you change the batteries, you will need to reprogram the remote control.

Some newer VCRs respond to either of two codes. These VCRs have a switch labeled "VCR1/VCR2." If your VCR has this kind of switch and does not respond to the codes for your VCR brand, set the switch to the other position ("VCR1" or "VCR2") and reprogram the remote control.

Remote control codes

In some cases you may not be able to operate your device with the TV remote control. Your other device may use a code that is not recognized by the TV remote control. If this happens, you will need to use the remote control provided with the device.

Menu system (general instructions)

After installing the batteries and programming the remote control, you will need to set some preferences on your TV using the menu system.


You can access the menus using the buttons on the TV front panel or remote control. Following are general instructions for using the menu system:

- Press MENU and then ◄ or ► to select a menu (Picture, Audio, Setup, Preference, or Closed Caption, as shown in the menu system overview, below).
- 2. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark to select the function you want to adjust in the menu.
- 3. Press \triangleleft or \blacktriangleright to adjust the selected function.

Note: The $\triangleleft \triangleright$ buttons function as FAV $\blacktriangle \lor$ (favorite channel) buttons when no menu is on-screen.

- 4. When you make a menu selection, your changes occur immediately. You do not have to press MENU or EXIT to save your changes. Note: The TV front panel does not have an EXIT button.
- 5. On-screen menus close automatically if no adjustments are made within 15 seconds. To close an on-screen menu instantly, press **EXIT** on the remote control.



Changing the on-screen display language



Selecting the signal source

You can use the **TV/VIDEO** button on the remote control or TV to select the signal source connected to your TV.

To change the signal source:

Repeatedly press **TV/VIDEO** to select either TV, VIDEO 1, VIDEO 2, or VIDEO 3 (32A43 and 36A43 only). The selected signal source is highlighted on-screen.



To verify the signal source: Press **RECALL**.

Programming channels into the TV's memory

When you press **CHANNEL** $\blacktriangle \lor$ on the TV or remote control, the TV stops only on the channels stored in the TV's memory.

Note: To tune the TV to a channel not programmed into the memory, use the **CHANNEL NUMBERS** on the remote control.

Follow the steps below and on the next page to program channels into the TV's memory.


Programming channels automatically


Your TV can automatically detect all active channels in your area and store them in the TV's memory. After the channels are stored automatically, you can manually add or erase individual channels (see page 17).

To program channels automatically:

- 1. Press MENU.
- 2. Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to highlight the SET UP menu.

- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight TV/CABLE.
- 5. Press ▼ to highlight CH PROGRAM.



- 6. Press *◄* or *▶* to start automatic channel programming ("CH PROGRAM" displays on-screen). The TV automatically cycles through every TV or cable channel (depending on which you selected), and stores all active channels in the TV's memory.
- 7. When automatic channel programming is complete, the message "CH Programming Completed" appears.
- 8. Press **CHANNEL** \blacktriangle to view the programmed channels.

Adding and erasing channels manually

After you have automatically programmed the channels into the TV's memory, you can manually add and erase individual channels.

To add or erase a channel in the TV's memory:

- Tune the TV to the channel you want to add or erase. If you are adding a channel, you will need to use the CHANNEL NUMBERS to select the channel.
- 2. Press MENU.
- 3. Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to highlight the SET UP menu.
- 4. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark to highlight ADD/ERASE.




- 5. Press *d* or *b* to highlight ADD or ERASE, whichever function you want to perform.

Changing channels

To change to the next programmed channel: Press CHANNEL $\blacktriangle \bigtriangledown$.

Switching between two channels

To switch between two channels without entering a channel number:

- 1. Select the first channel you want to view.
- 2. Select a second channel using the **CHANNEL NUMBERS** (0–9 and 100).
- 3. Press CH RTN (channel return). The previous channel will display.

Every time you press CH RTN, the TV will switch back and forth between the last two channels you tuned the TV to.

Programming your favorite channels

The Favorite Channel feature allows you to use the **FAV** \checkmark buttons on the remote control to cycle through your favorite channels, skipping over channels you do not normally watch. You can program a maximum of 12 favorite channels.

Note: You can still use **CHANNEL** $\blacktriangle \forall$ to cycle through all the channels you programmed into the TV's memory on page 16.

To program your favorite channels:

- 1. Tune the TV to a channel you want to program as a favorite channel.
- 2. Press MENU.
- 3. Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to highlight the SET UP menu.
- 4. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark to highlight FAVORITE CH.



Blocking programs by ratings

The Motion Picture Association of America (MPAA) uses a rating system to qualify motion picture content. Television broadcasters employ a similar rating system to qualify the content of television programs. The MPAA, Youth TV, and TV ratings work with the V-Chip feature to allow you to block access to programs that exceed the rating limits you set.

Note:

Press **RECALL** to see the rating of the program you are viewing. Not all programs are rated, however. To block programs or movies that are not rated, see "Blocking unrated movies and programs" on page 23.






You can block a maximum of four TV channels and four cable channels. Blocked channels cannot be viewed, regardless of their programs' ratings. If you try to tune the TV to a blocked channel, the nearest unblocked channel will display.
