Power Connections (L17W36 Only)

* Caution: Please make sure to connect the TV to the AC power adapter before connecting the TV's power plug to a wall power outlet.

a. Remove the connection panel cover as shown below.

b. Connect the antenna cable to the antenna input port on the TV.

c. Connect the AC adapter to the power input port on the TV.
d. Plug the power cord into the wall power outlet only after connecting the power cord to the AC adapter first.

e. Reinstall the connection panel cover.

Kensington Security System (L23W36 Only)

- The TV is equipped with a Kensington Security System connector on the back panel. Connect the Kensington Security System cable as shown below.
- For the detailed installation and use of the Kensington Security System, refer to the user's guide provided with the Kensington Security System.

- Note: The Kensington Security System is an optional accessory.

NOTES

- a. If the TV feels cold to the touch, there may be a small "flicker" when when it is turned on. This is normal, there is nothing wrong with TV.
- b. Some minute dot defects may be visible on the screen, appearing as tiny red, green, or blue spots. However, they have no adverse effect on the monitor's performance.
- c. Avoid touching the LCD screen or holding your finger(s) against it for long periods of time. Doing so may produce some temporary distortion effects on the screen.







Installation Instruction

Rear A/V Cover

- * The connection panel is hidden behind the A/V cover.
- a. Remove the cover.
- b. Install wires as necessary.
- c. Reinstall the cover. Position the A/V cover with the TV back panel, tilt it back as shown.
- d. Align the holes on the TV back panel with the two tabs on the rear A/V cover and insert.
- e. Close cover.



Adjusting the TV Viewing Angle

- You can adjust the vertical angle of the TV between 3° and $12^\circ.$



Installation on the Wall

- An optional wall mount is available for this TV, see your dealer. For installation, follow the instructions provide with the optional wall mount.



- Wire Holders
- Thread, then pull the wires through the hole on the TV stand.







- The TV can be conveniently swiveled on its stand 25° (L23W36) / 30^(L17W36) to the left or right to provide the optimum viewing angle.



External Equipment Connections

- This manual mainly explains the features for the L17W36.

Antenna Connection

- For optimum picture quality, adjust antenna direction.

Connecting to an Inside Antenna Setup



- If you have a 75 Ω round cable, insert the bronze wire and then tighten the connection nut. If you have a 300 Ω flat wire, connect the twisted wire to the antenna converter and then connect the converter to the antenna jack on the TV.

- If using 75Ω round cable, do not bend the bronze wire. It may cause poor picture quality.

Connecting to an Outdoor Antenna Setup



- In poor signal areas, to get better picture quality, install a signal amplifier to the antenna as shown to the right.
- If signal needs to be split for two TVs, use an antenna signal splitter for connection.



External Equipment Connections Continued

VCR Setup

 In Video mode, TV automatically reverts to TV mode if the fcr button or flashbk buttons are pressed.

Connection 1

Set VCR switch to 3 or 4 and then tune TV to the same channel number.

Connection 2

- Connect the audio/video output jacks on VCR to the corresponding input jacks on the TV. When connecting the TV to a VCR, match the jack colors (Video = yellow, Audio Left = white, and Audio Right = red).
- 2. Insert a video tape into the VCR and press PLAY on the VCR. (Refer to the VCR owner's manual.)
- Use the tv/video button on the remote control to select Video 1 or Video 2. (If connected to S-VIDEO on side panel, select the S-Video external input source.)



Cable TV Setup

- After subscribing to a local cable TV service and installing a converter, you can watch cable TV programming.
- For further cable TV information, contact a local cable service provider.

Connection 1

- 1. Select 3 or 4 with channel switch on cable box.
- 2. Tune the TV channel to the same selected output channel of cable box.
- 3. Select channels at the cable box or with the cable box remote control.

Connection 2

 Connect the audio/video output jacks on Cable Box to the corresponding input jacks on the TV. When connecting the TV to Cable Box, match the jack colors (Video = yellow, Audio Left = white, and Audio Right =

red).2. Use the tv/video button on the remote control to select Video 1 or Video 2.

3. Select channels with the cable box remote control.

External A/V Source Setup

Connections

Connect the audio/video output jacks on the external A/V equipment to the corresponding input jacks on the TV. When connecting the TV to external A/V equipment, match the jack colors (Video = yellow, Audio Left = white, and Audio Right = red).

Viewing Setup

- 1. Turn on the external A/V equipment.
- 2. Use the **tv/video** button on the remote control to select **Video 1** or **Video 2**.
- Operate the corresponding external equipment. Refer to external equipment operating guide.





DVD Setup

Connections

Connect the DVD video outputs to the COMPONENT (Y, PB, PR) jacks and connect the DVD audio outputs to the AUDIO jacks.

Viewing Setup

- 1. Turn on the DVD player, insert a DVD.
- 2. Use the **tv/video** or **multimedia** button on the remote control to select **Component**.
- 3. Refer to the DVD player's manual for operating instructions.

Component Input ports

To get better picture quality, connect a DVD player to the component input ports as shown below.







DTV Setup

- To watch digitally broadcast programs, purchase and connect a digital set-top box.

Connections

Connect the digital set-top box video outputs to the COMPONENT (Y, PB, PR) jacks and connect the digital set-top box audio outputs to the AUDIO jacks.

Viewing Setup

- 1. Turn on the digital set-top box. (Refer to the owner's manual for the digital set-top box.)
- Use the tv/video or multimedia button on the remote control to select Component.



Using Headphones

- Plug headphones in to H/P jack as shown.
- Adjust sound level to a headphone using the volume (◄, ►) buttons. While you are listening to sound through a headphone(s), TV speakers will not be heard.



PC Setup

- After setup, be sure to select RGB-PC source on TV.

Connections

- 1. Set the monitor output resolution on the PC before connecting to the TV.
- 2. Connect the TV to the PC with the PC cable.
- 3. Connect the PC audio output to the TV's PC SOUND input.

Viewing Setup

- 1. Turn on the PC.
- 2. Use the **tv/video** or **multimedia** button on the remote control to select **RGB-PC**.

NOTES

- a. For optimum picture quality, use standard XGA (1024x768) computer output at a 60Hz refresh rate. Using other formats (VGA, SVGA, etc.) or refresh rates may result in reduced picture quality. (To change the computer video output format, please refer to the operating manual for the computer you are using).
- b. If the message "Out of range" appears on the screen, adjust the PC output to a format listed in the 'Displayable Monitor Output Format Specifications' chart above.
- c. The synchronization input form for Horizontal and Vertical frequencies is separate.

DPM (Display Power Management) mode

If the PC goes to power saving mode, the monitor automatically switches to DPM mode. DPM mode may not work if you don't use the PC cable provided.

Operation

TV Operation Overview

- 1. First, make all equipment connections. Plug the AC Adapter into the TV, then plug the AC Adapter into a power outlet. At this time, the TV is switched to standby mode.
 - In standby mode, press the power, ch (▲,▼), tv/video, multimedia or number button on the remote control or on/off, ch (▲,▼), tv/video located on the TV to turn the TV on.
- 2. Select the viewing source by pressing tv/video or multimedia repeatedly.
- Note: See page 16 if you have not auto programmed the TV to receive channels in your local broadcast area.
- 3. After viewing, press the **power** button on the remote control or **on/off** located on the TV. The TV reverts to standby mode.

NOTE

• If you want to turn the TV off, press the on/off button located on the TV. If you intend to be away on vacation, disconnect the power plug from the wall power outlet.

Menu Language Selection

- The menus can be shown on the screen in the selected language. First select your language.
- 1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the **Special** menu.
- 2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Language.
- Use the ◄ / ► button to select your desired language. From this point on, the on-screen menus will be shown in the language of your choice.
- 4. Press the exit button to save and return to TV viewing.



Channel Menu Options

Memorizing the Channels with EZ Scan

- For EZ scan to work, the programming source must be connected to the TV and the TV must be receiving programming signals either over-the-air or from a cable-type service provider.

Channel

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- Press the menu button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Channel menu.
- 2. Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select EZ Scan.
- 3. Press the ► button to begin the channel search.

 Wait for auto program to complete the channel search cycle before choosing a channel. The TV scans for over-the-air channels and then channels provided by a cable service.

NOTES

- When the channel search is complete, use the ▲ / ▼ buttons to review the memorized channels.
- If you press the enter button in EZ Scanning, the function will stop and only channels programming up to that time will remain.
- EZ Scan function can memorize only the channels which are being received at that time.

Add/Delete Channels with Ch.edit

- You can manually include or erase individual channels.
- Press the menu button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Channel menu.
- 2. Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Ch.edit.
- Press the ► button and then use ◄ / ► button to select a channel you want to add to memory or erase.
- Press the ▼ button and then use ◄ / ► button to select Memory (add) or Erase (delete).
- 6. Press the **exit** button to save and return to TV viewing. The current channel is added to Memory or Erased from the channel list.

Fine Tuning Adjustment

- This function adjusts the pictures stability and condition when it is poor.
- Press the menu button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Channel menu.
- 2. Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Ch.edit.
- 3. Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Fine**.
- 4. Use the *◄* / ► button to adjust the picture to your preference.
- 5. Press the exit button to save and return to TV viewing.

Favorite Channels Setup

- Favorite Channel lets you quickly tune in up to 5 channels of your choice without having to wait for the TV to scan through all the in-between channels.
- Press the menu button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Channel menu.
- 2. Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Favorite ch.
- Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the first favorite channel position.
- Use the ◄ / ► button to set the desired channel number for first favorite channel.
- 5. Repeat steps 3 to 4 to memorize other channels.
- 6. Press the enter button to save.
 - To tune to a favorite channel, press the **fcr** (Favorite Channel Review) button repeatedly. The 5 favorite channels appear on the screen one-by-one.



The current channel number is displayed.





Picture Menu Options

EZ Video

- This function adjusts the TV for the best picture appearance.
- 1. Press the video button repeatedly to select the picture appearance setup option as shown below.



- · You can also adjust EZ Video in the Picture menu.
- · Clear, Optimum and Soft are preset for good picture quality at the factory and cannot be changed.

Manual Picture Control (User option)

- You can adjust picture contrast, brightness, color, sharpness and tint to the levels you prefer.
- Press the menu button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Picture menu.
- 2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select EZ Video
- Press the enter button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the desired picture option (Contrast, Brightness, Color, Sharpness, Tint).
- 4. Use the ◀ / ► button to make appropriate adjustments.
 - Contrast, Brightness, Color, and Sharpness are adjustable from 0 to 100. • Tint is adjustable from Red 50 to Green 50.
- 5. Press the exit button to save and return to TV viewing.



Auto Color Control Adjustment

- To initialize values (reset to default settings), select the Normal option.
- Press the menu button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Picture menu.
- Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select ACC .
- Use the ◄ / ► button to select either Normal (Default), Warm (Preset), User (Manual Adjustment) or Cool (Preset).
- 4. Press the exit button to save and return to TV viewing.



Picture Menu Options Continued

Manual Color Temperature Control (**User** option)

- You can adjust red, green, or blue to any color temperature you prefer.
- Press the menu button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Picture menu.
- 2. Press the $\blacktriangleright\,$ button and then use \blacktriangle , $\blacktriangledown\,$ button to select ACC .
- Press the enter button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Red, Green or Blue.
- 4. Use the \blacktriangleleft / \blacktriangleright button to make appropriate adjustments.
 - The adjustment range of Red, Green, and Blue is 0 ~100.
- 5. Press the exit button to save and return to TV viewing.

DRP (Digital Reality picture)

- Improves picture outline in dark areas.
- 1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the **Picture** menu.
- 2. Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown button to select **DRP**.
- 3. Use the ◀ / ► button to select Clear or Soft.
- 4. Press the exit button to save and return to TV viewing.





Picture Format Setup

1. Press the arc button repeatedly to select the desired picture format.



· Picture format Zoom is not available in Component and RGB-PC mode.

Sound Menu Options

EZ Audio

- This function lets you enjoy the best sound without any special adjustment because the TV selects the appropriate sound option based on the program content.
- 1. Use the audio button to select the appropriate sound setup as shown below.



- · You can also adjust EZ Audio in the Sound menu.
- Manufactured under license from Dolby Laboratories. "Dolby" and the double-D symbol are trademarks of Dolby Laboratories.
- D Virtual lets you experience panoramic sound effects.

Equalizer Adjustments

- Press the menu button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Sound menu.
- 2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select EZ Audio.
- Press the enter button and then use
 / ▶ button to select the band you want to adjust. Then, use ▲ / ♥ button to adjust the band level.
- 5. Press the exit button to save and return to TV viewing.



Sound Balance

- Press the menu button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Sound menu.
- Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Balance.
- Use the ◄ / ► button to adjust the sound balance.
 - Balance is adjustable from Left 50 to Right 50.
- 4. Press the exit button to save and return to TV viewing.



AVL (Auto Volume Leveler)

- AVL maintains an equal volume level automatically even if the channel is changed.
- Press the menu button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Sound menu.
- 2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select AVL.
- Use the ◄ / ► button to to select On or Off.
- 4. Press the exit button to save and return to TV viewing.



Sound Menu Options Continued

Sound selection in PC mode

- Be sure to select the RGB-PC source and turn on the PIP before operation.
- 1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the **Sound** menu.
- 2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to choose Sound select.
- 3. Use the *◄* / ► button to select desired screen sound (**RGB-PC** or **PIP**).
- 4. Press the **exit** button to save and return to TV viewing.



Stereo/SAP Broadcasts Setup

- The TV can receive MTS stereo programs and any SAP (Secondary Audio Program) that accompanies the stereo program, if the broadcaster transmits an additional sound signal as well as the original one.
- Mono: The primary language is heard from left and right speakers. Signal mode is mono.
- Stereo: The primary language is heard from left and right speakers. Signal mode is stereo.
- SAP: The secondary language is heard from left and right speakers.
 - 1. Press the **mts** button repeatedly.



- · Select mono sound mode if the signal is not clear or in poor signal reception areas.
- Stereo, SAP mode are available only if included on the broadcast signal.

Time Menu Options

Auto Clock Setup

- The time is set automatically through from a PBS broadcast signal.
- The PBS channel signal includes information for the correct time and daylight saving time.
- Press the menu button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Timer menu.
- 2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Clock.
- 3. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Auto.
- Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the time zone for your viewing area. Your choices are: Auto, E.S.T. (Eastern Standard Time), C.S.T. (Central Standard Time), M.S.T. (Mountain Standard Time), P.S.T. (Pacific Standard Time), Alaska, and Hawaii.
- 5. Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown button to set **PBS channel**.
- 6. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to set **D.S.T.** (Daylight Savings Time) **Auto**, **Off** or **On**, depending on whether or not your viewing area observes Daylight Savings Time.
- 7. Press the exit button to save and return to TV viewing.

Manual Clock Setup

- If the time on the clock is incorrect, reset the clock manually.
- Press the menu button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Timer menu.
- Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Clock.
- Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Manual.
- Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to set the hour.
- 5. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to set the minutes.
- 6. Press the **exit** button to save and return to TV viewing.





Time Menu Options Continued

On/Off Timer Setup

- Timer function operates only if current time is set.
- Off-Timer function overrides On-Timer function if they are set to the same time.
- The TV must be in standby mode for the On-Timer to work.
- If you don't press any button within 2 hours after turning on the TV with the On-Timer function, the TV will automatically revert to standby mode.
- 1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ *i* ▼ button to select the **Timer** menu.
- 2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Off timer** or **On timer**.
- 3. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to set the hour.
- 4. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to set the minutes.
- 5. For On timer function only:

Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown button to set the channel at turn-on. Then, press the \blacktriangleright button and then use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown button to set the turn-on sound level.

6. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Run** or **Hold**.

• Hold: Off timer/On timer will not work. Run: Off timer/On timer are active.

7. Press the exit button to save and return to TV viewing.



Sleep Timer Setup

- The Sleep Timer turns the TV off at a preset time.
- 1. Press the **sleep** button repeatedly to select the number of minutes. First the $\mathcal{O}^{z_{--}^z}$ option appears on the screen, followed by the following sleep timer options: 10, 20, 30, 60, 90, 120, 180, and 240 minutes.
- 2. When the number of minutes you want is displayed on the screen, press the **enter** button. The timer begins to count down from the number of minutes selected.
- 3. To check the remaining minutes before the TV turns off, press the sleep button once.
- 4. To cancel the Sleep Timer, press the **sleep** button repeatedly until $\mathcal{O}^{z_{--}^2}$ appears.

Special Menu Options

Closed Captions

Closed captioning is a process which converts the audio portion of a television program into written words which then appear as subtitles on the television screen. Closed captions allow viewers to read the dialogue and narration of television programs.

Using Closed Captions



Captions are the subtitles of the dialogue and narration of television programs. For prerecorded programs, program dialogue can be arranged into captions in advance. Its possible to caption a live program by using a process called real-time captioning, which creates captions instantly. Real-time captioning is normally done by professional reporters using a machine shorthand system and computer for translation into English.

Captioning is an effective system for the hearing-impaired, and it can also aid in teaching language skills.

The picture at left shows a typical caption.

Caption Tips

- Not all TV broadcasts include closed caption signals.
- Sometimes TV stations broadcast four different caption signals on the same channel. By selecting From CC1 to CC4, you can
 choose which signal you view. CC1 is usually the signal with the captions, while Another mode might show demonstration or
 programming information.
- · Your TV might not receive caption signals normally in the following situations.
- 1. Poor reception conditions are encountered:



IGNITION:

Picture may flutter, drift, suffer from black spots, or horizontal streaking. Usually caused by interference from automobile ignition systems, neon lamps, electrical drills, and other electrical appliances.



GHOSTS:

Ghosts are caused when the TV signal splits and follows two paths. One is the direct path and the other is reflected off tall buildings, hills or other objects. Changing the direction or position of the antenna may improve reception.



SNOW:

If your receiver is located at the weak, fringe area of a TV signal, your picture may be marred by small dots. It may be necessary to install a special antenna to improve the picture.

2. An old, bad, or illegally recorded tape is being played.

- 3. Strong, random signals from a car or airplane interfere with the TV signal.
- 4. The signal from the antenna is weak.
- 5. The program wasn't captioned when it was produced, transmitted, or taped.

Special Menu Options Continued



1. Use the cc button repeatedly to select Captions.



- · You can also adjust Captions in the Special menu.
- Ez Mute shows the selected captions option (if available on program) when the TV sound is muted.
- · It's not available in Component and RGB-PC modes.

Caption/Text

- Press the menu button and then use ▲ /▼ button to select the Special menu.
- Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Caption/Text.
- 3. Use the ◀ / ▶ button to select your caption selection. Your choices are: CC1, CC2, CC3, CC4, Text 1, Text 2, Text3 and Text4.
- 4. Press the exit button to save and return to TV viewing.



Key Lock

- The TV can be set up so that it can only be used with the remote control.
- This feature can prevent unauthorized viewing.
- Press the menu button and then use ▲ /▼ button to select the Special menu.
- 2. Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Key lock.
- 3. Use the ◀ / ► button to select **On** or **Off**.
- 4. Press the exit button to save and return to TV viewing.



Auto Off

- If Auto Off is active and there is no input signal, the TV switches to Standby mode automatically after 10 minutes.
- Press the menu button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Special menu.
- 2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Auto off.
- Use the ◄ / ► button to select On or Off.
- 4. Press the exit button to save and return to TV viewing.



Lock Menu Options

Parental Control can be used to block specific channels, ratings and other viewing sources.

The Parental Control Function (V-Chip) is used to block program viewing based on the ratings sent by the broadcast station. The default setting is to allow all programs to be viewed. Viewing can be blocked by the type of program and by the categories chosen to be blocked. It is also possible to block all program viewing for a time period. To use this function, the following must be set :

- 1. Ratings and categories to be blocked.
- 2. Set a password
- 3. Enable the lock

V-Chip rating and categories

Rating guidelines are provided by broadcast stations. Most television programs and television movies can be blocked by TV Rating and/or Individual Categories. Movies that have been shown at the theaters or direct-to-video movies use the Movie Rating System (MPAA) only.

Lock Menu Setup

- 1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the **Lock** menu. Then, press the ► button.
 - If Lock is already set, enter the password requested.
 - The TV is set with the initial password "0-0-0-0".
- 2. Setting Lock on/off:
 - Press the \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown button to select **Lock on/off**.

Use the \blacktriangleleft / \blacktriangleright button to select **on** or **off**.

3. Set password:

Press the \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown button to select **Set password**.

Press the \blacktriangleright button and then enter a four digit password. Enter it again when requested.

- 4. Press the \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown button to select type of blocking to be set .
- 5. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select type of ratings to block .
 - Age block, Content block, and Canadian menus, also have sub menus. So, repeat steps 4 and 5 in the sub menu, to set the types of blocking and ratings.



RGB-PC Menu Options

- Be sure to select the RGB-PC source before operation.

Auto Config. Adjustment

- Automatically adjusts picture position and minimizes image shaking.
- If the image is still not correct, your TV is functioning properly but needs further adjustment.
- 1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ /▼ button to select the **RGB-PC** menu.
- 2. Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Auto configure.
- 3. Press the ► button to run Auto configure.
 - If the position of the image is still not correct, try Auto adjustment again.
- If picture needs to be adjusted more after Auto adjustment in RGB-PC mode, you can adjust the Clock / Phase.

Horizontal / Vertical Position Adjustments

- 1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the **RGB-PC** menu.
- 2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select H-Position / V-Position.
- Press the ◀ / ► button to make adjustments
 - The adjustment range is 0 ~ 100.
- 4. Press the exit button to save and return to TV viewing.

Phase / Clock Adjustments

- If the picture isn't clear after auto adjustment and especially if characters are still jittery, adjust the picture Phase manually.
- 1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the **RGB-PC** menu.
- 2. Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown button to select **Clock** or **Phase**.
- Use the ◄ / ► button to make appropriate adjustments.
 - The Clock adjustment range is 0 ~ 100.
 - The **Phase** adjustment range is 0 ~ 31.
 - Based on the input mode, the adjustment range for Clock / Phase may change.
- 4. Press the exit button to save and return to TV viewing.







PIP (Picture-in-Picture) Feature

- PIP lets you view 2 different inputs pictures (sources) on your TV screen at the same time. One source will be large, and the other source will show a smaller inset image.
- Double Window splits the screen into 2, allowing 2 picture sources to be shown on the TV screen at the same time. Each source is given half the screen.
- PIP is not available if Lock is active (On) in Lock menu.

Watching PIP / Double Window

Press the pip button repeatedly to select one of the PIP options.



* You can only select this Double Window using RGB-PC for main picture source. With this setup, the main and sub pictures cannot be swapped.

TV Program Selection for PIP

Use the **ch** \blacktriangle *i* **ch** \blacktriangledown button to select a channel for the sub picture in PIP mode.

Using PIP Still Function

- 1. Press the still button in PIP mode.
 - In PIP mode, the PIP (inset) picture's image is frozen.
- 2. To return to normal viewing, press the still button again.



Press the **size** button and then use \blacktriangleleft / \blacktriangleright button to change the sub picture size.



Moving the PIP

Press the **position** button in PIP mode.

Press the \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown / \blacktriangledown / \blacklozenge button repeatedly until desired position is achieved. The sub picture moves up/down/left/right.



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Press the pip swap button to switch the main and sub pictures.



Selecting an Input Signal Source for PIP

Use the **pip input** button to select the input source for the sub picture. Each press of **pip input** button changes the PIP source.

POP (Picture-of-Picture: Channel Scan)

- Use POP to search the programs of all the memorized channels one-by-one, while the main picture source remains the current channel.
- Press the scan button in PIP mode. Each press of scan button changes the screen as shown below.
- Note: Run EZ Scan channel search before using POP mode.

Maintenance

- Early malfunctions can be prevented. Careful and regular cleaning can extend the amount of time you will have your new TV. Be sure to turn the power off and unplug the power cord before you begin any cleaning.

Cleaning the Screen

- 1. Here's a great way to keep the dust off your screen for a while. Wet a soft cloth in a mixture of lukewarm water and a little fabric softener or dish washing detergent. Wring the cloth until it's almost dry, and then use it to wipe the screen.
- 2. Make sure the excess water is off the screen, and then let it air-dry before you turn on your TV.

Cleaning the Cabinet

To remove dirt or dust, wipe the cabinet with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth. Please be sure not to use a wet cloth.

Extended Absence



If you leave your TV dormant for a long time (such as a vacation), it's a good idea to unplug the power cord to protect against possible damage from lightning or power surges.
