### SERVICING

- Please refer to relevant topics on the Troubleshooting Guide on page 23 before return the product.
- When this unit become inoperative, do not try to correct the problem by yourself. There are no user-serviceable parts inside. Turn off, unplug the power plug, and please call our help line mentioned on the front page to locate an Authorized Service Center.

### **CLEANING THE CABINET**

• Use a soft cloth slightly moistened with a mild detergent solution. Do not use a solution containing alcohol, spirits, ammonia or abrasive.

### **CLEANING DISCS**

- When a disc becomes dirty, clean it with a cleaning cloth. Wipe the disc from the center out. Do not wipe in a circular motion.
- Do not use solvents such as benzine, thinner, commercially available cleaners, detergent, abrasive cleaning agents or antistatic spray intended for analogue records.

### **CLEANING THE DISC LENS**

If this unit still does not perform properly although you refer to the relevant sections and to "TROU-BLESHOOTING GUIDE" in this Owner's Manual, the laser optical pickup unit may be dirty. Consult your dealer or an Authorized Service Center for inspection and cleaning of the laser optical pickup unit.

### **DISC HANDLING**

- Handle the discs so that fingerprints and dust do not adhere to the surfaces of the discs.
- Always store the disc in its protective case when it is not used.

### AUTO HEAD CLEANING

- Automatically cleans video heads as you insert or remove a cassette, so you can see a clear picture.
- Playback picture may become blurred or interrupted while the TV program reception is clear. Dirt accumulated on the video heads after a long period of use, or the usage of rental or worn tapes can cause this problem. If a streaky or snowy picture appears during playback, the video heads in your DVD/VCR may need to be cleaned.
- 1. Please visit your local Audio/Video store and purchase a good quality VHS Video Head Cleaner.
- 2. If a Video Head Cleaner does not solve the problem, please call our help line mentioned on the front page to locate an Authorized Service Center.

### NOTES:

- Clean video heads only when problems occur.

### Setup About the Video Cassettes and Discs

### **Playable Video Cassettes**

Use only cassettes marked WHS with this unit.

### **Playable Discs**



If you cannot play back a disc which bears one of the marks above, check the following notes.

\*1: This unit conforms to the NTSC color system. Discs recorded in other color systems such as PAL cannot be played back. \*2: Certain DVD-Video discs do not operate as described in this manual due to the intentions of the disc's producers.

\*3: Only the discs which have been recorded in the video format and finalized can be played back. Discs unfinalized or recorded in the video recording format cannot be played back. Depending on the recording status of a disc, the disc may not be played back at all or normally (the picture or sound may be not be smooth, etc.).

- \*4: Scratched or stained discs may not be played back.
- \*5: Some discs cannot be played back because of incompatible recording conditions, characteristics of the recorder or special properties of discs.
- \*6: You can play back discs which bear the marks above. If you use nonstandardized discs, this unit may not play them back. Even if they are played back, the sound or video quality will be compromised.

# Connections

# Please refer to "Basic TV Connection" on the front page before you use this unit.

### **RF Output Channel**

If there is a TV station broadcasting on channel 3,

- 1) Set your TV to channel 4.
- 2) Insert a pre-recorded tape into this unit.
- Press the OUTPUT button on the DVD/VCR so that the VCR OUTPUT light is lit.
   If noise appears on the TV screen, press the VCR/TV button on the remote control.
- 4) Press the PLAY button once.
- 5) After a few seconds, press the PLAY button on the DVD/VCR for 3 seconds.
- The RF output channel will change to channel 4 from channel 3 and you will see a playback picture.
- When a picture does not appear on the TV screen, repeat step [4].
- 6) Press the STOP button to stop playback.

• The RF output channel may not change when you adjust tracking during playback. In this case, stop playback, and start playback again. After that, press the PLAY button on the DVD/VCR for 3 seconds again. Setup



With this connection, channels cannot be changed on the DVD/VCR. You can view or record ONLY the channels you have selected on the cable box or the satellite box.

• While you are recording, only the channel selected on the box can be viewed.

#### To select channels of the cable box or satellite box

- 1) Turn on the DVD/VCR by pressing the POWER button, and then, press the VCR/TV button.The "POWER" and "VCR" lights on the front panel will appear. Then, press the CHANNEL buttons to select channel 3 or 4 (the same channel as the output channel of the cable b ox or satellite box).
- If you use the channel 4, you need to change the DVD/VCR's RF output to channel 4. Refer to "RF Output Channel".
- At the TV, select channel 3 or 4 (the same channel as you have selected at step 1).
- At the cable box or satellite box, select the channel you want to view or record.



Select this connection when you want to change channels on the DVD/VCR. With this connection, you may watch one channel while recording another.

- You may not view or record a scrambled channel.
- To select channels of the cable box or satellite box
- 1) At the cable box or satellite box, select channel 3 or 4 (the same channel as the DVD/VCR's RF output channel.)
- Refer to "RF Output Channel".
- At the TV, select the same channel as the output channel (3 or 4) of the cable box or satellite box.
- 3) Turn on the DVD/VCR by pressing the POWER button, and then, press the VCR/TV button. The "POWER" and "VCR" lights on the front panel will appear. Then, select the channel you want to view or record.

#### <u>To play back a tape</u>

- Follow the steps 1) to 2) above. Then, play back a tape.
- Refer to "Playback" on page 11.
   **To view one channel while recording another**
- 1) While you are recording on the DVD/VCR, press the VCR/TV but-
- ton so that the "VCR" light disappears on the DVD/VCR.
- 2) At the cable box or satellite box, select the channel you want to view.

### Connection to an Audio System (DVD Audio Only)



#### Note

- Set "DOLBY DIGITAL" to "OFF" for the AUDIO setting in the setup mode for method 1 only. Playing a DVD using incorrect settings may generate noise distortion, and may also damage the speakers. (Refer to pages 20-21.)
- The DVD/VCR Audio Output jacks will output either VCR or DVD signals, depending on which OUTPUT mode you have selected.

The DVD Audio Output jacks will only output DVD signals, regardless of which OUTPUT mode you have selected. See page 9.

### Method 2

#### Audio receiver with Dolby Digital decoder



#### Note

- If output is Dolby Digital encoded audio, connect to a Dolby Digital decoder, and set "DOLBY DIGITAL" to "ON" for the AUDIO setting in the setup mode. (Refer to pages 20-21.)
- The audio source on a disc in a Dolby Digital 5.1 channel surround format cannot be recorded as digital sound by an MD or DAT deck.
- Unless connected to a Dolby Digital decoder, set "DOLBY DIGITAL" to "OFF" for the AUDIO setting in the setup mode. Playing a DVD using incorrect settings may generate noise distortion, and may also damage the speakers. (Refer to pages 20-21.)
- Set "DOLBY DIGITAL" to "OFF" for the AUDIO setting in the setup mode for connecting to an MD deck or DAT deck. (Refer to pages 20-21.)
- By hooking this unit up to a Multi-channel Dolby Digital decoder, you can enjoy high-quality Dolby Digital 5.1 channel surround sound as heard in the movie theaters.



#### (Analog) AUDIO OUT

#### Note

. Connect this unit directly to the TV. If the A/V cables are connected to a VCR, pictures may be distorted due to the copy protection system.

The COAXIAL, DVD AUDIO OUT, S-VIDEO OUT, and COMPONENT VIDEO OUT jacks are only useful in DVD mode.
The DVD/VCR Audio Output jacks will output either VCR or DVD signals, depending on which OUTPUT mode you have selected. The DVD Audio Output jacks will only output DVD signals, regardless of which OUTPUT mode you have selected. See page 9.

# VCR/DVD Selection

Because this product is a combination of a VCR and a DVD player, you must select which component you wish to operate with the OUTPUT button.

### VCR MODE

Press the VCR button on the remote control. (Verify that the VCR OUTPUT light is lit.)

### **DVD MODE**

Press **the DVD button** on the remote control. (Verify that the DVD OUTPUT light is lit.)

### Note

- Pressing only **the OUTPUT button** on the front panel DOES NOT switch the mode of the remote control. You MUST select the correct mode on the remote control.
