This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

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## **INSTALLING YOUR TV SET**

#### **WARNING:**

TO AVOID INJURY TO A CHILD OR ADULT:

- Do not place the TV on an uneven floor or on unstable stand.
- Do not stand or climb on the TV.
- Do not put a VCR or any heavy object on top of the TV.

#### DO NOT:


- Place your TV set in a room where direct lighting strikes the screen.
- Place your TV set too close to a wall, in a confined area or in a very warm location.
- Change the plug's safety prong.

#### DO:

- Use soft and indirect lighting.
- Sit at least 6 feet away from the set.
- Provide normal air circulation for reliable long life.
- Plug into an electrical outlet with standard house power (120 volt AC, 60 Hz).

#### **CAUTION:**

As a safety feature, the plug has one prong wider than the other. It will fit only one way into a standard electrical outlet. If the plug will not fit into the outlet, try turning it around. If the plug will not fit either way, the outlet is probably old and non-standard. You will need to have a new outlet installed by an electrician. DO NOT CHANGE THE SAFETY FEATURE OF THE PLUG.




## ANTENNA/CABLE TV GENERAL INFORMATION

- You can use either an indoor or outdoor antenna to receive VHF and/or UHF channels.
- Channels 2-13 are VHF channels, and channels 14-69 are UHF channels.
- We recommend using an outdoor antenna for better picture quality.
- You can receive Cable TV by contacting your local cable company.
- Cable TV delivers both VHF and UHF channels and other channels not available to your antenna.

#### **TYPES OF ANTENNA CABLES**


Shown below are two basic types of antenna cables. Signals from a home antenna may be conveyed by either type. Cable TV signals will always be conveyed by a 75 ohm coaxial cable.

1 A 75 ohm coaxial cable is generally a round cable with F-type connectors that can easily be attached to a terminal without tools.






2 A 300 ohm cable is a flat "twin-lead" cable that can be attached to a terminal through an antenna adapter supplied as an accessory.




#### ANTENNA CONNECTION PANEL


There are two separate 75 ohm F-type connector terminals and a converter output terminal as shown below.



The ANT-1 and ANT-2 terminals are for connecting a VHF/UHF antenna or a cable TV system. The signal, which is input on the ANT-1, also is output from the OUT terminal whenever the RF switcher in the TV is in the ANT-2 position. You can switch between the ANT-1 and ANT-2 positions by pressing the ANT 1/2 button on the Remote Control or the ANT/VIDEO button on the TV. See page 21.

## **HOME ANTENNA CONNECTION**






Note: You can connect another signal source like a cable TV system or video game to the ANT-2 terminal.

## **CABLE TV CONNECTION**

Generally, the incoming cable for a Cable TV system can be connected directly to the TV antenna terminal just like a home antenna connection. Simply attach it to the ANT-1 (or ANT-2) terminal. You will be able to receive unscrambled cable channels.




Some cable companies offer "premium pay channels". Since the signals of these premium pay channels are scrambled, a cable TV converter/decoder is generally provided to the subscriber by the cable TV company. This decoder box is necessary for normal viewing the scrambled channels. For more specific instructions on installing cable TV, consult your cable TV company.

#### Cable with a decoder box (Unscrambled and Scrambled channels)


You can choose between viewing unscrambled channels and scrambled channels by pressing the ANT 1/2 button or the ANT/VIDEO button. See page 21.


The unscrambled channels will come thru the ANT-1 terminal when the "ANT 1" mode is selected. The scrambled channels from the decoder box will come thru the ANT-2 terminal when the "ANT 2" mode is selected. Place your TV on channel 3 or 4 to match your converter's output channel and select channels using the converter's channel keys.

**Note:** The descrambler device may or may not be a part of the cable converter.




## ANTENNA/CABLE TV AND VCR CONNECTIONS





**Note:** When connected either way, the VIDEO/AUDIO connections from the VCR to the TV are required for (stereo) playback from VCR's. See pages 41 and 42 for connection details.




The unscrambled channels will come thru the ANT-1 terminal whenever the ANT 1/2 button or the ANT/VIDEO button is in "ANT 1" mode.


The scrambled channels from the decoder box will come thru the VCR and the ANT-2 terminal whenever the ANT 1/2 button or the ANT/VIDEO button is in "ANT 2" mode. Place your TV and VCR on channel 3 or 4 to match your converter's output channel. See page 21.

**Note:** When connected this way, the VIDEO/AUDIO connections from the VCR to the TV are required for stereo tape playback from stereo VCR's. See pages 41 and 42 for connection details.



## BEFORE USING THE REMOTE CONTROL

#### **INTRODUCTIONS**

With this Remote Control, you can operate your TV and most models of remote-controlled VCR's and Cable TV Converters even if they are different brands. However, this Remote Control must be programmed to control other brands of VCR's and/or Converters. If you will be using your TV set with a TOSHIBA VCR, your Remote has already been preprogrammed for you.


- Before attempting to operate your Remote Control, install the batteries according to the section "INSTALLING AND REPLACING BATTERIES" shown below.
- For more detailed instructions, see the section "PROGRAMMING THE REMOTE CONTROL" on page 15.

#### Notes:


- After installing new batteries, the Remote Control will set itself to the codes for TOSHIBA's TV and VCR. If you are using the Remote Control to operate equipment that uses different codes, it will have to be reprogrammed for those codes.
- This Remote Control may have functions not available on the original remote control.
- These functions may or may not operate your VCR or Cable TV Converter. Refer to the owner's manuals supplied with the equipments to see which functions are available.
- The remote control supplied with your VCR or Cable TV Converter may have keys not duplicated on this Remote Control. If these functions are desired, the original remote will have to be used.

#### INSTALLING AND REPLACING BATTERIES

1 Place the Remote Control with the face down. Press down on the ridged area of the battery cover and slide it off.



Place two "AA" size batteries, matching the + and – signs on each battery to the + and – signs of the battery compartment.



3 Replace the battery cover until the lock snaps.

#### **TIPS FOR BEST OPERATION**


- For optimum performance, aim the Remote Control directly at the TV from a distance no more than 23 ft (7m) and be sure there is no obstruction between the Remote Control and the TV.
- If your Remote Control does not always adjust the TV as you wish, you probably need to replace the batteries.
   See the directions at the left.
- Remove dead batteries immediately to prevent battery acid from leaking into the battery compartment.
- If you do not intend to use the Remote Control for a long period, remove the batteries.

#### **CAUTION:**

- Do not throw your batteries into a fire. Dispose of your batteries in a designated disposal area.
- Do not combine used old batteries with new ones.
- Do not mix battery types.


## USING THE REMOTE WITH VCR OR CABLE TV CONVERTER

- To control TOSHIBA VCR, first set the TV-CABLE-VCR switch to "VCR" position. The buttons shown below will then control the VCR. The rest of the buttons operate the TV as usual.
  - If you have another brand of VCR, you can probably program your Remote to control it. Details are on page 15.
- To control a cable TV converter, this Remote Control must be programmed to recognize the brand of your converter. See page 15.
  - Set the TV-CABLE-VCR switch to "CABLE" position whenever you control the cable TV converter.



## PROGRAMMING THE REMOTE CONTROL

- This Remote Control is preprogrammed to operate TOSHIBA VCR's.
- To use VCR's other than Toshiba models (or Cable converter), perform the following procedures before operating.

## TO CONTROL OTHER BRANDS OF VCR'S AND CABLE TV CONVERTERS

1 Refer to the "VCR code table" (or "Cable TV converter code table") on pages 16 and 17 to find the code number that corresponds to the brand name of your VCR (or your converter).

If more than one number is listed, try each one separately until you find the one that works.

- 2 Set the TV-CABLE-VCR switch to VCR (or CABLE).
- 3 Hold down RECALL while pressing the Number buttons for the three digit code number for your brand of VCR (or converter).
  The transmit indicator lights up for 1 second when the programming is completed.

When an operation error has occurred, the indicator blinks. Press **RECALL** again to reset.

- 4 Point the Remote Control at the VCR (or at the converter) and press POWER to test the code number.
  - If the right number was entered, the VCR should turn on.
  - If the VCR does not respond to the Remote Control, repeat steps
     1 to 4 with another code number.

#### Notes:

- You have to reprogram the Remote Control when you change its batteries.
- Some newer VCR's are capable of working on either of two remote codes. These VCR's have a switch labeled "VCR1/VCR2".
   If your VCR has this kind of switch, and does not respond to all the code numbers for your VCR brand name, set the switch to another position ("VCR1" or "VCR2") and reprogram the Remote Control.





## **MENU FUNCTION (General Instructions)**

We suggest you familiarize yourself with the procedure before using the Menu function.


To adjust any TV feature, the use of the Menu function is required. The adjustments that can be made to the TV appear on the screen.





#### **MENU BUTTON (on TV)**

Each time you press **MENU**, the Picture, Audio, Set up or Option menu onscreen display is selected in order, then press **ADV**.



#### **ADV BUTTON (on TV)**

Use this **ADV** after you have pressed **MENU** to select the function you want to adjust.


Each time you press **ADV**, the function to be adjusted will be selected in order.

The selected function will be displayed in magenta.

#### -/+ BUTTONS (on TV and on Remote)

Use these -/+ after you have pressed ADV or any of the four menu buttons (PIC, AUD, SET UP or OPTION).

Example: CONTRAST adjustment mode display



Pressing + increases the picture contrast. Pressing - increases the picture contrast.

#### PIC (Picture) BUTTON (on Remote)

Press **PIC** repeatedly until the Picture menu function you want to adjust is selected. The selected function will be displayed in magenta, then press -/+ to adjust the setting. Details for each function begin on page 26.

#### AUD (Audio) BUTTON (on Remote)

Press **AUD** repeatedly until the Audio menu function you want to adjust is selected. The selected function will be displayed in magenta, then press –/+ to adjust the setting. Details for each function begin on page 27.

#### **OPTION BUTTON (on Remote)**

Press **OPTION** repeatedly until the Option menu function you want to adjust is selected. The selected function will be displayed in magenta, then press –/+ to adjust the setting. Details for each function begin on pages 31 and 38.

#### **EXIT BUTTON (on Remote)**

The above four menu displays will automatically disappear from the screen if no control has been operated for about 15 seconds, and all other menu displays also disappear after about 6 seconds.

If you want to clear the screen of all on-screen displays instantly, press **EXIT**.

#### Notes:

- The ADV button on the TV will function as the ANT/VIDEO button when no menu display is on the screen.
- The -/+ buttons on the TV will function as the VOLUME ▼/▲ buttons when no menu display is on the screen.

### TV CHANNELS

This TV will receive the following TV signals:

- 1. TV: Off the air TV signals. (VHF channels 2 thru 13 and UHF channels 14 thru 69)
- 2. STD CABLE: Standard (or IRC: Incremental Related Carrier) cable TV signals.
- 3. HRC CABLE: Harmonic Related Carrier cable TV signals.
- 4. IRC CABLE: Incremental Related Carrier cable TV signals.

For each of these systems, your TV has exact frequencies built into it to ensure precise tuning. For precise tuning, the TV/CABLE function must be set to match your TV or CABLE system. (See page 22.) The following chart shows channels available in each system and how your TV displays them. When you connect your TV to a cable TV system and if you are not sure what system they are using, proceed with the following section "HOW TO FIND YOUR TYPE OF CABLE SYSTEM" or consult your local cable company to check if your system is STD, HRC or IRC.

#### HOW TO FIND YOUR TYPE OF CABLE SYSTEM

- 1 Select the "STD CABLE" mode following the instructions on page 22.
- 2 Select various channels and confirm whether the channel will lock immediately with perfect picture. If the channels seem to take a few seconds to lock in, your cable system may be one of the other cable systems. In this case, continue with the following steps.
- 3 Select the "HRC CABLE" mode and try above procedure again.
- 4 If you are having problem with only channel 5 or 6, you may have an IRC system so change the mode to the "IRC CABLE".





**Note:** The above chart is typical of many cable system channel allocations. However, the numbering system may differ in your area. If in doubt, consult your local cable company.

## **SELECTING THE ANTENNA INPUT**

Your TV has two separate antenna inputs (ANT-1 and ANT-2) that allow you to connect two different signal sources, if desired.





#### **USING THE ANT 1/2 BUTTON (on the Remote Control)**

Each time you press the button, the ANT 1 mode and ANT 2 mode will alternate. The selected mode will be displayed in magenta to show which antenna source you are watching.

Select the mode that matches the antenna terminal you use.

ANT 1 ANT 2 TO SELECT PUSH ANT 1+2

#### Note:

This button does not function in the VIDEO mode.

#### **USING THE ANT/VIDEO BUTTON (on the TV)**

Each time you press the button, the ANT 1 VIDEO 1, VIDEO 2 or ANT 2 mode will be selected in order.

The selected mode will be displayed in magenta to show which signal source you are watching.

Press the button until "ANT 1" or "ANT 2" is displayed in magenta to match the antenna terminal you use.


#### Note:

This button functions as the ADV button while any of four menu displays (Picture, Audio, Set up or Option) are on the screen.

## PROGRAMMING CHANNEL MEMORY

The channel memory is the list of TV channel numbers your TV will stop on when you press the CHANNEL ▲ or ▼ button. First, use the TV CABLE and CHANNEL PROGRAM functions to preset all active channels in your area automatically. If necessary, arrange the preset channels with the ADD/ERASE functions so that you can tune into only desired channels.

Note: If you utilize both "ANT-1" and "ANT-2" terminals, perform channel programming for each input source.




#### **TV/CABLE FUNCTION**

- 1 Press POWER to turn on the TV.
- 2 Press SET UP on the Remote Control (or MENU on the TV) to display the Set up menu on the screen.
- Press SET UP repeatedly (or ADV on the TV) until "TV/CABLE" is displayed in magenta.
- 4 Press or + until the mode that corresponds to your TV signal system is displayed in magenta. Each time you press the button, the TV, STD CABLE, HRC CABLE or IRC CABLE mode will be selected in order.

Press – or + to start channel programming. The TV will automatically cycle through all the TV or CABLE channels on the mode selected by the TV/CABLE function and store active channels in the channel memory. CH PROGRAM TV 21



**4** Press **CHANNEL △** or **▼** to make sure the channel programming has been done properly.

#### **ADD ERASE FUNCTION**

First follow the instructions "CH PROGRAM FUNCTION" and then add or erase individual channels as desired.

1 Select the channel you want to erase using the CHANNEL ▲ or ▼ button, or select the channel you want to add using the Channel Number buttons.


Press the button until "CH ERASE" is displayed in magenta indicating that the channel has been erased from the memory.

Press the button until "CH ADD" is displayed in magenta indicating that the channel has been memorized.


**5** Repeat steps 1 to 4 for other channels.







## If you cannot select certain channels, either TV (off the air) or CABLE channels

3 Press VOLUME ▲/▼ to adjust the volume.

To increase the volume, press ▲. To decrease the volume, press ▼.



#### Watching Video Input

The TV/VIDEO button (or ANT/VIDEO button) is used to view the signals coming from other devices like VCR's or Video Disc Players connected to this TV. Details are on page 41.

#### Auto-Power-Off


If a vacant channel is tuned or TV broadcast for a day is finished, the TV will automatically turn off after about 15 minutes.

This feature does not operate in the VIDEO mode.

#### Last Mode Memory

If the power is cut off while you are viewing the TV and the power is resupplied, the TV is turned on automatically by the *Last Mode Memory* feature. If the power is going to be off or when you leave home for a long time, remove the power plug from the wall outlet to prevent the TV from turning on in your absence.


## CONVENIENT REMOTE FUNCTIONS



#### TO DISPLAY ON-SCREEN INFORMATION

Press **RECALL** to display the following onscreen information.

- Channel number or VIDEO mode selected.
- Channel caption (if previously preset).
- Closed Caption or Text program status.



#### TO MUTE THE SOUND

Press **MUTE** to mute the sound immediately without affecting the picture. The word "MUTE" will be displayed on the screen as shown. This is useful during telephone calls or other interruptions.

To restore the sound, press MUTE again.



#### TO CHANGE QUICKLY BETWEEN TWO CHANNELS


Press **RTN** to return to the last channel that was tuned previously. This is useful should you want to view two channels. This allows you to view two programs without entering an actual channel number each time.

#### To operate this function

- 1 Select the first channel you want to view.

The previous channel will return.


#### TO SET THE OFF (SLEEP) TIMER

## **SELECTING STEREO/SAP BROADCASTS**

The MTS (Multi-channel TV Sound) feature allows you to improve your TV viewing with high fidelity stereo sound. MTS also provides for an extra channel, SAP (Second Audio Program), used to transmit a second language or other audio information.






#### LISTENING TO STEREO SOUND

- **1** When the TV receives a stereo broadcast, the STEREO indicator (green) will light up.
- **2** Press MTS until "STEREO" is displayed on the screen in magenta.

Normally this function can be left in the STEREO mode. Your TV will then automatically reproduce either stereo or monaural sound, whichever is broadcast.



#### If the stereo sound is noisy

If a broadcast signal is not strong enough, and noise-free stereo sound is not available, select the MONAURAL mode. The noise should be reduced.

#### LISTENING TO SECOND LANGUAGE

- **1** When the TV receives a SAP broadcast, the SAP indicator (orange) will light up.
- **2** Press MTS until "SAP" is displayed in magenta.

You will hear only the second language from the left and right speakers.




#### Notes:

- Be sure you have selected the STEREO mode if broadcast is in stereo.
- The MTS button will not function in the VIDEO mode.

## ENHANCING THE SURROUND SOUND EFFECT

The Surround function expands the audio listening field wider than you would believe possible from a TV's speakers. Toshiba's CYCLONE ABX is a deep bass reproduction system.



#### Note on the Surround function

Normally you can leave the MTS button set to "STEREO" and the Surround function set to "ON". The TV will automatically produce either Surround stereo or monaural, whatever is broadcast.

#### TO ACTIVATE THE SURROUND FUNCTION

- 1 Press MTS to select the STEREO mode.
- 2 Press **DSP/SUR** on the Remote Control to call up the Surround ON/OFF mode onscreen display as shown.







## **WATCHING PICTURE IN PICTURE (PIP)**

This TV is capable of displaying two pictures simultaneously. This is called the Picture-in-Picture function. A TV broadcast picture, or a picture from external source equipment such as a VCR, can be displayed as a small picture.

Note: The signal sources from the ANT-2 terminal cannot be displayed as a small picture.

1 To open up the PIP window Press PIP once. The 1/9 size picture will appear.



Closed captioning is a printed version of the dialogue, narration, and/or sound effects of a TV program.

Captions will appear at either the top or bottom of the screen during captioned broadcasts as shown.

Captioning is especially helpful for hearing impaired individuals.

- 2 Press RECALL to check if the program is being captioned. If it is, the word "CAPTION" is displayed on the screen. The captioned programs are usually notated on your local TV listings by its service marks such as "CC".

- 23 VIDEO 1/VIDEO 2 IN Jacks provide for direct connection of video devices (VCR, video disc player, camcorder, etc.) with video/audio outputs. Connection details are on pages 41 and 43.
- VIDEO 1 SELECT Button lets you switch between two signal sources connected to the Front VIDEO 1 and Rear VIDEO 1 jacks. See page 41 for details.
- **VARIABLE AUDIO OUT Jacks** feed volume-controlled stereo audio out from whatever is displayed on the screen, allows connection of audio amplifier and lets you adjust sound level with TV's remote. Connection details are on page 44.
- **EXTERNAL SPEAKER Terminals** provide for direct connection of external speakers. Connection details are on page 45.
- MAIN SPEAKER Switch lets you turn off TV's built-in speakers so that sound will instead come through speakers connected to EXTERNAL SPEAKER terminals. See page 45 for details.

# **CONNECTING A STANDARD VCR**

Connect VIDEO1 or VIDEO2 IN jacks on the TV rear panel to the video/audio output jacks of an installed VCR, video disc player, etc. for playback of video material.







### TO SELECT VIDEO INPUT SOURCE

To operate your TV and video equipment properly, refer to the instructions furnished with the video equipment.

- 1 Turn the TV and VCR ON.
- 2 Press TV/VIDEO on the Remote Control (or ANT/VIDEO on the TV) to select the appropriate source.

Each time you press the button, TV, VIDEO 1 or VIDEO 2 source will be selected in order.

The selected source will be displayed in magenta.

- **3** Push the VIDEO 1 SELECT button on the TV set to the inner position (**■**) to select the Rear "VIDEO 1".
  - ..... Inner position for Rear "VIDEO 1".
  - ..... Outer position for Front "VIDEO 1".

Normally set this button in the inner position.

4 Operate your VCR normally.


#### Notes:

- The VIDEO 2 IN jacks can also be used for connecting a second piece of video equipments with video/audio outputs. To view video from equipment connected to the VIDEO 2 IN jacks, select "VIDEO 2".
- If you connect a monaural VCR, connect the audio output of the VCR to the L/MONO jack of VIDEO 1/2 on the TV.



# **CONNECTING A VCR WITH AN S-VIDEO JACK**

If you connect a VCR with an S-video jack to the "S-VIDEO" jack on the back of the TV, you must also connect the audio cables to the AUDIO jacks of "VIDEO 1 IN" on the back of the TV. The S-video cable only carries the video signal. Audio signals are separate.



### TO SELECT VIDEO INPUT SOURCE

- 1 Turn the TV and VCR ON.
- Press TV/VIDEO on the Remote Control (or ANT/VIDEO on the TV) to select the "VIDEO 1" mode.
- **3** Push the VIDEO 1 SELECT button on the TV to the inner position (**\_**).
- 4 Operate your VCR normally.


### Notes:

- If you connect a monaural VCR, connect the audio output of the VCR to the L/MONO jack of VIDEO 1 on the TV.
- The S-VIDEO jack has priority over the phono-type (yellow) video jack when both are used.
- The S-VIDEO terminal accepts SEPARATED Luminance/Chrominance (Y-C) signals conforming to the NTSC standard.

# **CONNECTING A CAMCORDER**

This connection allows you to play back tapes in the camcoder and watch them on the TV.

- If you have a camcorder with an S-video jack, connect the s-video cable to the S-VIDEO jack of the Front "VIDEO 1 IN" jacks.
- If you have a standard camcorder, connect the video cable to the VIDEO jack of the Front "VIDEO 1 IN" jacks. With either video connection, connect the audio cables.



#### SELECTING VIDEO SOURCES

To operate your TV and camcorder properly, refer to the instructions furnished with the connected camcorder.


- 1 Turn the TV and the camcorder ON.
- 2 Press TV/VIDEO on the Remote Control (or ANT/VIDEO on the TV) to select the "VIDEO 1" mode.
- **3** Push the VIDEO 1 SELECT button on the TV set to the outer position (■).
- 4 Operate your camcorder normally.

- \* When the S-video cable is connected to the S-VIDEO INPUT jack, the Video plug does not have to be connected.
- If you connect a monaural camcorder, connect the audio output of the camcorder to the L/MONO jack.

# **CONNECTING AN AUDIO AMPLIFIER**

Connect the VARIABLE AUDIO OUT jacks to the external input jacks on the stereo amplifier. You will be able to change and mute volume with the TV's remote control. You will also be able to control bass, treble and balance functions.




## PREPARING FOR USE

- 1 Turn the TV and stereo amplifier ON.
- 2 Adjust the VOLUME control on the TV for a moderate listening level.
- **3** Disconnect the built-in speakers following the instructions at the right.
- **4** Adjust the volume control on the stereo amplifier for a moderate listening level.
- **5** Control of the audio can now be done using the audio function buttons (VOLUME, MUTE, BASS, TREBLE and BALANCE) on the TV's remote control.



The built-in main speakers will be disconnected.



To use the built-in speakers again


Select "SPEAKERS ON" in step 2 above.

Before connecting the speakers, turn the TV off.





### PREPARING FOR USE

Match the right and left channels and +/- polarities of the TV speaker terminals and external speakers.






Twist wire core.

## **CAUTIONS:**

 Do not connect external speakers to more than one audic source at a time. You will damage your equipment if you connect the same speaker system to both the TV and amplifier.



 Use only external speakers with an impedance rating of 8 ohms and input power of 7 W or greater.

**Note:** The CYCLONE woofer is not affected by the MAIN SPEAKER switch. If necessary, deactivate the CYCLONE. See page 29.

## **CLEANING AND CARE**

WARNING: TV sets use High Voltage. Do not try to remove the cabinet back. Refer servicing to qualified service personnel.

- To clean the TV screen:
  - 1. First remove the plug from the power outlet to avoid possible shock hazard.
  - Use a clean cellulose sponge or chamois cloth dampened with a solution of mild detergent and warm water to clean TV screen and trim. Do not use too much water on the TV screen. Water spills into the cabinet may cause damage to the TV. Avoid excess water.
  - Remove any extra moisture with the same cloth or a dry one.
- To maintain the finish and appearance of the cabinet, polish it from time to time with a quality furniture polish.

**Note:** Never use strong solvents such as thinner, benzene or other chemicals on or near cabinet, as they might damage the finish of the cabinet.

Authorized TACP/THI service station personnel will come to your home when warranty service is required.
