IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Safety is a combination of common sense, staying alert and knowing how your vac works. Read this manual to understand the vac.

Safety Signal Words

DANGER: means if the safety information is not followed someone **will** be seriously injured or killed.

WARNING: means if the safety information is not followed someone **could** be seriously injured or killed.

CAUTION: means if the safety information is not followed someone **might** be injured.

When using your vac, follow basic safety precautions including the following.

WARNING - To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, or injury:

Read and understand this owner's manual and all labels on the vac before operating. Use only as described in this manual. To avoid personal injury or damage to vac, use only Sears Craftsman recommended accessories.

Sparks inside the motor can ignite flammable vapors or dust. To reduce the risk of fire or explosion: Do not vacuum, or use this vac near, flammable or combustible liquids, gases, or explosive dusts such as gasoline or other fuels, lighter fluid, cleaners, oil-based paints, natural gas, hydrogen, coal dust, magnesium dust, grain dust, or gun powder.

Do not vacuum anything that is burning or smoking, such as cigarettes, matches, or hot ashes.

Do not vacuum fireplace soot or ash, this is a very fine dust which will not be captured by the filter and may cause damage.

To reduce the risk of health hazards from vapors or dusts, do not vacuum toxic materials.

Do not use or store near hazardous materials.

Do not allow to be used as a toy. Close attention is necessary when used by or near children.

For dry pickup, do not use this vac with a torn filter or without the filter installed.

Do not leave vac when plugged in. Unplug from outlet when not in use and before servicing. Turn off vac before unplugging.

To avoid injury from accidental starting, unplug power cord before changing or cleaning filter.

Connect to a properly grounded outlet only. See Grounding Instructions.

Do not unplug by pulling on cord. To

unplug, grasp the plug, not the cord.

Do not use with damaged cord, plug or other parts. If your vac is not working as it should, has missing parts, has been dropped, damaged, left out- doors, or dropped into water, return it to a Sears Service Center.

Do not pull or carry by cord, use cord as handle, close a door on cord, or pull cord around sharp edges or corners.

Keep cord away from heated surfaces.

Do not handle plug or the vac with wet hands.

openings. Do not vacuum with any ventilation openings blocked; keep free of dust, lint, hair or anything that may reduce air flow.

Keep hair, loose clothing, fingers, and all parts of body away from openings and moving parts.

To reduce the risk of falls, use extra care when cleaning on stairs.

Observe the following warnings that appear on the motor housing of your vac.

WARNING: To reduce the risk of electric shock - do not expose to rain - store indoors.

Do not put any object into ventilation

For your own safety, read and understand owner's manual. Do not pick up hot ashes, coals, toxic, flammable or other hazardous material. Do not use around explosive liquids or vapors.

SAVE THESE INSTRUCTIONS

The operation of any utility vac can result in foreign objects being blown into the eyes, which can result in severe eye damage. Always wear safety goggles complying with ANSI Z87.1 (shown on package) before commencing operation. Safety Goggles are available at Sears retail stores.

To reduce the risk of hearing damage, wear ear protectors when using the vac for extended hours or when, using it in a noisy area.

For dust operations, wear dust mask.



Use only extension cords that are rated for outdoor use. Extension cords in poor condition or that are too small in wire size can pose fire and shock hazards. When using an extension cord, be sure it is in good condition. Using any extension cord will cause some loss of power. To keep the loss to a minimum, use the following table to choose the minimum wire size extension cord.

Extension Cord Length	A.W.G.
0-50 Ft.	14
50-100 Ft.	12

Grounding Instructions

This appliance must be grounded. If it should malfunction or breakdown, grounding provides a path of least resistance for electric current to reduce the risk of electric shock. This appliance is equipped with a cord having an equipment-grounding conductor and grounding plug. The plug must be inserted into an appropriate outlet that is properly installed and grounded in accordance with all local codes and ordinances.

WARNING: Improper connection of the equipmentgrounding conductor can result in a risk of electric shock. Check with a qualified electrician or service person if you are in doubt as to whether the outlet if properly grounded. Do not modify the plug provided with the appliance - if it will not fit the outlet, have a proper outlet installed by a qualified electrician.

This appliance is for use on a nominal 120 volt circuit, and has a grounded plug that looks like the plug shown. A temporary adaptor that looks like the adaptor shown may be used to connect this plug to a 2-pole receptacle as shown if a properly grounded outlet is not available. The temporary adaptor should be used only until a properly grounded outlet can be installed by a qualified electrician. The green colored rigid ear, lug or the like extending from the adaptor must be connected to a permanent ground such as a properly grounded outlet box cover. Whenever the adaptor is used, it must be held in place by a metal screw.

NOTE: In Canada, the use of a temporary adaptor is not permitted by the Canadian Electrical Code.





Introduction

This vac is intended for household use only. It may be used for light vacuuming of wet or dry media and may also be used as a blower. The light weight design allows usage for most small household vacuuming chores. Familiarize yourself with the following product features and read the entire owner's manual for specific usage of your new wet/dry vac.

IMPORTANT NOTE Please Read Carefully

Static Shocks Are Common - In dry areas or when the relative humidity of the air is low. To reduce the frequency of static shocks in your home the best remedy is to add moisture to the air with a console humidifier.

Getting to Know Your Vac



Cord Storage

- Your wet/dry vac has a convenient area to store your power cord while not in use.
- 2. Coil the power cord around the wet/dry vac, between the power head assembly and the dust drum.

CAUTION: A partially unwrapped cord may fall in coils near your feet. You could trip. To avoid this, always fully unwrap the cord before plugging it in.

Hose Storage

A convenient location for hose storage is to connect one end of the hose into the vacuum port and one end into the blowing port.



Operation

WARNING

To reduce the risk of fire or explosion, do not operate this vac in areas with flammable gases, vapors or explosive dust in the air. Flammable gases or vapors include but are not limited to; lighter fluid, solvent type cleaners, oilbase paints, gasoline, alcohol or aerosol sprays. Explosive dusts include but are not limited to; coal, magnesium, grain or gun powder. Do not vacuum explosive dust, flammable or combustible liquids or hot ashes. Do not use this vac as a sprayer for any flammable or combustible liquid. To reduce the risk of health hazards from vapors or dusts, do not vacuum toxic materials.

CAUTION: To reduce the risk of hearing damage wear ear protectors when using the vac for extended hours or when using it in a noisy area.

The operation of any utility vac can result in foreign objects being blown into the eyes, which can result in severe eye damage. Always wear safety goggles complying with ANSI Z87.1 (shown on package) before commencing operation. Safety Goggles are available at Sears retail stores.

Your Craftsman two gallon wet/dry vac is assembled at the factory and ready for use when you remove it from the carton. The unit is ready for dry vacuuming or blowing. After you plug the power cord into the wall receptacle, turn the unit "ON" by pushing the switch from position "**O**" to position "**I**". The symbols used on the switch are international symbols. The "**O**" is the "OFF" position and the "**I**" is the "ON" position.



Operation (continued)

Vacuuming Dry Materials

- 1. The filter must be in the correct position at all times to avoid leaks and possible damage to the vac. Make sure that the filter is completely covering the filter cage and that the retainer band is as close to the lid as possible, making sure there are no gaps between the filter and the lid. (See illustration). It is very important to assemble the filter to the cage without allowing any possible leaks or tears. Any leaks will allow the picked up media to be blown out of the blower port and back into the surrounding environment.
- When using your vac to pick up very fine dust, empty the dust drum and clean or replace the filter at more frequent intervals to maintain peak performance.

NOTE: A dry filter is necessary to pick up dry material. If you use your vac to pick up dust when the filter is wet, the filter will clog quickly and be very difficult to clean. In case the filter gets wet, replace it before continuing to do dry pickups.

Vacuuming Liquids

- 1. Removal of the filter is recommended for wet pickups.
- 2. This wet/dry vac is equipped with a float mechanism which will rise automatically to cut off the air flow when the liquid in the drum reaches a predetermined level. When this happens, turn off vac, unplug the power cord, and empty the dust drum. You will know that the float has shut the airflow off because the suction ceases and the motor noise becomes higher in pitch, due to increased motor speed. The liquid capacity may vary with the rate of pickup.

IMPORTANT: To avoid damage to the vac do not run motor with float in raised position.



Emptying the Dust Drum

WARNING: To avoid injury from accidental starting, unplug power cord before emptying the drum.

- Remove the power head assembly of the wet/dry vac by pulling outward on the latches located on each side of the vac. Lift off the power head assembly.
- 2. Dump the contents of the dust drum into a proper waste disposal container.



Blowing Feature

Your vac features "Full Blowing". It has the capability to blow sawdust and other debris. It is excellent to use to blow dust and debris out of garages or off patios and driveways. Follow the steps below to use your vac as a blower.

WARNING: Always wear safety goggles complying with ANSI Z87.1 when using as a blower.

WARNING: Wear a dust mask if blowing creates dust which might be inhaled.

CAUTION: To reduce the risk of hearing damage wear ear protectors when using the vac/blower for extended hours or when using it in a noisy area.

WARNING: To avoid injury to bystanders, keep them clear of blow-ing debris.

- 1. Locate blowing port of your vac.
- 2. Insert one end of the 4 foot x 1-1/4 inch hose into the blowing port.
- 3. Turn vac "ON" and you are ready to use your vac as a blower.

NOTE: If you need additional length at the end of the hose, extension wands are available at Sears retail stores as stock no. 9-17861.

Maintenance

Filter

Your filter should be cleaned often to maintain peak vac performance.

NOTE: The filter is made of high quality material designed to stop very small particles of dust. Handle the filter carefully when removing to clean or installing a new filter. Do not tear the filter during removal or installation if your intent is to reuse the filter.

Easy to Replace Filter

- 1. Extend the retainer band around the plastic posts on the lid.
- 2. Remove filter bag off the filter cage.
- 3. Place the replacement filter on the filter cage until open end touches bottom of lid.
- 4. Release the retainer band from the plastic post on the lid, holding the filter bag secure to the lid.
- 5. Make sure the retainer band is positioned on the filter bag covering the black printed line.



IMPORTANT: To avoid damage to the blower wheel and motor, always reinstall the filter before using the vac for dry material pick-up.

Take the dirty filter to a disposal container and gently brush away small dirt particles that may be adhering to the filter material. **IMPORTANT**: After cleaning, check the filter for tears or small holes. Do not use a filter with holes or tears in it. Even a small hole can cause a lot of dust to come out of your vac. Replace it immediately.

Installation

New filters may be purchased at area Sears retail stores, Sears retail replacement filters are sold by stock no. 9-16949.

NOTE: Before installing the filter on the vac, clean the area of the lid so that the retainer band will seal the bag against the lid and stop small particles from bypassing the filter bag.

If the filter is clean and not damaged, replace it on the filter cage. If it cannot be reused, place a new filter over the filter cage.

Replace the retainer band around the filter. Make sure the retainer band is positioned on the filter, and the filter completely covers the filter cage. Also, make sure the edges of the filter are completely secured under the retainer band.

NOTE: For best results of cleaning due to accumulated dust, clean the filter in an open area. Cleaning should be done outdoors and not in the living quarters.

Cleaning

To keep your wet/dry vac looking its best, clean the outside with a cloth dampened with warm water and mild soap.

To clean the dust drum:

- 1. Dump debris out.
- 2. Wash dust drum thoroughly.
- 3. Wipe out with dry cloth.

Storage

Before storing your vac, the dust drum should be emptied and cleaned. The cord should be wrapped around the unit and the hose should be stored as described in the cord/hose storage section in this manual. Accessories should be kept in the same area as the vac so they can be readily available. The vac should be stored indoors.

Accessories

Sears offers many specialized 1-1/4" nonmechanical cleaning accessories that may be used with this wet/dry vac. Wet/dry vac accessories may be found at all Sears retail stores and may also be ordered from the Sears "Power and Hand Tool" Catalog.

Troubleshooting

Problem	Cause	Remedy
Vac will not pick up dirt	1. Clogged filter	1. Clean or replace filter (follow instructions on page 10)
	2. Clogged hose 3. Air leak	 Remove hose and clear debris. Make sure power head is securely attached to dust drum.
Vac will not run	1. No electricity	1. Make sure electrical outlet has voltage. (A qualified electrician may need to be contacted.)

WARNING: If any of the power head assembly parts should become detached or broken, exposing motor or any other electrical components, operation should be discontinued immediately to avoid personal injury or further damage to the vacuum. Repairs should be made before reusing the vacuum.
