

### NOTE TO CATV SYSTEM INSTALLER IN THE USA:

This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

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# **Installing Your TV Set**

### Where to install

Place the TV on the floor or on a sturdy platform. The mounting surface should be flat and steady.

### Lighting

Do not place the TV in a room where direct lighting strikes the screen. Use soft and indirect lighting.

### Air circulation

Place the TV far enough from the walls to allow proper ventilation. This will prevent the TV from overheating and avoid possible damage to the TV. Avoid dusty places too.

### **Power supply**

Plug into an electrical outlet with standard household power (120 volt AC, 60Hz). Do not change the plug's safety prong. See the right column.

### **WARNING:**

TO AVOID PERSONAL INJURY


- Do not stand or climb on the TV.
- Do not put a VCR or any heavy object on top of the TV.

### **CAUTION:**

As a safety feature, the plug has one prong wider than the other. It will fit only one way into a standard electrical outlet. If the plug will not fit into the outlet, try turning it around. If the plug will not fit either way, the outlet is probably old and non-

standard.

# **Antenna/Cable TV Connection**

You can use either an indoor or outdoor antenna to receive VHF and/or UHF channels.


Channels 2 - 13 are VHF channels, and channels 14 - 69 are UHF channels.

We recommend using an outdoor antenna for better picture quality.


You can receive Cable TV by connecting a cable supplied by your local cable company.

Cable TV delivers both VHF and UHF channels and other channels not available from your antenna.

### Connecting a Cable with a decoder box




### Notes:

- \*"A" position on the A/B switch allows you to select unscrambled channels using the TV's channel keys.
  "B" position allows you to select scrambled channels via the converter/decoder box using the converter's channel keys. Place your TV on channel 3 or 4 to match the converter's output channel.
- If you use a VCR, connect its antenna in/out between the decoder box and A/B switch.

# Antenna/Cable TV and VCR Connections


After antenna cable connections are made, you are still required to connect the VCR using a video/audio connecting cables for (stereo) playback of good quality from the VCR. See page 40.

### Antenna/Cable TV connection via VCR (simplified method)



**Note**: On many VCR's, playing tapes causes the VCR's TV/VCR switching to disconnect the antenna signals from the TV. If you cannot select a certain channel, try pressing the TV/VCR button on the Remote Control.

### Using a 2-way signal splitter




### Notes:

- When connecting a cable TV converter/decoder (A):
  - "A" position on the A/B switch allows you to select unscrambled channels using the TV's channel keys.
  - "B" position on the A/B switch allows you to select scrambled channels via the cable TV converter/decoder using the converter's channel keys. Place your TV and VCR on channel 3 or 4 to match the converter's output channel.
- The cable 

   ® connection is necessary only when the cable TV converter/decoder 
   ® is connected.



# **Location of Controls (Remote Control)**

Only the buttons that are used to operate the TV set are described here. For details on the use of each control, refer to pages in brackets.

### Aim at the remote sensor on the TV.



\*These functions do not have duplicate locations on the TV set. They can be controlled only with the Remote Control.

# **Before Using the Remote Control**

### Introductions

With this Remote Control, you can operate your TV and most models of remote-controlled VCR's and Cable TV converters even if they are different brands. However, this Remote Control must be programmed to control other brands of VCR's and/or Converters. If you will be using your TV set with a TOSHIBA VCR, your remote has already been preprogrammed for you.


- Before attempting to operate your Remote Control, install the batteries according to the section "Installing and replacing batteries" shown below.
- For more detailed instructions, see the section "Programming the Remote Control" on page 11.

### Notes:


- After installing new batteries, the Remote Control will set itself to the codes for TOSHIBA's TV and VCR. If you are using the Remote Control to operate equipment that uses different codes, it will have to be reprogrammed for those codes.
- This Remote Control may have functions not available on the original remote control.
- These functions may or may not operate your VCR or Cable TV Converter. Refer to the owner's manuals supplied with the equipment to see which functions are available.
- The remote control supplied with your VCR or Cable TV Converter may have keys not duplicated on this Remote Control. If these functions are desired, the original remote will have to be used.

### Installing and replacing batteries

Place the Remote Control with the face down. Press down on the ridged area of the battery cover and slide it off.



Place two "AAA" size batteries, matching the + and signs on each battery to the + and - signs of the battery compartment.



**3** Replace the battery cover until the lock snaps.

### **CAUTION:**

- Do not throw your batteries into a fire. Dispose of your batteries in a designated disposal area.
- Do not combine used old batteries with new ones.
- Do not mix battery types.

### Tips for Best Operation


- For optimum performance, aim the Remote Control directly at the TV from a distance of no more than 16 ft (5m) and be sure there is no obstruction between the Remote Control and the TV.
- If your Remote Control does not always adjust the TV as you wish, you probably need to replace the batteries
- Remove dead batteries immediately to prevent battery acid from leaking into the battery compartment.
- If you do not intend to use the Remote Control for a long period, remove the batteries.

# Using the Remote with VCR or Cable TV Converter

- To control TOSHIBA VCR, first set the TV/CABLE/VCR switch to "VCR" position. The buttons shown below will then control the VCR. The rest of the buttons operate the TV as usual.
   If you have another brand of VCR, you can probably program your Remote to control it.
   Details are on page 11.
- To control a cable TV converter, this Remote Control must be programmed to recognize the brand of your converter. See page 11.


Set the TV/CABLE/VCR switch to "CABLE" position whenever you control the cable TV converter.

# **Programming the Remote Control**

- This Remote Control is preprogrammed to operate TOSHIBA VCR's.
- To use VCR's other than Toshiba models (or Cable converter), perform the following procedures before operating.



### To control other brands of VCR's and cable TV converters

1 Refer to the "VCR code table" (or "Cable TV converter code table") on pages 12 and 13 to find the code number that corresponds to the brand name of your VCR (or your converter).

If more than one number is listed, try each one separately until you find the one that works.

- 2 Set the TV/CABLE/VCR switch to "VCR" (or "CABLE").
- 3 Hold down **RECALL** while pressing the **Number** buttons for the three digit code number for your brand of VCR (or converter).
- 4 Point the Remote Control at the VCR (or at the converter) and press POWER to test the code number.
  - If the right number was entered, the VCR (or the converter) should turn on.
  - If the VCR (or the converter) does not respond to the Remote Control, repeat steps 1 to 4 with another code number.

### Notes:

- You have to reprogram the Remote Control when you change its batteries.
- Some newer VCR's are capable of working on either of two remote codes. These VCR's have a switch labeled "VCR1/VCR2". If your VCR has this kind of switch, and does not respond to all the code numbers for your VCR brand name, set the switch to another position ("VCR1" or "VCR2") and reprogram the Remote Control.





# Menu Function (General Instructions)

We suggest you familiarize yourself with the procedure before using the Menu function.


To adjust any TV feature, the use of the Menu function is required. The adjustment that can be made to the TV appear on the screen.





### MENU button (on TV and on Remote)

Each time you press **MENU**, the Picture, Audio, Setup or Option menu on-screen display is selected in order, then press **ADV**.



### ADV button (on TV and on Remote)

Use **ADV** after you have selected the on-screen menu you want to adjust with the MENU button.

Each time you press **ADV**, the function to be adjusted will be selected in order.

ADV + button...... from bottom to top ADV, ADV – button ..... from top to bottom The selected function will be displayed in magenta.

### - /+ buttons (on TV and on Remote)

Use - /+ to adjust the function you have selected with the ADV button.

### Notes:

- The ADV button on the TV will function as the TV/VIDEO button when no menu display is on the screen.
- The -/+ buttons on the TV will function as the VOLUME ▼/▲ buttons when no menu display is on the screen.
- The -/+ buttons on the Remote Control will function as the FAV ▼/▲ buttons when no menu display is on the screen.

### EXIT button (on Remote)

The above four menu displays will automatically disappear from the screen if no control has been operated for about 15 seconds. If you want to clear the screen of all on-screen displays instantly, press **EXIT**.

### **DEMO** button (on TV)

When you press the button, the TV will automatically display a variety of its on-screen menus and special features.

This function is provided for demonstration purposes only. Press **DEMO**.



# **Programming Channel Memory**


The channel memory is the list of TV channel numbers your TV will stop on when you press the CHANNEL ▲ or ▼ button. First, use the TV/CABLE and CH PROGRAM functions to preset all active channels in your area automatically.

# **Selecting Stereo/SAP Broadcasts**

The MTS (Multi-channel TV Sound) feature allows you to improve your TV viewing with high fidelity stereo sound. MTS also provides for an extra channel, SAP (Second Audio Program), used to transmit a second language or other audio information.






### Listening to stereo sound

When the TV receives a stereo (or SAP) broadcast, the word "STEREO" (or "SAP") is displayed on the screen whenever the TV is turned on, a channel is selected, or the RECALL button is pressed.




- 2 Press **MENU** repeatedly to display the AUDIO menu.
- **3** Press **ADV** repeatedly until "MTS" is displayed in magenta.



Press – or + until "STEREO" is displayed in magenta.

If a stereo broadcast is received, "STEREO" will be displayed in yellow.





### If the stereo sound is noisy

If a broadcast signal is not strong enough, and noise-free stereo sound is not available, select the "MONAURAL" mode. The noise should be reduced.

# **Enhancing the Surround Sound Effect**

The Surround function expands the audio listening field wider and deeper than you would believe possible from a TV's speakers. This function process stereo signals from a TV broadcast or VIDEO input.



### **Activating the Surround function**

- 1 Select the STEREO mode following the steps on the previous page.
- 2 Press SUR on the Remote Control to call up the Surround ON/OFF mode on the screen display as shown.

Press **SUR** until "SURROUND ON" is displayed in magenta.



The Surround function has now been activated.

**Note:** Normally you can leave the MTS function set to "STEREO" and the Surround function set to "ON". The TV will automatically produce either Surround stereo or monaural, depending on the broadcast type.



# Setting the Off-Timer (Sleep Timer)



### Setting the off-timer

With the off-timer, you can set the TV to turn off automatically after a pre-determined period of time (up to 180 minutes in 10 minutes unit).







# **Locking Channels**


With this function you can lock out specific channels by entering your own 4-digit code. The TV will not be able to tune to those channel for the next 24 hours, unless you enter the code. This TV has 8 memory spaces total, 4 for the TV mode and 4 for CABLE mode.



### Locking out channels





Example: To enter "1234"

Press 1, 2, 3 and 4 in order.



6 Press ADV to lock out the channel. The display at the right will appear on the screen for about 4 seconds.




7 Repeat steps 1 to 6 for other channels. This TV has 8 memory spaces total, 4 for the TV mode and 4 for CABLE mode respectively.

**Note:** If a different code number is used whenever you lock out a channel, the last one has priority over the preceding ones.

8 Select another channel before turning off the TV.


1 Select "CLEAR" following steps 2 to 4 on the previous page.




- 2 Enter the 4-digit code used to lock out the channels with the Number buttons.



# **Programming Your Favorite Channels**

The Favorite Channel Programming feature allows you to program up to 12 of your favorite channels.

Once programmed, you can use the FAV ▼/▲ buttons on the Remote Control to scan through only your favorite channels, skipping other channels you do not normally view.


You can use the CHANNEL ▲/▼ buttons to scan through all the channels you programmed in the TV's memory.



### Programming your favorite channels

1 Select a channel you want to program.

Example: channel 2



- **2** Press **MENU** repeatedly to display the SET UP menu.
- 3 Press ADV repeatedly until "FAVORITE CH" is displayed in magenta.
- SET UP TIMER/GLOCK TV/CABLE CH PROGRAM ADD/EPASE CP LCCK FAVORITE CH
- 4 Press or + to display FAVORITE CH menu.

Each time you press – or +, you are guided between "SET" and "CLEAR".



### Selecting your favorite channels


To select your favorite channels you have programmed, use the **FAV** ▼/▲ buttons on the Remote Control instead of using the CHANNEL ▲/▼ buttons.

Note: The FAV ▼/▲ buttons cannot function if you have not programmed your favorite channels.

### Clearing your favorite channels

1 Select a favorite channel you want to clear.

Example: channel 2



- **3** Press **ADV** repeatedly until "FAVORITE CH" is displayed in magenta.
- Press or + to display FAVORITE CH menu.
  Each time you press or +, you are

guided between "SET" and "CLEAR".

Display "CLEAR" in magenta.

**5** Press **ADV** until the channel number to clear ("2" in this example) changes to "0" on the display.







# **Using Closed-Captioned Function**







### Viewing captions

Closed-captioning is a printed version of the dialogue, narration, and/or sound effects of a TV program.


Captions will appear at either the top or bottom of the screen during captioned broadcasts as shown.

Captioning is especially helpful for hearing impaired individuals.

- 1 Select the desired program.
- Press C.CAPT on the Remote Control to call up the CLOSED CAPTION mode display.


Press **C.CAPT** repeatedly until "CAPTION 1", "CAPTION 2", "CAPTION 3" or "CAPTION 4" is displayed in magenta. Select "CAPTION 1" for a transcription of the primary language in your area. Select "CAPTION 3" for captioning information usually of secondary languages.


"CAPTION 2" or "CAPTION 4" carries Closed Captioning but not necessarily in the same time frame as the sound from the program.



You can also select this feature using the on-screen menu function.

- 1 Press MENU repeatedly to display the OPTION menu.
- 2 Press ADV repeatedly until "CLOSED CAPTION" is displayed in magenta.
- 3 Press or + to select "CAPTION 1", "CAPTION 2", "CAPTION 3" or "CAPTION 4".





### To deactivate this feature

Select "OFF" in the CLOSED CAPTION mode display.

### Note:

A closed-captioned signal may not be decoded in the following situations.


- When a video tape has been dubbed.
- When the signal reception is weak.
- When the signal reception is nonstandard.

### Viewing text

Text is information that is presented using from one half to all of the television screen. It is usually not related to the program. For example, it could be a listing of the closed-captioned programs, news, weather information or stock market reports.

- 1 Select the desired program.
- 2 Press C.CAPT on the Remote Control to call up the CLOSED CAPTION mode display.


Press **C.CAPT** repeatedly until "TEXT 1", "TEXT 2", "TEXT 3" or "TEXT 4" is displayed in magenta.






### You can also select this feature using the on-screen menu function.

- 1 Press MENU repeatedly to display the OPTION menu.
- Press ADV repeatedly until "CLOSED CAPTION" is displayed in magenta.
- 3 Press or + to select "TEXT 1", "TEXT 2", "TEXT 3" or "TEXT 4".





### To deactivate this feature


Select "OFF" in the CLOSED CAPTION mode display.


**Note:** If you select a closed-captioned channel and the "TEXT" mode, the TEXT screen always appears.

However, TEXT characters are not displayed when no signal is aired.

# **Labeling Channels**

This feature allows you to enter a 4 letter channel identifier of your choice that will appear over the channel number display. The labeling can be anything you want (for example the station call letters).







### Programming the channel labels

Select the channel you want to apply labels.


**Example:** To assign "ABCD" to channel 4.



3 Press ADV repeatedly until "CH LABEL" is displayed in magenta.




**4** Press – or + to call up the CH LABEL mode display shown below on the screen.




Letters of the alphabet, numbers and other graphic symbols are available for labeling.

Each time you press the – or + button, the displayed character will change in the following order.



**5** Press – or + repeatedly until the 1st character ("A" in this example) appears in the 1st character space.


**6** Press **ADV** once to enter the 1st character and to advance to the next character space.



- 7 Repeat steps 5 and 6 to enter the 2nd, 3rd and 4th characters ("B", "C", "D" in this example). When the on-screen message at the right appears, the channel label has been stored in the memory.

- **8** Repeat steps 1 through 7 for other channels.

You will be able to apply labels to up to 32 names.

The label will appear when you turn the TV on, select a channel, or press the RECALL button.



## Clearing channel labels

- 1 Select the channel which has the label you want to clear.
- **2-4** Follow steps 2-4 on the previous page to call up the CH LABEL mode display.




# **Activating Noise Reduction/Flesh Tone Functions**




### Reducing picture noise

This function allows you to reduce visible interference in your TV picture. This is useful when receiving a broadcast with a weak signal or playing back a video cassette or disc damaged by repeated use.

- 1 Press MENU repeatedly to display the OPTION menu.
- **2** Press **ADV** repeatedly until "NOISE REDUCTION" is displayed in magenta.



3 Press – or + until "NOISE REDUCTION ON" is displayed in magenta.




To deactivate this function

Select "NOISE REDUCTION OFF".




This function allows you to obtain natural flesh tone by correcting the reference of tint between TV stations.


**1-2** Select "FLESH TONE" following steps 1 and 2 above.



3 Press – or + until "FLESH TONE ON" is displayed in magenta.






# **Changing On-Screen Display Language**

Three different languages (ENGLISH, FRENCH and SPANISH) are available for the on-screen displays (adjustment menus, and messages), and you can choose the desired one.





## Selecting a language

- Press MENU repeatedly to display the OPTION menu.
- Press ADV repeatedly until "LANGUAGE" is displayed in magenta.
- 3 Press or + until your desired language is displayed in magenta.







# Connecting a Standard VCR

Connect VIDEO 1, VIDEO 2 or VIDEO 3 IN jacks on the TV rear panel to the video/audio output jacks of a VCR, Laser disk player, camcorder, etc. for playback of video material.








### Selecting video input source

To operate your TV and video equipment properly, refer to the instructions furnished with the video equipment.

- 1 Turn the TV and VCR ON.
- Press TV/VIDEO on the Remote Control or on the TV to select the appropriate source. ("VIDEO 1" in this example). Each time you press the button, TV, VIDEO 1, VIDEO 2 or VIDEO 3 source will be selected in order.




3 Operate your VCR normally.

### Notes:

- The VIDEO 2 IN jacks can also be used for connecting a second piece of video equipments with video/audio outputs. To view video from equipment connected to the VIDEO 2 IN jacks, select "VIDEO 2".
- The VIDEO 3 IN jacks can also be used for connecting a third piece of video equipments with video/audio outputs.
   To view video from equipment connected to the VIDEO 3 IN jacks, select "VIDEO 3".
- If you connect a monaural VCR, connect the audio output of the VCR to the L/MONO jack of the VIDEO 1/2/3 IN jacks on the TV.

## Connecting a VCR with an S-Video Jack

If you connect a VCR with an S-video jack to the S-VIDEO jack on the back of the TV, you must also connect the audio cables to the AUDIO jacks of the VIDEO 1 IN jacks on the back of the TV. The S-video cable only carries the video signal. Audio signals are separate.



## Selecting video input source

- 1 Turn the TV and VCR ON.
- 2 Press TV/VIDEO to select "VIDEO 1".
- 3 Operate your VCR normally.


### Notes:

- If you connect a monaural VCR, connect the audio output of the VCR to the L/MONO jack of the VIDEO 1 IN jacks on the TV set.
- When the S-video cable is connected to the S-VIDEO IN jack, the video cable (phono-type) should not be connected.
- The S-VIDEO jack accepts SEPARATED Luminance/ Chrominance (Y-C) signals conforming to the NTSC standard.

# **Dubbing/Editing Video Tapes Using 2 VCRs**

To dub or edit your own video tapes between one VCR and another, connect the VCR that will play to the input jacks (VIDEO 1, VIDEO 2 or VIDEO 3) on the TV. Then connect the output jacks from the TV to the input jacks on the recording VCR.

Note: Do not connect one VCR to the output and input jacks on the TV at the same time.



## Monitoring your dubbing/editing

- 1 Turn the TV and both VCR's ON.
- 2 Press TV/VIDEO to select "VIDEO 1".
- 3 Set the recording VCR to record mode and the playback VCR to play.
- 4 You can view the video signal from the playback VCR on the TV screen while dubbing it onto the recording VCR.

### **CAUTION:**


The unauthorized recording of television programs, video tapes and other materials may infringe upon the provisions of the copyright laws.

#### Notes

- The input switch of the VCR is normally in the TV position.
  - Change the switch of the recording VCR to the LINE or CAMERA position when using the video/audio inputs of the VCR as above. Some VCR's automatically switch when the cables are plugged into the video/audio inputs.
- The PIP picture cannot be output through the VIDEO OUT jack.

# **Connecting an Audio Amplifier**

Connect the VARiable AUDIO OUT jacks to the auxiliary input jacks on a stereo amplifier. You can control the audio signal going to the audio level using the Remote Control for this TV.



\* The "fixed level" audio signal present at the AUDIO jacks of VIDEO/AUDIO OUT jacks is also ideal for connecting an audio cassette recorder (or amplifier) to record audio from the TV. This constant audio signal is not affected by pressing the VOLUME buttons on the TV or the TV's Remote Control.


### Preparing for use

- 1 Turn the TV and the stereo amplifier ON.
- Adjust the VOLUME buttons on the TV for a moderate listening level.
- 3 Disconnect the built-in speakers following the instructions at the right.
- 4 Adjust the volume control on the stereo amplifier for a moderate listening level.
- 5 Control of the audio can now be done using the VOLUME and MUTE buttons on the Remote Control of the TV, and using the AUDIO menu items (BASS, TREBLE and BALANCE).

## Turning off the built-in speakers

- 1 Press MENU repeatedly to display the AUDIO menu.
- Press ADV repeatedly until "SPEAKERS" is displayed in magenta.
- Press or + until "SPEAKERS OFF" is displayed in magenta.

The built-in speakers will be turned off.



# **Connecting External Speakers**

You can connect speakers to the EXTernal SPEAKER terminals on the TV set to enhance sound from the TV.

Before connecting the speakers, turn the TV off.





## **Preparing for use**

Connect the speaker cables.

While pressing the clamp, insert the cable core. Then, release the clamp.

Match the right and left channels and +/- polarities of the TV speaker terminals with the external speakers.






2 Set the MAIN SPEAKER switch to "EXT". The built-in TV speakers are switched off.



### **CAUTIONS:**

- Do not connect external speakers to more than one audio source at a time.
   You will damage your equipment if you connect the same speaker system to both the TV and amplifier.
- Use only external speakers with an impedance rating of 8 ohms and input power of 10 W or greater.



## **Cleaning and Care**

WARNING: TV sets use High Voltage. Do not try to remove the cabinet back. Refer servicing to qualified service personnel.

- To clean the TV screen:
  - 1. First remove the plug from the power outlet to avoid possible shock hazard.
  - Use a clean cellulose sponge or chamois cloth dampened with a solution of mild detergent and warm water to clean TV screen and trim. Do not use too much water on the TV screen. Water spills into the cabinet and may cause damage to the TV. Avoid excess water.
  - Remove any extra moisture with the same cloth or a dry one.
- To maintain the finish and appearance of the cabinet, polish it from time to time with a quality furniture polish.

**Caution:** Never use strong solvents such as thinner, benzene or other chemicals on or near cabinet, as they might damage the finish of the cabinet.

#### Limited One (1) Year Warranty

TACP and THI warrant this product and its parts against defects in materials or workmanship for a period of one (1) year after the date of original retail purchase. During this period, TACP and THI will repair a defective product or part, without charge to you. "Authorized TACP/THI service station personnel will come to your home when warranty service is required. Depending on the type of repair required, the service will either be performed in your home or the set will be taken to the authorized TACP/THI service station for repair and returned to your home at no cost to you."

### Limited Two (2) Year Warranty of Picture Tube

TACP and THI further warrant the picture tube in this product against defects in materials or workmanship for a period of two (2) years after the date of original retail purchase. During this period, TACP and THI will replace a defective picture tube without charge to you, except that if a defective picture tube is replaced after one (1) year from the date of the original retail purchase, you pay labor charges involved in the replacement.

### **Owner's Manual and Registration Card**
