

Care and Cleaning

Screen (Turn TV Off)

- Use a mild soap solution or window cleaner with a soft clean cloth. DO NOT USE ABRASIVE CLEANERS.
- Avoid excessive moisture and wipe dry.

Cabinet and Remote Control

- For cabinets and remote control, use a soft cloth dampened with water or a mild detergent solution. Avoid excessive moisture and wipe dry.
- Do not use benzene, thinner or other petroleum based products.

Installation

Television Location

This unit is intended to be used with an optional stand (TY-27SF25M) or entertaintment center. Consult your dealer for available options.

- Avoid excessive sunlight or bright lights, including reflections.
- Keep away from excessive heat or moisture. Inadequate ventilation may cause internal component failure.
- Fluorescent lighting may reduce remote control transmitting range.
- C Keep away from magnetic equipment, including motors, fans and external speakers.

Optional Cable Connections

Shielded audio and video cables should be used between components. For best results:

- Use 75-ohm coaxial shielded cables.
- Use appropriate input and output connectors, that match your component connectors.
- D Avoid long cables to minimize interference.

AC Power Supply Cord

CAUTION: TO PREVENT ELECTRIC SHOCK, MATCH WIDE BLADE OF PLUG TO WIDE SLOT OF AC OUTLET AND FULLY INSERT. DO NOT USE A PLUG WITH A RECEPTACLE OR OTHER OUTLET UNLESS THE BLADE CAN BE FULLY INSERTED TO PREVENT BLADE EXPOSURE. FOR SOME MODELS THAT ARE NON-POLARIZED, THE USE OF AN AC ADAPTOR CONNECTOR MAY BE NECESSARY.



Cable / Antenna

For proper reception, either a cable or antenna connection is required.


Cable Connection

Connect the cable supplied by your local cable company.

Note: A cable converter box may be required for proper reception. Check with your local cable company for compatibility requirements.

Antenna Connections

- For proper reception of VHF/UHF channels, an external antenna is required. For best reception an outdoor antenna is recommended.
- Antenna Mode must be set to TV.



Incoming Cable from Home Antenna


75 Ohm VHF/UHF on back of TV

INSTALLATION Optional Equipment Connections

VCR's, DVD players, video game consoles, and DSS equipment can also be connected to the video inputs. See the optional equipment manual for details.



Note: The remote control must be programmed with supplied codes to operate the VCR. See Programming the Remote Control in the **Remote Control Quick Reference Guide**.

Procedure

- 1. Connect equipment to rear Audio/Video input jacks, as shown.
- 2. Select the corresponding video input by pressing TV/VIDEO button.
- 3. Operate optional equipment as instructed in equipment manual.
 - **Note:** The S-VIDEO connection provides higher quality picture. It overrides other VIDEO connections. Use INPUT 1 AUDIO R and L with S-VIDEO connection.

Amplifier Connection (TO AUDIO AMP)

Connect to an external audio amplifier input for listening through a stereo system.

Note: TO AUDIO AMP terminals cannot be connected directly to external speakers.

Audio Adjustments


- 1. Select SPEAKERS ON located in the onscreen AUDIO menu.
- 2. Set amplifier volume to minimum.
- 3. Adjust TV volume to desired level.
- 4. Adjust amplifier volume to match the TV.
- 5. Select SPEAKERS OFF & VAO (Variable Audio Out) from AUDIO menu.
- 6. Volume, mute, bass, treble and balance are now controlled through the television.
 - **Note:** Select SPEAKERS OFF & FIXED AUDIO OUT to control audio functions through the external amplifier.

Picture In Picture (PIP) Operation

With a VCR and Cable Box

This television includes a Picture In Picture (PIP) feature. A second video source (VCR, Camcorder, etc.) is required to provide a second picture.

Connect your television to a VCR and Cable Box, as shown.

Note: The Remote Control must be programmed with supplied codes to operate the VCR and Cable Box. See Programming the Remote Control in the **Remote Control Quick Reference Guide**.


Procedure

Press the **PIP** button on the Remote Control to display the PIP frame.

Note: The PIP picture is the same as the main picture, initially.


To view a different picture in the PIP frame:

- 1. Press the **TV/VIDEO** button on the Remote Control to select the video PIP source.
- 2. Verify the CABLE BOX and VCR are turned on and the VCR tuned to Channel 3 or 4, depending on the VCR.
- 3. Choose channels for the *PIP* frame by pressing the **CBL** button on the Remote Control and using the numeric keypad or **CH** up/down buttons.
- 4. Choose channels for the *Main Picture* by pressing the **TV** button on the Remote Control and using the numeric keypad or **CH** up/down buttons.



<u>PICTURE IN PICTURE (PIP) OPERATION</u> With a VCR - No Cable Box

This television includes a Picture In Picture (PIP) feature. A second video source (VCR) is required to provide a second picture.



Connect your television to a VCR, as shown.

Note: The Remote Control must be programmed with the supplied codes to operate the VCR. See Programming the Remote Control in the Remote Control Quick Reference Guide.


Procedure

Turn the VCR off and tune the TV to Channel 3 or 4, depending on the VCR.

Press the **PIP** button on the Remote Control to display the PIP frame on screen.


Note: The PIP picture is the same as the Main picture, initially.

- Press the TV/VIDEO button on the Remote Control to select the VIDEO PIP source.
- 2. Press the VCR button on the Remote Control and turn the VCR on.
- 3. Press the TV/VCR button on the Remote Control.
- Choose channels for *PIP* frame by pressing VCR CHANNEL up/down buttons on the Remote Control.
- 5. Choose channels for the *Main Picture* by pressing the **TV** button on the Remote Control and using the numeric keypad or **CH** up/down buttons.



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Roller Guide Menu



Basic Navigation

Procedure

- Press the ACTION button in the middle of the large blue button on the remote control to display the Roller Guide Menu.
 - **Note:** Be careful to press the **ACTION** button in the middle of the button. If you do not press in the middle of the button, the channel or volume keys may be activated.
- D Press the CH up/down buttons to rotate the Roller Guide.
- Press the left VOL button to exit the Roller Guide Menu.

Navigation in the Roller Guide

Procedure

- Press the **ACTION** button to select main menu items.
- D Press the CH up/down buttons to highlight submenus
- Press the **VOL** buttons to select and adjust features.
- D Press the **ACTION** button to return to submenus.



Special Features

Menu Languages


In SET UP Menu, select IDIOMA / LANGUE to change menu language to ENGLISH, ESPAÑOL (Spanish), or FRANÇAIS (French).



Prog Chan (Program Channels)

In SET UP menu under PROG CHAN select:

- MODE to select TV (antenna) or CABLE mode depending on the signal source.
- AUTO PROGRAM to automatically program all channels with a signal.
- MANUAL PROGRAM to manually add or delete channels.



SPECIAL FEATURES

CC (Closed Captioning)

This television contains a built-in decoder that displays <u>CC</u> (Closed Captioned) text across the screen (white or colored letters on black background). It allows the viewer to read the dialogue of a television program or other information. The program viewed must include Close Captioning for the feature to work.

CC Mode

Procedure

- □ In SET UP Menu, select CC (Closed Caption):
- □ Select CC MODE.
- Select OFF, C1, C2, T1, T2, C3, C4, T3 or T4:
 - OFF When Closed Caption is not desired.
 - C1 For video related information to be displayed, up to 4 lines onscreen at a time. (It does not block relevant parts of the picture). Text may be in any language.
 - C2 to C4 For other modes of video related information.
 - T1 For program guide and other information to be displayed, when available. (Blocks a large portion of the picture on the television screen).
 - T2 to T4 For other modes of information. (Blocks a large portion of the picture on the television screen).
- Press ACTION to return to submenu options, and exit menus.

CC On Mute


Activates the onscreen Closed Caption feature when the MUTE button on the remote control is pressed.

Note: This feature only functions when the Closed Caption Mode is OFF. The program being viewed must be broadcast with Closed Captioning, (Refer to your local TV guide).

Procedure

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
- □ In SET UP Menu, select CC (Closed Caption):
- Select CC ON MUTE:
- Select NO, C1, C2, C3, or C4.
- Recommended set up for Closed Caption when using the MUTE button:
 - CC ON MUTE: C1
 - CC MODE: OFF
- Press **ACTION** to return to submenu options, and exit menus.
- Press the MUTE button to activate the Closed Caption feature.
- Press the **MUTE** button again to deactivate the feature.



TIMER

Sleep


In TIMER menu, select SLEEP to turn TV off in 30, 60 or 90 minutes. Select NO to turn off time.



Timer 1 and Timer 2

In TIMER menu, select one or both timers to turn the television on and off at selected times, on selected channels, and on selected days.

Note: TIME must be entered in CLOCK SET to operate TIMER features.




The TIMER is active when the TV is OFF or ON. The TV will switch to the selected channel at the selected time set in the TIMER.

Other Adjustments

In Picture menu under OTHER ADJ. select:

- COLOR TEMP to increase and decrease WARM (red) and COOL (blue) colors to suit personal preferences.
- AUTO COLOR to maintain consistent color and tint.



Favorites

In CHANNELS menu under FAVORITES select:


- CHANNEL SCAN FAV to enter up to 15 favorite channels.
- CHANNEL SCAN ALL to scan all channels when using the CH up/down buttons.



Caption

In CHANNELS menu under CAPTION select:

- PRESET CAPTION to enter channel numbers for popular TV stations.
- MANUAL CAPTION to enter numbers and captions manually.
- INPUT LABEL to label video input connections for onscreen display.



LOCK

MODE

To use LOCK options:

ENTER CODE FIRST - Use the numeric keypad to enter a four-digit secret code. After entering your secret code for the first time, the onscreen display will change to CHANGE CODE.

Note: Use a code that is easy to remember or record it in a safe place. In MODE submenu select:

LOCK SET to choose:


- OFF To turn lock function off.
- ALL To lock all channels and video inputs.
- CHANNEL To lock up to four channels of your choice.
- GAME To lock channels 3, 4 and video inputs.
- □ MOTION PICT[★] To use Motion Picture Ratings.
- □ TV PARENTAL[★] To use TV Parental Guide Ratings.
- CHANGE CODE Use numeric keypad to change your four-digit secret code.

Note: If in CHANGE CODE you enter a different code from the one used previously, the new code becomes the controlling code.

Press the **ACTION** button to return to submenu, then select HOW LONG to choose the period of time you want your option to be locked (12, 24, 48 hours or ALWAYS).

Note: Be cautious when selecting ALWAYS. If ALWAYS is selected, and you forget your secret code, the television must be serviced by a qualified technician in order to clear the LOCK setup.

Press the **ACTION** button to return to submenu, and to exit menus.



Note: If GAME, CHANNEL or ALL is selected, and if a blocked channel or video input is selected, the message PG (Parent Guard) displays in the upper right corner of the television screen.

Unlock LOCK SET by reentering the same four-digit secret code and selecting OFF.
