

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS - Read before operating equipment

This product was designed and manufactured to meet strict quality and safety standards. There are, however, some installation and operation precautions which you should be particularly aware of.

- 1. Read Instructions All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the appliance is operated.
- Retain Instructions The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.
- 3. Heed Warnings All warnings on the appliance and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.
- 4. Follow Instructions All operating and use instructions should be followed.
- Water and Moisture The appliance should not be used near water - for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, laundry tub, in a wet basement or near a swimming pool, etc.
- Carts and Stands The appliance should be used only with a cart or stand that is recommended by the manufacturer.



An appliance and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the appliance and cart combination to overturn.

- 68. Tilt/Stability All televisions must comply with recommended international global safety standards for tilt and stability properties of its cabinet design.

- Wall or Ceiling Mounting The appliance should be mounted to a wall or ceiling only as recommended by the manufacturer.

Section 810 of the National Electric Code, ANSI/NFPA No. 70-1984, provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mats and supporting structure grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding connectors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes and requirements for the grounding electrode. - 15. Non-use Periods The power cord of the appliance should be unplugged from the outlet when left unused for a long period of time.
- Object and Liquid Entry Care should be taken so that objects do not fall and liquids are not spilled into the enclosure through openings.
- 17. Damage Requiring Service The appliance should be serviced by qualified service personnel when:
 - A. The power supply cord or the plug has been damaged; or
 - B. Objects have fallen, or liquid has been spilled into the appliance; or
 - C. The appliance has been exposed to rain; or
 - D. The appliance does not appear to operate normally or exhibits a marked change in performance; or
 - E. The appliance has been dropped, or the enclosure damaged.
- Servicing The user should not attempt to service the appliance beyond that described in the operating instructions. All other servicing should be referred to qualified service personnel.

Note to the CATV system installer: This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.




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

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Features



First Time Set Up - automatically sets the TV for local channels and the correct picture signal (antenna or cable). See your Set-up and Quick Use Guide for details.

Infrared Remote Control - operates your TV set and a variety of wireless remote control VCRs, Cable TV Converters, and other accessory equipment.

Standard TV broadcast (VHF/UHF) or Cable TV (CATV) channel capability.

Closed Captioning - allows the viewer to read TV program dialogue or voice conversations as on-screen text.

Automatic Programming of channels - for quick and easy selection of favorite stations available in your area.

Picture-In-Picture (PIP) - can show a TV program and the direct video output from an accessory (VCR, etc.) onto the TV screen at the same time.

Stereo TV - with a built-in audio amplifier and a twin speaker system, reception of TV programs in both broadcast stereo sound or (SAP) bilingual broadcast are available.

On-Screen Features - display helpful information for the setting of TV controls (such as help messages, operating tips and glossary).

Parental Controls - for "censoring" or blocking out channels to keep children from watching undesirable programming.

Audio/Video Jacks - for direct connections with VCRs (and other accessories) for quality TV picture and sound playback.Component video Input connectors are also available for high fidelity color and picture resolution when using digital video source material, such as DVD.

Surround Sound -this TV set contains external audio speaker connections for a more dynamic sound effect.

Sleep-Timer - automatically turns the TV OFF at preset time intervals.

Smart Button - for the control of TV Sound and Picture levels. Use the Smart Button on the remote to quickly adjust Smart Sound (to set TV Volume levels during program changes or commercial breaks); Smart Picture (for programmed video level adjustments on a variety of program sources); and Smart Surf (for quick one button channel selection of up to 10 of your favorite channels). **Digital Ready -** Projection Television capable of connecting to both the current analog television signals of today as well as interfacing with new upcoming digital source playback products and devices. This TV includes multiple signal connectors (Component Video, S-Video, Composite Video) which give you a variety of equipment playback options for digital set top boxes, satellite receivers, cable boxes, and other digital devices.

While there may exist some digital devices with connections not available on this television, you should be adequately prepared for the vast majority of products coming onto the digital consumer electronics' market. Note: You should always use the connection output on digital devices that gives the highest level of picture quality possible. As listed above the Component Video (or Y PB PR) input delivers the best color and picture reproduction; followed by S-Video; and then Composite Video. In addition to the above listed inputs, your television also includes the standard 750hm cable signal connector for use with antennas or analog cable boxes.

End-of-Life disposal




Your product also uses batteries which should not be thrown away when depleted, but should be handed in and disposed of as small chemical waste.

Please find out about the local regulations on how to dispose of your old television, batteries, and packaging materials whenever you replace existing equipment.



RED/BLUE CONVERGENCE

Convergence is the correct lining up of the red and blue light paths on the TV screen. NOTE: If no color fringing (see Smart Help) shows, then no Convergence adjustments are necessary for your TV.

(BEGIN)

1 Select CONVERGENCE control.

With PICTURE MENU (2 of 2) on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU () buttons. Then press the MENU (M) button.

2 If there is RED or BLUE color fringing on the White cross, press the MENU button to continue.

Press the MENU buttons to move the red or blue cross directly over the white cross on the TV screen.


> The red or blue cross is properly adjusted when it is completely merged with the white cross. (No color appears around the edge of the white cross).

Press the STATUS button to clear the screen when convergence adjustments are complete.




SMART HELP

Remember. Convergence has been set at the factory for best viewing, but if one or more of the (red or blue) colors appear around the edges of objects (color fringing) follow the steps given in this section.

CLOSED CAPTION

Closed Captioning (CC) allows you to read the voice content of television programs on the TV screen. Designed to help the hearing impaired this feature uses on-screen "text boxes" to show dialogue and conversations while the TV program is in progress.

(BEGIN)

Select CLOSED CAPTIONING control.

With the FEATURES MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU () buttons. Then press the MENU (M) button.

2> Press the MENU ▲▼ buttons to move the RED highlight. Press the MENU button to select () the desired Closed Caption mode - For Example: "ALWAYS ON" and "CAPTION 1".

> CAPTION 1, 2, 3, 4: dialogue (and descriptions) for the action on the captioned TV program shows on-screen. (See Important Note on this page.)


TEXT 1, 2, 3, 4: often used for channel guide, schedules, or bulletin board information for CC programs.

After making your Caption mode selection, press the STATUS button to clear the TV screen. The selected Closed Caption mode will be active.

To cancel, set the Closed Captioned feature to OFF when finished view-ing.

SMART HELP

Remember. Broadcast stations will often use spelling abbreviations, symbols, dropouts and other grammatical shortcuts in order to keep pace with the on-screen action. These type factors vary upon the source of the captioned text material and do not indicate a need for service on the part of the TV. **NOTE:** Not all TV programs and product commercials are made for broadcast with Closed Caption (CC) information included. Neither are all Closed Caption modes (CAPTION 1-4; or TEXT 1-4) necessarily being used by a broadcast station during the transmission of a closed caption program. Usually "CAPTION 1" is the most used mode to view captioned material. Refer to your area's TV program listings for the stations and times of Closed Caption shows.



CABLE TUNING

NOTE: If you went through First Time Setup (in your Quick Use Guide), this task has already been completed for you. You need to make sure the TV is set to pick up either Cable TV or Antenna signals. In other words, the TV needs to know if you connected a Cable TV signal or a normal antenna to its ANTENNA plug.

(BEGIN)

Select CABLE CHANNEL TUNING control.

> With the FEATURES MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU () buttons. Then press the MENU (M) button.

PARENTAL CONTROL SETUP CODE NUMBER

Parental Control allows parents to block out, or "censor", any channels they think children should not watch. A channel placed under Parental Control cannot be viewed until a correct access code is used to unlock the channel for viewing.

First let's set your Parental Code:

Select the PARENTAL CON-TROL.

With FEATURES MENU (3 of 5) on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (buttons. Then press the MENU (M) button.

2 Press the MENU $\blacktriangle ullet$ and

MENU (M) buttons to highlight and select the SETUP CODE item.

(3) Press 0, 7, 1, 1 on the remote.

"XXXX" shows on the ACCESS CODE SETUP screen as you press the number buttons.

"INCORRECT ACCESS CODE -TRY AGAIN" will also show on the screen.

Press 0, 7, 1, 1 on the remote again.

"Next Enter Your New Access Code" shows on the screen.



SMART HELP

Note to Parents - it isn't possible to unlock or defeat your Censor Access Code without changing to a new code number. So if your Code number changes, and you didn't change it yourself, then you will know that someone has altered the code and the blanked out channel has been viewed. NOTE: Your TV left the factory with the Parental Code set to "0000". If you are using your TV and the Parental Control for the first time, and don't want to SETUP a new Access code number, you can use the "0000" number to block channels - see next page. The "0711" Parental Code (shown on this page) is given as a default or way to reset the Code when the current Access number is not known.



PARENTAL CONTROL CONTENT ADVISORY

nother new area available to A parents for the censoring of program material is through the TV Guidelines and Movie Ratings system. Program Content Advisory data will soon be contained within the broadcast signals of received TV programs. When setup by the parent or viewer, the TV can respond to transmitted advisory data by blocking out or denying access to TV shows (based on whether the program meets or exceeds the limitations you select as viewable). The TV program can then only be viewed by entering the correct and current Parental Code Access number.

The Content Advisory system uses both "Movie Ratings" and a "Parental Guidelines" form of censoring. Refer to the following page sections for explanations on the different Rating system levels and their uses.

Select the CONTENT ADVI-SORY Menu option

With PARENTAL CONTROL Menu on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU () buttons. Then press the MENU (M) button.

A Parental Guideline/Movie Rating status screen will appear with a review of currently BLOCKED Content Advisory categories.

2> Press the MENU ► button to select the ENTER ACCESS CODE Menu item.



"CONTENT ADVISORY" Menu screen appears. Parental Guidelines, Movie Ratings and other blocking control items are ready for selection and use.

Note: Please remember that a valid and current Access Code number will be required in the setup and use of the TV's "Content Advisory" system. Review the previous **SETUP CODE** section on how to obtain a valid Parental Access Code number before attempting to make adjustments within the Movie Ratings and Parental Guidelines system.



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CONTENT ADVISORY MOVIE RATINGS

Movie Ratings set viewing access levels for TV programming according to current Motion Picture Association of America (MPAA) ratings. These ratings are similar to the categories used with the rated movies appearing in cinema theaters and with video rental material.

BEGIN D Select the MOVIE RATINGS Menu option. Menu option.

With CONTENT ADVISORY Menu on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU () buttons. Then press the MENU (M) button.


Press the MENU ▲▼ and MENU (M) buttons to highlight and select (𝒴) the desired MOVIE BLOCKING level.

When in operation a "Blocked -Movie Rating" TV screen appears when movies are received which include the same selected rating as the Movie Blocking setting(s). Only the correct Access Code number, entered by the viewer, will unblock or allow the viewing of a block rated program.



SMART HELP

Note: When a Movie Rating is selected () all higher level ratings are automatically blocked (although each individual Movie Rating can be manually selected and turned On or Off as desired). Programs with lower than the selected rating level are allowed for viewing or unblocked.



G - General Audience: Most parents would find this program suitable for all ages. This type of programming contains little or no violence, no strong language, and little or no sexual dialogue or situations.

HELP

- **PG Parental Guidance:** This programming contains material that parents may find unsuitable for younger children. It may contain one or more of the following: Moderate violence, some sexual situations, infrequent coarse language, or some suggestive dialogue.
- **PG-13**: This programming contains material that parents may find unsuitable for children under the age of 13. It contains one or more of the following: violence, sexual situations, coarse language, or suggestive dialogue.
- **R Restricted:** This programming is specifically designed for adults. Anyone under the age of 17 should only view this programming with an accompanying parent or adult guardian. It contains one or more of the following: intense violence, intense sexual situations, strong coarse language, or intensely suggestive dialogue.
- NC-17 No one under 17 admitted: This type of programming should be viewed by adults only. It contains graphic violence, explicit sex, or crude indecent language.
- X Mature audience only: This type of programming contains one or more of the following: very graphic violence, very graphic and explicit or indecent sexual acts, very coarse and intensely suggestive language.

CONTENT ADVISORY PARENTAL GUIDELINES

Parental Guidelines can be even more defined and specific in the degree and extent of material parents may allow for TV program viewing. Sub-settings for Language, Violence, and other blocking factors can be manually switched On or Off for use within the major Parental Guideline categories (TV-Y7, TV-PG, etc.).

(BEGIN)

Select the PARENTAL GUIDELINES Menu option.

With CONTENT ADVISORY Menu on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU buttons. Then press the MENU (M) button.

Press the MENU ◀ ► to highlight and select the desired PARENTAL GUIDELINE rating level (TV-Y, TV-Y7, etc.).


SPress the MENU ▲▼ and MENU (M) buttons to Block () the selected Parental Guideline category (or to set other individual blocking feature items available within that Guideline category (L, V. S, D, etc.) as desired).

Note: Selecting "ALWAYS BLOCKED" (or individually adjusting the L, V, S, D settings) for any one rating will set all other higher level ratings to be automatically blocked as well.



SMART HELP

The TV-Y7; TV-PG; TV-14; and TV-MA guidelines also include customized settings for various additional items such as V (violence), S (sexual situations), L (coarse language), D (suggestive dialogue), and FV (fantasy violence). These additional settings are category specific and can be individually selected for use as desired.



CONTENT ADVISORY BLOCKING OPTIONS

The Content Advisory system also has "Blocking Option" controls which can be used to deny viewing access for channel programs and movies even when they are "unrated", or contain "no rating" information as broadcasted.


SECOND AUDIO PROGRAM

Second Audio Program (SAP) is part of the stereo broadcast system. Sent as a third audio channel SAP can be heard apart from the current TV program sound. TV stations are free to use SAP for any number of purposes, but many experts believe it will be used for foreign language translations of TV shows (or for weather and news bulletins.)

NOTE: If a SAP signal is not present with a selected program, the SAP option can not be selected. "This program does not contain SAP information" will show on the TV screen.





USING THE AUDIO/VIDEO INPUT JACKS

AUX 1 VIDEO INPUTS

The TV's Audio/Video Input jacks are for direct picture and sound connections between the TV and a VCR (or Video Disc Player, etc.) that has Audio/Video Output jacks.

To view the playback of a VCR tape by using the Audio/Video Input jacks on the TV:

(BEGIN)

Connect the VIDEO OUT jack from the VCR to the AUX 1 VIDEO IN jack on the TV.

2 Connect the AUDIO OUT jacks R(ight) and L(eft) from the VCR to the AUX 1 AUDIO IN jacks on the TV.

3> Select the "AUX 1 VIDEO" PICTURE SOURCE SELECT control on the TV.

With the FEATURES MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (M) () buttons. Then press the MENU button.

Press the MENU ▲▼ and MENU (M) buttons to highlight and select (𝒴) the AUX 1 VIDEO mode.


5 Turn the VCR ON and press PLAY to view the tape on the TV.



SMART HELP

Remember, after it is connected an easy way to select the AUX 1 VIDEO mode is to press the TV/VCR button on the remote. AUX 2 VIDEO; AUX 1 Y PB PR; and the last channel viewed can also be selected in this way.

Also, if you have added AUX 1 VIDEO to the TV's channel memory (see page 13), you can just press the CHANNEL ▲▼ buttons to select the AUX 1 mode.



USING THE AUDIO/VIDEO INPUT JACKS (CONTINUED)

AUX1 - S-VIDEO INPUTS

The S(uper)-Video connection on the rear of the TV can give you better picture detail and clarity, for the playback of S-VHS VCR tapes or Video Discs, than the normal antenna picture connections.

Note: The VCR (or Video Disc Player) must have a S-VIDEO OUT(put) jack in order for you to complete the connections shown on this page.

(BEGIN)

Connect the S-VIDEO (S-VHS) OUT jack from the VCR to the S-VIDEO AUX 1 IN(put) jack on the TV.

The S-VIDEO connecting cable will be supplied with the S-VHS VCR (or Video Disc Player).

Connect the AUDIO OUT jacks R(ight) and L(eft) from the VCR to the AUDIO AUX 1 IN(put) jacks on the TV.

Select the "AUX 1 S-VIDEO" PICTURE SOURCE control.

With the FEATURES MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (M) (•) buttons. Then press the MENU button.

The "AUX 1 S VIDEO" picture source option appears only when a S-VIDEO cable has been connected to the TV's AUX 1 IN(puts).


Turn the VCR ON and place it in the S-VIDEO (or S-VHS) playback mode. Insert S-VHS cassette tape and playback in a normal manner.

Remember, after it is connected an easy way to select the AUX 1 S-VIDEO mode is to press the TV/VCR button on the remote.)

Also, if you have added AUX 1 to the TV's channel memory, you can just press the CHANNEL $\blacktriangle \lor$ buttons to select the S-VIDEO mode (when active).



USING THE AUDIO/VIDEO INPUT JACKS (CONTINUED)

COMPONENT VIDEO INPUTS

Component Video Inputs provide for the highest possible color and picture resolution in the playback of digital signal source material such as with DVD players. The color difference signals (PB, PR) and the luminance (Y) signal are connected and received separately which permits for improved color bandwidth information (not possible when using composite video or S-Video connections).

(BEGIN)

Connect the Component (Y PB
 PR) VIDEO OUT jacks from the
 DVD player to the (Y PB PR)
 VIDEO IN(put) jacks on the TV.

2 Connect the AUDIO OUT

jacks R(ight) and L(eft) from the DVD player to the AUX 1 AUDIO IN jacks on the TV.

3> Select the "AUX 1 Y PB PR" PICTURE SOURCE control on the TV.

With the FEATURES MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (M) (buttons. Then press the MENU button.

4 Press the MENU $\blacksquare \forall$ and


MENU (M) buttons to highlight and select (ν) the AUX 1 Y PB PR mode.

5 Turn the DVD player ON and press PLAY to view the source material playback on the TV.



SMART HELP

The description for the component video connectors may differ depending on the DVD player or accessory digital source equipment used (e.g. Y PB PR; R-Y/B-Y/Y; Cr/Cb/Y, etc.). Although abbreviations and terms may vary, the letters "B" and "R" stand for the blue and red color component signal connectors and "Y" indicates the luminance signal. Refer to your DVD or digital accessory Owner's Manual for definitions and connection details.



AUDIO/VIDEO OUTPUTS

The Audio/Video Output jacks on the TV can be used to record TV programs on VCRs which have Audio/Video Input jacks.

To record TV programs by using the Audio/Video jacks on the TV:

(BEGIN)

- Connect the VIDEO OUT jack from the TV to the VIDEO IN jack on the VCR.
- Connect the AUDIO OUT jacks R(ight) and L(eft) from the TV to the AUDIO IN jacks on the VCR.
- Select the "ANTENNA" PIC-TURE SOURCE control on the TV.

With the FEATURES MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU () buttons. Then press the MENU (M) button.

Select the channel on the TV that you want to record.


4 Turn the VCR ON. Put a cassette tape in the unit and place the VCR in the RECORD mode.



SMART HELP

Remember, if the VCR has an INPUT SELECTOR switch, place it in the LINE or CAMERA position.

Unattended Timer Recordings with a VCR are possible, but not recommended with this connection since the TV must be left ON for the VCR to record.





REMOTE CONTROL OPERATION

SMART PICTURE

Degardless of what type of pro- $\mathbf{\Lambda}$ gram your watching, your TV has automatic video control settings matched for your current program source or content. The Smart Picture feature quickly resets your TV's video controls for a number of different types of programs and viewing conditions you may have in your home.

(BEGIN)


1> Press the Smart button on the remote.

2 Press the Menu (M) button to select the Smart Picture feature (highlighted in red).

3> Press the Menu (M) ▲ or ▼ but-

tons to choose any of the preset viewing categories (Example: Sports, Movies, etc.). Then press the Menu (M) button to select the highlighted control.

<4> Press STATUS button on the remote control to clear the screen.



SMART HELP

Remember. with the Smart Picture "CUSTOM" mode selected you can set a number of video controls to your own preference. Use the remote's SMART button to reselect these personally adjusted Custom settings contained within the Smart Picture feature.

The video control settings for the Smart Picture categories (except CUS-TOM) are memorized into the TV at the factory and can only be reset by field and service technicians.

SMART SOUND



re you tired of the sound of A commercials following you throughout the house? Smart Sound allows you to preset a desired volume level that the TV sound will not go above. This makes for an even, more consistent sound by reducing the "peaks" and "valleys" that can occur during commercials. (BEGIN) **Press the Smart button** on the remote. 2> With the SMART Menu on screen, move the RED highlight with the Menu (•) buttons. Then press the MENU (M) button to select the highlighted Smart Sound control. 3 Press the Menu \blacktriangle or \triangledown and

then the Menu (M) button to turn the Smart Sound control ON (or OFF.)

4 Press the STATUS button to clear the screen when completed.






Smart Sound works for sound levels coming from either the Antenna/Cable input on the rear of the TV (RF audio); or the Auxiliary (VCR/AUX IN) audio inputs. When using a Cable Converter Box with the Smart Sound Control ON, the TV's volume level may take up to ten seconds to gradually increase to normal listening levels (when the TV's first turned on). This is considered NOR-MAL with various Cable Converter Box use.







SETTING THE TV REMOTE TO WORK ACCESSORY DEVICES

SETTING THE REMOTE TO WORK OTHER DEVICES - SEARCH

SEARCH METHOD

 $V^{our \, TV \, remote \, can \, be \, set \, to}$ work various accessory devices (VCRs, Cable Converters, Satellite Receivers) by what is called the SEARCH method. Note: The Search Method only works with devices equipped with Channel Display Indicators or capability. If the "Direct Access" code number method (shown in the previous section) did not set your remote to work your accessory device, then follow the easy steps listed below.

(BEGIN)

 $< 1^{}$ > Turn ON the desired device. Press the correct VCR or ACC system button on the remote.

<2> Stand at least six feet away from the front of the accessory device. Point the remote toward the unit. HOLD DOWN the SURF and the desired System (VCR or ACC) buttons at the same time. KEEP HOLDING BUTTONS DOWN.

3 Watch the Channel Indicator on the unit. Channel Numbers will SCAN UP when the unit has been identified. This may take up to two minutes.

4 Release the SURF and System (VCR or ACC) buttons as soon as channel numbers start to scan up. The code has been identified and the remote is ready to operate with the accessory device.




SMART HELP

Remember, a minute or two can seem very long, but the code should be located within two minutes.

Don't let the accessory device scan up more than five channels. The remote may pass up the right code and another two minute search cycle will have to be repeated.

If no channel change happens within two minutes, repeat steps 1-4. Should a channel change still not occur, the remote will not work with the desired unit.





To see how channels selected on a VCR can be shown as PIP:

(BEGIN)

Connect the VIDEO OUT jack on the VCR to the AUX I VIDEO IN jack (yellow) on the TV.

Also connect the AUDIO OUT (R and L) jacks from the VCR to the AUX 1 AUDIO IN jacks (red and white) on the TV.


Also be sure the normal antenna connection between the VCR and TV are in place.

TV HELP MENU



Please make these simple checks before calling for ser- vice. These tips can save you time and money since charges for TV installation and adjustment of customer controls are not cov- ered under your warranty.	CAUTION: A video source (such as a video game, Compact Disc Interactive - CDI, or TV information channel) which shows a constant non-moving pattern on the TV screen, can cause picture tube damage. When your TV is continuously used with such a source the pattern of the non-moving portion of the game (CDI, etc.) could leave an image per- manently on the picture tube. When not in use, turn the video source OFF. Regularly alternate the use of such video sources with normal TV viewing.
<u>No Power</u>	 Check the TV power cord. Unplug the TV, wait 1 minute, then reinsert plug into outlet and push POWER button again. Check to be sure outlet is not on a wall switch.
<u>No Picture</u>	 Check antenna connections on the rear of the TV. Are they properly secured to the antenna plug on the TV? Check the CABLE TUNING control for correct position. Check PICTURE SOURCE control for correct position ANTENNA; AUX 1/AUX2 VIDEO; or AUX Y PB PR position without a signal source connection will result in a blank screen. Check the CLOSED CAPTIONS control. Some TEXT modes could block the screen.
<u>No Sound</u>	 Check the VOLUME buttons. Check the MUTE button on the remote control. Check the TV SPEAKER ON/OFF control for the correct position. If attempting auxiliary equipment hook-ups, check audio jack connections and that the auxiliary equipment is on and in the proper operating modes.
<u>Remote Does Not</u> <u>Work</u>	 Check VCR-ACC-TV "System" buttons on the remote. Press the remote's <u>TV</u> System button to send commands to the TV; <u>VCR</u> System to send to VCR; etc. Check batteries. Replace with AA Heavy Duty (Zinc Chloride) or Alkaline batteries if necessary. Clean the remote and the remote sensor window on the TV.
<u>TV Displays Wrong</u> <u>Channel or No</u> <u>Channels Above 13</u>	 Repeat channel selection. Add desired channel numbers (ADD/DELETE CHANNELS control) into TV memory. Check CABLE TUNING control for correct position.

This TV is equipped with protective circuitry that shuts the TV off in case of moderate power surges. Should this occur turn the TV back on by pressing the POWER button once or twice, or unplug and then replug the power cord at the AC outlet. This feature is NOT designed to prevent damage due to high power surges such as those caused by lightning, which is not covered by your warranty.

Cleaning and Care

- To avoid possible shock hazard be sure the TV is unplugged from the electrical outlet before cleaning.
- When cleaning the TV screen take care not to scratch or damage the screen surface (avoid wearing jewelry or using anything abrasive- do not use household cleaners). Wipe the front screen with a clean cloth dampened with water. Use even, easy, vertical strokes when cleaning.
- Specially designed screen cleaning kits are also available which contain anti-static cleaners and cloths designed to get into the ridges of the TV screen. If interested, ask your dealer about an optional Projection TV Screen Cleaning Kit or call our toll-free Accessory Parts ordering number 1-800-851-8885.
- Gently wipe the cabinet surfaces with a clean cloth or sponge dampened in a solution of cool clear water and a mild soap or detergent. Use a clean dry cloth to dry the wiped surfaces.
- · Occasionally vacuum the ventilation holes or slots in the cabinet back.
- Never use thinners, insecticide sprays, or other chemicals on or near the cabinet, as they might cause permanent marring of the cabinet finish.

GLOSSARY TO TELEVISION TERMS

Audio/Video Inputs * Located on the rear of the TV these connectors (RCA phono type plug) are used for the input of audio and video signals. Designed for use with VCRs (or other accessories) in order to receive higher picture resolution and offer sound connection options.

Coaxial Cable * A single solid antenna wire normally matched with a metal plug (F-type) end connector that screws (or pushes) directly onto a 75 Ohm input found on the Television or VCR.

Display * An on screen message or graphics that help the user operate and adjust TV feature controls. See On Screen Displays (OSD).

Identify* Method by which a remote control searches and finds an operating code for another product (such as a VCR or Cable Converter). Once the code has been "identified" then the TV remote can operate and send commands to the other product.

LED * Light Emitting Diode or indicator.

Menu * An on-screen listing of feature controls shown on the TV screen that are made available for user adjustments.

Multichannel Television Sound (MTS) * The broadcast standard that allows for stereo sound to be transmitted with the TV picture.

On Screen Displays (OSD) * Refers to the wording or messages generated by the TV to help the user with specific feature controls (color adjustment, programming, etc.).

Picture -In-Picture (PIP) * Term used when two pictures are shown on the TV screen at the same time. The smaller PIP picture is supplied by a VCR (or other tuner/video playback source). The PIP picture can also be moved and swapped with the TV's main screen picture.

Pre-Amplifier * The control center of a hi-fi system. Not only amplifies source inputs, but also allows for source selection, volume, tone, balance and all other controls that affect the sound.

Programming * The procedure of adding or deleting channel numbers into the TV's memory circuits. In this way the TV "remembers" only the locally available or desired channel numbers and skips over any unwanted channel numbers.

PTV * Projection Television (Rear and/or Front projection design systems are available.)

Remote Sensor Window * A window or opening found on the TV control panel through which infrared remote control command signals are received.

RF * Radio Frequency or modulated signal design used as the carrier for television broadcasts.

Second Audio Program (SAP) * Another or additional audio channel provided for in the Multichannel Television Sound (MTS) broadcast standard. A monaural soundtrack included within the recorded or video signal (usually containing a second language translation for the displayed programming.)

Status * Allows the user to quickly confirm what channel number is currently being viewed. Status can also be used to clear the TV of on-screen displays or information (rather than waiting for the displays to "time out" or automatically disappear from the screen).

S-Video Input * Allows direct connection of high-resolution video sources, such as a Super VHS videocassette recorder, Laser Disc player, etc. Provides improved picture resolution, sharpness, and clarity.

Twin Lead Wire * The more commonly used name for the two strand 300 Ohm antenna wire used with many indoor and outdoor antenna systems. In many cases this type of antenna wire requires an additional adapter (or balun) in order to connect to the 75 Ohm Input terminals designed into the more recent Televisions and VCRs.

Variable Audio Output * An adjustable audio output which allows for volume variations at the source.

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
